This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared if necessary, to give in Court as a Witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

I am an employee of the Australian Federal Police attached to Firearms Identification and Armoury Team, Forensics, Specialist Operations, based in Sydney in New South Wales. I have been a member of the team since May 2010.

Prior to this, I was employed with the Queensland Police Service from November 1986 to November 2007. There I held the position of a sworn member of the Police Service performing the role of Scientific Officer from June 1987 and as a Forensic Firearm Investigator from June 1988 to November 2007. During this time, I successfully completed an 'in-house' training program and was awarded expertise in the field of Forensic Firearms Investigation in 1997. On numerous occasions, I delivered training within this section, as well as lecturing in the area of forensic ballistics at Griffith University. I also relieved in the position of Officer in Charge of the Queensland Ballistics

Section. I have also lectured in the area of forensic ballistics at Canberra Institute of Technology.

I am currently engaged full time in the technical investigation of firearms related crime, the collection and preservation of exhibits and the identification of firearms and related ammunition components. A part of these duties include the provision of firearm identification advice to the Australian Government Department of Home Affairs.

I have a Bachelor of Science from the University of Queensland and a Masters of Science in Forensic Science from Griffith University.

I have attended and studied the manufacturing processes and the techniques adopted by the Government Small Arms Factory in Lithgow, New South Wales, the Olin Winchester Australian Factory in Geelong, Victoria, Tobler Barrels at Robertson, New South Wales and M.A.B. Engineering, Brisbane, Queensland.

I have successfully completed factory certified armourer's courses conducted by firearm manufacturers for handguns, rifles and shotguns.

I have studied the techniques in the field of firearm and ammunition examination and identification adopted by state and territory police agencies throughout Australia.

My duties also include the examination and comparison of tools and toolmarks. This type of examination involves comparing questioned toolmarks to either impressed or striated toolmarks made by a questioned tool.

I am recognised as an 'expert' Forensic Firearms Investigator by the Australasian Police Professional Standards Council.

Later on Tuesday 18th June 2019, the items were returned to Australian Border Force Officer s. 22(1)(a)(ii) at the Detained Goods Management of the Australian Border Force, 20-22 The Circuit, Skygate, Brisbane Airport.

2. EXAMINATION & RESULTS

I undertook an examination of the exhibit items recording the results of the examination as follows:

Seizure Q0116099

A cardboard box with Australian Border Force seal numbers 0711434 and labelled in part 'Q0113443 s. 47F(1) and an address label marked in part 'ADDRESSEE s. 47F(1) s. 47F(1) s. 47F(1) and 'SENDER s. 47F(1) s. 47F(1) which contained an AR15/M16/M4 style upper receiver.

An examination found that this upper receiver was consistent with being for an airsoft type copy of an AR15/M16/M4 style rifle and not for a 5.56x45mm calibre AR15/M16/M4 rifle. A comparison was made between this item and the upper receiver on a Lancer Tactical 6mm airsoft rifle. The Lancer Tactical soft air rifle was pulled apart and the gear box housing was found to be able to fit into the combination of the upper receiver in Q0116099 and the lower receiver from Q0115253. The hop-up unit on the rear of the barrel was unable to fit into this upper receiver. Barrels with a different style of hop-up unit may be able to fit into this upper receiver. To fit the Lancer Tactical hop-up unit it would need a small section of the metal removed to allow the hop-up unit to fit. As a result this upper receiver could be considered to be an unfinished part for a soft air rifle. As a result it would fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

If this upper receiver was added to an air soft gear box and other airsoft parts then they would give it substantially the same appearance as a fully automatic firearm. A soft air rifle, substantially the same in appearance as a fully automatic firearm, would fall to Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 12 of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia. As such this upper receiver could be considered to be a part for such an item and therefore fall to the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 13 of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

A cardboard box with Australian Border Force seal numbers 0711421 and labelled in part 'Q0115360 s. 47F(1) and an address label marked in part to 'ADDRESSEE s. 47F(1) s. 47F(1) and s. 47F(1) s. 47F(1) ' which contained twenty (20) soft air rifle gear box housings marked 'DT', with each gear box housing having six (6) bearings and nine (9) bolts.

An examination found that these gear box housings marked 'DT' with the six (6) bearings fitted could hold the gears from Q0116401. These gear box housing are made by Dynamic Tactical which is a company that manufactures soft air firearms. A comparison was made between these gear box housing and the gear box housing in the Lancer Tactical 6mm soft air rifle and they were found to be consistent with each other. These gear box housings were found to be able to fit into the Lancer Tactical 6mm soft air rifle. As a result this gear box housing could be considered to be an incomplete receiver and therefore a part for a soft air rifle. As a result it falls under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

Two bags each containing an upper and lower receiver each marked 'STONER RIFLE K83681' and 'SR-16 5.56mm KNIGHT'S ARMAMENT CO. TITUSVILLE FL. U.S.A.

