Request

Statistics from 2003 to 2018 for human trafficking brought to the attention of the Department of Home Affairs, divided by:

- 1) in total and originated from the state of South Australia;
- 2) sex trafficking, labour trafficking and forced marriage;
- 3) Age, gender and nationality.

Response:

- The total number of suspected victims of human trafficking, slavery, or slavery like practices known to the Department for the period 1 January 2004 to 28 February 2019, is at <u>Table 1</u> below. These figures represent both non-citizens and Australian citizens who have been placed on the Support for Trafficked People Program (STPP) by the Australian Federal Police. Data on suspected victims of trafficking placed on the STPP is provided to the Department of Home Affairs by the Department of Social Services (DSS). The STPP commenced in 2004. The Department does not have data on suspected victims of human trafficking prior to that date.
- <u>Table 2</u> provides a breakdown of the total (449) by the trafficking type; <u>Table 3</u> provides a breakdown by age; <u>Table 4</u> provides a breakdown by gender; and <u>Table 5</u> provides a breakdown by nationality.
