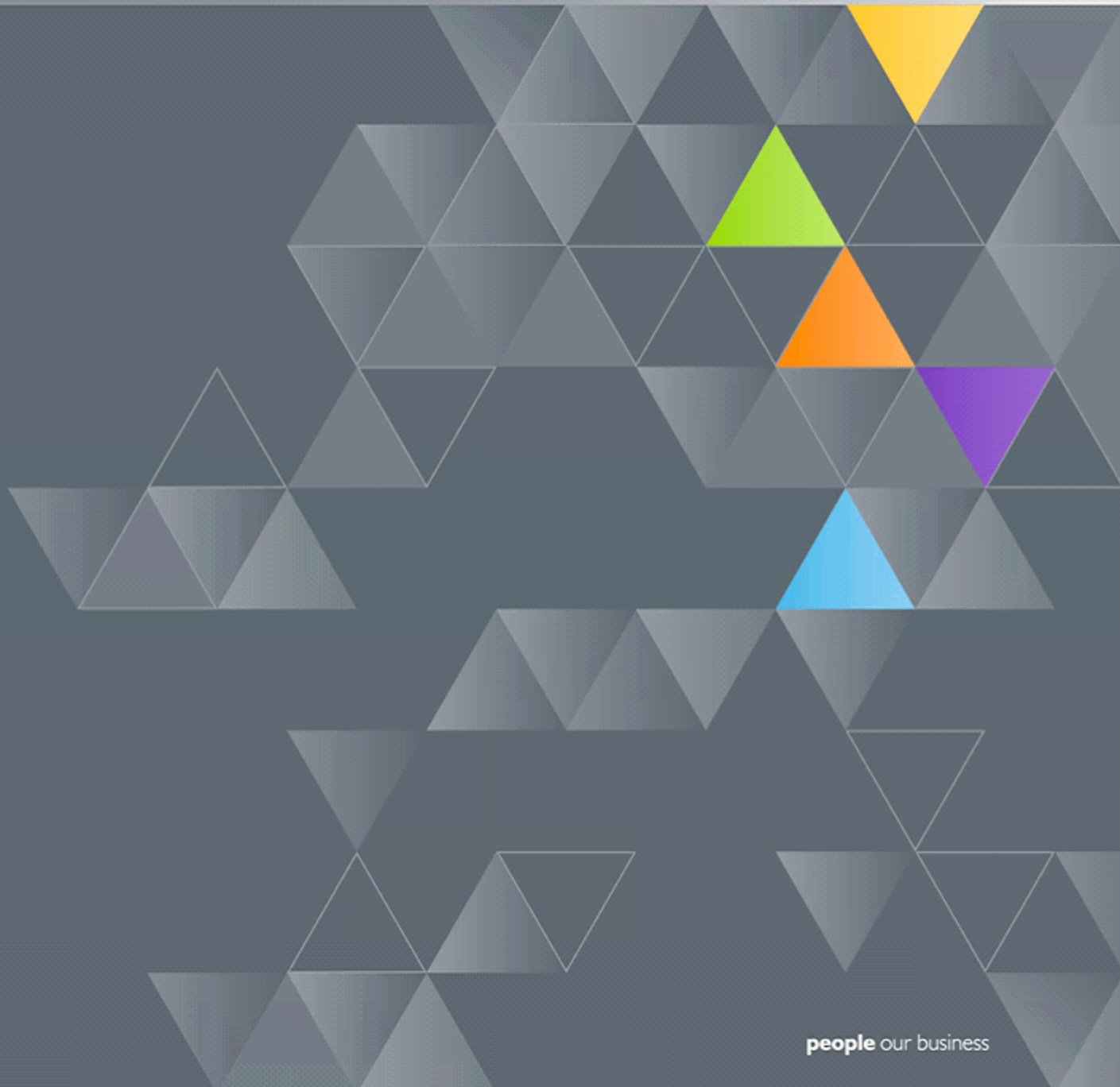

Subclass 457 quarterly report

quarter ending at 30 June 2014



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Explanatory notes:

- Note 1** All numbers have been rounded to the nearest 10 and salaries to the nearest \$100. Therefore the sum of individual items in a table may not exactly match the total. Where a number in a table is between 1 and 4, the number has been masked with < 5 for privacy reasons.
- Note 2** This report is based on visa grant data recorded for visa subclass 457 in the current financial year and provides a comparison with the SAME PERIOD IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR. It excludes a small number of visa grants made to Independent Executives, who also used to enter on subclass 457 visa but are now included in the Business Skills categories.
- Note 3** The principal data collected on 457 visa holders comes from the visa application and grant process. The applicant and their sponsor provide a range of information to enable DIBP to assess the eligibility of the sponsor and the applicant for the visa. This is the most accurate and verifiable data that DIBP collects on 457 visa holders. It includes such information as the location of the nominated position, the nominated occupation, the nominated base salary and the citizenship country.
- Note 4** Unless otherwise stated, the tables in this report relate to primary applicants only.
- Note 5** Unless otherwise stated, the occupation shown in tables in this report is the nominated occupation. That is, the position that is being filled rather than the previous or usual occupation of the visa applicant.
- Note 6** Sponsors self-identify with an industry classification when lodging a nomination or sponsorship. The industry classification shown is based on what the sponsor has recorded. If a sponsor has notified more than one industry over time, the most recently recorded industry classification has been used in this report.
- Note 7** Up until 1 April 2005, medical practitioners applied for a visa in Visa Subclass 422 Medical Practitioner. From that date, medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a Subclass 457 visa.
- Note 8** In tables showing the top 15 citizenship countries, the figure for 'Unknown' is included in the total only.
- Note 9** In some tables, 'Not recorded' or 'Not specified' appears. This mainly relates to visa applications processed in the IRIS system. IRIS does not have the capacity to record comprehensive information about sponsors and nominations. Since 1 November 2003, the ICSE system has largely replaced IRIS for processing subclass 457 visas, but a small number of visas are still processed in IRIS.
- Note 10** From 14 September 2009, subclass 457 visa holders changing sponsor or nominated occupation do not need to lodge a new visa application if they held a valid subclass 457 visa. DIBP estimates that the number of visa applications lodged since 14 September 2009 has been reduced by 8 to 9 per cent below the level that would have occurred without the change.

Definition of Terms:

ANZSCO Major Group:	Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
ANZSIC:	Australian and New Zealand Standard Industry Classification 2006 Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). Prior to November 2008, ANZSIC 1993 was used to record industry. Data recorded using ANZSIC 1993 has been converted to ANZSIC 2006 using concordance tables provided by the ABS.
Applicant Type:	<p>Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are defined below.</p> <p>If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary applications' or 'primary visa holders', dependants (secondary applicants) are not included.</p>
Independent Executive:	Formerly, a group within subclass 457 who did not require a sponsor. They are now included in the Business Skills categories. A small number of visa applications for Independent Executives were finalised in the current year.
Last Visa Held:	This refers to the last substantive visa held by a visa holder (that is, the last visa other than a bridging visa) prior to a point in time. The last visa held may have expired or still be in effect.
Nominated Base Salary:	Represents the gross annual salary based on a 38 hour week that the employer has indicated they will pay to the primary visa holder. These amounts do not include the value of salary packaged items, bonuses, commissions or other payments listed in the schedule to the legislative instrument specifying Minimum Salary Levels for the Subclass 457 program.
Nominated Occupation:	The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in Australia while holding the Subclass 457 visa based on the Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.
Nominated Position Location:	The State or Territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.
Nominated Total Remuneration:	The total value of the salary package including base salary, allowances, bonuses and superannuation.
Pathway:	A visa holder moving from one type of visa to another type of visa. Most commonly used in relation to visa applicants moving from a temporary visa to a permanent/provisional visa. The original visa is determined by the last visa held prior to permanent/provisional visa grant and the visa applicant may be onshore or offshore.
Permanent/provisional visa:	A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the migration program.
Primary Applicant:	The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Migration Regulations.
Primary Application:	An application lodged by a primary applicant.
Secondary Applicant:	Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the primary applicant.
Secondary Application:	A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.
Sponsor Industry:	The industry self-identified by the sponsoring client using the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industry Classification (ANZSIC) 2006 edition.

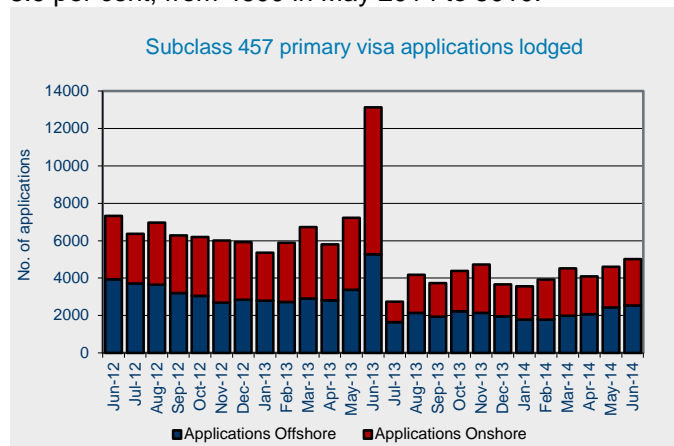
Trends in the subclass 457 Temporary Work (Skilled) visa programme in the 2013-14 programme year¹ to 30 June 2014

Key points

- The number of subclass 457 primary visa applications lodged in the 2013-14 programme year was 39.9 per cent lower than the previous programme year.
- The number of onshore primary visa lodgements in the 2013-14 programme year decreased 42.9 per cent compared with the previous programme year.
- The number of subclass 457 primary visas granted in the 2013-14 programme year was 24.2 per cent lower than in the 2012-13 programme year.
- The number of primary visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2014 was 0.8 per cent higher compared with the previous programme year.