An examination found that the gear box housings and the barrel from the Lancer Tactical soft air rifle could be fitted into these upper and lower receivers. The gear box housings marked 'DT' from Q0115360 could also be fitted into them. As a result these upper and lower receivers are parts for a soft air rifle. As a result they fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

If these upper and lower receivers were added to an air soft gear box and other airsoft parts then they would give it substantially the same appearance as a fully automatic firearm. A soft air rifle, substantially the same in appearance as a fully automatic firearm, would fall to Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 12 of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia. As such these upper and lower receivers could be considered to be parts for such an item and therefore fall to the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 13 of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

An examination found that these gears fitted into the gear box housings marked 'DT' with the bearings fitted in Seizure Q0115360. The pistol sleeves were also consistent with being used in the gear box housings. As such these gears and pistol sleeves could be considered to be an incomplete receiver and therefore parts for a soft air rifle. As a result these parts fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia.

3. CONCLUSIONS

3.1 The upper receiver in Q0116099 could be considered to be an unfinished part for a soft air rifle. As a result it falls under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956.

3.2 The gear box housings in Q0115360 could be considered to be an incomplete receiver and therefore parts for a soft air rifle. As a result they fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956.

3.3 The upper and lower receivers in Q0115253 are parts for a soft air rifle. As a result they fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956.

3.4 The gears and pistol sleeves in Q0116401 could be considered to be an incomplete receiver and therefore parts for a soft air rifle. As a result these parts fall under the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 2B of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956.

3.5 The upper receiver in Q0116099 and the upper and lower receivers in Q0115253 could be considered to be a parts for an airsoft rifle that is substantially the same in appearance as a fully automatic firearm and therefore fall to the control of Schedule 6, Part 2, Item 13 of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations 1956 for importation into Australia

