# State and territory migration summary

31 December 2014







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## About this report

This report provides year to date data about permanent and temporary migration by state/territory and statistical division where available. It aims to assist state/territory/regional governments and other stakeholders to better plan for and manage migration in their regions.

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data currently in legacy systems is being migrated to newer systems leading to improvements in output. Data is dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, data from the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

Permanent Additions, Settler Arrivals and Permanent Departures data sourced from passenger cards is not included in this publication following processing issues with the cards.

This report will be developed over time to increase and improve information sharing about the various visa programmes by state/territory.

# Definition of terms

1 November onshore:	A special class of visa, created in 1993, to provide permanent residency for certain asylum seekers already onshore at the time.
ANZSCO Major Group:	Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
Applicant type:	<p>Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are defined below.</p> <p>If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary applications', dependants (secondary applicants) are not included.</p>
Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP):	Superseding the Business Skills Programme, the Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP) is specifically designed to increase entrepreneurial talent and to improve business expertise in Australia.
Child visa:	The child permanent visa category includes visas for dependent children, orphan relatives and adopted children.
Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Distinguished talent visa:	The distinguished talent visa is a permanent visa for people nominated for migration on the basis of their internationally recognised record of exceptional and outstanding achievement in a profession, the arts, sport, research or academia.
Education provider registered state:	The education provider registered state is based on the student visa holder's confirmation of enrolment (CoE). Where more than one CoE is recorded on the visa application, the education provider registered state is based on the CoE with the highest course level. For secondary applicants, the registered state is based on the primary application.
Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS):	The Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) allows Australian employers to nominate employees who are foreign nationals for a permanent visa to work in Australia and fill a skilled occupation in their business.
English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS):	English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) (subclass 570) visa. This applies to stand-alone English language courses that lead to a certificate level award or non-formal award.
Foreign Affairs/Defence:	This visa (subclass 576) is designed for international students who are sponsored by Foreign Affairs (under the Australia Awards) or Defence to study a full-time course of any type in Australia.
General Skilled migration:	General skilled migration allows the permanent entry of persons who are not sponsored by an employer and who have skills in particular occupations required in Australia.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review grants.

## Definition of terms (continued)

Higher Education:	Higher Education (subclass 573) visa. This applies to bachelor degree, associate degree, higher education diploma, higher education advanced diploma, graduate certificate, graduate diploma or Masters by coursework.
Nominated occupation:	The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in Australia while holding the subclass 457 visa based on the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.
Nominated position location:	The state or territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.
Non Award:	Non Award (subclass 575) visa. This applies to non award foundation studies or other full time courses not leading to an Australian Award.
Other Family visa:	This visa group includes aged dependent relatives, remaining relatives and carer visas.
Outcomes:	Data on grants of permanent visas are Migration Programme outcomes. Outcomes are the number of visas granted net of Business Skills visas cancelled under s134 of the Migration Act 1958 and net of places taken by provisional spouse/fiance and interdependent visa holders who do not subsequently obtain permanent visas due to refusal or withdrawal.
Parent visa:	The parent permanent visa category relates to people whose child is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen.
Partner visa:	The partner category visa comprises the prospective marriage and partner visa subclasses.
Permanent additions:	Permanent additions are defined as the number of settler arrivals plus the number of people granted permanent residence while in Australia on a temporary visa.
Permanent/provisional visa:	A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the Migration Programme.
Postgraduate Research:	Postgraduate Research (subclass 574) visa. This applies to Master's degree by research or Doctoral degree.
Primary applicant:	The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Migration Regulations.
Primary application:	An application lodged by a primary applicant.
Primary grant:	An outcome where a decision maker (which may include system generated decision making) makes an assessment based on the initial visa application which results in a visa being granted to an applicant.
Primary visa holder:	A person who has had a primary application for a visa granted.
Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS):	The regional sponsored migration scheme (RSMS) is specifically designed to assist regional employers to nominate skilled migrants to fill a full time vacancy (available for at least two years) when there is a genuine need for a paid employee in a business located in regional Australia.