Visa application trends

The number of subclass 457 primary visa applications lodged in 2013-14 was 49 150, a decrease of 39.9 per cent compared with 2012-13. Monthly primary visa lodgements for 2013-14 have been relatively stable averaging just over 4000 per month, down from 2012-13 average of approximately 6250 per month. In June 2014, the number of primary applications lodged rose 8.9 per cent, from 4600 in May 2014 to 5010.



In the 2013-14 programme year the number of primary applications lodged offshore was 24 680, a decrease of 36.7 per cent compared to the previous programme year, which was 38 970. The number of primary applications lodged offshore for June 2014 was 2530, 3.5 per cent higher compared to May 2014, which was 2440.

The number of primary applications lodged onshore in the 2013-14 programme year was 24 460, which was 42.9 per cent lower compared to the previous programme year, which was 42 830. Primary applications lodged onshore for June 2014 was 2480, 15.1 per cent higher compared to May 2014, which was 2160.

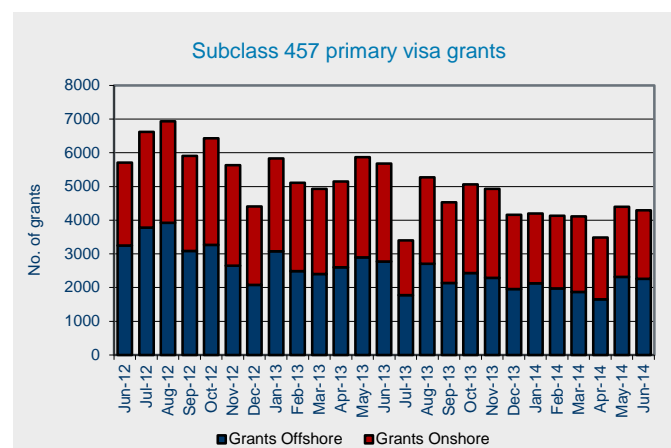
The number of Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO)² Major Group 3 (Technicians and Trades Workers) primary applications

lodged in the 2013-14 programme year was 11 950, 47.7 per cent lower compared with the previous programme year, which was 22 860.

During the 2013-14 programme year the number of ANZSCO Major Group 1 (Managers) primary applications lodged was 9720, 41.4 per cent lower compared to the previous programme year, which was 16 570. The number of ANZSCO Major Group 2 (Professionals) primary applications lodged was 24 810, a decrease of 30.2 per cent compared with the previous programme year, which was 35 560.

Visa grant trends³

The number of subclass 457 primary visas granted in 2013-14 was 51 940, 24.2 per cent lower compared to the previous programme year, which was 68 480. Consistent with a general downward trend in visa grants since the peak in August 2012, the number of primary visas granted in June 2014 was 4290, 2.5 per cent lower than May 2014, which was 4400.



In the 2013-14 programme year, offshore primary visa grants were 25 510, 27.2 per cent lower compared with the previous programme year, which was 35 040. The number of offshore primary visas granted in June 2014 was 2260, a decrease of 2.5 per cent compared with May 2014, which was 2320.

In the 2013-14 programme year, onshore primary visa grants were 26 430, a decrease of 21.0 per cent compared with the previous programme year, which was 33 440. The number of onshore primary visas granted in June 2014 was 2030, a decrease of 2.4 per cent compared with May 2014, which was 2080.

In the 2013-14 programme year, Managers and Professionals accounted for 69.0 per cent of total visa grants (recording 10 420 and 25 420 visa grants, respectively). Technician and Trades Workers was the next highest with 13 210 visa grants, which was 25.4 per cent of total grants.

In the 2013-14 programme year the largest nominated position location for primary 457 visa grants was New South Wales (37.9 per cent). The next largest locations were Victoria (23.6 per cent) and Western Australia (16.6 per cent). These states were also the top three nominated position locations for primary subclass 457 visa grants in the previous programme year.

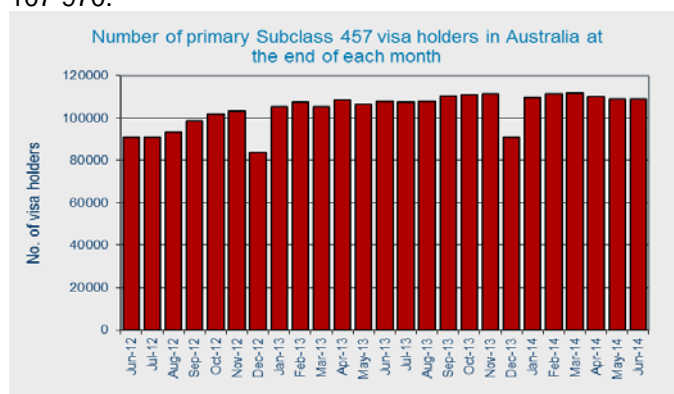
The top three industries for primary visa grants in the 2013-14 programme year were Other Services (13.9 per cent), Accommodation and Food Services (12.1 per cent) and Information Media and Telecommunications (11.2 per cent).

Primary subclass 457 visa grants to Cooks represented 5.2 per cent of total primary grants in the 2013-14 programme year, compared to 4.4 per cent for the previous programme year. Cooks were the largest occupation for primary visa grants in the 2013-14 programme year. Café or Restaurant Manager recorded the second largest primary visa grants at 4.0 per cent of total primary visa grants. They were followed by Developer Programmer at 3.7 per cent of total primary visa grants.

The top three citizenship countries for primary visa grants in the 2013-14 programme year were India (23.3 per cent), the United Kingdom (18.3 per cent) and the Republic of Ireland (7.2 per cent).

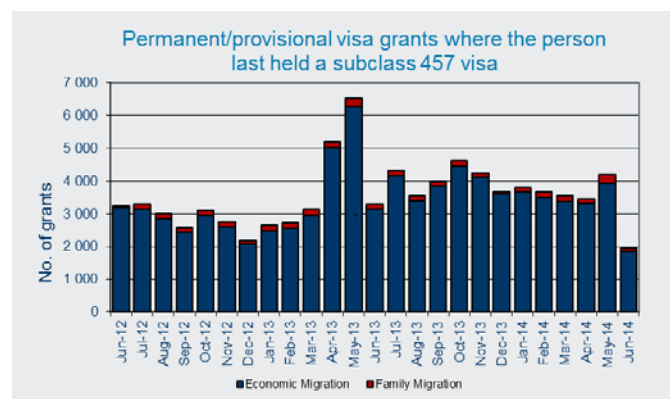
Number of primary subclass 457 visa holders in Australia

The number of primary visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2014 was 108 870, 0.8 per cent higher compared with the previous programme year, which was 107 970.



Flow of subclass 457 visa holders to permanent residence

In the 2013-14 programme year, the number of subclass 457 visa holders who were granted a permanent residence/provisional visa was 44 990, an increase of 11.7 per cent compared with the previous programme year, which was 40 270.



The number of subclass 457 visa holders who were granted a permanent residence/provisional visa in June 2014 was 1950, 53.5 per cent lower compared with May 2014 (which was 4200). The low number of subclass 457 visa holders who were granted a permanent residence/provisional visa in June 2014 (1950) reflected a small decrease in the processing of skill stream visas.

The vast majority (96.0 per cent) of permanent visa grants to subclass 457 visa holders in the 2013-14 programme year were in the skill stream, with the remaining 4.0 per cent of permanent visa grants in the family stream.

