

Lifejackets washed ashore at Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI)

#### Issue:

Media reported on 27 and 28 May 2013 that lifejackets were found on the beach at Cocos (Keeling) Islands leading to speculation that a SIEV had foundered in the vicinity.

#### **Key Points:**

- At approximately 3.17pm AEST on 24 May 2013 the Customs National Operation Centre (CNOC) received advice from an Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (ACBPS) officer deployed on Cocos Island who had been told of 25 life jackets washed up on the beach.
- 2. The ACBPS officer was advised on 24 May 2013 that a third party was on a walking tour between Home Island and South Island at CKI on 18 May 2013 and saw life jackets described as fairly new, washed up on the beach. It was reported that there were no signs of humans, camping or discarded food stuffs.
- This information was passed to Australian Federal Police (AFP) on CKI and to Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) in Canberra. AFP is the emergency coordination agency on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.
- 4. A Border Protection Command (BPC) assigned surveillance flight was airborne at this time and was tasked by AFP to locate the life jackets. At approximately 5.18pm AEST AFP reported that the surveillance flight sighted 23 lifejackets in total, spread across a number of islands from South Island heading north.
- Approximately 9.28pm on 24 May 2013 AFP reported that ACBPS located a lifejacket on West Island very similar to those sighted on South Island. The life jacket was manufactured in Cearle, Indonesia.
- 6. AFP responded to the sighting on 25 May 2013 at low tide when South Island is accessible on foot. ACBPS offered two officers to assist with this activity however this was not required. AFP also conducted a sea and land search of South Island, Home Island and Direction Island on 26 May 2013 and located 25 additional life jackets the same as those previously located.
- 7. ACBPS continue to assist AFP with their investigation by providing information on vessels movements. Given the vast area of ocean from which the life jackets may have originated it is not feasible to form a view as to their origin.
- 8. The overwhelming majority of SIEV intercepted at CKI and Christmas Island are incinerated within 96 hours of their arrival due to unseaworthiness. Where PII have been embarked on BPC assigned assets due to the danger of remaining on their vessel, their vessels are destroyed in situ which may be in either Australia or Indonesia's search and rescue zone.
- On occasions debris such as lifejackets may not be fully incinerated in the process of vessel destruction. This debris is usually transported in a westerly direction on ocean currents.

- 10. Enquiries undertaken by ACBPS established the following:
  - Further debris located at CKI included one life ring in good condition and fibreglass debris with burn marks. Fibreglass hulls are typical of Sri Lankan vessels arriving at CKI rather than Christmas Island;
  - One of the lifejackets located contained 50,000 Iranian Rial approximately four Australian dollars:
  - Merchant vessels do traverse the seas in the vicinity of CKI as there are a number of major shipping channels in the vicinity. The last fortnight has been a period of bad weather in the vicinity of CKI with merchant vessels reporting taking shelter near CKI.

Lifejackets washed ashore at Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI)

#### Issue:

Media reported on 27 and 28 May 2013 that lifejackets were found on the beach at Cocos (Keeling) Islands leading to speculation that a SIEV had foundered in the vicinity.

#### **Key Points:**

- At approximately 3.17pm AEST on 24 May 2013 the Customs National Operation Centre (CNOC) received advice from an Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (ACBPS) officer deployed on Cocos Island who had been told of 25 life jackets washed up on the beach.
- 2. The ACBPS officer was advised on 24 May 2013 that a third party was on a walking tour between Home Island and South Island at CKI on 18 May 2013 and saw life jackets described as fairly new, washed up on the beach. It was reported that there were no signs of humans, camping or discarded food stuffs.
- This information was passed to Australian Federal Police (AFP) on CKI and to Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) in Canberra. AFP is the emergency coordination agency on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.
- 4. A Border Protection Command (BPC) assigned surveillance flight was airborne at this time and was tasked by RCC to locate the life jackets. At approximately 8.48pm AEST AFP reported that the surveillance flight sighted 23 lifejackets in total, spread across a number of islands from South Island heading north.
- Approximately 9.28pm on 24 May 2013 AFP reported that ACBPS located a lifejacket on West Island very similar to those sighted on South Island. The life jacket was manufactured in Cearle, Indonesia.
- 6. AFP responded to the sighting on 25 May 2013 at low tide when South Island is accessible on foot. ACBPS offered two officers to assist with this activity however this was not required. AFP also conducted a sea and land search of South Island, Home Island and Direction Island on 26 May 2013 and located 25 additional life jackets the same as those previously located.
- 7. The overwhelming majority of SIEV intercepted at CKI and Christmas Island are destroyed by burning or sink of their own accord. Where PII have been embarked on BPC assigned assets due to the danger of remaining on their vessel, their vessels are destroyed in situ which may be in either Australia or Indonesia's search and rescue zone.
- On occasions debris such as lifejackets may not be fully incinerated in the process of vessel destruction. Wind direction at this time of year tends to transport any debris in a north-westerly direction.
- 9. Enquiries undertaken by ACBPS established the following:

- Merchant vessels do traverse the seas in the vicinity of CKI as there are a number of major shipping channels in the vicinity. The last fortnight has been a period of bad weather in the vicinity of CKI with merchant vessels reporting taking shelter near CKI.
- 10. ACBPS has no intelligence to suggest a vessel may have recently sunk near CKI or Christmas Island. It is possible that the lifejackets are debris from a SIEV which has been destroyed at sea after interception as has happened previously. Most recently with SAR2013/3455 (22 May 2013) when surveillance observed a number of lifejackets around 105 nautical miles north-north east of Christmas Island which were assessed to have been from vessel destruction rather than capsizing. Note: the lifejackets were located on CKI prior to this particular event.
- 11. ACBPS continue to assist AFP with their investigation by providing information on vessels movements.

