National Action Plan to Combat Modern Slavery 2020-24

Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand supports the Australian Government's National Action Plan to Combat Modern Slavery 2020-24 ("the National Action Plan") and we welcome the opportunity to provide a submission to the Public Consultation Paper. The Appendix provides more information about Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ).

Feedback on proposed goals

We support the 12 proposed goals of the National Action Plan. However, with respect to goal 9, there are already mandatory reporting requirements under the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth Act) and also under the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (NSW Act). This dual layer of regulation has caused confusion in the business community, and the latter is currently being reviewed by the Standing Committee on Social Issues.

We recommend that proposed goal 12 'work collaboratively across government, along with nongovernment stakeholders, to combat modern slavery' is expanded to include collaboration with the states and territories, potentially via the Council of Australian Governments (COAG). We consider active engagement and collaboration between the Commonwealth and the states and territories is critical in order for the National Action Plan to be successful.

Further, we strongly support the independent Anti-Slavery Commissioner (the Commissioner) introduced under the NSW Act. The Commissioner plays an important role in promoting transparency and accountability for combating modern slavery risks in supply chains by supporting and educating businesses as well as raising awareness amongst the community and supporting victims.

The Commissioner has a number of tasks including to monitor reporting concerning risks of modern slavery occurring in supply chains of government agencies and commercial organisations and to raise community awareness of modern slavery.¹ To support proposed goal 2 *Engage the Australian community to understand and combat modern slavery* and goal 9 *Promote transparency and accountability for combating modern slavery risks in global supply chains, including in Government procurement*, we suggest the Government encourages similar state-based support systems (the role of the Commissioner under the NSW Act could be replicated in each state).