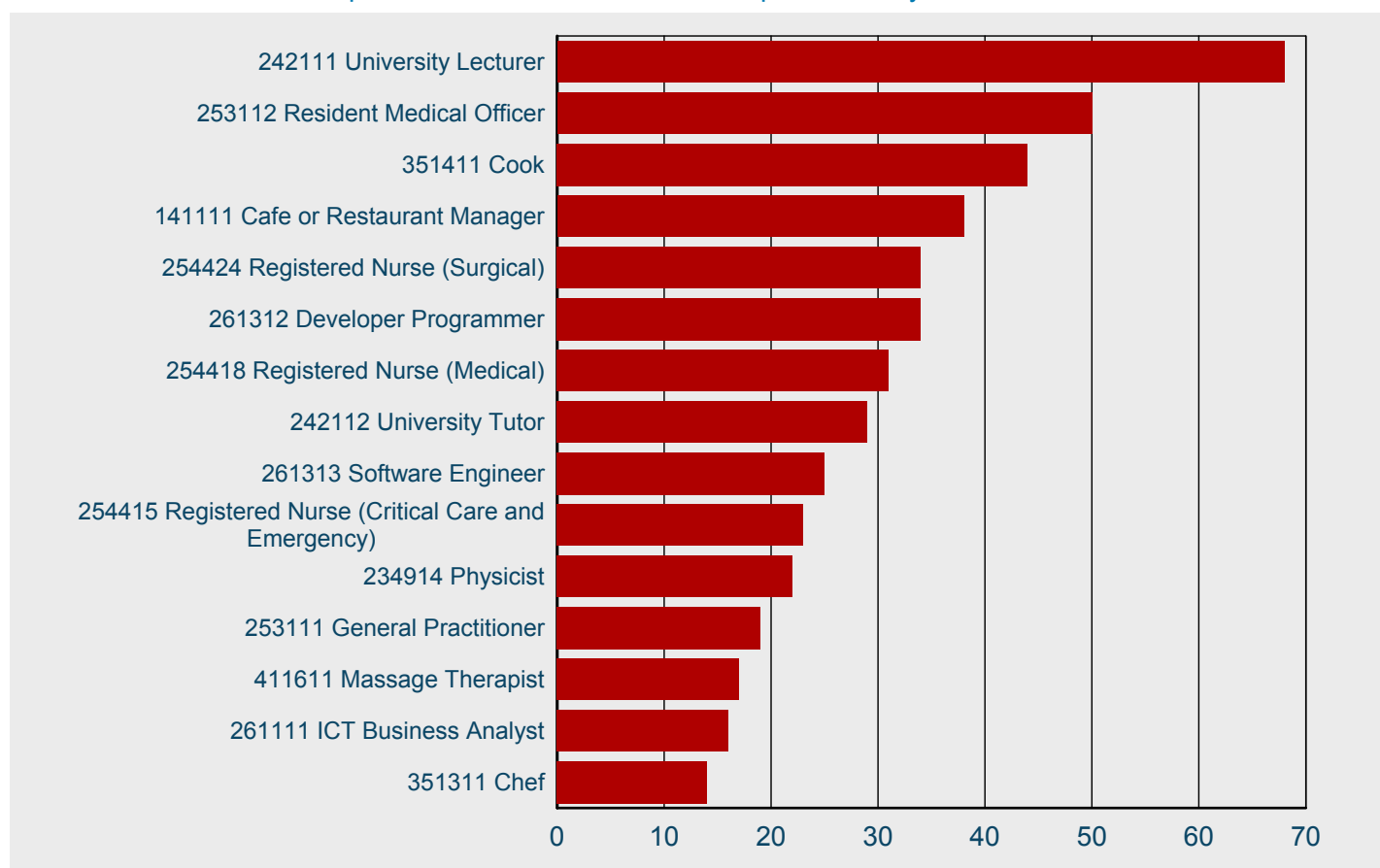

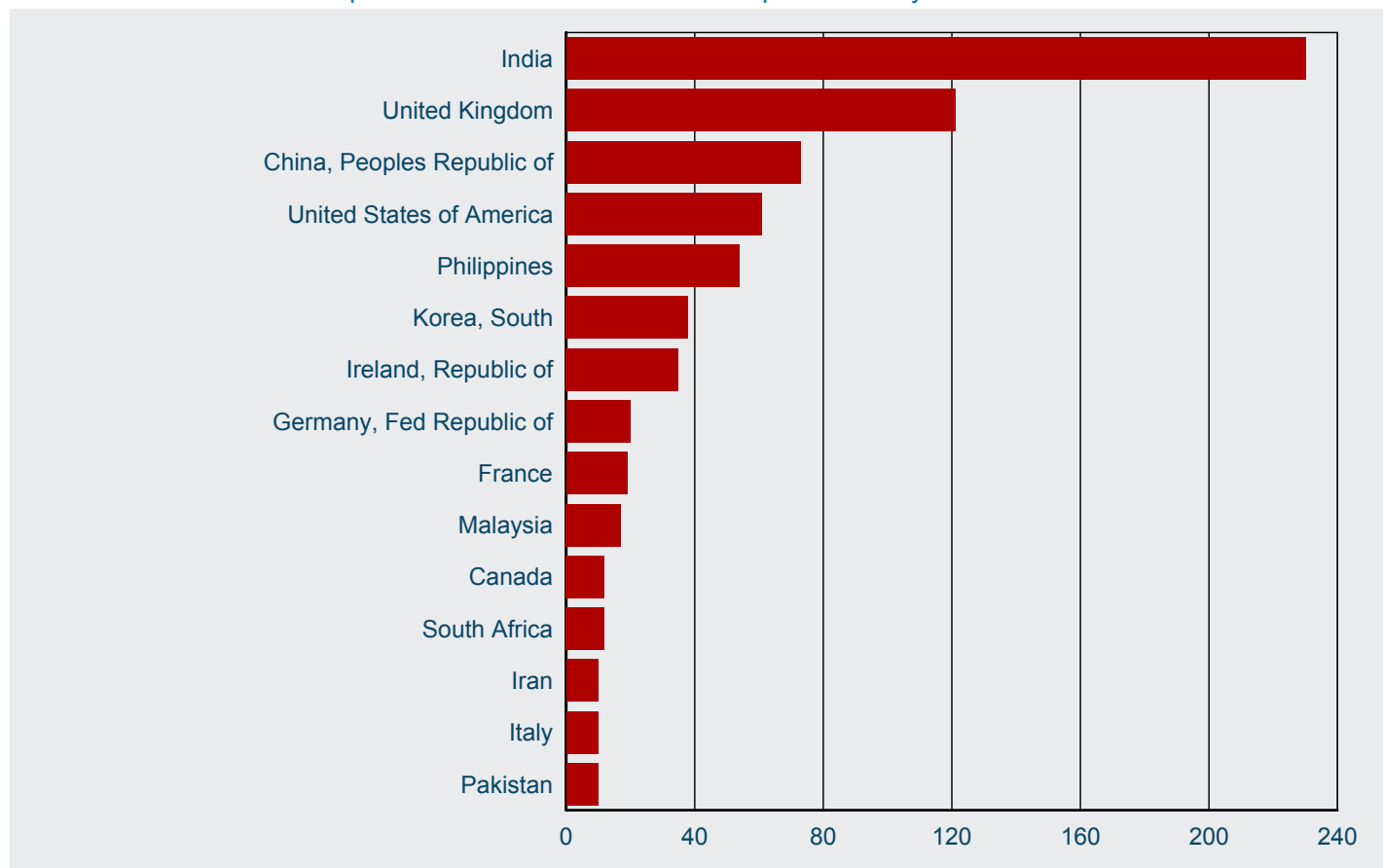

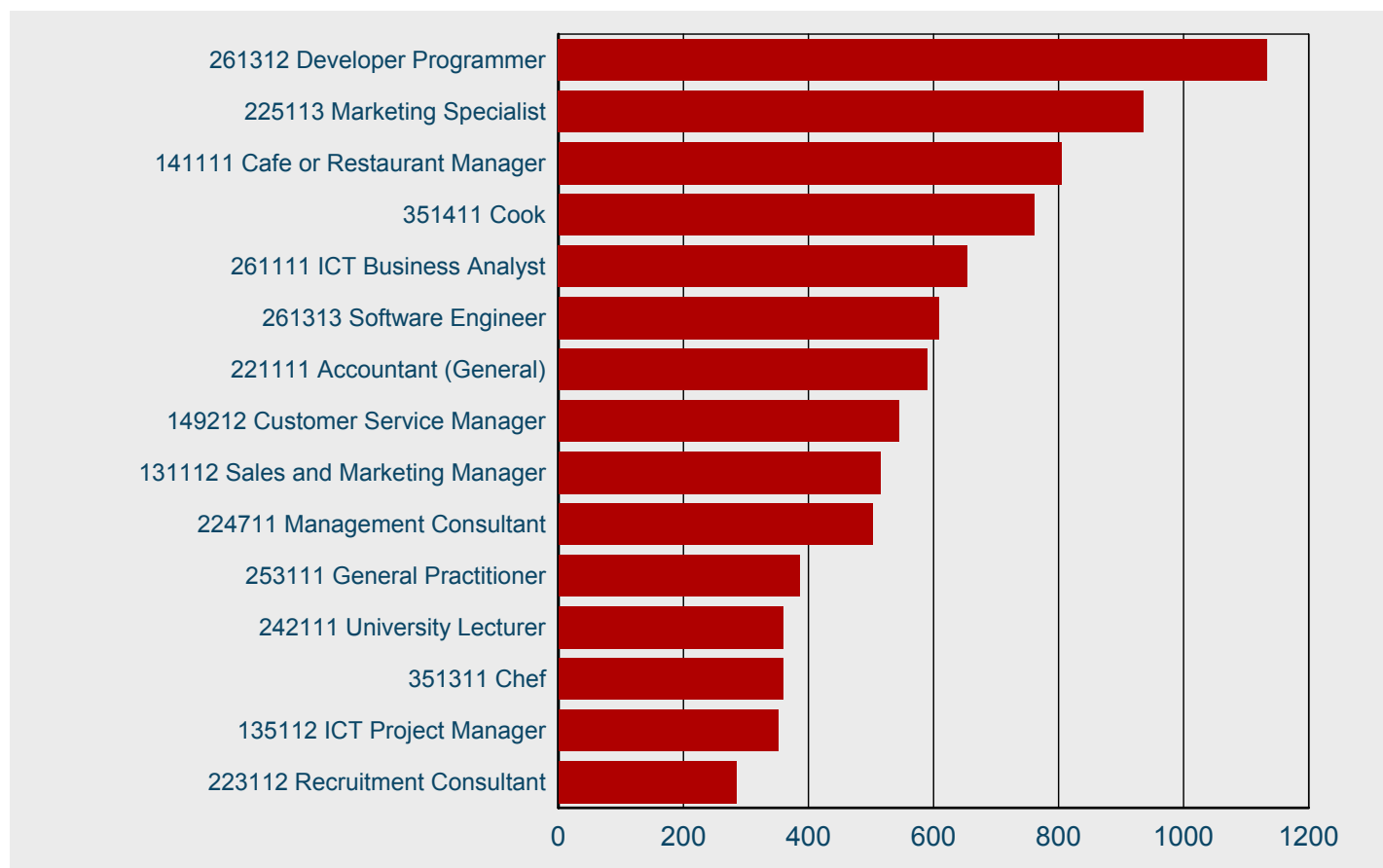

Graph 3.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in New South Wales

