## Freedom of Information request - Release of documents

### Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access documents or to amend or annotate Departmental records.

This letter is to provide you with my decision, which is set out below.

#### 3. Information considered

In reaching my decision, I have considered the following:

- The terms of your request;
- The Freedom of Information Act 1982;
- Departmental documents;
- · Consultations with relevant Departmental business areas; and
- The Australian Information Commissioner's guidelines relating to access to documents held by government.

## 4. Documents in scope of request

Section 17 of the FOI Act provides that where an agency can produce a written document containing the information in discrete form by the use of a computer, and the work required would not substantially and unreasonably divert resources of the agency from its other operations, the operation shall deal with the request as if it were a request for access to a written document so produced.

As such, in accordance with section 17 of the FOI Act, the Department has used its computer system to produce one document 'Business Innovation and Investment – Visa subclass 132 and 188 lodged in 2012-13 where the Citizenship Country is Malaysia' relevant the scope of your request.

I am satisfied that the Department has created a document relevant to the scope of your request.

#### 5. Decision on access

The decision in relation to the document in the possession of the Department which comes within the scope of your request is to release one document in full.
