on JOINT COMMITTEE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT REPORT [No. 497] Inquiry into the Commonwealth Financial Statements 2021-22

General comments

The Department of Home Affairs welcomes the opportunity to respond to Report No. 497 of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts and Audit 'Inquiry into the Commonwealth Financial Statements 2021-22' (the Report).

Response to the recommendation

Recommendation No. 5 paragraph 2.118

The Committee recommends that in light of the constant optimism biases which disguise the true situation in relation to public sector cyber-security the Government consider implementing an assurance regime on agencies' self-reporting to government on the cybersecurity aspects of the Protective Security Policy Framework, at least on a risk basis if not across all entities, and adopt appropriate assurance measures as recommended by the Australian National Audit Office.

Recommendation is supported.

The Department will implement an assurance mechanism to assess the self-reported cyber and protective security maturity of non-corporate Commonwealth entities to acquit recommendation 5, in consultation with the Government Security Committee.

The Department will commence this function following the 2024-25 Protective Security Policy Framework reporting period. Delivery will be subject to recruitment of appropriate skilled staff and consultation with all non-corporate Commonwealth entities.