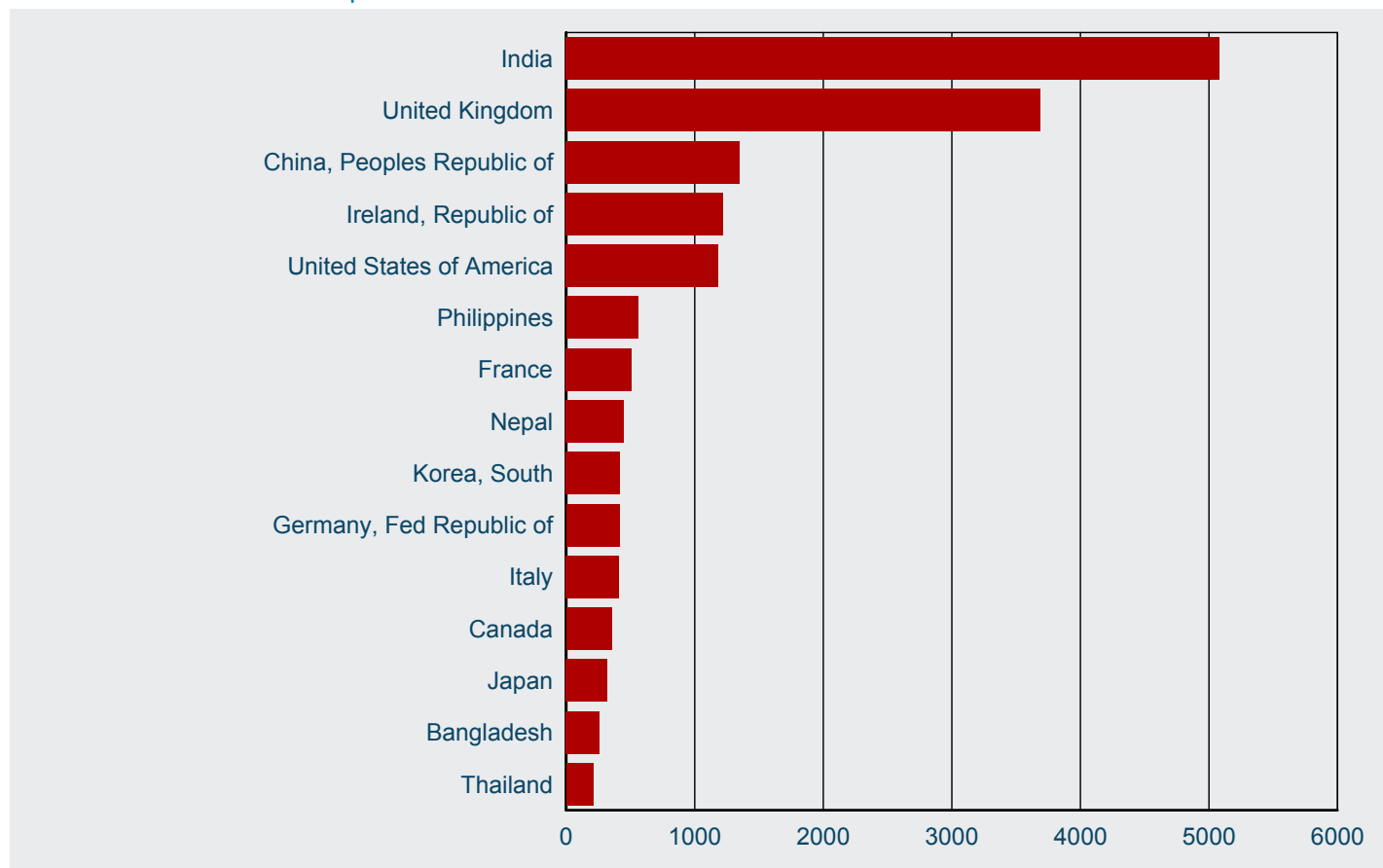

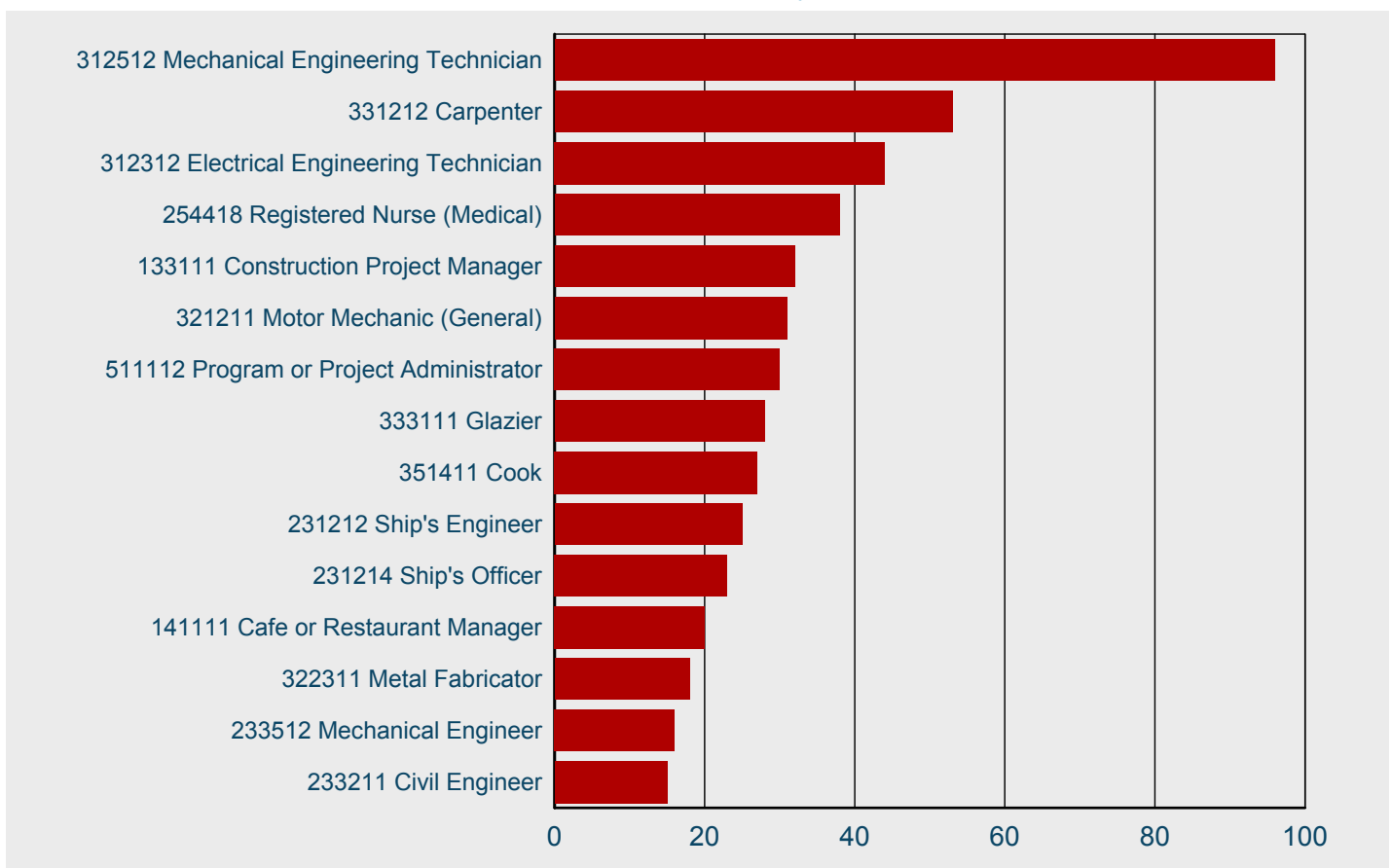

Graph 4.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in Northern Territory

