Thanks for the discussion about the skilled migration occupation lists.

Just confirming a couple of points:

- We intend to brief our Minister today regarding implementation of the prioritised skilled migration occupation lists (PSMOL) and are aiming for a mid to late July timeframe.
- Understand that your second cut of occupations for the PSMOL is **S**. 47C(1) 'll wait 'til you brief your Minister's office before we update ours). Occupations such as S. 22(1)(a)(ii), S. 47C(1) have been removed noting that these occupations will remain on existing lists but would not be prioritised for processing.
- There is turmoil in the labour market and uncertainty around government's approach to extension or not of Jobseeker and Jobkeeper in September.
- We'll advise Minister Tudge that as the labour market changes, there is some flexibility and an opportunity to undertake further analysis and adjust the PSMOL subject to advice from s. 47E(d)
- On the broader skilled migration occupation list review originally scheduled for March 2020, we have a S. 47C(1)

- there is an opportunity to refresh this list based on new data in September
- the annual review process is pushed back to Match 2021

Following the questions raised in your conversation with **s. 22(1)(a)(ii)** has had a look at the attachment ^{s. 22(1)(a)(ii)} provided and there are 16 occupations. Disability / health care didn't come up in the analysis as they appear to no longer be in demand. ^{s. 22(1)(a)(ii)} and I were speculating that this might be due to the temporary measures in place resolving the issue. There is an opportunity to revisit this in the refresh proposed to September.

On the submission itself, now we have received the list, do we include this in current submission and seek policy advice on this ^{5. 22(1)(a)(ii)}? Or send this one up and say another sub coming? Grateful for advice when we chat this afternoon.

Thank you for your correspondence of 24 July 2020 concerning recommendations for the composition of the Priority Migration Skilled Occupation List (PMSOL), the introduction of which was agreed to by Cabinet on 24 June 2020. The recommendations and analysis provided by your Department and the National Skills Commission (NSC) are appreciated.

I have noted your recommendations for the PMSOL based on available labour market information and stakeholder consultation as well as the input provided by the Department of Health. I have outlined the composition of the final PMSOL in Attachment A to this letter, as guided by your recommendations and other input from the Commonwealth.

Thank you for advising that the NSC will refresh its labour market analysis in early October 2020. I look forward to receiving any proposed recommendations for adjusting the PMSOL at that time. I agree that, when the Australian economy has entered an appropriate recovery phase from the COVID-19 pandemic, it will be appropriate for the next Skilled Migration Occupations List update to occur, subject to advice from the NSC. In the meantime, I seek your agreement to continue to refresh the labour market analysis at regular intervals and adjust the PMSOL accordingly.

I have provided a copy of this letter to the Prime Minister, the Hon Scott Morrison MP, the Treasurer, the Hon Josh Frydenberg MP, the Minister for Home Affairs, the Hon Peter Dutton MP, the Minister for Health, the Hon Greg Hunt MP and the Minister for Industry, Science, Energy and Resources, the Hon Karen Andrews MP.
