Travel Exemptions – request for information response

Question:

I respectfully request under FOI the following information from the period of 25 March 2020 until the date of this request (25 April 2021):

(1) Data regarding the number of travellers determined to be exempt from outward travel restrictions and not required to apply for an individual exemption. To the extent this data can be disaggregated, I respectfully request that it be disaggregated by the categories of traveller exempt from travel restrictions outlined in paragraph 2 of the 'Outward Travel Restrictions Operation Directive' v7.

(2) Data regarding the number of travellers who have applied for an individual exemption to the outward travel restrictions. To the extent this data can be disaggregated, I respectfully request that it be disaggregated by the general basis for the exemption request (or by another similar categorisation adopted by DHA), as well as by the country of intended travel.

(3) Data regarding the number of travellers who have been approved for an individual exemption to the outward travel restrictions. To the extent this data can be disaggregated, I respectfully request that it be disaggregated by the general basis for the exemption request (or by another similar categorisation adopted by DHA), as well as by the country of intended travel.

Response:

(1) - Outbound travel exemption requests assessed by the Australian Border Force (ABF) travel exemptions processing team as not requiring an individual exemption to depart because they met an automatically exempt category: 1 August 2020 to 25 April 2021.

- ii. Travellers who self-assess that they meet an automatically exempt category are not required to submit a travel exemption request to the ABF travel exemptions processing team ahead of departure. The data therefore excludes:
 - a. travellers who were automatically exempt from travel restrictions and did not submit a travel exemption request prior to departure.
 - b. Individuals travelling directly to New Zealand and who were only in Australia or New Zealand for the 14 days immediately before the travel date. These travellers can only be assessed as exempt from Australia's travel restrictions at the time of departure.
- iii. Processing of travel exemption requests moved to the Travel Exemptions Portal on 1 August 2020. The data above cannot be disaggregated prior to this date.
- *iv.* * *includes a small number of individuals found to be engaged in the day to day conduct of outbound and inbound freight.*