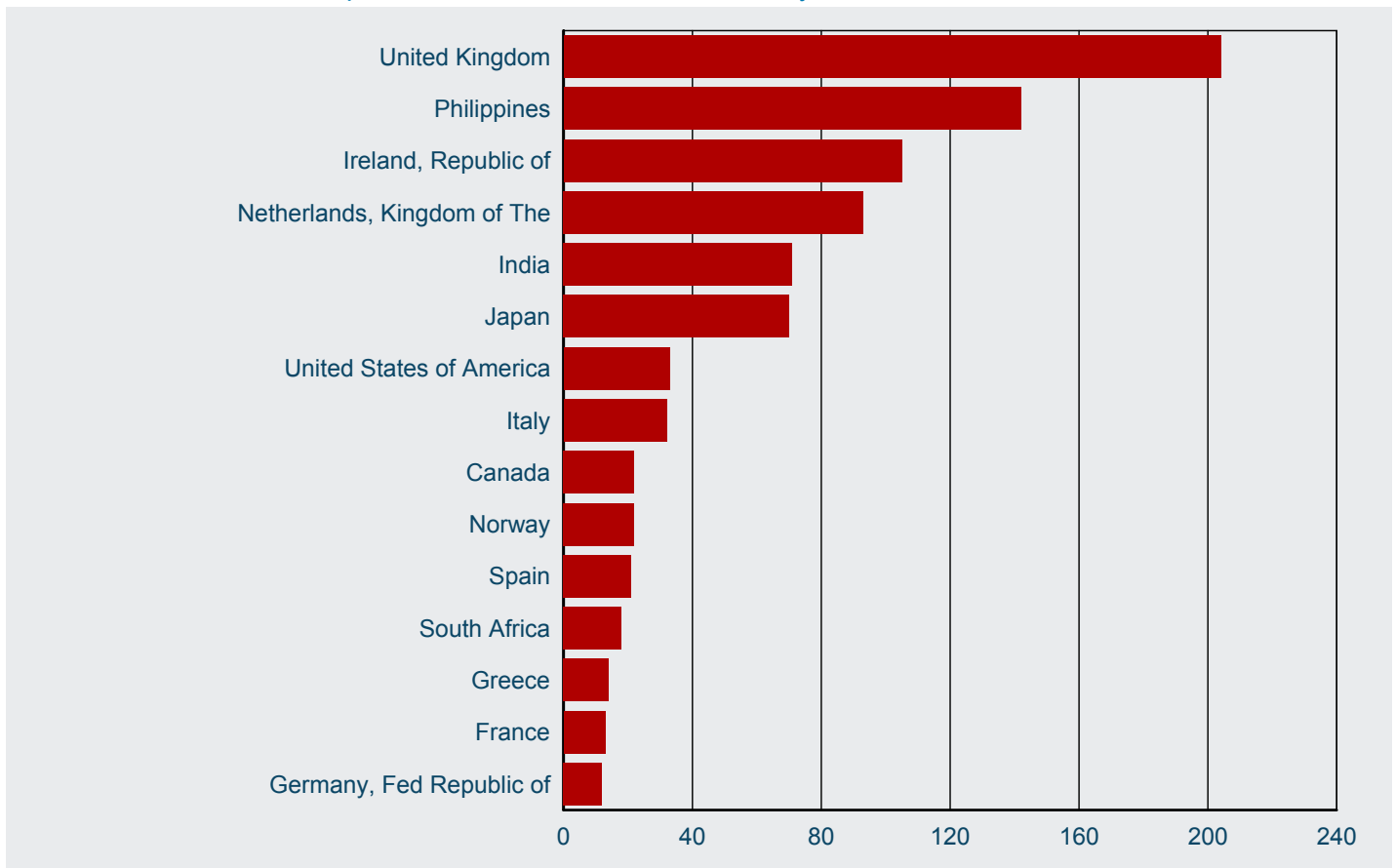

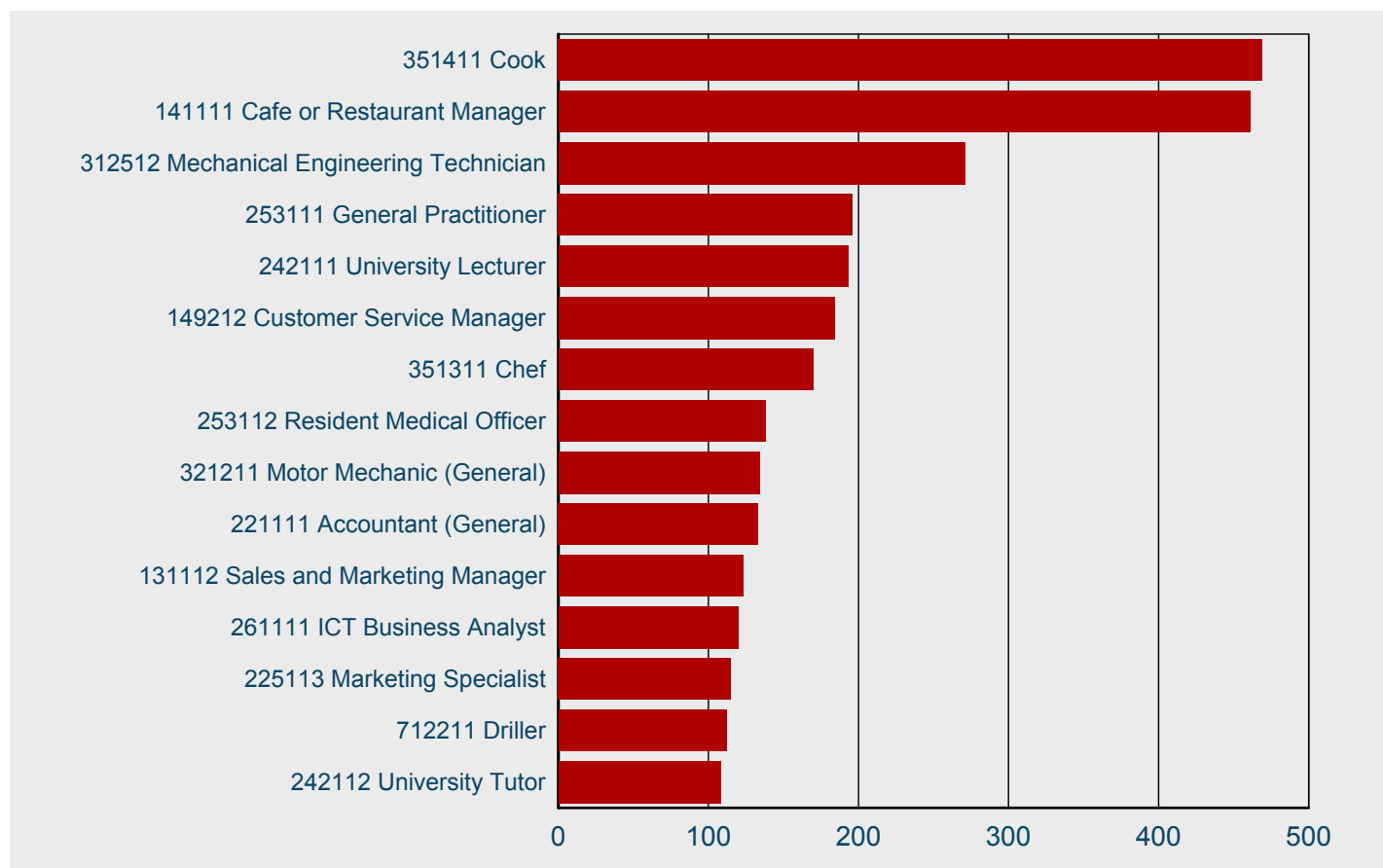

Graph 5.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in Queensland

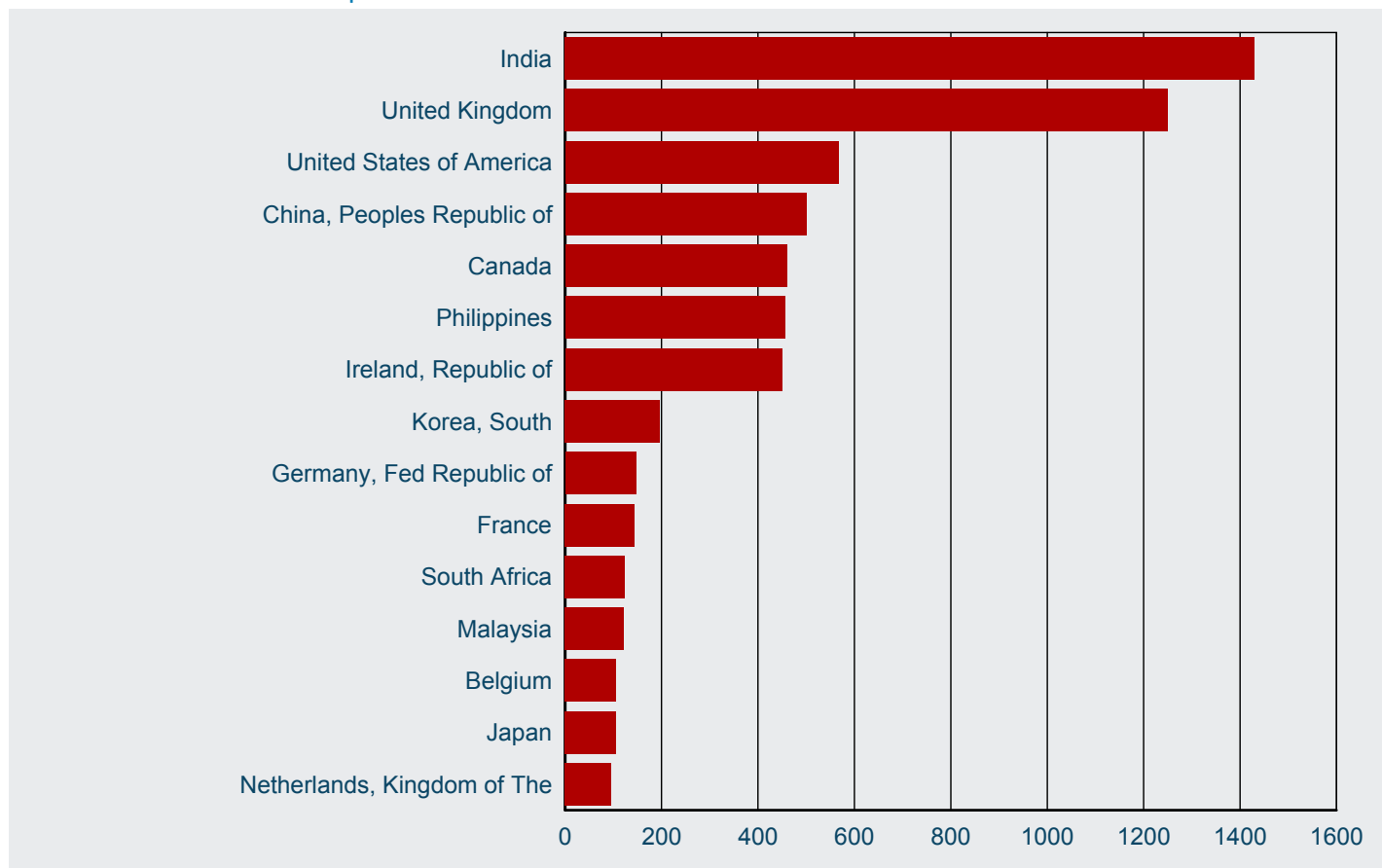

