



Travel Exemptions – request for information response

Question:

FOI request FA 21/07/00776 received on 12 July 2021 seeking:

- 1) The number of Inbound Travel Exemptions given to Prospective Marriage Visa (subclass 300) holders from 22/03/2020 till 01/07/2021

- 2) The number of Travel Exemption rejections given to Prospective Marriage Visa (subclass 300) holders from 22/03/2020 till 01/07/2021

 3) The number of approved Prospect Marriage Visa (subclass 300) holders as of 01/07/2021

 4) The number of Prospective Marriage Visa's (subclass 300) that received an extension of validity to 31/03/2022

 Answer:

 1. Between 22 March 2020 and 1 July 2021, 263 inwards requests* for a travel exemption were approved where the person declared they had applied for or held a subclass 300 (Prospective Marriage) visa**. Of this figure:

 234 requests were assessed as automatically exempt under the category Immediate Family member of an Australian citizen or permanent resident

 - 29 exemptions were approved by a decision maker on Compassionate and compelling grounds or due to critical skills.
 - 2. Between 22 March 2020 and 1 July 2021, 1,944 inwards requests for a travel exemption were refused where the person declared they had applied for or held a subclass 300 (Prospective Marriage) visa.

Notes

- Data excludes otherwise finalised (withdrawn requests, or requests that did not contain sufficient information for referral to a decision maker)
- ii. * An individual may submit more than one request
- ** Based on client declarations. It is not possible to accurately disaggregate visa holders from visa applicants in travel exemption data.

3) The number of approved Prospect Marriage Visa (subclass 300) holders as of 01/07/2021

There were 1,900 Prospective Marriage (subclass 300) visas granted between 01/03/2021 to 01/07/2021 as the table below refers.

4) The number of Prospective Marriage Visa's (subclass 300) that received an extension of validity to 31/03/2022

While there is no systems based reporting available for this data, a manual count of visa holders eligible to be provided with an extension of validity to 31 March 2022, on 10 December 2020, was 230 subclass 300 Prospective Marriage visa holders.
