


State and territory migration summary

30 June 2014



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About this report

This report provides year to date data about permanent and temporary migration by state/territory and statistical division where available. It aims to assist state/territory/regional governments and other stakeholders to better plan for and manage migration in their regions.

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data currently in legacy systems is being migrated to newer systems leading to improvements in output. Data is dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, data from the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

This report will be developed over time to increase and improve information sharing about the various visa programmes by state/territory.

Definition of terms

1 November onshore: A special class of visa, created in 1993, to provide permanent residency for certain

asylum seekers already onshore at the time.

ANZSCO Major Group: Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard

Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian

Bureau of Statistics (ABS).

Applicant type: Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of

applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are

defined below.

If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary'

applications', dependants (secondary applicants) are not included.

AusAID/Defence: This visa (subclass 576) is designed for international students who are sponsored by

AusAID (under the Australia Awards) or Defence to study a full-time course of any

type in Australia.

Business Innovation and Investment Programme

(BIIP):

Superseding the Business Skills Programme, the Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP) is specifically designed to increase entrepreneurial

talent and to improve business expertise in Australia.

Child visa: The child permanent visa category includes visas for dependent children, orphan

relatives and adopted children.

Citizenship country: The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant

or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the

travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.

Distinguished talent visa: The distinguished talent visa is a permanent visa for people nominated for migration

on the basis of their internationally recognised record of exceptional and outstanding

achievement in a profession, the arts, sport, research or academia.

Education provider

registered state:

The education provider registered state is based on the student visa holder's confirmation of enrolment (CoE). Where more than one CoE is recorded on the visa

application, the education provider registered state is based on the CoE with the highest course level. For secondary applicants, the registered state is based on the

primary application.

Employer Nomination

Scheme (ENS):

The Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) allows Australian employers to nominate employees who are foreign nationals for a permanent visa to work in Australia and fill

a skilled occupation in their business.

Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS):

English Language Intensive English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) (subclass 570) visa. This applies to stand-alone English language courses that leads to a certificate level award or non-formal award.

General Skilled migration:

General skilled migration allows the permanent entry of persons who are not

sponsored by an employer and who have skills in particular occupations required in

Australia.

Granted: Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review

grants.

Definition of terms (continued)

Higher Education: Higher Education (subclass 573) visa. This applies to bachelor degree, associate

degree, higher education diploma, higher education advanced diploma, graduate

certificate, graduate diploma or Masters by coursework.

Nominated occupation: The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in

Australia while holding the subclass 457 visa based on the Australian and New

Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.

Nominated position

location:

The state or territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from

the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.

Non Award: Non Award (subclass 575) visa. This applies to non award foundation studies or other

full time courses not leading to an Australian Award.

Other Family visa: This visa group includes aged dependent relatives, remaining relatives and carer

visas.

Outcomes: Data on grants of permanent visas are Migration Programme outcomes. Outcomes

are the number of visas granted net of Business Skills visas cancelled under s134 of the Migration Act 1958 and net of places taken by provisional spouse/fiance and interdependent visa holders who do not subsequently obtain permanent visas due to

refusal or withdrawal.

Parent visa: The parent permanent visa category relates to people whose child is an Australian

citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen.

Partner visa: The partner category visa comprises the prospective marriage and partner visa

subclasses.

Permanent additions: Permanent additions are defined as the number of settler arrivals plus the number of

people granted permanent residence while in Australia on a temporary visa.

Permanent/provisional visa: A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the Migration Programme.

Postgraduate Research: Postgraduate Research (subclass 574) visa. This applies to Master's degree by

research or Doctoral degree.

Primary applicant: The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant

of a visa under the Migration Regulations.

Primary application: An application lodged by a primary applicant.

Primary grant: An outcome where a decision maker (which may include system generated decision

making) makes an assessment based on the initial visa application which results in a

visa being granted to an applicant.

Primary visa holder: A person who has had a primary application for a visa granted.

Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS):

The regional sponsored migration scheme (RSMS) is specifically designed to assist regional employers to nominate skilled migrants to fill a full time vacancy (available

for at least two years) when there is a genuine need for a paid employee in a

business located in regional Australia.

Definition of terms (continued)

Schools: Schools (subclass 571) visa. This applies to primary, junior secondary or senior

secondary school course or an approved secondary school exchange programme.

