# **State and territory migration summary**

30 June 2015



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## About this report

This report provides year to date data about permanent migration outcomes and temporary visa grants. The Skilled permanent migration outcomes are split by category, state/territory and statistical division of intended residence, country of citizenship and occupation. While the permanent migration Family outcomes are split by stream, state of intended residence and country of citizenship.

The temporary visa grants are split by visa major group and subclass, applicant type, and state/territory where available. Temporary Work (Skilled) visa grants is also split into statistical division and occupation.

The aim of this report is to assist governments and other stakeholders to identify trends, understand, plan for and manage migration in their regions.

# Definition of terms

1 November onshore:	A special class of visa, created in 1993, to provide permanent residency for certain asylum seekers already onshore at the time.
ANZSCO Major Group:	Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
Applicant type:	<p>Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are defined below.</p> <p>If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary applications', dependants (secondary applicants) are not included.</p>
Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP):	Superseding the Business Skills Programme, the Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP) is specifically designed to increase entrepreneurial talent and to improve business expertise in Australia.
Child visa:	The Child permanent visa category includes visas for dependent children, orphan relatives and adopted children.
Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Distinguished Talent visa:	The distinguished talent visa is a permanent visa for people nominated for migration on the basis of their internationally recognised record of exceptional and outstanding achievement in a profession, the arts, sport, research or academia.
Education provider registered state:	The education provider registered state is based on the student visa holder's confirmation of enrolment (CoE). Where more than one CoE is recorded on the visa application, the education provider registered state is based on the CoE with the highest course level. For secondary applicants, the registered state is based on the primary application.
Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS):	The Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) allows Australian employers to nominate employees who are foreign nationals for a permanent visa to work in Australia and fill a skilled occupation in their business.
English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS):	English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) (subclass 570) visa. This applies to stand-alone English language courses that lead to a certificate level award or non-formal award.

## Definition of terms (continued)

Foreign Affairs/Defence:	This visa (subclass 576) is designed for international students who are sponsored by Foreign Affairs (under the Australia Awards) or Defence to study a full-time course of any type in Australia.
General Skilled migration (GSM):	General skilled migration allows the permanent entry of persons who are not sponsored by an employer and who have skills in particular occupations required in Australia.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review grants.
Higher Education:	Higher Education (subclass 573) visa. This applies to bachelor degree, associate degree, higher education diploma, higher education advanced diploma, graduate certificate, graduate diploma or Masters by coursework.
Nominated occupation:	The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in Australia while holding the subclass 457 visa based on the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.
Nominated position location:	The state or territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.
Non Award:	Non Award (subclass 575) visa. This applies to non award foundation studies or other full time courses not leading to an Australian Award.
Other Family visa:	This visa group includes aged dependent relatives, remaining relatives and carer visas.
Outcomes:	Data on grants of permanent visas are migration programme outcomes. Outcomes are the number of visas granted net of Business Skills visas cancelled under s134 of the Migration Act 1958 and net of places taken by provisional spouse/fiance and interdependent visa holders who do not subsequently obtain permanent visas due to refusal or withdrawal.
Parent visa:	The Parent permanent visa category relates to people whose child is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen.
Partner visa:	The Partner category visa comprises the Prospective Marriage and Partner visa subclasses.
Permanent additions:	Permanent additions are defined as the number of settler arrivals plus the number of people granted permanent residence while in Australia on a temporary visa.
Permanent/provisional visa:	A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the Migration Programme.

## Definition of terms (continued)

Postgraduate Research:	Postgraduate Research (subclass 574) visa. This applies to Master's degree by research or Doctoral degree.
Primary applicant:	The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Migration Regulations.
Primary application:	An application lodged by a primary applicant.
Primary grant:	An outcome where a decision maker (which may include system generated decision making) makes an assessment based on the initial visa application which results in a visa being granted to an applicant.
Primary visa holder:	A person who has had a primary application for a visa granted.
Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS):	The regional sponsored migration scheme (RSMS) is specifically designed to assist regional employers to nominate skilled migrants to fill a full time vacancy (available for at least two years) when there is a genuine need for a paid employee in a business located in regional Australia.
Schools:	Schools (subclass 571) visa. This applies to primary, junior secondary or senior secondary school course or an approved secondary school exchange programme.
Secondary applicant:	Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the primary applicant.
Secondary application:	A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.
Secondary visa holder:	A person who has had a secondary application for a visa granted.
Settler arrivals:	Settler arrivals are defined as the number of permanent settlers arriving in Australia.
State of intended residence:	State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settler arrivals on passenger cards and permanent additions by the state or territory where they currently live. In the case of settler arrivals, this information does not necessarily relate to the state or territory in which the traveller will eventually establish a permanent residence.
Temporary Work (Skilled) (subclass 457):	A visa for a stay of up to four years for business purposes. Since 1 April 2005, medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a visa in this subclass.

