Freedom of Information (FOI) request - Access Decision

On 26 February 2019, the Department of Home Affairs (the Department) received a request for access to document under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the FOI Act).

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the FOI Act.

1 Scope of request

You requested access to the following document:

- 1) any summary documents that outlines payments and the reasons for the payments made under the "letter of intent" between Paladin Solutions PNG Limited for the Contract Notice: CN3470670 and
- 2) any summary reports from Paladin Solutions PNG Limited which outlined the breakdown of expenditure for the delivery of the contract.

2 Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access document or to amend or annotate records.

3 Relevant material

In reaching my decision I referred to the following:

- the terms of your request
- the document relevant to the request
- the FOI Act
- Guidelines published by the Office of the Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the FOI Guidelines).

4 Document in scope of request

In accordance with section 17 of the FOI Act, the Department used its computer system to produce one document that contains information that falls within the scope of your request. This data is relevant to part 1 of your request, and consists of payments made to Paladin Solutions PNG Limited under Contract Notice CN3470670.

The data produced in the document existed in the possession of the Department on 26 February 2019 when your FOI request was received.

Details of the related services undertaken by Paladin Solutions PNG Ltd is publicly available on the Australian Government's procurement information system, which can be found here: https://www.tenders.gov.au/.

In relation to part 2 of your request, the Department undertook reasonable searches in relation to the documents you requested access to. Having regard to your request and the types of documents that may fall within the scope of your request I am satisfied that the searches conducted were thorough and all reasonable steps were taken to locate any document relevant to your request.

5 Decision

The decision in relation to the document in the possession of the Department which falls within the scope of part 1 of your request is to release one document in full.

Section 24A of the FOI Act provides that the Department may refuse a request for access to a document if all reasonable steps have been taken to find the document and the Department is satisfied that the document does not exist. I am satisfied that the Department undertook reasonable searches in relation to part 2 of your request and that no documents relevant to that part of your request were in the possession of the Department on 26 February 2019 when your FOI request was received. As such I am refusing part 2 of your request under section 24A of the FOI Act.
