COVID-19 arrangements

Given Australia's border measures, it may be difficult for BVB holders to depart and return to Australia within the timeframe of their travel facility. And it is not guaranteed that a BVB holder will be granted an exemption to Australia's border restrictions in order to re-enter Australia, as requests for an exemption are assessed on a case by case basis, as per the criteria outlined on the <u>Departmental</u> <u>website</u>. Therefore, to mitigate the risk of a BVB holder's visa ceasing while they are still outside Australia, case officers should give consideration to providing those who meet the criteria for grant with a 12 month travel facility.

Bridging B visa applications (BVB) - novel coronavirus

BVB applications can continue to be processed, assessed and decided as per the existing legislation and policy guidelines.

Each application is to be assessed on a case-by-case basis, with the decision maker taking into consideration the circumstances of the applicant and the purpose of the intended travel.

If the applicant has a substantial reason for wishing to travel to an area affected by the coronavirus travel restrictions:

- The location of the proposed travel is not sufficient in itself to refuse the BVB application on the basis of Schedule 2 clause 020.213.
- The applicant can be counselled about the travel restrictions and border control
 measures and advised that if they seek to return to Australia after travelling to, or
 transiting through, mainland China, they may be denied re-entry to Australia and
 their visa may be cancelled.
- If the BVB is granted, consideration should be given to issuing the BVB with a 12 month travel facility period. This would avoid the BVB inadvertently ceasing if the person is prevented from returning to Australia before their travel facility period expires.
