State and territory migration summary

30 September 2014





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About this report

This report provides year to date data about permanent and temporary migration by state/territory and statistical division where available. It aims to assist state/territory/regional governments and other stakeholders to better plan for and manage migration in their regions.

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data currently in legacy systems is being migrated to newer systems leading to improvements in output. Data is dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, data from the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

This report will be developed over time to increase and improve information sharing about the various visa programmes by state/territory.

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Definition of terms

1 November onshore:	A special class of visa, created in 1993, to provide permanent residency for certain asylum seekers already onshore at the time.
ANZSCO Major Group:	Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
Applicant type:	<p>Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are defined below.</p> <p>If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary applications', dependants (secondary applicants) are not included.</p>
AusAID/Defence:	This visa (subclass 576) is designed for international students who are sponsored by AusAID (under the Australia Awards) or Defence to study a full-time course of any type in Australia.
Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP):	Superseding the Business Skills Programme, the Business Innovation and Investment Programme (BIIP) is specifically designed to increase entrepreneurial talent and to improve business expertise in Australia.
Child visa:	The child permanent visa category includes visas for dependent children, orphan relatives and adopted children.
Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Distinguished talent visa:	The distinguished talent visa is a permanent visa for people nominated for migration on the basis of their internationally recognised record of exceptional and outstanding achievement in a profession, the arts, sport, research or academia.
Education provider registered state:	The education provider registered state is based on the student visa holder's confirmation of enrolment (CoE). Where more than one CoE is recorded on the visa application, the education provider registered state is based on the CoE with the highest course level. For secondary applicants, the registered state is based on the primary application.
Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS):	The Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) allows Australian employers to nominate employees who are foreign nationals for a permanent visa to work in Australia and fill a skilled occupation in their business.
English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS):	English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) (subclass 570) visa. This applies to stand-alone English language courses that leads to a certificate level award or non-formal award.
General Skilled migration:	General skilled migration allows the permanent entry of persons who are not sponsored by an employer and who have skills in particular occupations required in Australia.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review grants.

Definition of terms (continued)

Higher Education:	Higher Education (subclass 573) visa. This applies to bachelor degree, associate degree, higher education diploma, higher education advanced diploma, graduate certificate, graduate diploma or Masters by coursework.
Nominated occupation:	The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in Australia while holding the subclass 457 visa based on the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.
Nominated position location:	The state or territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.
Non Award:	Non Award (subclass 575) visa. This applies to non award foundation studies or other full time courses not leading to an Australian Award.
Other Family visa:	This visa group includes aged dependent relatives, remaining relatives and carer visas.
Outcomes:	Data on grants of permanent visas are Migration Programme outcomes. Outcomes are the number of visas granted net of Business Skills visas cancelled under s134 of the Migration Act 1958 and net of places taken by provision spouse/fiance and interdependent visa holders who do not subsequently obtain permanent visas due to refusal or withdrawal.
Parent visa:	The parent permanent visa category relates to people, whose child is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen.
Partner visa:	The partner category visa comprises the prospective marriage and partner visa subclasses.
Permanent additions:	Permanent additions are defined as the number of settler arrivals plus the number of people granted permanent residence while in Australia on a temporary visa.
Permanent/provisional visa:	A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the Migration Programme.
Postgraduate Research:	Postgraduate Research (subclass 574) visa. This applies to Master's degree by research or Doctoral degree.
Primary applicant:	The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Migration Regulations.
Primary application:	An application lodged by a primary applicant.
Primary grant:	An outcome where a decision maker (which may include system generated decision making) makes an assessment based on the initial visa application which results in a visa being granted to an applicant.
Primary visa holder:	A person who has had a primary application for a visa granted.
Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS):	The regional sponsored migration scheme (RSMS) is specifically designed to assist regional employers to nominate skilled migrants to fill a full time vacancy (available for at least two years) when there is a genuine need for a paid employee in a business located in regional Australia.

