- b) Engines or spare parts that are unavailable in Australia and are urgently required for ships or aircraft, or for other machinery that serves a public purpose; or
- c) Perishable food.

- a) Give the Department of Immigration and Border Protection a return, within 7 days of the delivery of the goods into home consumption, providing particulars in accordance with section 71K or 71L in relation to the goods; and
- b) At the time when the return is given to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection, pay any duty and GST owing at the rate applicable when the goods were delivered into home consumption; and
- c) Comply with any condition to which the permission is subject.

Other conditions:

Goods subject to a permission under section 70 must also be cleared by the Department of Agriculture and/or meet any Biosecurity requirements or conditions.
