Important – Please read this information carefully before you complete your application. Once you have completed your application we strongly advise that you keep a copy for your records.

## Who can use this form?

Form 852 is an application for a Confirmatory (Residence) visa (subclass 808). This visa is a permanent visa to be granted to persons who have entered Australia on a 'conditional' basis, ie. persons who are eligible for a permanent visa subject to their satisfying criteria which they were unable to satisfy before entry. To be eligible for this visa, you:

- must hold a Resident Return (Temporary) visa (subclass 159) because you applied outside Australia for a Return (Residence) visa and were unable to prove your claim to be a former Australian permanent resident; or
- must hold an Emergency (Temporary) visa (subclass 302) because you were able to satisfy all the criteria for a permanent visa overseas except health and/or character criteria; or
- must hold Border (Temporary) visa (subclass 773) and can now satisfy the decision-maker that you would have been eligible for a Return (Residence) visa when the Border (Temporary) visa was granted; or
- must be a former holder of a Norfolk Island Immigration permit, or a dependent child of such a person.

## Health requirements for applicants for a Confirmatory (Residence) visa who were former holders of Norfolk Island Immigration permits

If you are applying for a Confirmatory (Residence) visa as a former holder of a Norfolk Island Immigration permit, or a dependent child of such a person, you must be assessed against the health requirement.

**Note:** You may have already undertaken a health assessment for your visa. However, the Department reserves the right to request additional health examinations as part of this visa application process.

## Including family members in your application

In your visa application you will be asked for information about each member of your family unit (such as your partner or children) even if they do not intend to travel or migrate with you. Information about which family members are considered to be a 'member of your family unit' for travel and migration purposes is available by referring to form 1496i *Including family members in your application*. Form 1496i is available from the Department's website [www.homeaffairs.gov.au/allforms/](http://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/allforms/) or offices of the Department. You should ensure that you read and understand form 1496i before completing this form.

If you are applying for a Confirmatory (Residence) visa as a former holder of a Norfolk Island Immigration permit, or a dependent child of such a person, you can include on this form any members of your family unit who are in or outside Australia, and intend to apply for this visa.

## How to apply

A completed and signed form should be sent or delivered to the nearest office of the Department.

## Visa Application Charge

A Visa Application Charge (VAC) may be required for this visa.

You must only pay a VAC if:

- you were granted a Border (subclass 773) visa on last arriving in Australia; or
- you are applying as a former holder of a Norfolk Island Immigration permit, or a dependent child of such a person.

Evidence of payment of the required VAC (if any) must accompany your application and is generally not refunded if the application is unsuccessful.

Fees may be subject to adjustment at any time. VAC's may be subject to adjustment on 1 July each year. This may increase the cost of a visa.

## Method of payment

Make your payment electronically through the 'My Payments' section of ImmiAccount. Sign into, or create, your ImmiAccount and select My Payments>Manage Payments>Pre-Pay Paper Service, at [www.homeaffairs.gov.au/immiaccount](http://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/immiaccount)

Lodge your application **within 30 days** of making your payment online.

## Residential address

You must provide the address where you intend to live while your application is being dealt with. Failure to give a residential address in your application will result in your application being invalid. A post office box address will not be accepted as your residential address.

## Integrity of application

The Department is committed to maintaining the integrity of the visa and citizenship programs. In relation to this application, if you or a member of your family unit:

- provide, or have provided in a previous application, fraudulent documents or false or misleading information (knowingly or not); and/or
- fail to satisfy, or have failed to satisfy in a previous application, the Minister for Home Affairs and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection of your or their identity;

this visa application may be refused and you, and any members of your family unit, may become unable to be granted a visa for specified periods of time, as set out in migration legislation.

If documents are found to be fraudulent or information to be incorrect after the grant of a visa, the visa may subsequently be cancelled.

## Important information about privacy

Your personal information is protected by law, including the *Privacy Act 1988*. Important information about the collection, use and disclosure (to other agencies and third parties, including overseas entities) of your personal information, including sensitive information, is contained in form 1442i *Privacy notice*. Form 1442i is available from the Department's website [www.homeaffairs.gov.au/allforms/](http://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/allforms/) or offices of the Department. You should ensure that you read and understand form 1442i before completing this form.

