## Freedom of Information (FOI) request - Access Decision

On 31 August 2017, the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the Department) received a request for access to document under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the FOI Act).

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the FOI Act.

## 1 Scope of request

You have requested access to the following document:

All and any emails, memos, documents, notes, records and agreements, concerning the arrival of Cuban asylum seekers from the United States of America to Brisbane Australia between 1 June and 1 August 2017, in relation to these media reports:

On 20 September 2017 the Department issued you a notice under section 24AB of the FOI Act.

On 11 October 2017 the Department accepted the revised scope to the following:

- 1. Information the Department may hold in relation to an arrival of Cuban asylum seekers on an airline carrier owned by or funded by Donald trump in late July 2017.
- 2. Senate Estimates briefings regarding Cuban resettlement.
- 3. The Australian visa type that the Cubans have been issued and description of that class of visa if that information.

# 2 Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access document or to amend or annotate records.

#### 3 Relevant material

In reaching my decision, I referred to the following:

- · the terms of your request
- the document relevant to the request
- the FOI Act
- Guidelines published by the Office of the Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the FOI Guidelines)
- advice from Departmental officers with responsibility for matters relating to the document to which you sought access

## 4 Document in scope of request

The Department has identified one document as falling within the scope of your request. This document was in the possession of the Department on 31 August 2017 when your request was received.

#### 5 Decision

#### Part 1

For Part 1 of your request the relevant business area in the Department has undertaken searches and has advised no documents are held. In response to Part 1 of your request the Department advises that the flights taken by the individuals in question were funded by the Department of Immigration and Border Protection. The Department has no information to suggest the airline carrier(s) used are owned by Donald Trump.

#### Part 2

The decision in relation to the document in the possession of the Department that falls within Part 2 of your request is as follows:

Release one document in part with deletions.

**Attachment A** is a schedule that describes the relevant document and sets out my decision in relation to the document.

#### Part 3

For Part 3 of your request, the relevant business area in the Department can advise the Cuban asylum seekers were granted Refugee (Subclass 200) visas. There is publically available information describing the visa at - <a href="https://www.border.gov.au/Trav/Visa-1/200-">https://www.border.gov.au/Trav/Visa-1/200-</a>.

#### 6 Reasons for Decision

For the reasons set out below, I have exempted certain information in the document.

Where the schedule of documents indicates an exemption claim has been applied to a document or part of document, my findings of fact and reasons for deciding that the exemption provision applies to that information are set out below.

## 6.1 Section 22 of the FOI Act – irrelevant to request

Section 22 of the FOI Act provides that if giving access to a document would disclose information that would reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to the request, it is possible for the Department to prepare an edited copy of the document, modified by deletions, ensuring that the edited copy would not disclose any information that would reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to the request.

In addition, on 1 September 2017, the Department advised you that its policy is to exclude the personal details of officers not in the Senior Executive Service (SES), as well as the mobile and work telephone numbers of SES staff contained in documents that fall within scope of an FOI request.

I find that the documents relevant to your request contain material that is irrelevant to your FOI request. I have withheld or deleted that material accordingly. These deletions are marked s22(1)(a)(ii) in the documents released.
