Not sure how this is a TC&R issue.

At first glance, it appears that this person should be making a Tariff Advice application suggesting that their goods are eligible for the concessional treatment. Without knowing the person, they may be looking for quick advice rather than the 30 day window for a TA.

Reading the respective tc, he is looking simply for somebody to tell him that his goods are eligible.

We certainly cant do that without first knowing what he has.

Based on the email contents Concessions or TC&R could easily provide advice, but it would be non-binding.