Secondary applicant: Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under

the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the

primary applicant.

Secondary application: A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.

Secondary visa holder: A person who has had a secondary application for a visa granted.

Settler arrivals: Settler arrivals are defined as the number of permanent settlers arriving in Australia.

State of intended State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settler residence:

arrivals on passenger cards and permanent additions by the state or territory where they currently live. In the case of settler arrivals, this information does not necessarily

relate to the state or territory in which the traveller will eventually establish a

permanent residence.

Temporary Work (Skilled) A visa for a stay of up to four years for business purposes. Since 1 April 2005, (subclass 457):

medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a visa in this subclass.

Visa applicant: Used to refer to clients applying for a visa. Unless otherwise specified, the term

covers both primary and secondary applicants.

Visa application: An application lodged for a visa. A visa application may include both primary and

secondary visa applicants.

Visitor visa: Visitor visa subclasses are issued to non-permanent entrants to Australia, whose visa

is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment.

Vocational Education and Vocational Education and Training (subclass 572) visa. This applies to certificate,

Training: vocational education and training diploma, vocational education and training

advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate or vocational graduate diploma

courses.

Working Holiday Maker: Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and

> Holiday (subclass 462) visa. These visas are aimed at young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and

undertake short-term work and/or study.

Section 1

Overview

New South Wales led in attracting both temporary and permanent migrants for most visa categories, followed by Victoria. New South Wales attracted the largest share of Professionals, Victoria attracted the largest share of Managers, while Western Australia attracted the largest share of Technicians and Trades Workers in the permanent Skilled Stream.

India continues to be the top source country for permanent migrants, with China and the United Kingdom ranked second and third respectively.

Analysis of state preference for permanent migrants by nationality shows that the majority of Indian Skilled Stream migrants went to New South Wales whereas the majority of Indian Family Stream migrants went to Victoria. The majority of Chinese Skilled Stream migrants moved to Victoria while the majority of Chinese Family Stream migrants moved to New South Wales. For the United Kingdom, Western Australia was the top destination state for Skilled Stream migrants, whereas New South Wales was the top destination state for Family Stream migrants.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 98 571 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 22.0 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of 457 visa grants in 2013-14 were:
 - New South Wales with 37.1 per cent of the total, or 36 543 visa grants
 - Victoria with 23.7 per cent or 23 408
 - o Western Australia with 17.1 per cent or 16 854 and
 - o Queensland with 14.9 per cent or 14 736.
- Compared to the previous financial year, the largest change in 457 visa grants were for:
 - Western Australia down 37.5 per cent or -10 115 visa grants
 - o Queensland down 30.2 per cent or -6 373 and
 - o Tasmania down 28.2 per cent or -190.
- Of the 98 571 grants, 51 939 (52.7 per cent) were primary and 46 632 (47.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

Student visa

- There were 292 060 Student visa grants in 2013-14; an increase of 32 782 (12.6 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in 2013-14 were:
 - New South Wales with 31.8 per cent of the total, or 92 756 visa grants
 - Victoria with 24.2 per cent or 70 765 and
 - Queensland with 16.8 per cent or 48 937.
- Of the 292 060 grants, 252 114 (86.3 per cent) were primary and 39 946 (13.7 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in 2013-14 were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 52.2 per cent of the total, or 152 344 visa grants, of which:
 - 50 152 visa grants (32.9 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 42 130 visa grants (27.7 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 23 404 visa grants (15.4 per cent) in Queensland;
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 20.8 per cent or 60 648 visa grants, of which:
 - 20 462 visa grants (33.7 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 13 073 visa grants (21.6 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 8270 visa grants (13.6 per cent) in Queensland; and
 - Independent ELICOS Sector with 10.6 per cent or 30 964 visa grants, of which:
 - 10 769 visa grants (34.8 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 8557 visa grants (27.6 per cent) in Queensland and
 - 5787 visa grants (18.7 per cent) in Victoria.

Working Holiday Maker and Visitor visa

- There were 229 378 Working Holiday visa grants in 2013-14, down 8.0 per cent compared to the previous financial year. This was driven by a decline in first visa grants down 12.8 per cent or -26 941 visa grants compared to the previous financial year. This was offset by an increase in second visa grants up 18.2 per cent or 7 088 visa grants compared to the previous financial year.
- There were 10 214 Working and Holiday visa grants in 2013-14, up 13.3 per cent compared to the previous financial vear.
- There were 3 990 254 Visitor visa grants in 2013-14, up 6.4 per cent compared to the previous financial year. This
 was driven by an increase in Tourist visa grants up 8.2 per cent or 269 146. This was offset by a decline in Business
 visa grants down 6.4 per cent or 29 535.