Definition of terms (continued)

Schools:	Schools (subclass 571) visa. This applies to primary, junior secondary or senior secondary school course or an approved secondary school exchange programme.
Secondary applicant:	Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the primary applicant.
Secondary application:	A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.
Secondary visa holder:	A person who has had a secondary application for a visa granted.
Settler arrivals:	Settler arrivals are defined as the number of permanent settlers arriving in Australia.
State of intended residence:	State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settler arrivals on passenger cards and permanent additions by the state or territory where they currently live. In the case of settler arrivals, this information does not necessarily relate to the state or territory in which the traveller will eventually establish a permanent residence.
Temporary Work (Skilled) (subclass 457):	A visa for a stay of up to four years for business purposes. Since 1 April 2005, medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a visa in this subclass.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa. Unless otherwise specified, the term covers both primary and secondary applicants.
Visa application:	An application lodged for a visa. A visa application may include both primary and secondary visa applicants.
Visitor visa:	Visitor visa subclasses are issued to non-permanent entrants to Australia, whose visa is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment.
Vocational Education and Training:	Vocational Education and Training (subclass 572) visa. This applies to certificate, vocational education and training diploma, vocational education and training advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate or vocational graduate diploma courses.
Working Holiday Maker:	Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa. These visas are aimed at young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and undertake short-term work and/or study.

Section 1 - All States and Territories

Overview

New South Wales led in attracting both temporary and permanent migrants for most visa categories, followed by Victoria. New South Wales attracted the largest share of Professionals, and Managers, while Western Australia attracted the largest share of Technicians and Trades Workers in the permanent Skilled Stream.

India continues to be the top source country for permanent migrants, with China and the United Kingdom ranked second and third respectively.

Analysis of state preference for permanent migrants by nationality shows that the majority of Indian Skilled Stream migrants went to New South Wales whereas the majority of Indian Family Stream migrants went to Victoria. The majority of Chinese Skilled Stream migrants moved to Victoria while the majority of Chinese Family Stream migrants moved to New South Wales. For the United Kingdom, Western Australia was the top destination state for Skilled Stream migrants, whereas New South Wales was the top destination state for Family Stream migrants.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 25,308 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 0.8 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15 were:
 - New South Wales with 36.5 per cent of the total, or 9230 visa grants
 - Victoria with 24.9 per cent or 6305
 - Western Australia with 16.7 per cent or 4234 and
 - Queensland with 14.4 per cent or 3654.
- Compared to the same period in the previous financial year, the largest change in 457 visa grants were for:
 - Tasmania down 37.6 per cent or 50 visa grants
 - Northern Territory up 14.5 per cent or 51 and
 - Victoria up 10.8 per cent or 613.
- Of the 25,308 grants, 13,750 (54.3 per cent) were primary and 11,558 (45.7 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

Student visa

- There were 74,544 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; an increase of 1788 (2.5 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- The states/territories with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15 were:
 - New South Wales with 38.0 per cent of the total, or 28,320 visa grants
 - Victoria with 23.7 per cent or 17,695 and
 - Queensland with 16.6 per cent or 12,362.
- Of the 74,544 grants, 64,570 (86.6 per cent) were primary and 9974 (13.4 per cent) were secondary visa grants.

Section 1 - All States and Territories

- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15 were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 53.0 per cent of the total, or 39,521 visa grants, of which:
 - 14,568 visa grants (36.9 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 10,696 visa grants (27.1 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 5615 visa grants (14.2 per cent) in Queensland;
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 22.3 per cent or 16,608 visa grants, of which:
 - 7483 visa grants (45.1 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 3600 visa grants (21.7 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 2690 visa grants (16.2 per cent) in Queensland; and
 - Independent ELICOS Sector with 12.0 per cent or 8969 visa grants, of which:
 - 3914 visa grants (43.6 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 2412 visa grants (26.9 per cent) in Queensland and
 - 1495 visa grants (16.7 per cent) in Victoria.

Working Holiday Maker and Visitor visa

- There were 62,614 Working Holiday visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15, down 12.2 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was driven by a decline in first visa grants down 15.6 per cent or (9477) visa grants compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was offset by an increase in second visa grants up 7.2 per cent or 768 visa grants compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- There were 3067 Working and Holiday visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15, up 8.3 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- There were 997,518 Visitor visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15, up 4.6 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year. This was driven by an increase in Tourist visa grants up 4.0 per cent or 33,374. This was contributed to by eVisitor Tourist up by 10.6 percent, or 12,368 and Tourist Visitor up 7.1 per cent or 17,472.

