• From 13 Jan 2022, all work restrictions were removed for all student visa holders. Allowing work before course commencement and no restrictions on hours worked during course session. Student visa work restrictions were relaxed throughout the pandemic, and completely removed in Jan 2022. This ended on 30 June 2023.

• From 9 May 2023, the government announced that student visa holders already working in the aged care sector on 9 May 2023 could continue to work unrestricted hours in the aged care sector until 31 December 2023.
