Australia has strict border measures in place to protect the health of the Australian community. Visa holders cannot travel to Australia unless they are in an exempt category or have been granted an individual exemption to the current travel restrictions. Even with an exemption, there are very limited

individual exemption to the current travel restrictions. Even with an exemption, there are very limited flights currently available and visa holders may not be able to travel at this time. Visa holders may also delay their travel or not travel at all because of illness, pregnancy and other lifeo events, the time taken to obtain exit permission, inability to obtain exit permission, change of circumstances, change of conditions in their home or host country, or change of mind. Applicants granted a visa in one program year might not travel in the same program year they are granted.
