We are currently assisting ACV Storm Bay just north of Ashmore.

We have been advised of intitial numbers of IMA's as being approx 145.

Could you please seek an AMSA exemption to carry the maximum number of persons possible. Previously this has been a total 145 persons.

We presently have 34 Customs and ACS crew, plus <sup>s.</sup> ADF persons, <sup>s. 22(1)(a)(ii)</sup>
. Thgis make a total of 51 persons. Our normal limit is 98 persons total, so our current carrying capacity is 47 additional persons.

If an exemption was obtained to allow us to carry up to 145, it would still leave about 50 persons on the SIEV or with ACV Storm Bay.

Please advise the total number of person I can carry after an exemption is sought.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF TASK (SITUATION):

ACV Storm Bay detected a COI in the approaches to AI on investigation COI was identified as SIEV and is now designated SIEV 236. Vessel contained a large number of PII and crew approx 144 in total. Vessel was boarded and PII removed under rescue at sea.

ACV Triton is currently embarking 96 of PII for long haul to CI. HMAS Wollongong has been tasked with long haul for CI and will arrive AI 180800z Mar 11 embark 35 PII from Ashmore Guardian and depart for CI.

HMAS Maitland has been tasked to provide support to ACV Storm Bay as a response vessel but will not be available for long Haul.ETA AI approximately 180200zMar 11.

#### **DESCRIPTION OF TASK (MISSION):**

ACV Storm Bay is to embark Doctor and Linguist from ACV Triton and retain the duties of on seen commander and maintain the Hull of SIEV 236 and provide condition and valuation report if current tasking permit, if Storm Bay hands over the on seen command to Corio Bay AMSOC is to be advised.

ACV Corio Bay is patrol to AI at best economical speed and BPT provide response support to ACV Storm Bay ETA AI NLT approximately 171400Z Mar 11. BPT conduct vessel inspection and condition and valuation report of SIEV 236 Hull and destruction is required

ACV Ashmore Guardian is to provide support to SIEV 236 by embark and providing security elements to maintain PII not embarked on ACV Triton.

**note** the outcomes of the boarding of Suspected Irregular Entry Vessel 236 by ACV Storm Bay, operating under the control of Border Protection Command (BPC), approximately 5nm north of West Island at Ashmore Islands at approximately 11:00am (AEDST) on Thursday 17 March 2011.

#### NOTED / PLEASE DISCUSS

#### **Key Points:**

- 1. At approximately 10:23am (AEDST) on Thursday 17 March 2011, ACV Storm B operating under the control of Border Protection Command, reported a contact interest (COI) approx 5nm north of West Island at Ashmore Islands. At approximately 11:00am (AEDST) on the same day, ACV Storm Bay boarded the COI, now designated SIEV 236, approximately 5nm north of West Island at Ashmore Islands.
- Initial reporting indicates that there are 145 passengers onboard SIEV 236.
- 3. Arrangements are being made to transfer the people from SIEV 236 to Australian Government authorities on Christmas Island where they will undergo health, security and other checks to determine their identity and reasons for travel. These arrangements will involve a number of BPC assets, including ACV Triton, HMAS Wollongong and third vessel yet to be determined, due to the high number of passengers onboard SI 236.





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

Update on the rescue at sea situation below.

Triton (carrying 111 PII) was unable to land the PII at Christmas Island as it was not considered safe to do so. Triton then returned to Ashmore Reef where additional patrol vessels had arrived since Triton's original departure. Numbers on board Triton were able to be reduced to other vessels due to the arrival of the additional patrol vessels in the interval, however, due to the arrival of a SIEV, numbers on board Triton have not been unable to reduce to 64 (which is the number required to keep Triton within its 98 total POB limit).

The master of Triton has advised that he is able to safely carry 75 PII (copy of risk assessment to follow), subject to approval from AMSA, making a total of 109 POB. His intention is to arrive at mainland Australia within 36 hours.

Note that even with approval to the carriage of 75 PII on Triton and the removal of 110 PII on other patrol vessels, there will continue to remain PII at Ashmore for a few more days until further assets are available.

Grateful if you would advise asap your decision on this matter.

note they are obligated to do so. As indicated in your correspondence on this issue:

If the vessels are responding to a valid safety of life at sea situation where the Master has determined there is a real an immediate danger to life then the Master of the either ACV Triton or ACV Ashmore Guardian may take what ever measures are necessary to protect life, provided such actions do not endanger their vessels or those they are trying to assist.

My concerns surround the fact that where a ship is responding to a valid distress situation, the master of either ship should be clear in their mind that is in fact the case, assess the situation and then take all steps to ensure the operation can be carried out without endangering those on the ship or those being assisted.

I am quite concerned about the comment from the Master of Ashmore Guardian that they are simply embarking PII to bring them up to their maximum capacity under Ex4941 (noting the latter requires the vessel to be certified for the numbers being carried and this vessel is certified for a max POB of 25 and an increase ahs not been agreed by NT or AMSA) suggesting the master may be of the view this is "ops normal". Hence my request for clarification.

In short the Masters must be clear in their minds, and appropriately record the fact, that they are responding to a distress situation. The master of a ship can respond to a distress situation without seeking AMSA approval, and in order to protect life where there is an immediate risk this may be necessary. However, the master should keep all authorise appraised of his actions noting section 5.1.5 of MSC.Circ.167(78).

This is a salient point as it is the Masters decision and they, along with Gardline, are ultimately responsible for the safety of those on the vessels those they attempt to assist, they need to be an essential element in the communications process. In the past we have had to requested that they be bought into the communications process were they were not directly involved and the approach has solely been from BPC to AMSA.

