## Freedom of Information (FOI) request - Access Decision

On 3 September 2019, the Department of Home Affairs (the Department) received a request for access to documents under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the FOI Act).

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the FOI Act.

### 1 Scope of request

You have requested access to the following documents:

Access to documents containing information regarding how much the Department has spent on detaining New Zealand citizens, due to be deported from Australia, on Christmas Island.

Specifically, I am seeking the overall cost for the years 2017 and 2018. This includes flights and air transfers, as well as the cost of housing detainees there. I am also seeking the total number of New Zealand citizens in the years 2017 and 2018 that have been detained on Christmas Island.

I advise I am not interested in duplicate copies of documents or documents that have already been publicly released or media releases, media articles or media statements.

## 2 Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access documents or to amend or annotate records.

### 3 Relevant material

In reaching my decision I referred to the following:

• the terms of your request

- the FOI Act
- Guidelines published by the Office of the Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the FOI Guidelines)

## 4 Documents in scope of request

The data produced in the document existed in the possession of the Department on 3 September 2019 when your FOI request was received.

## 5 Decision

The decision in relation to the documents in the possession of the Department which fall within the scope of your request is as follows:

• Release one document in full.

## 6 Reasons for Decision

Detailed reasons for my decision are set out below.

Where the schedule of documents indicates an exemption claim has been applied to a document or part of document, my findings of fact and reasons for deciding that the exemption provision applies to that information are set out below.

## 6.1 Section 22 of the FOI Act – irrelevant to request

Section 22 of the FOI Act provides that if giving access to a document would disclose information that would reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to the request, it is possible for the Department to prepare an edited copy of the document, modified by deletions, ensuring that the edited copy would not disclose any information that would reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to the request.

On 3 September 2019, the Department advised you that its policy is to exclude the personal details of officers not in the Senior Executive Service (SES), as well as the mobile and work telephone numbers of SES staff, contained in documents that fall within scope of an FOI request.

I have therefore decided that parts of document marked 's22(1)(a)(ii)' would disclose information that could reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to your request, and have therefore prepared an edited copy of the document, with the irrelevant material deleted pursuant to section 22(1)(a)(ii) of the FOI Act.

The remainder of the document has been released to you as it is relevant to your request.

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#### Your Review Rights

#### Internal Review

If you disagree with this decision, you have the right to apply for an internal review by the Department of this decision. Any request for internal review must be provided to the Department within 30 days of you being notified of the decision. Where possible please attach reasons why you believe a review of the decision is necessary. The internal review will be carried out by an officer other than the original decision maker and the Department must make a review decision within 30 days.