## Immigration assistance

A person gives immigration assistance to you if he or she uses, or claims to use, his or her knowledge or experience in migration procedure to assist you with your visa application, request for ministerial intervention, cancellation review application, sponsorship or nomination.

In Australia a person may only lawfully give immigration assistance if he or she is a registered migration agent or is exempt from being registered. Only registered migration agents may receive a fee or reward for providing immigration assistance.

If an unregistered person in Australia, who is not exempt from registration, gives you immigration assistance they are committing a criminal offence and may be prosecuted.

## Migration agents in Australia

Migration agents in Australia must be registered with the Office of the Migration Agents Registration Authority (Office of the MARA) unless they are exempt from registration.

## Migration agents outside Australia

Migration agents who operate outside Australia do not have to be registered. The Department may give some overseas agents an ID number. This number does not mean that they are registered.

**Note:** Some Australian registered migration agents operate overseas.

## Migration agent information

A migration agent is someone who can:

- advise you on the visa that may best suit you;
- tell you the documents you need to submit with your application;
- help you fill in the application and submit it; and
- communicate with the Department on your behalf.

If you appoint a migration agent, the Department will assume that your migration agent will be your authorised recipient, unless you indicate otherwise.

Your migration agent will be the person with whom the Department will discuss your application and from whom it will seek further information when required.

You are not required to use a migration agent. However, if you use a migration agent, the Department encourages you to use a registered migration agent. Registered agents are bound by the Migration Agents Code of Conduct, which requires them to act professionally in their clients' lawful best interests.

## Exempt persons

The following people do not have to be a registered migration agent in order to provide immigration assistance, but they must not charge a fee for their service:

- a close family member (spouse, de facto partner, child, parent, brother or sister);
- a member of parliament or their staff;
- an official whose duties include providing immigration assistance (eg. a Legal Aid provider);
- a member of a diplomatic mission, consular post or international organisation.

## Appointing a migration agent/exempt person

To appoint a migration agent/exempt person you should complete *Part J – Options for receiving written communications*.

Your migration agent/exempt person should complete form 956 *Advice by a migration agent/exempt person of providing immigration assistance*.

## Options for receiving written communications

If you do not appoint a migration agent/exempt person you may still authorise another person, in writing, to receive written communications on your behalf. This person is called the authorised recipient.

### Authorised recipient information

All written communication about your application will be sent to your authorised recipient, unless you indicate that you wish to have health and/or character information sent directly to you.

The Department will communicate with the most recently appointed authorised recipient as you may only appoint one authorised recipient at any time for a particular application.

You will be taken to have received any documents sent to that person as if they had been sent to you.

To appoint an authorised recipient you should complete:

- *Part J – Options for receiving written communications*; and
- form 956A *Appointment or withdrawal of an authorised recipient*.

**Note:** Migration agents/exempt persons do not need to complete form 956A.

## Consent to communicate electronically

The Department may use a range of means to communicate with you. However, electronic means such as fax or email will only be used if you indicate your agreement to receiving communication in this way.

To process your application the Department may need to communicate with you about sensitive information, for example, health, police checks, financial viability and personal relationships. Electronic communications, unless adequately encrypted, are not secure and may be viewed by others or interfered with.

If you agree to the Department communicating with you by electronic means, the details you provide will only be used by the Department for the purpose for which you have provided them, unless there is a legal obligation or necessity to use them for another purpose, or you have consented to use for another purpose. They will not be added to any mailing list.

The Australian Government accepts no responsibility for the security or integrity of any information sent to the Department over the internet or by other electronic means.

If you authorise another person to receive documents on your behalf and they wish to be contacted electronically, their signature is required on form 956 or 956A to indicate their consent to this form of communication.

**Note:** Electronic communication is the fastest means of communication available and the Department prefers to communicate electronically because this results in faster processing.