## Definition of terms (continued)

Schools:	Schools (subclass 571) visa. This applies to primary, junior secondary or senior secondary school course or an approved secondary school exchange programme.
Secondary applicant:	Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the primary applicant.
Secondary application:	A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.
Secondary visa holder:	A person who has had a secondary application for a visa granted.
Settler arrivals:	Settler arrivals are defined as the number of permanent settlers arriving in Australia.
State of intended residence:	State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settler arrivals on passenger cards and onshore permanent additions by the state or territory where they currently live. In the case of settler arrivals, this information does not necessarily relate to the state or territory in which the traveller will eventually establish a permanent residence.
Temporary Work (Skilled) (subclass 457):	A visa for a stay of up to four years for business purposes. Since 1 April 2005, medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a visa in this subclass.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa. Unless otherwise specified, the term covers both primary and secondary applicants.
Visa application:	An application lodged for a visa. A visa application may include both primary and secondary visa applicants.
Visitor visa:	Visitor visa subclasses are issued to non-permanent entrants to Australia, whose visa is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment.
Vocational Education and Training:	Vocational Education and Training (subclass 572) visa. This applies to certificate, vocational education and training diploma, vocational education and training advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate or vocational graduate diploma courses.
Working Holiday Maker:	Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa. These visas are aimed at young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and undertake short-term work and/or study.

# Section 1 - All States and Territories

## Overview

New South Wales led in attracting both temporary and permanent migrants for most visa categories, followed by Victoria. New South Wales attracted the largest share of Professionals and Managers, while Western Australia attracted the largest share of Technicians and Trades Workers in the permanent Skilled Stream.

India continues to be the top source country for permanent migrants, with China and the United Kingdom ranked second and third respectively.

Analysis of state preference for permanent migrants by nationality shows that the majority of Indian Skilled Stream migrants went to New South Wales whereas the majority of Indian Family Stream migrants went to Victoria. The majority of Chinese Skilled Stream migrants moved to Victoria while the majority of Chinese Family Stream migrants moved to New South Wales. For the United Kingdom, Western Australia was the top destination state for Skilled Stream migrants, whereas New South Wales was the top destination state for Family Stream migrants.

## Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 47,563 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 9.1 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15 were:
  - New South Wales with 37.0 per cent of the total, or 17,601 visa grants
  - Victoria with 24.8 per cent or 11,814
  - Western Australia with 16.3 per cent or 7734 and
  - Queensland with 13.5 per cent or 6440.
- Compared to the same period in the previous financial year, the largest change in 457 visa grants were for:
  - Queensland down 20.6 per cent or -1667 visa grants
  - Western Australia down 15.7 per cent or -1435 and
  - Northern Territory down 14.2 per cent or -110.
- Of the 47,563 grants, 25,533 (53.7 per cent) were primary and 22,030 (46.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

## Student visa

- There were 145,832 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 10,400 (7.7 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15 were:
  - New South Wales with 37.0 per cent of the total, or 54,022 visa grants
  - Victoria with 24.2 per cent or 35,288 and
  - Queensland with 16.1 per cent or 23,436.
- Of the 145,832 grants, 125,686 (86.2 per cent) were primary and 20,146 (13.8 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

## Section 1 - All States and Territories

- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15 were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 51.2 per cent of the total, or 74,630 visa grants, of which:
    - 27,632 visa grants (37.0 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 20,677 visa grants (27.7 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 10,060 visa grants (13.5 per cent) in Queensland;
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 23.0 per cent or 33,479 visa grants, of which:
    - 14,411 visa grants (43.0 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 7694 visa grants (23.0 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 5316 visa grants (15.9 per cent) in Queensland; and
  - Independent ELICOS Sector with 11.5 per cent or 16 757 visa grants, of which:
    - 6920 visa grants (41.3 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 4300 visa grants (25.7 per cent) in Queensland and
    - 2817 visa grants (16.8 per cent) in Victoria.

### Working Holiday Maker and Visitor visa

- There were 114,807 Working Holiday visa grants in the first half of 2014-15, down 10.4 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was driven by a decline in first visa grants down 10.9 per cent or -11,266 visa grants compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was contributed to further by a decrease in second visa grants down 8.2 per cent or 1997 visa grants compared to the previous financial year.
- There were 5879 Working and Holiday visa grants in the first half of 2014-15, up 11.7 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- There were 2,239,049 Visitor visa grants in the first half of 2014-15, up 6.0 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was driven by an increase in Tourist visa grants up 5.9 per cent or 112,341. This was contributed to further by an increase in Business visa grants up 6.9 per cent or 14,782.

### Skill Stream

- There were 67,946 Skill Stream outcomes in the first half of 2014-15, where the state/territory of nomination/intended residence was:
  - New South Wales with 19,366 Skill Stream outcomes (28.5 per cent) of which:
    - 11,572 Skill Stream outcomes (59.8 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
    - 6714 (34.7 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
    - 619 (3.2 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme;
  - Victoria with 15 004 (22.1 per cent) of which:
    - 8427 Skill Stream outcomes (56.2 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
    - 3803 (25.3 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
    - 2203 (14.7 per cent) were Business Innovation and Investment Programme;
  - Western Australia with 10 576 (15.6 per cent) of which:
    - 4568 Skill Stream outcomes (43.2 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
    - 3416 (32.3 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
    - 2279 (21.5 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme; and
  - State/territory not specified with 4571 (6.7 per cent) of which 95.8 per cent (4378 outcomes) were in General Skilled Migration.

