A total of 50 first stage Partner (subclasses 309 and 820) and Prospective Marriage (subclass 300) visa applications were refused at the visa processing office at the Australian High Commission in London between 1 January and 31 October 2020.

## 4. The average processing time for partner visa applications assessed and decided by the Australian High Commission, London for the financial year 01 June 2018 to 30 June 2019:

The Department's standard reporting methodology for processing times is percentile based. The processing time at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile for first stage Partner (subclasses 309 and 820) and Prospective Marriage (subclass 300) visa applications finalised at the visa processing office at the Australian High Commission in London in financial year 2018-19 was 13 months, indicating 75 per cent of applications were processed within that timeframe.

5. The average processing time for partner visa applications assessed and decided by the Australian High Commission, London for the financial year 01 June 2019 to 30 June 2020:

The Department's standard reporting methodology for processing times is percentile based. The processing time at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile for first stage Partner (subclasses 309 and 820) and Prospective Marriage (subclass 300) visa applications finalised at the Australian High Commission in London in financial year 2019-20 was 25 months.
