INVESTIGATION SUMMARY

SUMMARY

We offer the following Investigation summary:

The delays in obtaining statements relate to several factors:

- Some staff are no longer employed by Wilson Security
- Some staff were on holiday and unavailable
- A recent evaluation of the distribution lists has significantly increased the number of statements required from the original investigation company list from 42 to over 100. This is the result of s. 47G(1)(a) investigation team reviewing the distribution lists created by the previous investigation company.

As a consequence of this the extent of the investigation more than doubles in size.

CONCLUSION

- 1) The Investigation has found no evidence of the media leaks coming from Wilson Security employees. We found no evidence of any Wilson Security employee distributing, copying, printing or otherwise disclosing the content of the files and emails in full or in part to any person, organisation or entity.
- 2) The significant changes implemented by Wilson Security now provide clear audit trails of information copying, scanning or transmission and a significant tightening in Information Security.

The Investigation has found no evidence of the media leaks coming from Wilson Security employees.

3.2. The significant changes implemented by Wilson Security now provide clear audit trails of information copying, scanning and transmission and a significant tightening in Information Security.