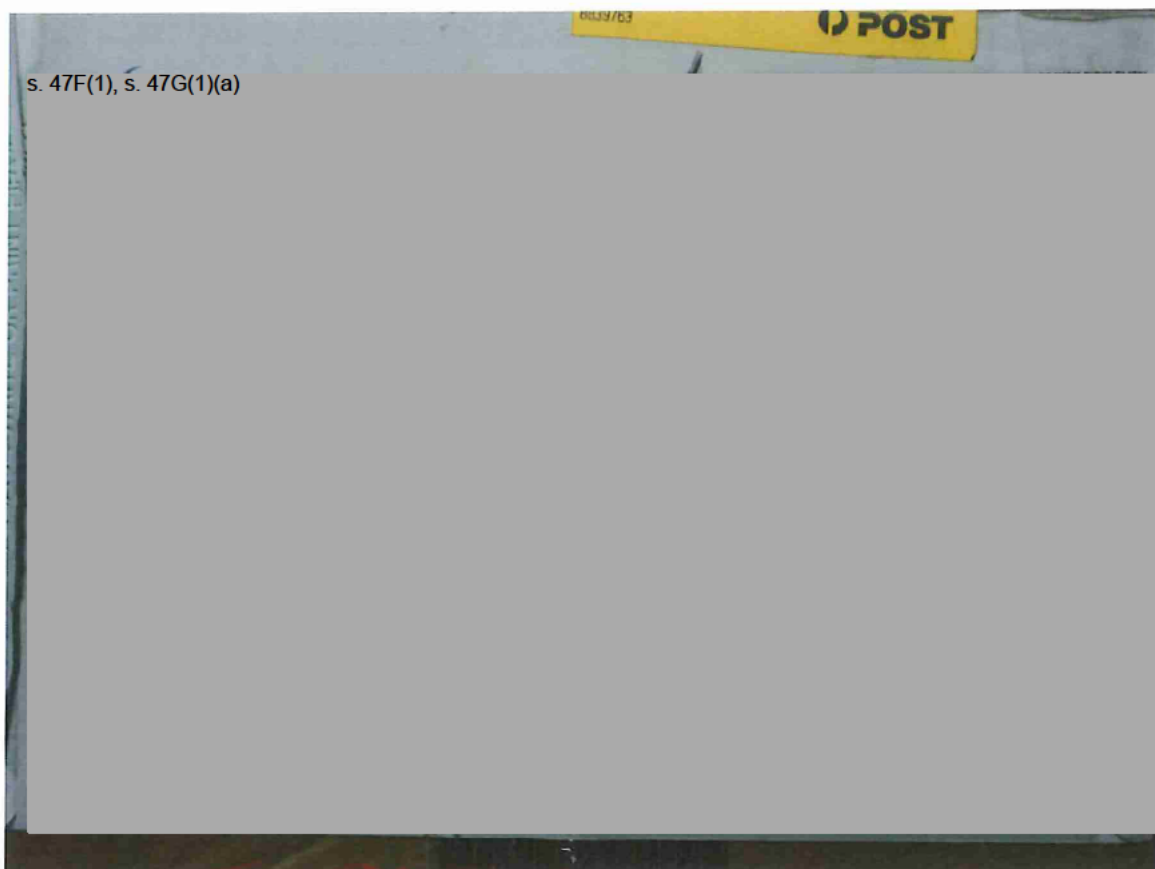

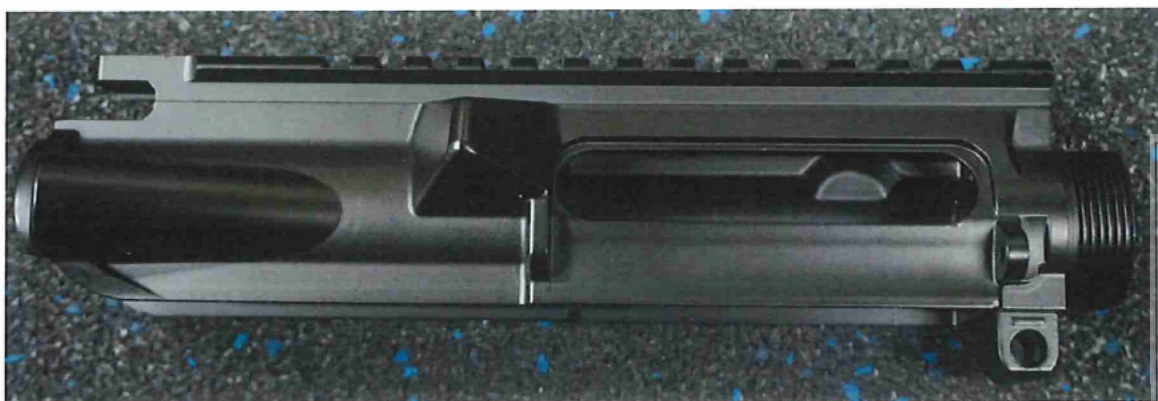

