• The health situation in Al Hol has further deteriorated, with eight children dying during one week in early August, likely due to malnutrition. In late August, Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) and the Rojava Information Centre confirmed COVID-19 infection among residents of Al Hol. MSF have reported that only five healthcare clinics remained operational in Al Hol, and water supply to Al Hol continues to be disrupted, resulting in shortages and protests.

COVID-19 in AI Hol camp

- An outbreak of COVID-19 in AI Hol is inevitable, given overcrowding, existing health issues, and limited PPE. Several cases of COVID-19 have now been reported among AI Hol residents s. 47E(d)
- Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) and the Rojava Information Centre confirmed COVID-19 infection among residents of AI Hol on 27 and 28 August respectively. MSF have reported that only five healthcare clinics remained operational in AI Hol, and water supply to AI Hol continues to be disrupted, resulting in shortages and protests.
