As at 30 September almost **1.3 tonnes of ice was seized at the border** – most supplied by transnational crime groups.



Proceeds of drug crime leave Australia to fund the lives of **international criminals**.

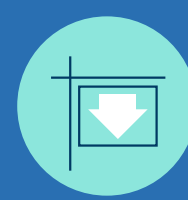


but the harm stays here...

...in your home



In 2017–18, **70.8%** of detected clan labs were in **residential locations**.



Meth contamination can **reduce a property's value by 10%**.



...in your neighbourhood



90% of clandestine labs go **undetected** until abandoned or relocated.



Harmful chemicals from clan labs are often dumped into nearby waterways, parks and reserves.



Within clan labs, levels of **toxic chemical residue** (contamination levels) are between approximately **10 and 40 times higher** than the Australian guideline.



...in your community



The social cost of meth in 2013–14 was just over **\$5 billion dollars**.



Many of the victims injured by clan labs are first responders.



Use of meth is associated with **increased odds of domestic violence**. A recent survey found that ice was a factor in nearly **1/3 of domestic violence deaths**.

Not to mention causing harms that are harder to quantify:

- Road deaths
- Robbery
- Assaults
- Property crime
