Broker licenses		
'Nominee' broker's licence grant or renewal charge	\$120 (charge payable every three years)	Broker upon grant or renewal. A 'Nominee' is a natural person who does not intend to act as a customs broker in his or her own right
'Sole trader' or 'Corporate' broker's licence grant or renewal charge	\$1200 (charge payable every three years)	Broker upon grant or renewal. Charge applies to all brokers other than 'Nominees'

Current Department of Agriculture charges

There are number of fees and charges that the Department of Agriculture (Agriculture) is considering as part of a broader review of its import cost recovery arrangements, and this may see additional fees and/or charges included as part of the joint border fee review.

Agriculture's review will also identify where charging arrangements could be made more efficient for clients. The review will examine each fee and charge, where there are joint/multiple impacts or interactions with the same clients and the current revenue collection points. This will ensure that fees are imposed and collected in the most effective and efficient manner.

Visa Application Charges

The Visa Application Charge is the amount of money that must be paid for a visa application. These charges differ based on the type of visa being applied for. Visa Application Charges are payable at the time the visa application is made, with some visas also requiring a second instalment, which is due before the visa is granted.

A Visa Pricing Table is available online at <http://www.immi.gov.au/Help/Pages/fees-charges/visa.aspx>. This table outlines the various Visa Application Charges that are considered in-scope for the Fees Review. It divides the charges into five categories that correspond to what the applicant plans to do in Australia; Visit, Study, Work, Live and Other.

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection administers a number of charges outside of Visa Application Charges, such as Citizenship, interpreting services, migration agent registration, Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) business travel cards and LegendCOM subscriptions which may be included as part of this Review.