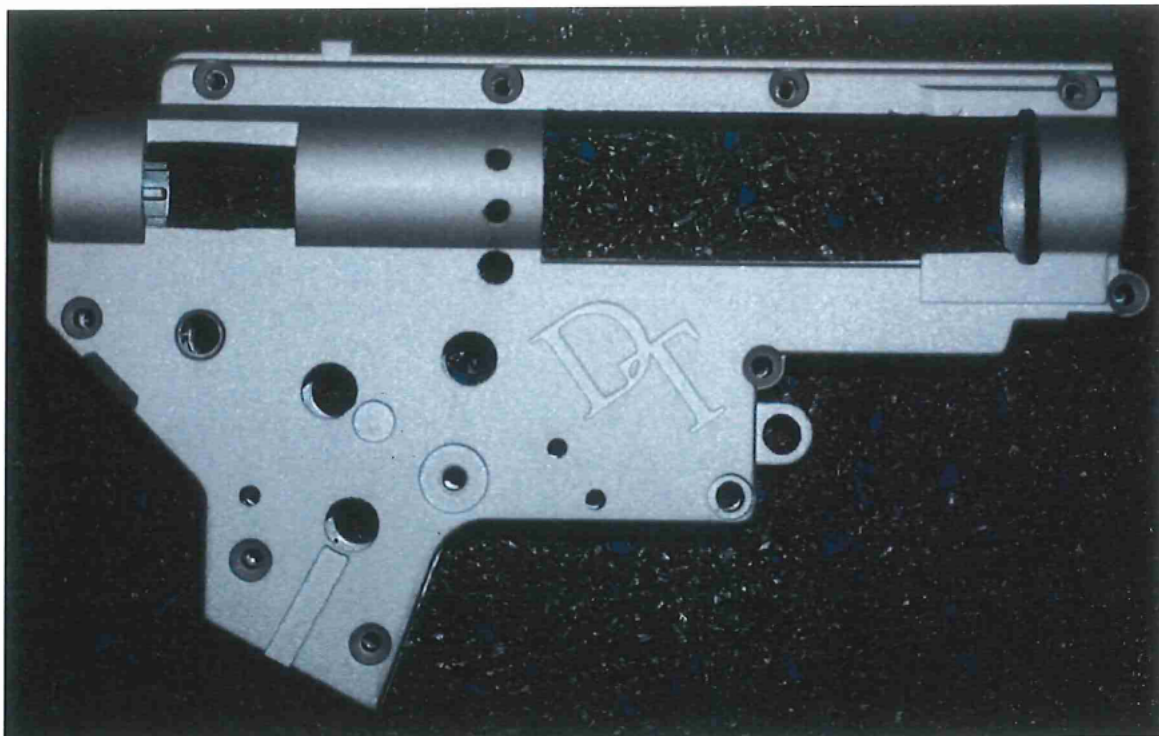

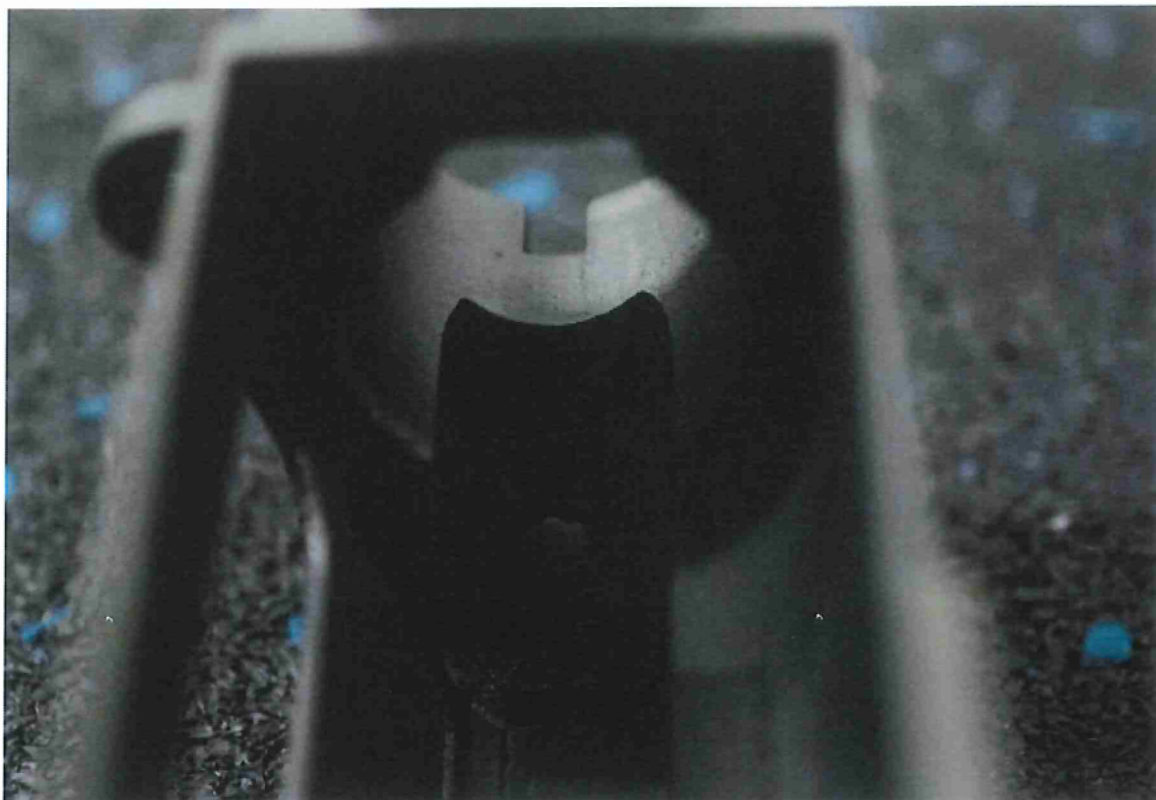

