



2023–24 Humanitarian Program Outcomes


The 2023–24 Humanitarian Program was fully delivered with 20,000 visas granted, comprising:

- **16,750 offshore visas**
 - o 9,762 Refugee category visas
 - o 5,475 Global Special Humanitarian Program visas
 - o 1,513 Community Support Program (CSP) visas
- **3,250 onshore protection visas**

Source of offshore grants by Region

Each year, the size and focus of the Program responds to evolving humanitarian situations and changes to the global need for resettlement.

In line with global resettlement needs, in 2023–24 Australia’s Offshore Humanitarian Program focused principally on four priority regions of the Middle East, Asia (includes Afghanistan), Africa and Americas.




■ Middle East ■ Asia ■ Africa ■ Americas and Other

Vulnerable women and children visa grants

In 2023–24, the resettlement of highly vulnerable women and their families continued to be a priority under the Program, with 2,159 of offshore visas granted to vulnerable women and their families.

Community Support Program

1,500 places was allocated for the CSP in 2023–24, of which 1,513 visas were granted. Of those, 834 grants (55 per cent) were to Afghan nationals.



Offshore grants By Age and Gender




Afghanistan

There are 10,000 places allocated to Afghan nationals within the Offshore Humanitarian Program between 2021-22 and 2024-25. Further, an additional 16,500 places for Afghan nationals have been allocated and will be delivered over four years (4,125 places per year between 2022–23 and 2025–26). This brings the total number of places available to Afghan nationals to 31,500, which comprise 26,500 places under the Humanitarian Program and 5,000 under the Family stream of the Migration Program.

In 2023–24, 6,961 visas were granted to Afghan nationals under the Offshore Humanitarian Program, comprising:

- 3,674 Refugee category visas
- 2,453 Global Special Humanitarian Program visas
- 834 Community Support Program visas

Proportion of Class XB visas granted to Afghans, 2109–20 to 2023–24




Humanitarian Program grants by component 2014–15 to 2023–24

Offshore resettlement component:

- This offers resettlement in Australia for people overseas who are in the greatest need of resettlement.
- It comprises visas granted under the Refugee category, Global Special Humanitarian Program and CSP.

Onshore protection component:

- This offers protection for people in Australia who are found to be refugees according to the *Refugees Convention*, the *International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights*, and the *Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment*.