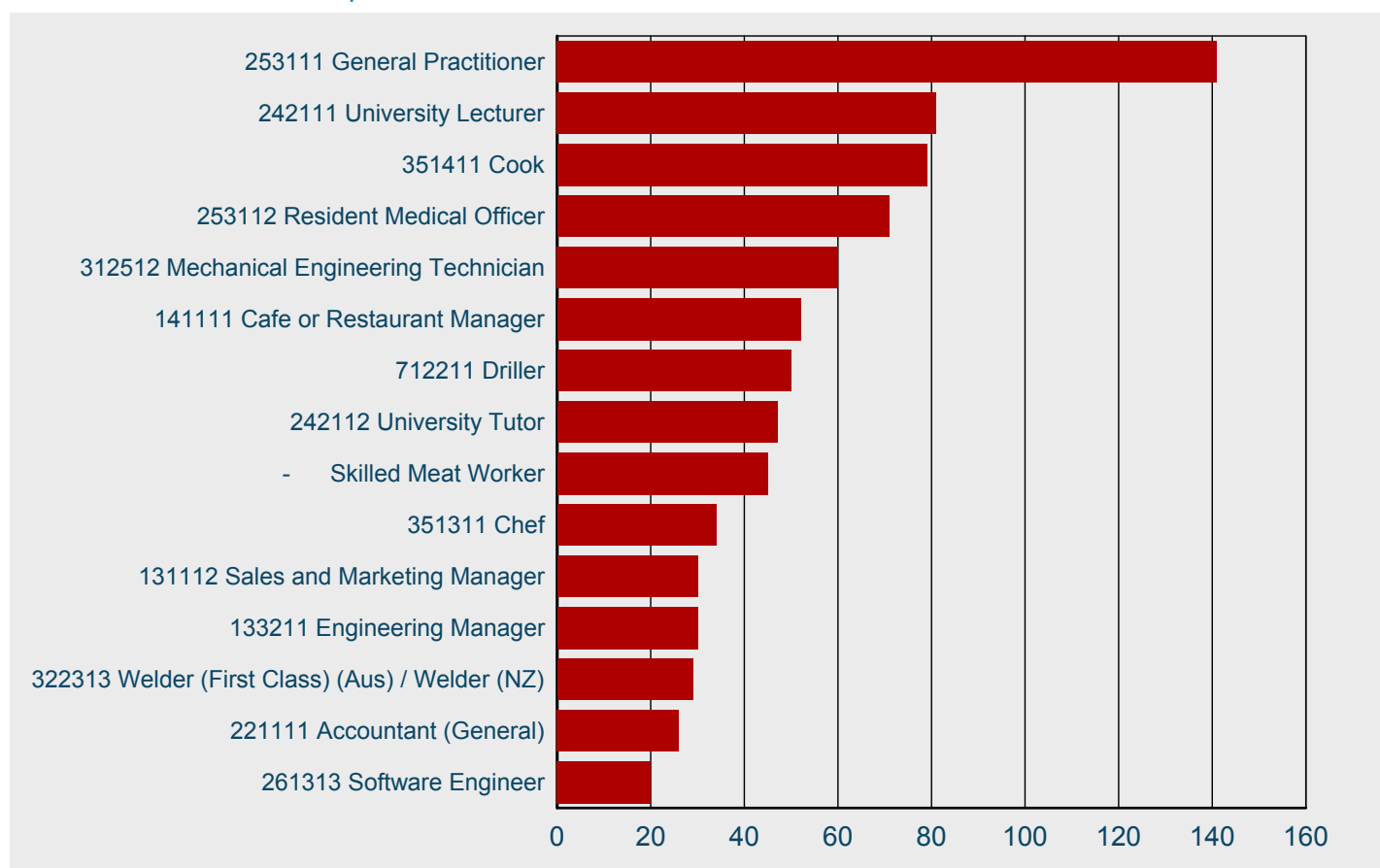

Graph 6.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in South Australia

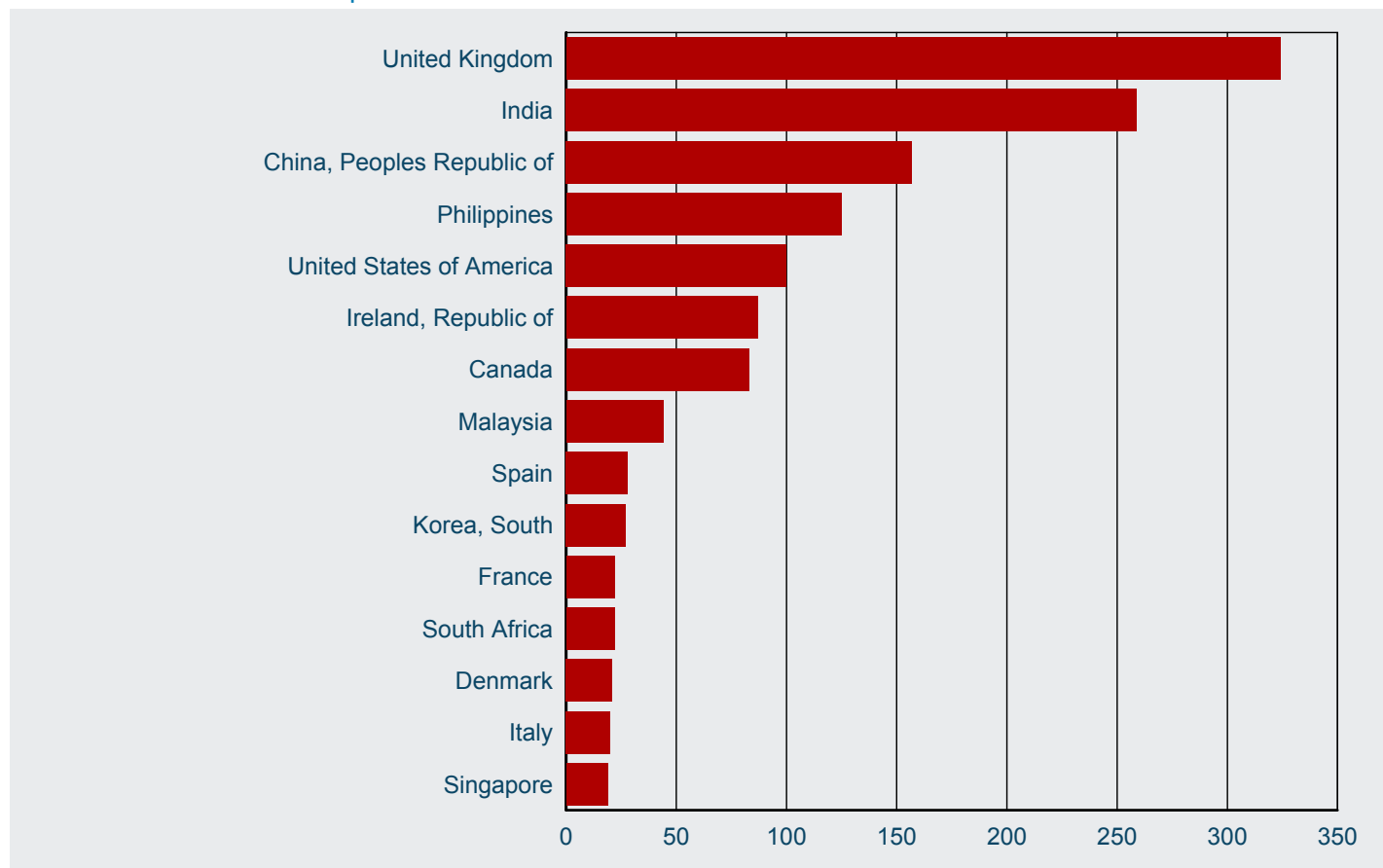

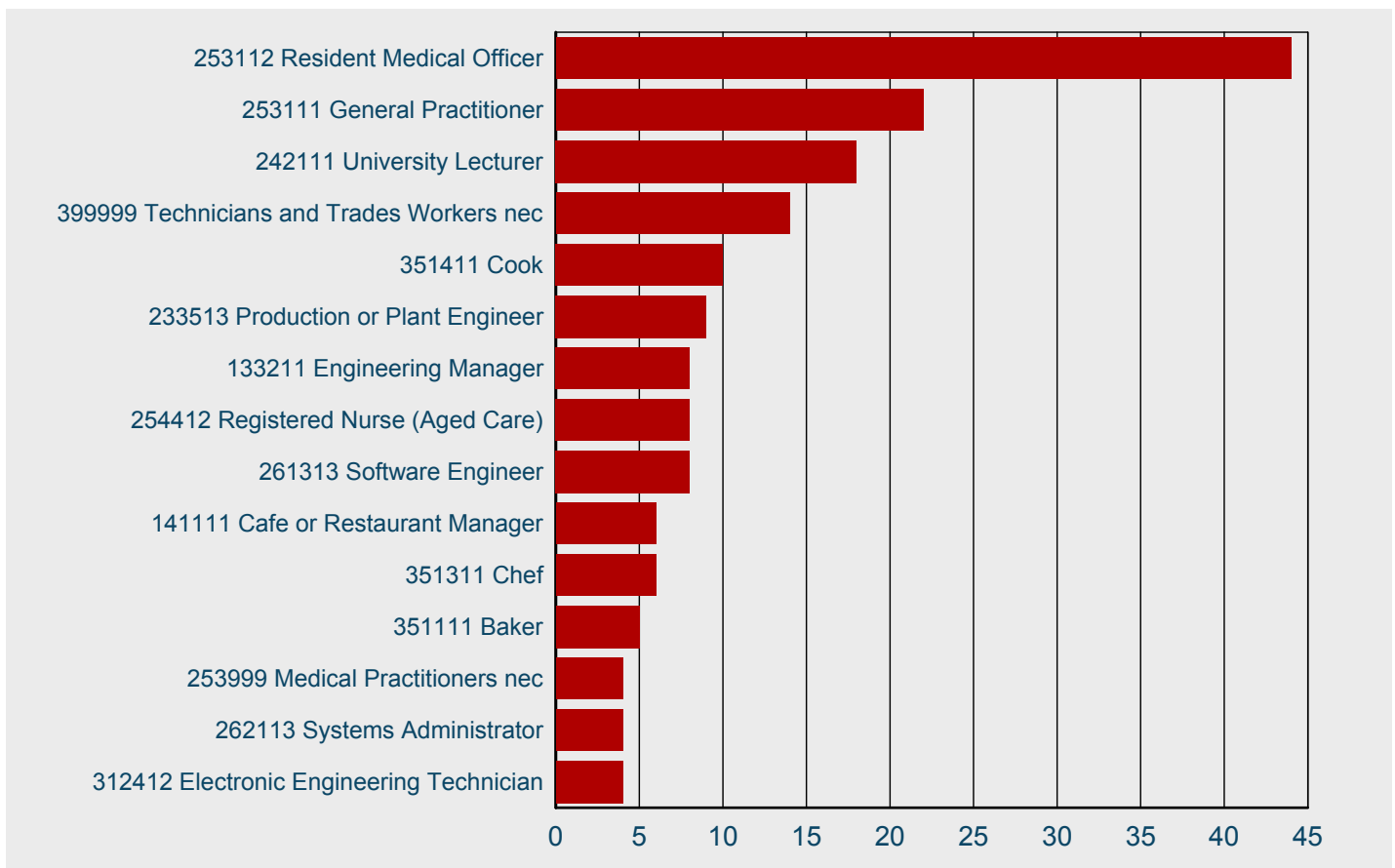

