

FOI Request – FA 17/12/00767

Request for access to documents subject to the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (FOI Act)

On 19 December 2017, the Department received an FOI request seeking access to:

- 1. Under the offshore humanitarian programme for 2015/16/17
- a) What were the top ten lodgements in terms of religion for people from Syria and Iraq only.
- b) What were the top ten refusals in terms of religion for people from Syria and Iraq?
- 2. Taking into account all offshore humanitarian visas for the source countries of Iraq and Syria, please
- a) provide a breakdown of the declared* religion of those provided with a visa
- b) provide a breakdown of the declared religion of those refused a visa

*I'm aware this has been released up until Jan 2017. Update appreciated.

- Religion is self-identified and as declared in application and may include generic responses.
- It is not a requirement that applicants declare their religion on their application form for humanitarian entry to Australia.

Important caveat: Applications lodged in one program year may not be finalised in the same program year. Therefore, it is not accurate to make comparisons about data relating to application lodgements and finalisations, ie grants or refusals, in a program year
