### Detailed Description of Change

Introduction of a new Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa (Subclass 491) which will be points tested. Subclass 491 will require an invitation.

Changes include:

- 1. Add a new Visa subclass for Intending Migrant (IM) to select/start, draft and submit an Expression Of Interest.
- 2. Enable points based assessment of the claims made by the IM in the EOI for the new Visa subclass, and ensure points test changes also apply to subclasses 189 and 190.
- 3. Enable department batch invitations for the new visa by category.
- 4. Enable nomination of IM for the new visa by State/Territory users by category and enable other functions for State/Territory users.
- 5. Apply regional postcode rules for new visa.
- 6. Apply occupational restrictions via occupation lists to new visa.
- 7. Enable reassessment of subclass eligibility at appropriate times including every 24-hour period.
- 8. Update web service between SkillSelect and Home Affairs for invitations for new visa service from SkillSelect to ePlus.
- 9. Add new visa into Departmental Program Management (DPM) planning console and enable setting of quotas, invitations and management via DPM portal.
- 10. Add new correspondence functions for the new visa including new templates.
- 11. Enable existing correspondence functions for the new visa.
- 12. Incorporate the new visa into existing reports by category.
- 13. Archiving solution implemented to enable reporting.
- 14. URL links and help text to support the changes.
- 15. Cater for the possibility of disallowance by parliament.

The above changes should leverage existing SkillSelect code and infrastructure where possible.

#### **Expression of Interest (EOI)**

An applicant must submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) through SkillSelect with details of their nominated occupation, skills and qualifications. SkillSelect will estimate a points score and rank the applicant against other intending migrants. If the applicant is ranked high enough and there are places available against their nominated occupation, they will be invited to apply for the visa.

If they are invited, they have 60 calendar days to apply for the visa.

s 22(1)(a)(i) is in the process of modifying the previous 491 PCR so that it is ready to send to the department previously known as JOBS when we have funding sorted.

She has come up with some questions about partner points which have some implications for SkillSelect and the online form.

I have attached what the new partner points decision looks like.

Here is a summary of the implications for SkillSelect and the online visa application:

- · It appears not to make sense any more to ask them whether they are claiming partner points as they will get partner points even for not having a partner.
- · From a SkillSelect point of view, we would need to know:
- o Do they have a partner?
- o Is that partner an Australian citizen or permanent resident ? (If they are, they will need to provide evidence)
- o Are they planning to bring their partner with them?
- o If they are does their partner have competent English?
- o Are they seeking points for their partner's skills? If yes then we need details.
- · From a visa application point of view:
- o It appears that at the moment we would NOT collect details of someone's partner if they are an Australian citizen or permanent resident. Now we would need to
- o If the partner is a migrating family member we need to collect details of their English
- o We COULD still drive whether questions about skills were included in the form based on whether they were migrating family member and whether they applicant was seeking to claim points for those skills