# Lifejackets washed ashore at Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI)

#### **Issue:**

Media reported on 27 and 28 May 2013 that lifejackets were found on the beach at Cocos (Keeling) Islands leading to speculation that a SIEV had foundered in the vicinity.

# **Key Points:**

- 1. At approximately 3.17pm AEST on 24 May 2013 the Customs National Operation Centre (CNOC) received advice from an Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (ACBPS) officer deployed on Cocos Island who had been told of 25 life jackets washed up on the beach.
- 2. The ACBPS officer was advised on 24 May 2013 that a third party was on a walking tour between Home Island and South Island at CKI on 18 May 2013 and saw life jackets described as fairly new, washed up on the beach. It was reported that there were no signs of humans, camping or discarded food stuffs.
- 3. This information was passed to Australian Federal Police (AFP) on CKI and to Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) in Canberra. AFP is the emergency coordination agency on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.
- 4. A Border Protection Command (BPC) assigned surveillance flight was airborne at this time and was tasked by RCC to locate the life jackets. At approximately 8.48pm AEST AFP reported that the surveillance flight sighted 23 lifejackets in total, spread across a number of islands from South Island heading north.
- 5. Approximately 9.28pm on 24 May 2013 AFP reported that ACBPS located a lifejacket on West Island very similar to those sighted on South Island. The life jacket was manufactured in Cearle, Indonesia.
- 6. About 9:30am (local time) on 25 May 2013, a search commenced on the seaward side of Home Island in the area identified earlier as having life jackets washed ashore. AFP responded to the sighting on 25 May\_2013 at low tide when South Island is accessible on foot. ACBPS offered two officers to assist with this activity however this was not required. AFP also conducted a sea and land search of South Island, Home Island and Direction Island on 26 May 2013 and located 25 additional life jackets the same as those previously located.
- 7. The overwhelming majority of SIEV intercepted at CKI and Christmas Island are destroyed by burning or sink of their own accord. Where PII have been embarked on BPC assigned assets due to the danger of remaining on their vessel, their vessels are destroyed in situ which may be in either Australia or Indonesia's search and rescue zone.
- 8. On occasions debris such as lifejackets may not be fully incinerated in the process of vessel destruction. Wind direction at this time of year tends to transport any debris in a north-westerly direction.
- 9. Enquiries undertaken by ACBPS established the following:

#### UNCLASSIFIED

- Further debris located at CKI included part of a shipping container door, one life ring in good condition and fibreglass debris with burn marks (fibreglass hulls are typical of Sri Lankan vessels arriving at CKI rather than Christmas Island);
- One of the lifejackets located contained 50,000 Iranian Rial approximately four Australian dollars (Iranians do not transit near CKI but rather to Christmas and Ashmore Islands):
- Merchant vessels do traverse the seas in the vicinity of CKI as there are a number of major shipping channels in the vicinity. The last fortnight has been a period of bad weather in the vicinity of CKI with merchant vessels reporting taking shelter near CKI.
- 10. ACBPS has no intelligence to suggest a vessel may have recently sunk near CKI or Christmas Island. It is possible that the lifejackets are debris from a SIEV which has been destroyed at sea after interception as has happened previously. Most recently with SAR2013/3455 (22 May 2013) when surveillance observed a number of lifejackets around 105 nautical miles north-north east of Christmas Island which were assessed to have been from vessel destruction rather than capsizing. Note: the lifejackets were located on CKI prior to this particular event.
- 11. ACBPS continue to assist AFP with their investigation by providing information on vessels movements.

# TITLE: LIFE JACKETS ON COCOS (KEELING) ISLANDS

# Key facts:

- The Australian Federal Police can confirm that a total of 31 life jackets have been found on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.
- The entire coastline of the atoll, (with the exception of North Keeling) has now been searched.
- Throughout this search the only item of personal property was a 50 000 Iranian Rial note (approximately AUD\$4.20) located in the pocket of a life jacket.
- It is common for debris and other items to wash up on the east coast of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, including items from Indonesia.
- Search activity throughout the duration of this search has not located any items/evidence of personal belongings, flotsam/jetsam debris consistent with a vessel sinking nor any sign of deceased, or survivors having made it to shore.
- The AFP is continuing to make enquiries into the origin of the life
  jackets in conjunction with Australian Maritime Safety Authority
  (AMSA) Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC) and Australian Customs
  and Border Protection Service (ACBPS).