Skill Stream

- There were 34,885 Skill Stream outcomes in the first quarter of 2014-15, where the state/territory of nomination/intended residence was:
 - New South Wales with 9902 Skill Stream outcomes (28.4 per cent) of which:
 - 5595 Skill Stream outcomes (56.5 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 3677 (37.1 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 364 (3.7 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme;
 - Victoria with 7303 (20.9 per cent) of which:
 - 3973 Skill Stream outcomes (54.4 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 1981 (27.1 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 1036 (14.2 per cent) were Business Innovation and Investment Programme;
 - Western Australia with 5804 (16.6 per cent) of which:
 - 2551 Skill Stream outcomes (44.0 per cent) were General Skilled Migration
 - 1954 (33.7 per cent) were Employer Nomination Scheme and
 - 1167 (20.1 per cent) were Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme; and
 - State/territory not specified with 2428 (7.0 per cent) of which 95.8 per cent (2327 outcomes) were in General Skilled Migration.

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- The top source citizenship countries for the Skill Stream programme were:
 - India with 8077 (23.2 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 2372 (29.4 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 1854 (23.0 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 921 (11.4 per cent) in South Australia;
 - United Kingdom with 4603 (13.2 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 1231 (26.7 per cent) were in Western Australia
 - 1130 (24.5 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 814 (17.7 per cent) in Victoria; and
 - China (excl SARs) with 4047 (11.6 per cent) Skill Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 1540 (38.1 per cent) were in Victoria
 - 1353 (33.4 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 333 (8.2 per cent) in Queensland.
- Skill Stream outcomes top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 10,709 (66.5 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 3647 (34.1 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 2365 (22.1 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 1337 (12.5 per cent) in Western Australia;
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 2864 (17.8 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 815 (28.5 per cent) were in Western Australia
 - 630 (22.0 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 480 (16.8 per cent) in Victoria; and
 - Managers with 1476 (9.2 per cent) outcomes, of which:
 - 382 (25.9 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 292 (19.8 per cent) in Victoria and
 - 277 (18.8 per cent) in Western Australia.
- The top source citizenship country in each Skill Stream programme was:
 - India with 6191 (30.5 per cent) General Skilled Migration outcomes
 - United Kingdom with 2500 (25.9 per cent) Employer Nomination Scheme outcomes
 - India with 789 (24.3 per cent) Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme outcomes and
 - China (excl SARs) with 1259 (79.4 per cent) Business Innovation and Investment Programme outcomes.

Family Stream

- There were 15,635 Family Stream outcomes in the first quarter of 2014-15, of which the states of intended residence were:
 - New South Wales with 4924 (31.5 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 3679 (74.7 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 965 (19.6 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
 - 263 (5.3 per cent) were Child;
 - Victoria with 3737 (23.9 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 2894 (77.4 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 653 (17.5 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory) and
 - 182 (4.9 per cent) were Child; and
 - Not Specified with 1974 (12.6 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 1597 (80.9 per cent) were Partner outcomes
 - 314 (15.9 per cent) were Child and
 - 63 (3.2 per cent) were Parent (incl. contributory).

- The top source citizenship countries for the Family Stream programme were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 2869 (18.3 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 994 (34.6 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 566 (19.7 per cent) in Victoria
 - 200 (7.0 per cent) in Queensland and
 - 853 (29.7 per cent) did not specify a state/territory;
 - India with 1533 (9.8 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 580 (37.8 per cent) were in Victoria
 - 412 (26.9 per cent) in New South Wales and
 - 180 (11.7 per cent) in Western Australia; and
 - United Kingdom with 1330 (8.5 per cent) Family Stream outcomes, of which:
 - 309 (23.2 per cent) were in New South Wales
 - 257 (19.3 per cent) in Western Australia
 - 201 (15.1 per cent) in Queensland and
 - 265 (19.9 per cent) did not specify a state/territory.
- The top source citizenship country in each Family Stream programme was:
 - China (excl SARs) with 1560 (12.7 per cent) partner outcomes
 - China (excl SARs) with 180 (16.5 per cent) child outcomes
 - China (excl SARs) with 1126 (49.4 per cent) parent (incl. contributory) outcomes and
 - Lebanon with 8 (32.0 per cent) other family outcomes.