Skill Stream

- There were 128 550 Skill Stream outcomes in 2013-14, where the state/territory of nomination/intended residence was:
 - o New South Wales with 34 589 Skill Stream outcomes (26.9 per cent) of which:
 - 20 237 Skill Stream outcomes (58.5 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 12 007 (34.7 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 1 773 (5.1 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme;
 - o Victoria with 25 513 (19.8 per cent) of which:
 - 13 266 Skill Stream outcomes (52.0 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 6 336 (24.8 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 4 283 (16.8 per cent) were Business Innovation and Investment Programme;
 - Western Australia with 23 097 (18.0 per cent) of which:
 - 10 684 Skill Stream outcomes (46.3 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 5 998 (26.0 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 5 761 (24.9 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme; and
 - State/territory not specified with 18 000 (14.0 per cent) of which 97.8 per cent (17 607 outcomes) were in General Skilled Migration.

- The top source citizenship countries for the Skill Stream programme were:
 - o India with 32 719 (25.5 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 9 369 (28.6 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 6 441 (19.7 per cent) in Victoria
 - 3 393 (10.4 per cent) in Western Australia and
 - 7 026 (21.5 per cent) did not specify a state/territory;
 - o United Kingdom with 17 913 (13.9 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 5 427 (30.3 per cent) were in Western Australia
 - 4 765 (26.6 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 2 614 (14.6 per cent) in Victoria; and
 - China (excl SARs) with 16 434 (12.8 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 5 971 (36.3 per cent) were in Victoria
 - 4 771 (29.0 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 1 527 (9.3 per cent) in Western Australia.
- Skill Stream outcomes top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 38 848 (63.1 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 13 484 (34.7 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 7 924 (20.4 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 5 195 (13.4 per cent) in Western Australia;
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 13 554 (22.0 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 2 787 (20.6 per cent) were in Western Australia
 - 2 092 (15.4 per cent) in New South Wales
 - 1 911 (14.1 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 4 335 (32.0 per cent) did not specify a state/territory; and
 - Managers with 5 282 (8.6 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 1 234 (23.4 per cent) were in Victoria
 - 1 182 (22.4 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 1 128 (21.4 per cent) in Western Australia.
- The top source citizenship country in each Skill Stream programme was:
 - o India with 24 568 (32.9 per cent) General Skilled Migration outcomes
 - United Kingdom with 9 048 (29.3 per cent) Employer Nomination Scheme outcomes
 - India with 5 010 (30.3 per cent) Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme outcomes and
 - China (excl SARs) with 4 614 (74.9 per cent) Business Innovation and Investment Programme outcomes.

Family Stream

- There were 61 112 Family Stream outcomes in 2013-14, of which the states of intended residence were:
 - o New South Wales with 20 450 (33.5 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 15 180 (74.2 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 3 919 (19.2 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
 - 1 043 (5.1 per cent) were Child;
 - Victoria with 14 325 (23.4 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 10 849 (75.7 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 2 556 (17.8 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
 - 783 (5.5 per cent) were Child; and
 - Not Specified with 8 512 (13.9 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 7 354 (86.4 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 828 (9.7 per cent) were Child and
 - 290 (3.4 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory).

- The top source citizenship countries for the Family Stream programme were:
 - o China (excl SARs) with 10 327 (16.9 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 4 024 (39.0 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 2 196 (21.3 per cent) in Victoria
 - 633 (6.1 per cent) in Queensland and
 - 2 509 (24.3 per cent) did not specify a state/territory;
 - o India with 6 295 (10.3 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 2 285 (36.3 per cent) were in Victoria
 - 1 753 (27.8 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 649 (10.3 per cent) in Western Australia; and
 - United Kingdom with 5 267 (8.6 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 1 419 (26.9 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 893 (17.0 per cent) in Western Australia and
 - 881 (16.7 per cent) in Queensland.
- The top source citizenship country in each Family Stream programme was:
 - China (excl SARs) with 5 366 (11.2 per cent) partner outcomes
 - o China (excl SARs) with 601 (15.6 per cent) child outcomes
 - China (excl SARs) with 4 329 (48.5 per cent) parent (incl. contributory) outcomes and
 - o Vietnam with 109 (18.6 per cent) other family outcomes.