Graph 7.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in Tasmania

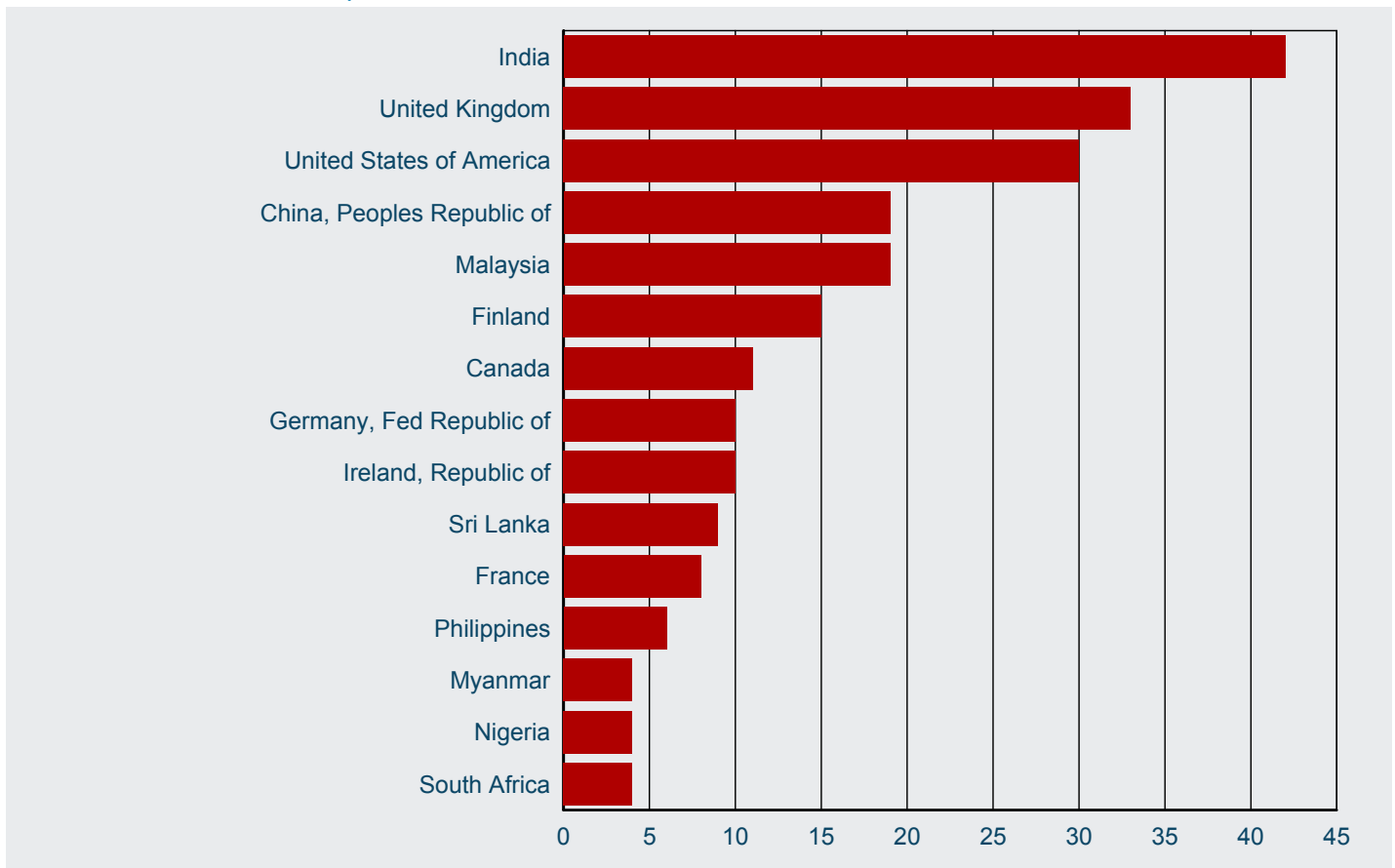

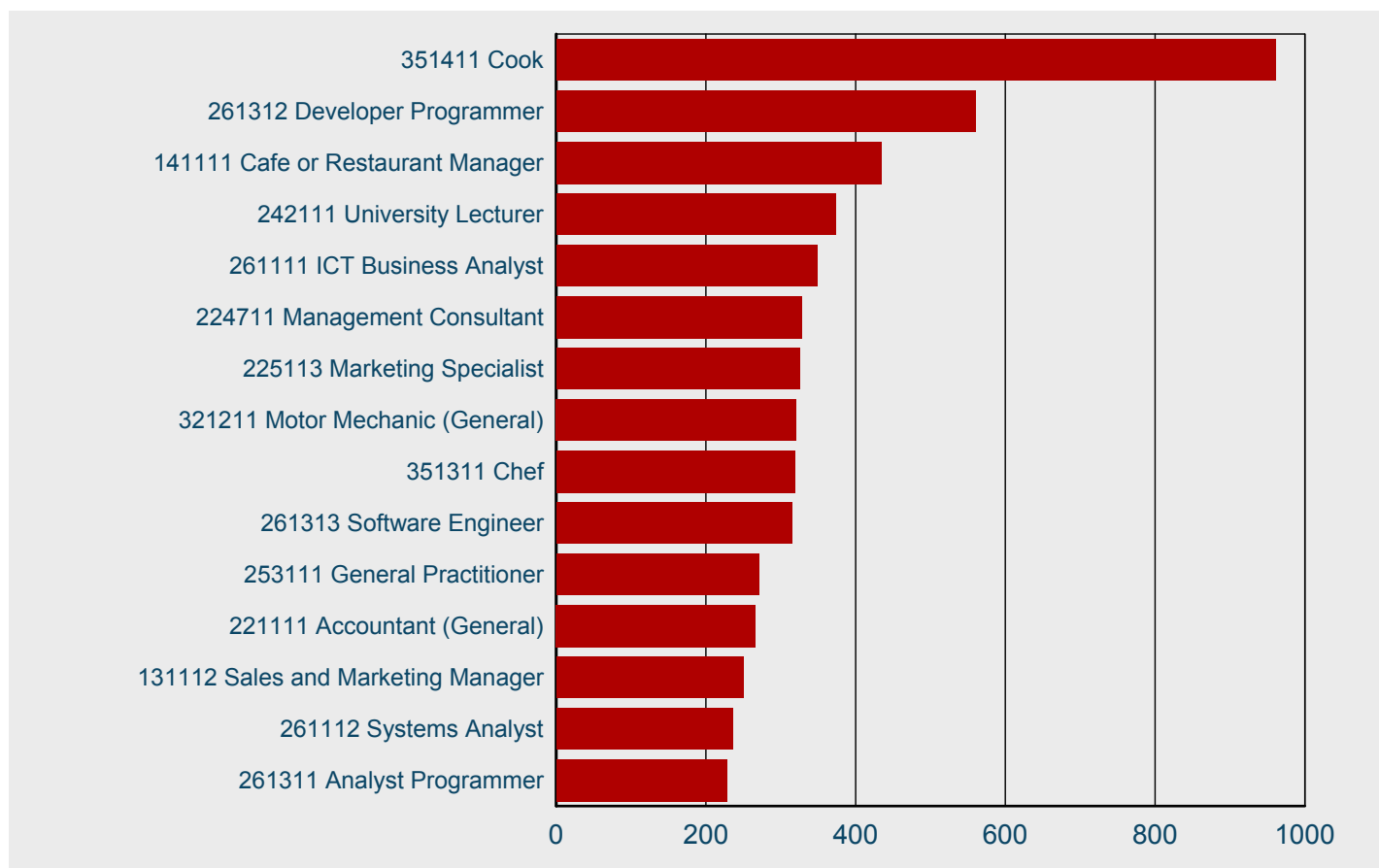