As always I am happy to meet to ensure we have a shared understanding and continue with a collaborative approach.

As you have not been copied into the email exchange between BPC and AMSA ,and noting Gardline are the operators of the two vessels currently recovering PII from a SEIV, I want to ensure you are aware of how we view the current situation. The reason for ensuring all parties are all clear on this is that incidents such as this do recur and it is appropriate that Gardline, as operators, and the Master understand their obligations such cases. The relevant text of my response to BPC was as follows:

Noting our concerns with the arrangements and certification of these vessels, and noting neither is currently certified as being capable of safely carrying such numbers, the permitted maximum POB should only be exceeded in cases where the vessel is responding to a valid safety of life at sea situation exists as opposed to operational considerations. We note the numbers being considered are:

- a 48% increase over the maximum POB for ACV Triton
- a 92% increase over the maximum POB for ACV Ashmore Guardian

If the vessels are responding to a valid safety of life at sea situation where the Master has determined there is a real an immediate danger to life then the Master of the either ACV *Triton* or *ACV Ashmore Guardian* may take what

ever measures are necessary to protect life, provided such actions do not endanger their vessels or those they are trying to assist. In doing so the Master must ensure that:

- those who are assisted are removed to safety by the most expedient means available; and
- that the intended actions have been only where the master has satisfied themselves that such actions will not endanger the vessel, the crew and those being assisted.

As a point of process we have not raised before, but is expected, the master should record in the ships official log book that the ship is responding to a valid SOLAS situation, the circumstances and the action they take.

As discussed, DCBPC has directed that TRITON and LARRAKIA depart Ashmore Islands and commence transit southwards from Ashmore Islands when they have confirmed that they are loaded and ready for sea.

I understand that Broome is firming as the destination, however, do not have DIAC confirmation that Derby is written off.

TRITON will be undertaking the transit at her best speed (approximately 15 knots). I expect that we will need to stagger their arrival at Broome to allow the DIAC and Customs shoreside contingent to process the two boatloads in an orderly fashion. We have advised DIAC that TRITON could be in Broome, if the destination port, by approximately 0930 Broome time tomorrow. We can tactically manage the actual alongside time for TRITON and LARRAKIA over the next few hours and into tomorrow.

Could you direct LARRAKIA to commence her transit south (most likely Broome, less likely Derby) when she is ready to depart? Also please ask LARRAKIA to liaise with TRITON on how she intends to undertake the independent passage southwards. Also, ETA Broome would be good.

# **Key Points:**

- 1. At approximately 4:58pm (AEDST) on Sunday 20 March 2011, a RAAF P-3 maritime patrol aircraft, operating under the control of Border Protection Command, reported a contact of interest (COI) approx 49nm north-east of Ashmore Islands. At approximately 2:51am (AEDST) on Monday 21 March 2011, HMAS *Maitland* boarded the COI, now designated SIEV 237, approximately 13nm easy of Ashmore Islands.
- 2. Initial reporting indicates that there are 61 people onboard SIEV 237, comprising of passengers and four crew. The passengers are suspected to be of Afghan, Iranian, Iranian Pakistani nationality, and the four crew of Indonesian nationality.
- 3. On the basis of advice from DIAC, arrangements are being made to transfer the people from SIEV 237 to Australian Government authorities on the mainland for health security and other checks to determine their identity and reasons for travel.

4. High. Incidents of this nature will attract significant media scrutiny and public attention, as well as international scrutiny. The Australian Government spokesperson is the Minister for Home Affairs.

On Sat 19 March 2011, on direction from DIAC, ACV Triton carrying 111 PII from SIEVs 5.22(1)(a)(iii) 236, was diverted from transit to Christmas Island, and redirected to Broome via Ashmore Islands. Consequently, BPC will have no dedicated longhaul capability until ACV Triton disembarks passengers at Broome and is re-supplied for further duty, and HMAS Melville arrives at Ashmore Islands on Wed 23 March 2011. Assuming ACV Triton remains undiverted to Broome, Triton will be ready to recommence longhaul (sailing from Broome) AM Wed 23 March 2011.







Subject to a number of factors, but MELVILLE's ETA in Darwin could be PM Thursday through to AM Friday. BPC will be able to provide greater details tomorrow after MELVILLE departs Ashmore Islands

On the basis of advice from the Harbour Master at the Broome Port Authority and the Customs and Border Protection District Manager at Broome, the following arrangements are proposed for the arrival of ACV TRITON and HMAS LARRAKIA at Broome on the afternoon of Tuesday 22 March 2011:

- HMAS LARRAKIA enter Broome Port and proceed alongside Berths 11/12, or as directed by Harbour Master, at approximately 1500 Broome time;
- On completion of berthing and when approved by LARRAKIA, DIAC and Customs
  Border Protection staff commence transfer of the 35 people onboard LARRAKIA to the
  wharf for processing;
- By approximately 1530 and avoiding LARRAKIA berthing, ACV TRITON anchor in Broome Port, as directed by Harbour Master, and commence preparations for tender transfer;
- When advised by LARRAKIA, tenders from TRITON and LARRAKIA commence the transfer of the people of the 75 people from TRITON to LARRAKIA by tender. Request LARRAKIA provide tender support for these transfers. People then transferred from LARRAKIA to the wharf for processing.

Direct liaison is authorised between Customs and Border Protection Broome, ACV TRITON and HMAS LARRAKIA in relation to these arrangements.

DIAC will contact ACV TRITON so that DIAC medical provider can speak with TRITON nurse