- The top source citizenship countries for the Skill Stream programme were:
  - India with 15,567 (22.9 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 4419 (28.4 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 3760 (24.2 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 2084 (13.4 per cent) in South Australia;
  - China (excl SARs) with 9075 (13.4 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 3419 (37.7 per cent) were in Victoria
    - 3132 (34.5 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 726 (8.0 per cent) in South Australia; and
  - United Kingdom with 8725 (12.8 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 2394 (27.4 per cent) were in Western Australia
    - 2199 (25.2 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 1526 (17.5 per cent) in Victoria.
- Skill Stream outcomes top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 21,452 (67.9 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 7467 (34.8 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 4890 (22.8 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 2433 (11.3 per cent) in Western Australia;
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 5290 (16.7 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 1481 (28.0 per cent) were in Western Australia
    - 1151 (21.8 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 958 (18.1 per cent) in Victoria; and
  - Managers with 2788 (8.8 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 702 (25.2 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 507 (18.2 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 472 (16.9 per cent) in Western Australia.
- The top source citizenship country in each Skill Stream programme was:
  - India with 11,838 (28.9 per cent) General Skilled Migration outcomes
  - United Kingdom with 4477 (25.5 per cent) Employer Nomination Scheme outcomes
  - India with 1532 (25.5 per cent) Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme outcomes and
  - China (excl SARs) with 2529 (76.9 per cent) Business Innovation and Investment Programme outcomes.

## Family Stream

- There were 30 843 Family Stream outcomes in the first half of 2014-15, of which the states of intended residence were:
  - New South Wales with 9890 (32.1 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 7517 (76.0 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 1859 (18.8 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 462 (4.7 per cent) were Child;
  - Victoria with 7500 (24.3 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 5905 (78.7 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 1237 (16.5 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 323 (4.3 per cent) were Child; and
  - Queensland with 3 893 (12.6 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 3250 (83.5 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 433 (11.1 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 210 (5.4 per cent) were Child.

  - China (excl SARs) with 5617 (18.2 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 1995 (35.5 per cent) were in New South Wales

    - 1539 (27.4 per cent) did not specify a state/territory;
  - India with 3006 (9.7 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 1126 (37.5 per cent) were in Victoria
    - 831 (27.6 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 352 (11.7 per cent) in Western Australia; and
  - United Kingdom with 2 516 (8.2 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
    - 587 (23.3 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 436 (17.3 per cent) in Western Australia
    - 409 (16.3 per cent) in Queensland and
    - 518 (20.6 per cent) did not specify a state/territory.
- The top source citizenship country in each Family Stream programme was:
  - China (excl SARs) with 3027 (12.4 per cent) partner outcomes
  - China (excl SARs) with 363 (18.0 per cent) child outcomes
  - China (excl SARs) with 2217 (50.9 per cent) parent (incl. contributory) outcomes and
  - Afghanistan with 36 (32.4 per cent) other family outcomes.

- There were 17,601 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 9.6 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 17,601 grants, 9703 (55.1 per cent) were primary and 7898 (44.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 5788 (59.7 per cent) and
  - Managers with 2008 (20.7 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 54,022 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 6813 (14.4 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 54,022 grants, 48,419 (89.6 per cent) were primary and 5603 (10.4 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 27,632 (51.1 per cent) and

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### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 666 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 14.2 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 666 grants, 403 (60.5 per cent) were primary and 263 (39.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 171 (42.4 per cent) and
  - Professionals with 145 (36.0 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 934 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 250 (36.5 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 934 grants, 789 (84.5 per cent) were primary and 145 (15.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 841 (90.0 per cent) and
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 48 (5.1 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 1158 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 526 (45.4 per cent) were primary and 632 (54.6 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 269 (51.1 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 127 (24.1 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 250 (21.6 per cent) and
  - United Kingdom with 173 (14.9 per cent).

### Family Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 301 Family Stream outcomes, 263 (87.4 per cent) were primary and 38 (12.6 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - Philippines with 71 (23.6 per cent) and
  - United Kingdom with 26 (8.6 per cent).

### Regional Analysis

- In the first half of 2014-15, 569 or 85.4 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Darwin statistical division, a decrease of 5.3 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- In contrast to the subclass 457 visa grants, 62.9 per cent (124) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Darwin.