## Definition of terms (continued)

Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa. Unless otherwise specified, the term covers both primary and secondary applicants.
Visa application:	An application lodged for a visa. A visa application may include both primary and secondary visa applicants.
Visitor visa:	Visitor visa subclasses are issued to non-permanent entrants to Australia, whose visa is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment.
Vocational Education and Training (VET):	Vocational Education and Training (subclass 572) visa. This applies to certificate, vocational education and training diploma, vocational education and training advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate or vocational graduate diploma courses.
Work and Holiday (subclass 462):	This visa is for young people who want to holiday and work in Australia for up to a year.
Working Holiday Maker (WHM):	Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa. These visas are aimed at young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and undertake short-term work and/or study.

# Section 1 - All states and territories

## Overview

Overall, there were a greater number of temporary and permanent migrants that moved to New South Wales, followed by Victoria. In the permanent Skilled stream, most Professionals and Managers moved to New South Wales, while most Technicians and Trades Workers moved to Western Australia.

India continues to be the top source country for permanent migrants, with China (excluding special administrative regions (SARs)) and the United Kingdom ranked second and third respectively.

Analysis of state preference for permanent migrants by nationality shows that the majority of Indian Skilled stream migrants went to New South Wales whereas the majority of Indian Family stream migrants went to Victoria. The majority of Chinese Skilled stream migrants moved to Victoria while the majority of Chinese Family stream migrants moved to New South Wales. For the United Kingdom, Western Australia was the top destination state for Skilled stream migrants, whereas New South Wales was the top destination state for Family stream migrants.

## Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 96,084 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2014-15; a 2.5 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of 457 visa grants in 2014-15 were:
  - New South Wales with 38.8 per cent of the total, or 37,276 visa grants
  - Victoria with 25.3 per cent or 24,354
  - Western Australia with 15.9 per cent or 15,244 and
  - Queensland with 13.1 per cent or 12,585.
- Compared to the previous financial year, the largest change in 457 visa grants were for:
  - Queensland down 14.6 per cent or -2151 visa grants
  - Tasmania down 12.2 per cent or -59 and
  - Northern Territory down 10.7 per cent or -173.
- Of the 96,084 grants, 51,125 (53.2 per cent) were primary and 44,959 (46.8 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

## Student visa

- There were 299,540 Student visa grants in 2014-15; an increase of 7480 (2.6 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in 2014-15 were:
  - New South Wales with 36.2 per cent of the total, or 108,518 visa grants
  - Victoria with 25.3 per cent or 75,751 and
  - Queensland with 16.6 per cent or 49,613.
- Of the 299,540 grants, 259,791 (86.7 per cent) were primary and 39,749 (13.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

## Section 1 - All states and territories

- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in 2014-15 were:
  - Higher Education with 50.6 per cent of the total, or 151,713 visa grants, of which:
    - 54,384 visa grants (35.8 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 44,540 visa grants (29.4 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 20,372 visa grants (13.4 per cent) in Queensland;
  - VET with 21.9 per cent or 65,690 visa grants, of which:
    - 27,990 visa grants (42.6 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 14,845 visa grants (22.6 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 11,004 visa grants (16.8 per cent) in Queensland; and
  - ELICOS with 11.1 per cent or 33,215 visa grants, of which:
    - 14,005 visa grants (42.2 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 8814 visa grants (26.5 per cent) in Queensland and
    - 5966 visa grants (18.0 per cent) in Victoria.

### Working Holiday Maker and Visitor visa

- There were 214,830 Working Holiday visa grants in 2014-15, down 6.3 per cent compared to the previous financial year. This was driven by a decline in first visa grants down 5.4 per cent or -9937 visa grants compared to the previous financial year. This was contributed to by a decline in second visa grants down 10.0 per cent or -4611 visa grants compared to the previous financial year.
- There were 11,982 Work and Holiday visa grants in 2014-15, up 17.3 per cent compared to the previous financial year. During 2014-15 visa grants to the citizens of Poland, Portugal and Spain were granted for the first time, and equated to 701 visas or 40 per cent of the increase in visa grants.
- There were 4,308,107 Visitor visa grants in 2014-15, up 8.0 per cent compared to the previous financial year. This was driven by an increase in Tourist visa grants up 8.6 per cent or 306,187 and Business visa grants up 2.7 per cent or 11,661.

