The response for question 3 is:

The planning level for Global Talent Independent (GTI) for Program Year (PY) 2019-2020 was 5,000 places. For PY 2020-21, the size and composition for the Migration Program will be considered as part of the delayed 2020-21 Budget process. This means that until the Migration Program is formally considered, the PY 2020-21 planning ceilings for total places available will be retained at the Migration Program planning levels for 2019-2020 (160,000 places).

Therefore, the planning level for GTI during this interim period, will remain at the same level as for P 2019-2020 (5,000 places).