Permanent additions

- Permanent additions to Australia's residential population include:
 - o people who are granted permanent residence status while already in Australia on a temporary visa
 - o people who arrive from overseas and are entitled to stay permanently in Australia
 - o people granted permanent migration visas and humanitarian visas both offshore and onshore and
 - Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identify themselves as settlers.
- In 2013-14, permanent additions to Australia's population totalled 239 036. Of all permanent additions:
 - o 41.2 per cent (98 431) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 81.0 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 66.5 per cent (128 744) were in the Skill Stream
 - 33.2 per cent (64 242) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.4 per cent (718) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - o 6.6 per cent (15 800) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 12.4 per cent (29 532) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.
- The top states/territories of intended residence for all permanent additions were:
 - New South Wales with 75 260 or 31.5 per cent
 - Victoria with 58 351 or 24.4 per cent and
 - Western Australia with 36 959 or 15.5 per cent.

Settler Arrivals

- During 2013-14, 140 605 settlers arrived in Australia. The top source countries of birth were:
 - o New Zealand with 19 929 (14.2 per cent) settler arrivals
 - o India with 19 512 (13.9 per cent) and
 - o China (excl SARs) with 17 339 (12.3 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In 2013-14, 86 780 persons departed permanently, of which:
 - o 14 278 (16.5 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - o 3 345 (3.9 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers
 - o 2 429 (2.8 per cent) were Community and Personal Service Workers and
 - 60 227 (69.4 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 40 566 (46.7 per cent) were Australian born compared to 46 214 (53.3 per cent) born overseas.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 1 542 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 13.6 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 1 542 grants, 840 (54.5 per cent) were primary and 702 (45.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - o Professionals with 564 (67.1 per cent) and
 - o Technicians and Trades Workers with 139 (16.5 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 6 848 Student visa grants in 2013-14; an increase of 1 627 (31.2 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 6 848 grants, 6 280 (91.7 per cent) were primary and 568 (8.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 4 982 (72.8 per cent) and
 - o Vocational Education and Training Sector with 522 (7.6 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 3386 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 1504 (44.4 per cent) were primary and 1882 (55.6 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 1 004 (66.8 per cent) and
 - Managers with 200 (13.3 per cent).

- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o India with 1 100 (32.5 per cent) and
 - o United Kingdom with 396 (11.7 per cent).

Family Stream

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 36 543 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 15.7 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 36 543 grants, 19 693 (53.9 per cent) were primary and 16 850 (46.1 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

Skill Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 34 589 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 17 473 (50.5 per cent) were primary and 17 116 (49.5 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 13 484 (77.2 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 2 092 (12.0 per cent).

- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o India with 9 369 (27.1 per cent) and
 - o China (excl SARs) with 4 771 (13.8 per cent).

Family Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 20 450 Family Stream outcomes, 17 362 (84.9 per cent) were primary and 3 088 (15.1 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o China (excl SARs) with 4 024 (19.7 per cent) and
 - o India with 1 753 (8.6 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In 2013-14, permanent additions to New South Wales's population totalled 75 260. Of all permanent additions:
 - 41.9 per cent (31 525) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - o 83.3 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 61.7 per cent (38 640) were in the Skill Stream
 - 38.0 per cent (23 787) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.4 per cent (247) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - o 7.7 per cent (5 782) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 9.0 per cent (6 804) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

Settler Arrivals

- During 2013-14, 43 735 settlers arrived in New South Wales. The top source countries of birth were:
 - o China (excl SARs) with 6 905 (15.8 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - o India with 6 744 (15.4 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In 2013-14, 32 816 persons departed permanently from New South Wales, of which:
 - o 5 752 (17.5 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - o 1 019 (3.1 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 22 613 (68.9 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 15 394 (46.9 per cent) were Australian born compared to 17 422 (53.1 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- There were 1 611 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 2.7 per cent increase compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 1 611 grants, 1 031 (64.0 per cent) were primary and 580 (36.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 505 (49.0 per cent) and
 - o Professionals with 311 (30.2 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 1 461 Student visa grants in 2013-14; an increase of 609 (71.5 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 1 461 grants, 1 181 (80.8 per cent) were primary and 280 (19.2 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - o Higher Education Sector with 1 260 (86.2 per cent) and
 - o Vocational Education and Training Sector with 72 (4.9 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 1796 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 846 (47.1 per cent) were primary and 950 (52.9 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 413 (48.8 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 228 (27.0 per cent).

