As discussed to try and investigate further than our initial report of one board test for Chrysotile (@5%) used by SA electric switch room floors.

I'd like to collect who the Manufacture was, how they got the supply? Name of how the supplier gets product etc What made them think the product didn't contain asbestos. One test three years ago probably isn't enough but I'll review paperwork and SDS.

This can all then be reported to customs.

Then for us...

How many have been build ? What floor area or exposure each worker has had? How many screws / how much dust etc

Where they have been supplied?

Working from 3000-4000m2 used in 3 years – maybe use 1000m2 a year and at 100m2 on each unit – may have made 10 units??

I can advise both on contacting customers (can make them do if they need to) and on worker potential exposures once I see what they do (and they have test results).

They will need to get s47F or others at s47G(1)(b) to chat about worker exposure (lifetime exposure risk etc) with the workers ...

I'll call you after I've been out there at 8am tomorrow.

As discussed to try and investigate further than our initial report of one board test for Chrysotile (@5%) used by SA electric switch room floors.

I'd like to collect who the Manufacture was, how they got the supply? Name of how the supplier gets product etc What made them think the product didn't contain asbestos. One test three years ago probably isn't enough but I'll review paperwork and SDS.

This can all then be reported to customs.

Then for us...

How many have been build ? What floor area or exposure each worker has had? How many screws / how much dust etc

Where they have been supplied?

Working from 3000-4000m2 used in 3 years – maybe use 1000m2 a year and at 100m2 on each unit – may have made 10 units??

I can advise both on contacting customers (can make them do if they need to) and on worker potential exposures once I see what they do (and they have test results).

They will need to get s22(1)(a)(ii) or others at AEC to chat about worker exposure (lifetime exposure risk etc) with the workers ...

I'll call you after I've been out there at 8am tomorrow.