### Darwin

- In the first half of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Darwin were:
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 155 (44.3 per cent) and
  - Professionals with 122 (34.9 per cent).

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### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 6440 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 20.6 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 6440 grants, 3355 (52.1 per cent) were primary and 3085 (47.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 1589 (47.4 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 802 (23.9 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 23,436 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a decrease of -93 (0.4 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 23,436 grants, 20,940 (89.3 per cent) were primary and 2496 (10.7 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 10,060 (42.9 per cent) and
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 5316 (22.7 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 7858 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 3594 (45.7 per cent) were primary and 4264 (54.3 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 2142 (59.6 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 827 (23.0 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 1515 (19.3 per cent) and
  - United Kingdom with 1241 (15.8 per cent).

### Family Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 3893 Family Stream outcomes, 3412 (87.6 per cent) were primary and 481 (12.4 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 1603 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 8.8 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 1603 grants, 806 (50.3 per cent) were primary and 797 (49.7 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 367 (45.5 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 172 (21.3 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 7312 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 173 (2.4 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 7312 grants, 6418 (87.8 per cent) were primary and 894 (12.2 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 4606 (63.0 per cent) and
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 1133 (15.5 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 6764 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 2843 (42.0 per cent) were primary and 3921 (58.0 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 1801 (63.3 per cent) and
  - Managers with 470 (16.5 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 2084 (30.8 per cent) and
  - China (excl SARs) with 726 (10.7 per cent).

### Family Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 1469 Family Stream outcomes, 1181 (80.4 per cent) were primary and 288 (19.6 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:

## Section 7 - Tasmania

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 216 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 9.6 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 216 grants, 128 (59.3 per cent) were primary and 88 (40.7 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 89 (69.5 per cent) and
  - Managers with 16 (12.5 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 1267 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 399 (46.0 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 1267 grants, 1 002 (79.1 per cent) were primary and 265 (20.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 994 (78.5 per cent) and
  - Postgraduate Research Sector with 105 (8.3 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 350 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 181 (51.7 per cent) were primary and 169 (48.3 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 136 (75.1 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 17 (9.4 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - China (excl SARs) with 82 (23.4 per cent) and
  - India with 58 (16.6 per cent).

### Family Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 225 Family Stream outcomes, 200 (88.9 per cent) were primary and 25 (11.1 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - Philippines with 26 (11.6 per cent) and
  - China (excl SARs) with 24 (10.7 per cent).

### Regional Analysis

- In the first half of 2014-15, 102 or 47.2 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Greater Hobart statistical division, an increase of 6.3 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 60.6 per cent (40) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Greater Hobart.

### Greater Hobart

- In the first half of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Greater Hobart were:
  - Professionals with 43 (69.4 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 10 (16.1 per cent).

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- In the first half of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Greater Hobart were:
  - Professionals with 15 (37.5 per cent) primary outcomes and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 10 (25.0 per cent).

### Mersey-Lyell

- In the first half of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Mersey-Lyell were:
  - Professionals with 23 (74.2 per cent) and
  - Managers with less than five (12.9 per cent).
- In the first half of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Mersey-Lyell were:
  - Professionals with 8 (80.0 per cent) primary outcomes and
  - Managers with less than five (20.0 per cent).

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 11,814 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 1.0 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 11,814 grants, 6161 (52.1 per cent) were primary and 5653 (47.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 3431 (55.7 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 1474 (23.9 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 35,288 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; an increase of 607 (1.8 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 35,288 grants, 31,755 (90.0 per cent) were primary and 3533 (10.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 20,677 (58.6 per cent) and
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 7694 (21.8 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 15,004 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 7035 (46.9 per cent) were primary and 7969 (53.1 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 4890 (69.5 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 958 (13.6 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 3760 (25.1 per cent) and
  - China (excl SARs) with 3419 (22.8 per cent).

### Family Stream

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 7734 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a 15.7 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 7734 grants, 4284 (55.4 per cent) were primary and 3450 (44.6 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 1761 (41.1 per cent) and
  - Professionals with 1598 (37.3 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 10,318 Student visa grants in the first half of 2014-15; a decrease of -222 (2.1 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 10,318 grants, 8734 (84.6 per cent) were primary and 1584 (15.4 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education Sector with 4420 (42.8 per cent) and
  - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 3157 (30.6 per cent).

### Skill Stream

- In the first half of 2014-15, there were 10,576 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 4752 (44.9 per cent) were primary and 5824 (55.1 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 2433 (51.2 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 1481 (31.2 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - United Kingdom with 2394 (22.6 per cent) and