### Skill stream

- There were 127,774 Skill stream outcomes in 2014-15, of which the state/territory of nomination/intended residence was:
  - New South Wales with 36,509 Skill stream outcomes (28.6 per cent) of which:
    - 20,716 Skill stream outcomes (56.7 per cent) were General Skilled Migration (GSM)
    - 13,775 (37.7 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) and
    - 1153 (3.2 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS);
  - Victoria with 29,630 (23.2 per cent) of which:
    - 16,263 Skill stream outcomes (54.9 per cent) were GSM
    - 7838 (26.5 per cent) were ENS and
    - 4329 (14.6 per cent) were Business Innovation and Investment programme (BIIP);
  - Western Australia with 20,216 (15.8 per cent) of which:
    - 7518 Skill stream outcomes (37.2 per cent) were GSM
    - 7123 (35.2 per cent) were ENS and
    - 4909 (24.3 per cent) were RSMS; and
  - State/territory not specified with 9869 (7.7 per cent) of which 96.8 per cent (9551 outcomes) were in GSM.

  - India with 28,600 (22.4 per cent) Skill stream outcomes, of which:
    - 7844 (27.4 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 7377 (25.8 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 3133 (11.0 per cent) in South Australia;
  - China (excl SARs) with 16,834 (13.2 per cent) Skill stream outcomes, of which:
    - 6496 (38.6 per cent) were in Victoria
    - 5680 (33.7 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 1351 (8.0 per cent) in Queensland; and
  - United Kingdom with 16,254 (12.7 per cent) Skill stream outcomes, of which:
    - 4657 (28.7 per cent) were in Western Australia
    - 4242 (26.1 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 2719 (16.7 per cent) in Victoria.
- Skill stream outcomes top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 39,930 (67.1 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 13,765 (34.5 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 9513 (23.8 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 4514 (11.3 per cent) in Western Australia;
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 9905 (16.7 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 2813 (28.4 per cent) were in Western Australia
    - 2176 (22.0 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 1927 (19.5 per cent) in Victoria; and
  - Managers with 5357 (9.0 per cent) outcomes, of which:
    - 1498 (28.0 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 939 (17.5 per cent) in Victoria and
    - 913 (17.0 per cent) in Western Australia.
- The top source citizenship country in each Skill stream programme was:
  - India with 20,290 (27.9 per cent) General Skilled Migration outcomes
  - United Kingdom with 8812 (24.6 per cent) Employer Nomination Scheme outcomes
  - India with 3079 (24.9 per cent) Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme outcomes and
  - China (excl SARs) with 4870 (75.1 per cent) Business Innovation and Investment Programme outcomes.

## Family stream

- There were 61,085 Family stream outcomes in 2014-15, of which the state/territory of intended residence was:
  - New South Wales with 20,200 (33.1 per cent) Family stream outcomes, of which:
    - 15,265 (75.6 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 3739 (18.5 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 965 (4.8 per cent) were Child;
  - Victoria with 15,677 (25.7 per cent) Family stream outcomes, of which:
    - 12,316 (78.6 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 2495 (15.9 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 749 (4.8 per cent) were Child; and
  - Queensland with 7496 (12.3 per cent) Family stream outcomes, of which:
    - 6136 (81.9 per cent) were Partner outcomes
    - 883 (11.8 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
    - 452 (6.0 per cent) were Child.

    - 4078 (37.0 per cent) were in New South Wales

    - 2630 (23.9 per cent) did not specify a state/territory;
  - India with 6262 (10.3 per cent) Family stream outcomes, of which:
    - 2248 (35.9 per cent) were in Victoria
    - 1784 (28.5 per cent) in New South Wales and
    - 723 (11.5 per cent) in Western Australia; and
  - United Kingdom with 4786 (7.8 per cent) Family stream outcomes, of which:
    - 1201 (25.1 per cent) were in New South Wales
    - 806 (16.8 per cent) in Victoria
    - 735 (15.4 per cent) in Queensland and
    - 1019 (21.3 per cent) did not specify a state/territory.
- The top source citizenship country in each Family stream programme was:
  - China (excl SARs) with 5631 (11.8 per cent) Partner outcomes
  - China (excl SARs) with 687 (16.6 per cent) Child outcomes
  - China (excl SARs) with 4658 (53.7 per cent) Parent (incl. contributory) outcomes and
  - Vietnam with 109 (24.2 per cent) other Family outcomes.

