Freedom of Information (FOI) request - Access Decision

On 12 September 2017, the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the Department) received a request for access to documents under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the FOI Act).

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the FOI Act.

1 Scope of request

You have requested access to the following:

'For Financial Years 2012-2017

1. Number of 186 and 187 applications by source countries (top 10 countries) under visa streams (direct entry, TRT, labour agreement).

2. Number of 186 and 187 determination (approved and refused) by countries of origin (top 10 countries) under visa streams.

3. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s137Q by visa streams, by state, by source countries.

4. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s109 by visa streams, by state, by source countries.

5. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s116 by visa streams, by state, by source countries.'

On 3 October 2017 you agreed to revise the scope of your request to the following documents:

'For Financial Years 2012-2017

1. Number of 186 and 187 applications by source countries (top 10 countries) under visa streams (direct entry, TRT, labour agreement).

2. Number of 186 and 187 determination (approved and refused) by countries of origin (top 10 countries) under visa streams.

3. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s137Q by visa streams, by state, by source countries.

4. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s109 by visa streams, by state, by source countries.

5. Number of 186 and 187 cancellations under s116 by visa streams, by state, by source countries.'

2 Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access or to amend or annotate records.

3 Relevant material

In reaching my decision I referred to the following:

- the Freedom of Information Act 1982;
- advice from the relevant Departmental business area;
- Departmental documents (attached); and
- Guidelines published by the Office of the Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the FOI Guidelines).

4 Documents in scope of request

Section 17 of the FOI Act provides that where an agency can produce a written document containing the information in discrete form by the use of a computer, and the work required would not substantially and unreasonably divert resources of the agency from its other operations, the agency shall deal with the request as if it were a request for access to a written document so produced.

In accordance with section 17 of the FOI Act, the Department has used its computer system to produce five documents that are relevant to your request.

5 Decision on access

My decision in relation to the documents in the possession of the Department which falls within the scope of your request is to release five documents in full.

7 Your Review Rights

Internal Review
