The applicant is a genuine applicant for entry and stay as a student because:

- (a) the applicant intends genuinely to stay in Australia temporarily, having regard to:
 - (i) the applicant's circumstances; and
 - (ii) the applicant's immigration history; and
 - (iii) if the applicant is a minor—the intentions of a parent, legal guardian or spouse of the applicant; and
 - (iv) any other relevant matter; and
- (b) the applicant intends to comply with any conditions subject to which the visa is granted, having regard to:
 - (i) the applicant's record of compliance with any condition of a visa previously held by the applicant (if any); and
 - (ii) the applicant's stated intention to comply with any conditions to which the visa may be subject; and
- (c) of any other relevant matter.