- Of the 37,276 grants, 20,389 (54.7 per cent) were primary and 16,887 (45.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 12,095 (59.3 per cent) and
  - Managers with 4192 (20.6 per cent).

### Student visa

  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 342 (41.2 per cent) and
  - Professionals with 301 (36.3 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 1616 Student visa grants in 2014-15; an increase of 100 (6.6 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 1616 grants, 1350 (83.5 per cent) were primary and 266 (16.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

- Skill stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 2957 (20.1 per cent) and
  - United Kingdom with 2317 (15.7 per cent).

- In 2014-15, there were 7496 Family stream outcomes, 6487 (86.5 per cent) were primary and 1009 (13.5 per cent) were secondary outcomes.

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 3108 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2014-15; a 5.0 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 3108 grants, 1529 (49.2 per cent) were primary and 1579 (50.8 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 719 (47.0 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 352 (23.0 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 14,968 Student visa grants in 2014-15; a decrease of -157 (1.0 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 14,968 grants, 13,146 (87.8 per cent) were primary and 1822 (12.2 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education with 9282 (62.0 per cent) and
  - VET with 2346 (15.7 per cent).

### Skill stream

- In 2014-15, there were 10,701 Skill stream outcomes, of which 4596 (42.9 per cent) were primary and 6105 (57.1 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 2926 (63.7 per cent) and
  - Managers with 769 (16.7 per cent).

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 425 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2014-15; a 12.2 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 425 grants, 248 (58.4 per cent) were primary and 177 (41.6 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 178 (71.8 per cent) and
  - Managers with 31 (12.5 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 2818 Student visa grants in 2014-15; an increase of 598 (26.9 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 2818 grants, 2341 (83.1 per cent) were primary and 477 (16.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education with 2157 (76.5 per cent) and
  - Postgrad Research with 210 (7.5 per cent).

### Skill stream

- In 2014-15, there were 679 Skill stream outcomes, of which 347 (51.1 per cent) were primary and 332 (48.9 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 257 (74.1 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 37 (10.7 per cent).
- Skill stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - China (excl SARs) with 160 (23.6 per cent) and
  - India with 101 (14.9 per cent).

### Family stream

## Section 8 - Victoria

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 24,354 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2014-15; a 4.0 per cent increase compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 24,354 grants, 12,664 (52.0 per cent) were primary and 11,690 (48.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Professionals with 7073 (55.9 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 2946 (23.3 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 75,751 Student visa grants in 2014-15; a decrease of -1452 (1.9 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 75,751 grants, 68,840 (90.9 per cent) were primary and 6911 (9.1 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education with 44,540 (58.8 per cent) and
  - VET with 14,845 (19.6 per cent).

### Skill stream

- In 2014-15, there were 29,630 Skill stream outcomes, of which 13,880 (46.8 per cent) were primary and 15,750 (53.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 9513 (68.5 per cent) and
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 1927 (13.9 per cent).
- Skill stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
  - India with 7377 (24.9 per cent) and
  - China (excl SARs) with 6496 (21.9 per cent).

### Family stream

- In 2014-15, there were 15,677 Family stream outcomes, 13,246 (84.5 per cent) were primary and 2431 (15.5 per cent) were secondary outcomes.

### Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 15,244 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in 2014-15; a 9.6 per cent decrease compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 15,244 grants, 8238 (54.0 per cent) were primary and 7006 (46.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
  - Technicians and Trades Workers with 3427 (41.6 per cent) and
  - Professionals with 3044 (37.0 per cent).

### Student visa

- There were 22,237 Student visa grants in 2014-15; a decrease of -416 (1.8 per cent) compared to the previous financial year.
- Of the 22,237 grants, 19,083 (85.8 per cent) were primary and 3154 (14.2 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
  - Higher Education with 9890 (44.5 per cent) and
  - VET with 6388 (28.7 per cent).

### Skill stream

- In 2014-15, there were 20,216 Skill stream outcomes, of which 9066 (44.8 per cent) were primary and 11,150 (55.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
  - Professionals with 4514 (49.8 per cent) and