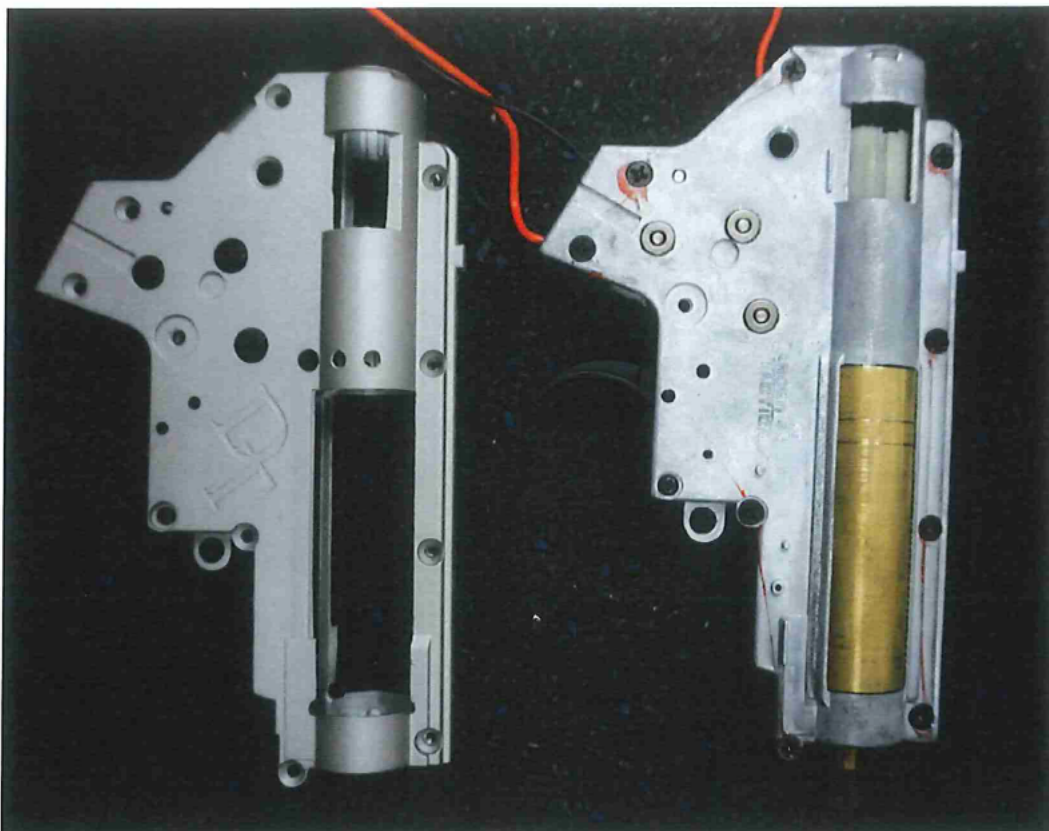

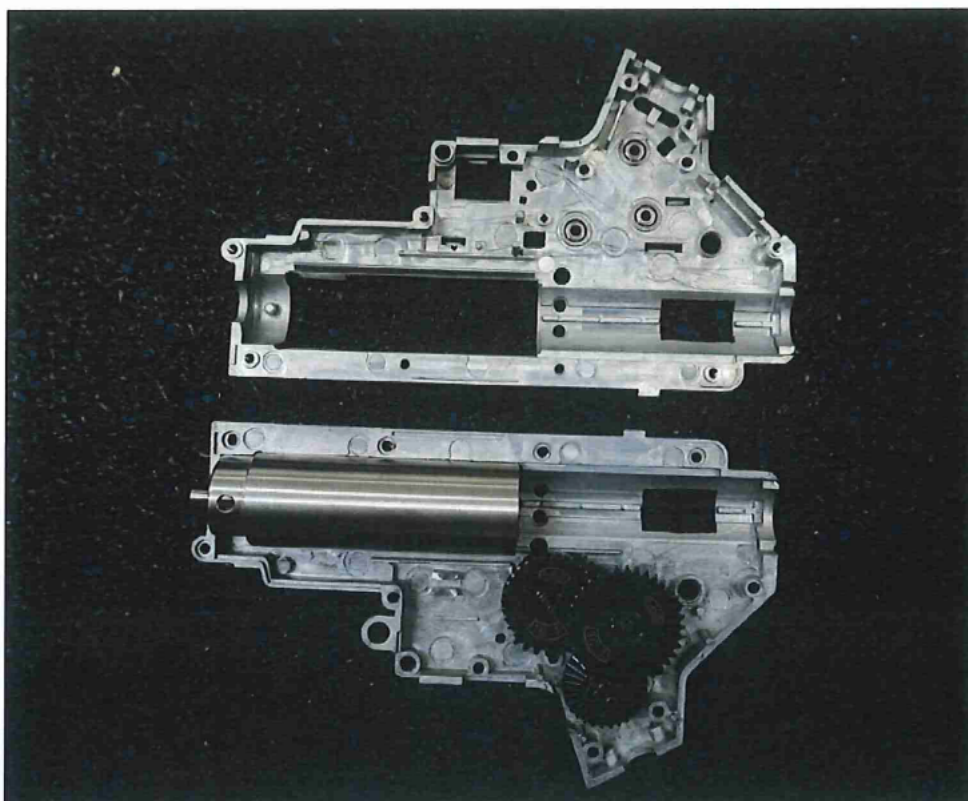