 - o Technicians and Trades Workers with 2 205 (29.2 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 48 937 Student visa grants in 2013-14; an increase of 4 672 (10.6 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 48 937 grants, 43 774 (89.4 per cent) were primary and 5 163 (10.6 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - o Higher Education Sector with 23 404 (47.8 per cent) and
 - o Independent ELICOS Sector with 8 557 (17.5 per cent).

Skill Stream

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 3 272 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 17.4 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 3 272 grants, 1 658 (50.7 per cent) were primary and 1 614 (49.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - o Professionals with 749 (45.2 per cent) and
 - o Technicians and Trades Workers with 442 (26.7 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 14 595 Student visa grants in 2013-14; an increase of 1 406 (10.7 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 14 595 grants, 12 650 (86.7 per cent) were primary and 1 945 (13.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - o Higher Education Sector with 8 753 (60.0 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 2 333 (16.0 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 7980 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 3497 (43.8 per cent) were primary and 4483 (56.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 2 376 (67.9 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 558 (16.0 per cent).

- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o India with 2 357 (29.5 per cent) and
 - $\circ~$ China (excl SARs) with 1 088 (13.6 per cent).

Family Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 2 734 Family Stream outcomes, 2 273 (83.1 per cent) were primary and 461 (16.9 per cent) were secondary outcomes.

Permanent additions

 - o 10.3 per cent (1 370) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 4.1 per cent (546) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

Settler Arrivals

- During 2013-14, 8 624 settlers arrived in South Australia. The top source countries of birth were:
 - o India with 1 619 (18.8 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - o China (excl SARs) with 820 (9.5 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In 2013-14, 3 552 persons departed permanently from South Australia, of which:
 - o 604 (17.0 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - o 122 (3.4 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 2 469 (69.5 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 1 939 (54.6 per cent) were Australian born compared to 1 613 (45.4 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In 2013-14, 2 659 or 81.3 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Adelaide statistical division, a decrease of 16.6 per cent compared to the previous financial year.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 484 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2013-14; a 28.2 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 484 grants, 264 (54.5 per cent) were primary and 220 (45.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - o Professionals with 175 (66.3 per cent) and
 - o Technicians and Trades Workers with 49 (18.6 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 1 980 Student visa grants in 2013-14; a decrease of -113 (5.4 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 1 980 grants, 1 732 (87.5 per cent) were primary and 248 (12.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - o Higher Education Sector with 1 524 (77.0 per cent) and
 - o Non-Award Sector with 144 (7.3 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 768 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 359 (46.7 per cent) were primary and 409 (53.3 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - o Professionals with 241 (67.1 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 56 (15.6 per cent).

- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o China (excl SARs) with 163 (21.2 per cent) and
 - India with 148 (19.3 per cent).

Family Stream

- In 2013-14, there were 364 Family Stream outcomes, 310 (85.2 per cent) were primary and 54 (14.8 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - o Philippines with 42 (11.5 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 39 (10.7 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In 2013-14, permanent additions to Tasmania's population totalled 2 011. Of all permanent additions:
 - 34.5 per cent (694) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 53.3 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 64.2 per cent (688) were in the Skill Stream
 - 35.5 per cent (380) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.3 per cent (<5) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - o 41.0 per cent (824) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 5.8 per cent (116) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

Section 7 - Tasmania

Settler Arrivals

- During 2013-14, 1 317 settlers arrived in Tasmania. The top source countries of birth were:
 - o Afghanistan with 280 (21.3 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - o Iran with 200 (15.2 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In 2013-14, 772 persons departed permanently from Tasmania, of which:
 - o 133 (17.2 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - o 35 (4.5 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 544 (70.5 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 465 (60.2 per cent) were Australian born compared to 307 (39.8 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In 2013-14, 210 or 43.4 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Greater Hobart statistical division, a decrease of 24.2 per cent compared to the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 55.6 per cent (90) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Greater Hobart.