Graph 8.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2013-14 to 30 June 2014 - nominated positions located in Victoria

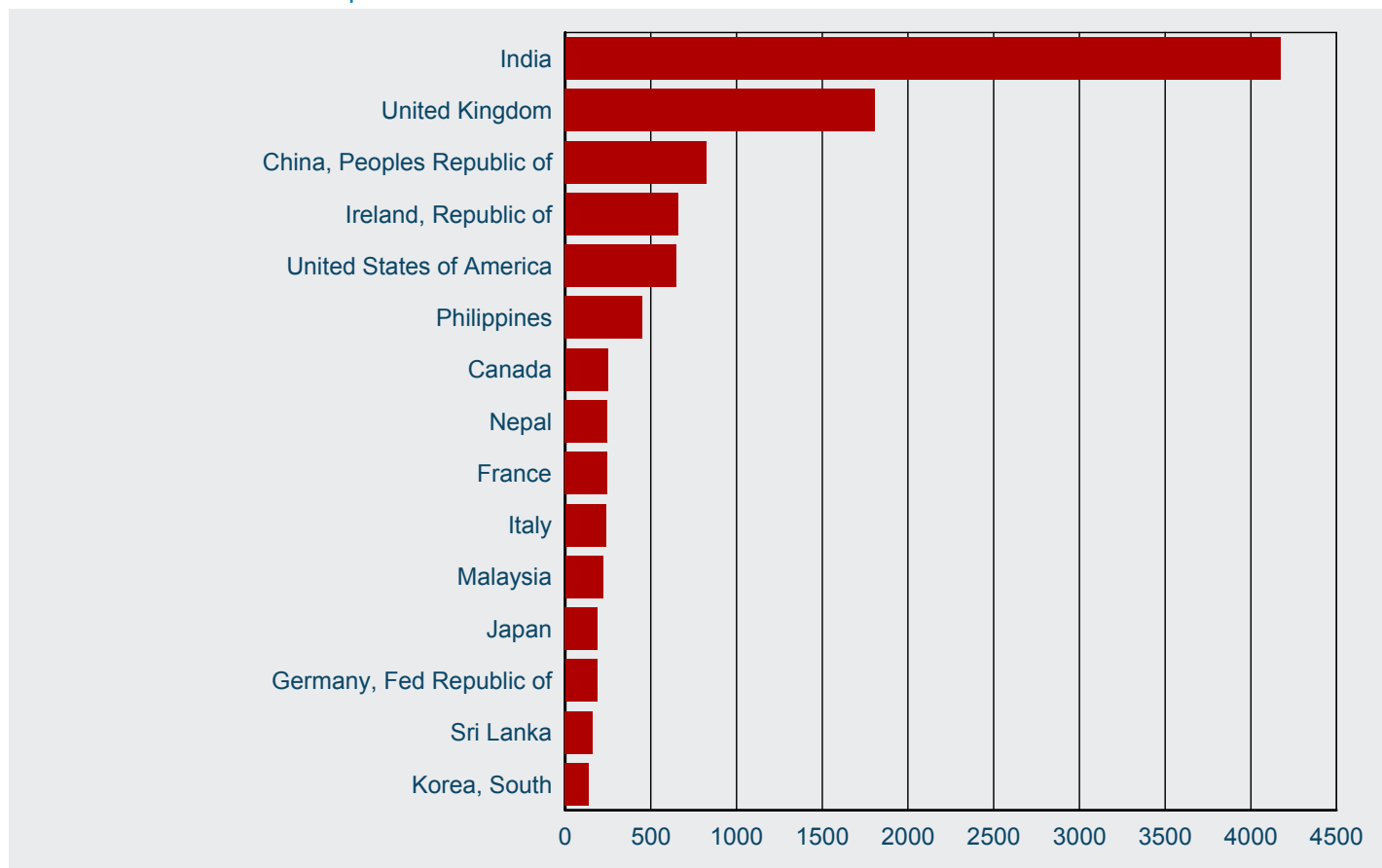

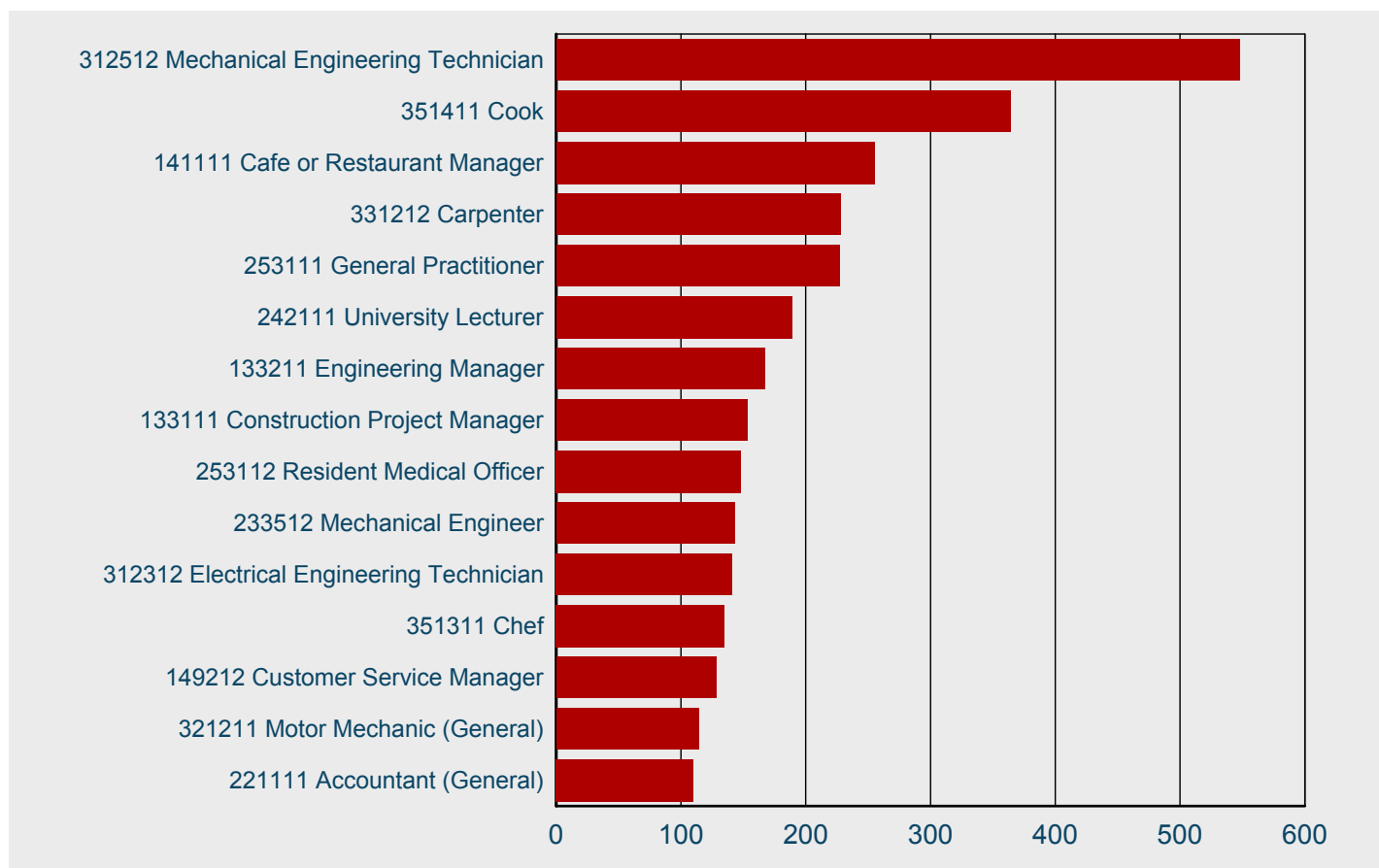