 AMSA has confirmed there is no specific incident they can relate to these lifejackets. Consequently there is no Search and Rescue
 Operation in the Cocos (Keeling) Islands area.

# **Chronology of Key Events**

Saturday 18 May 2013

 A member of the public originally discovered numerous life jackets on South Island of Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI). However, the matter was not reported for six days (24 May 2013).

# Friday 24 May 2013

- At approximately 11.30am (CCT) on Friday 24th May 2013,
   Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (ACBPS) members attended Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI) Police Station to report that a member of the public had seen at least ten life jackets washed ashore on South Island.
- Police attended the home of the complainant who stated that on Saturday 18 May 2013, she was walking around CKI atoll with a group of about 10 people when she observed numerous life jackets washed ashore. The complainant did not report the incident to anyone until six days later.
- At 12:45pm, CKI Police discussed the lifejackets with AMSA Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC). As a result of those discussions, a RAAF

- P-3 Orion Aircraft was tasked to search the seaward side of South Island.
- At 4:00pm, RAAF advised CKI Police that additional lifejackets were observed along the shore line of South Island during the flyover. The RAAF aircraft found no evidence of a relevant vessel or wreckage.

# Saturday 25 May 2013

- About 6:00pm, CKI Police were advised that a member of the public had located a lifejacket of the same Chinese make as the others. This lifejacket had one 50000 Iranian note (approximately AUD\$4.22) in the pocket and was located on Pulu Mariah about two to three days earlier.

# Sunday 26 May 2013

A sweep of South Island by Volunteer Marine Rescue Services
 (VMRS) located additional life jackets, bringing the total to 28.

# *Monday 27 May 2013*

• At 4:30pm, **s. 47F(1)**, Duty Chief Rescue Coordination Centre AMSA confirmed that the life jackets cannot be linked to any search

and rescue incident as far back as February 2013. Consequently there is no search and rescue operation in the Cocos (Keeling) islands area.

- AFP members on Cocos (Keeling) Islands located two more life jackets on West Island.
- AFP members also located an additional life jacket which is currently on Horsburgh Island. This life jacket will be collected when tidal levels permit access to Horsburgh Island.
- The AFP has a total of 30 life jackets in their possession. There will be a revised total 31 life jackets when the remaining life jacket is recovered from Horsburgh Island.

# Tuesday 28 May 2013

- The sweep of West Island shoreline was completed at 3:40pm CCT.
- The entire coastline of the atoll, (with the exception of North Keeling) has now been searched.
- There is no further search activity that can be performed by AFP on Cocos (Keeling) Islands at the conclusion of Tuesday. Further search activity will be initiated in the event that further items of interest are sighted by locals, police or potentially RAAF P-3 Orion aircraft.
- As previously reported AFP members on Cocos (Keeling) Islands have request RCC to task RAAF to perform a coastline search of the entire Atoll including North Keeling Island, (16 NM North of

main Atoll). Throughout this search the only item of personal property was the 50000 Rial note located in the pocket of a lifejacket. Search activity throughout the duration of this search has not located any items/evidence of personal belongings, flotsam/jetsam debris consistent with a vessel sinking nor any sign of deceased, or survivors having made it to shore.

Hi Rachel.

No intel as yet, and nothing to suggest there has been a capsizing incident.

I note that the media article suggests that a small amount of Iranian currency was found in one of the jackets. Iranians do not transit to/near Cocos Islands, but rather to Christmas Island and Ashmore Islands.

It is possible (if not likely) that these jackets are those that were observed in water north of Christmas Island on Wednesday 22 May (SAR 3455 refers).

By way of background, on 22 May a P3 detected a number of life jackets tied together around 105nm NNE of CI, not far from a submerged section of a vessel. AMSA assessed that all of this material was the 'leftovers' of a previously destroyed SIEV, not a capsizing. This would be consistent with the Iranian currency being found in the jackets.

Notwithstanding this, we'll continue to ask our counterparts to hunt for any information that may suggest a different conclusion, and will let you know asap if something further comes to light.



- It is common for debris and other items to wash up on the east coast of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, including items from Indonesia.
- AMSA has confirmed there is no specific incident they can relate to these lifejackets. Consequently there is no Search and Rescue Operation in the Cocos (Keeling) Islands area.

Where PII have been embarked on BPC assigned assets due to the danger of remaining on their vessel, their vessels are destroyed in situ which may be in either Australia or Indonesia's search and rescue zone.
- 5. On occasions debris such as lifejackets may not be fully incinerated in the process of vessel destruction. Wind direction at this time of year tends to transport any debris in a north-westerly direction.

AFP also conducted a sea and land search of South Island, Home Island and Direction Island on 26 May 2013 and located 25 additional life jackets the same as those previously sighted.

Further debris located at the same time as these lifejackets included part of a shipping container door, one life ring in good condition and fibreglass debris with burn marks;

One of the lifejackets located contained 50,000 Iranian Rial – approximately four Australian dollars. Iranians PII's are not known to transit near CKI but rather to Christmas and Ashmore Islands.