Permanent additions

- Permanent additions to Australia's residential population include:
 - people who are granted permanent residence status while already in Australia on a temporary visa
 - people who arrive from overseas and are entitled to stay permanently in Australia
 - people granted permanent migration visas and humanitarian visas both offshore and onshore and
 - Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identify themselves as settlers.
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to Australia's population totalled 59,563. Of all permanent additions:
 - 46.5 per cent (27,706) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 80.7 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 68.2 per cent (32,799) were in the Skill Stream
 - 31.5 per cent (15,150) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.2 per cent (116) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 10.0 per cent (5971) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 9.3 per cent (5527) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.
- The top states/territories of intended residence for all permanent additions were:
 - New South Wales with 20,196 or 33.9 per cent
 - Victoria with 15,408 or 25.9 per cent and
 - Western Australia with 9218 or 15.5 per cent.

Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 31,857 settlers arrived in Australia. The top source countries of birth were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 4607 (14.5 per cent) settler arrivals
 - India with 4604 (14.5 per cent) and
 - New Zealand with 3576 (11.2 per cent).

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Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 21,101 persons departed permanently, of which:
 - 3267 (15.5 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 692 (3.3 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers
 - 514 (2.4 per cent) were Community and Personal Service Workers and
 - 15,206 (72.1 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 9908 (47.0 per cent) were Australian born compared to 11,193 (53.0 per cent) born overseas.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 434 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 2.1 per cent increase compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 434 grants, 221 (50.9 per cent) were primary and 213 (49.1 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 148 (67.0 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 41 (18.6 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 2234 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; an increase of 726 (48.1 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 2234 grants, 2082 (93.2 per cent) were primary and 152 (6.8 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 1782 (79.8 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 208 (9.3 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 1260 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 538 (42.7 per cent) were primary and 722 (57.3 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 410 (76.2 per cent) and
 - Managers with 56 (10.4 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 469 (37.2 per cent) and
 - Pakistan with 106 (8.4 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 289 Family Stream outcomes, 247 (85.5 per cent) were primary and 42 (14.5 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 51 (17.6 per cent) and
 - India with 47 (16.3 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to the Australian Capital Territory's population totalled 1079. Of all permanent additions:
 - 49.5 per cent (534) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 88.4 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 74.8 per cent (714) were in the Skill Stream

 - 6.7 per cent (72) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 4.9 per cent (53) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 336 persons departed permanently from the Australian Capital Territory, of which:

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Section 3 NSW

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Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 9230 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 3.2 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 9230 grants, 5127 (55.5 per cent) were primary and 4 103 (44.5 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 3076 (60.0 per cent) and
 - Managers with 1033 (20.1 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 28,320 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; an increase of 2999 (11.8 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 28,320 grants, 25,474 (90.0 per cent) were primary and 2846 (10.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 14,568 (51.4 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 7483 (26.4 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 9902 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 4910 (49.6 per cent) were primary and 4992 (50.4 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 3647 (74.3 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 630 (12.8 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 2372 (24.0 per cent) and
 - China (excl SARs) with 1353 (13.7 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 4924 Family Stream outcomes, 4153 (84.3 per cent) were primary and 771 (15.7 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 994 (20.2 per cent) and
 - India with 412 (8.4 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to New South Wales's population totalled 20,196. Of all permanent additions:
 - 48.0 per cent (9692) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 80.8 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 66.0 per cent (10,776) were in the Skill Stream
 - 33.7 per cent (5502) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.3 per cent (42) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 12.9 per cent (2600) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 6.3 per cent (1276) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 10,504 settlers arrived in New South Wales. The top source countries of birth were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 1901 (18.1 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - India with 1693 (16.1 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 7658 persons departed permanently from New South Wales, of which:
 - 1330 (17.4 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 198 (2.6 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 5391 (70.4 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 3574 (46.7 per cent) were Australian born compared to 4084 (53.3 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 8435 or 91.4 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Sydney statistical division, a decrease of 2.2 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 85.3 per cent (1677) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Sydney.

Sydney

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Sydney were:
 - Professionals with 2918 (61.6 per cent) and
 - Managers with 972 (20.5 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Sydney were:
 - Professionals with 919 (54.8 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 333 (19.9 per cent).

Hunter

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Hunter were:
 - Professionals with 50 (61.7 per cent) and
 - Managers with 14 (17.3 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Hunter were:
 - Professionals with 48 (57.8 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 20 (24.1 per cent).

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Illawarra

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Illawarra were:
 - Professionals with 30 (51.7 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 17 (29.3 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Illawarra were:
 - Professionals with 16 (48.5 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 11 (33.3 per cent).

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 402 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 14.5 per cent increase compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 402 grants, 234 (58.2 per cent) were primary and 168 (41.8 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 108 (46.2 per cent) and
 - Professionals with 76 (32.5 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 495 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; an increase of 71 (16.7 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 495 grants, 421 (85.1 per cent) were primary and 74 (14.9 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 455 (91.9 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 21 (4.2 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 626 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 289 (46.2 per cent) were primary and 337 (53.8 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 132 (45.7 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 79 (27.3 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 152 (24.3 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 86 (13.7 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 180 Family Stream outcomes, 157 (87.2 per cent) were primary and 23 (12.8 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - Philippines with 39 (21.7 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 17 (9.4 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to the Northern Territory's population totalled 787. Of all permanent additions:
 - 57.3 per cent (451) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 92.8 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 70.0 per cent (511) were in the Skill Stream
 - 30.0 per cent (219) were in the Family Stream and
 - 2.0 per cent (16) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 5.2 per cent (41) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 336 settlers arrived in the Northern Territory. The top source countries of birth were:
 - India with 56 (16.7 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - Philippines with 50 (14.9 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 161 persons departed permanently from the Northern Territory, of which:
 - 23 (14.3 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 12 (7.5 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 113 (70.2 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 72 (44.7 per cent) were Australian born compared to 89 (55.3 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 347 or 86.3 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Darwin statistical division, an increase of 28.0 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- In contrast to the subclass 457 visa grants, 64.3 per cent (72) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Darwin.

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 3654 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 7.9 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 3654 grants, 1 966 (53.8 per cent) were primary and 1688 (46.2 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 918 (46.7 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 483 (24.6 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 12,362 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a decrease of (50) (0.4 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 12,362 grants, 10 968 (88.7 per cent) were primary and 1394 (11.3 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 5615 (45.4 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 2690 (21.8 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 4192 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 1877 (44.8 per cent) were primary and 2315 (55.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 1083 (57.7 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 468 (24.9 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 763 (18.2 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 667 (15.9 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 1934 Family Stream outcomes, 1703 (88.1 per cent) were primary and 231 (11.9 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - United Kingdom with 201 (10.4 per cent) and
 - China (excl SARs) with 200 (10.3 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to Queensland's population totalled 8831. Of all permanent additions:
 - 48.4 per cent (4277) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 73.0 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 65.1 per cent (4198) were in the Skill Stream
 - 34.9 per cent (2251) were in the Family Stream and
 - 7.7 per cent (684) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 19.2 per cent (1698) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 4554 settlers arrived in Queensland. The top source countries of birth were:
 - New Zealand with 1248 (27.4 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - United Kingdom with 469 (10.3 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 4722 persons departed permanently from Queensland, of which:
 - 622 (13.2 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 191 (4.0 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 3465 (73.4 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 2267 (48.0 per cent) were Australian born compared to 2455 (52.0 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 2161 or 59.1 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Brisbane statistical division, a decrease of 6.2 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 50.1 per cent (524) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Brisbane.

Brisbane

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Brisbane were:

Section 6 - South Australia

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 814 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 4.9 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 814 grants, 399 (49.0 per cent) were primary and 415 (51.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 177 (44.4 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 101 (25.3 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 3543 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a decrease of (278) (7.3 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 3543 grants, 3133 (88.4 per cent) were primary and 410 (11.6 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 2274 (64.2 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 509 (14.4 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 3159 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 1312 (41.5 per cent) were primary and 1847 (58.5 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 812 (61.9 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 207 (15.8 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 921 (29.2 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 363 (11.5 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 743 Family Stream outcomes, 623 (83.8 per cent) were primary and 120 (16.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 92 (12.4 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 80 (10.8 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to South Australia's population totalled 3259. Of all permanent additions:
 - 45.2 per cent (1474) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 87.4 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 71.2 per cent (2026) were in the Skill Stream
 - 28.8 per cent (820) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.0 per cent (<5) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 9.1 per cent (295) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 3.6 per cent (117) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

Section 6 - South Australia

Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 1785 settlers arrived in South Australia. The top source countries of birth were:
 - India with 344 (19.3 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - United Kingdom with 207 (11.6 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 815 persons departed permanently from South Australia, of which:
 - 124 (15.2 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 29 (3.6 per cent) were Community and Personal Service Workers and
 - 588 (72.1 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 436 (53.5 per cent) were Australian born compared to 379 (46.5 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 678 or 83.3 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Adelaide statistical division, a decrease of 1.7 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 81.8 per cent (171) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Adelaide.

Adelaide

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Adelaide were:
 - Professionals with 162 (50.3 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 70 (21.7 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Adelaide were:
 - Professionals with 61 (35.7 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 53 (31.0 per cent).

South East

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in South East were:
 - Non Labour Force/Other with 21 (72.4 per cent) and
 - Professionals with 6 (20.7 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in South East were:
 - Managers with <5 (50.0 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Non Labour Force/Other with <5 (50.0 per cent).

Section 7 - Tasmania

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 83 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 37.6 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 83 grants, 44 (53.0 per cent) were primary and 39 (47.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 34 (77.3 per cent) and
 - Managers with 5 (11.4 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 575 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; an increase of 132 (29.8 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 575 grants, 451 (78.4 per cent) were primary and 124 (21.6 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 478 (83.1 per cent) and
 - Postgraduate Research Sector with 46 (8.0 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 211 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 105 (49.8 per cent) were primary and 106 (50.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 76 (72.4 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 14 (13.3 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 49 (23.2 per cent) and
 - United Kingdom with 39 (18.5 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 117 Family Stream outcomes, 102 (87.2 per cent) were primary and 15 (12.8 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 17 (14.5 per cent) and
 - Philippines with 13 (11.1 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to Tasmania's population totalled 412. Of all permanent additions:
 - 54.6 per cent (225) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 78.9 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 59.4 per cent (193) were in the Skill Stream
 - 39.7 per cent (129) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.9 per cent (<5) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 13.6 per cent (56) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 7.5 per cent (31) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 187 settlers arrived in Tasmania. The top source countries of birth were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 24 (12.8 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - New Zealand with 23 (12.3 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 171 persons departed permanently from Tasmania, of which:
 - 24 (14.0 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 8 (4.7 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 126 (73.7 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 103 (60.2 per cent) were Australian born compared to 68 (39.8 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 47 or 56.6 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Greater Hobart statistical division, a decrease of 2.1 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 61.9 per cent (26) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Greater Hobart.

Greater Hobart

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Greater Hobart were:
 - Professionals with 18 (78.3 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with <5 (13.0 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Greater Hobart were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 9 (34.6 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Professionals with 8 (30.8 per cent).

Mersey-Lyell

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Mersey-Lyell were:
 - Professionals with 9 (75.0 per cent) and
 - Managers with <5 (16.7 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Mersey-Lyell were:

Victoria

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Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa

- There were 6305 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 10.8 per cent increase compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 6305 grants, 3338 (52.9 per cent) were primary and 2967 (47.1 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Professionals with 1912 (57.3 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 779 (23.3 per cent).

Student visa

- There were 17,695 Student visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a decrease of (1647) (8.5 per cent) compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 17,695 grants, 16,094 (91.0 per cent) were primary and 1601 (9.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The education sectors with the largest proportion of Student visa grants were:
 - Higher Education Sector with 10,696 (60.4 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 3600 (20.3 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 7303 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 3436 (47.0 per cent) were primary and 3867 (53.0 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 2365 (68.8 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 480 (14.0 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 1854 (25.4 per cent) and
 - China (excl SARs) with 1540 (21.1 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 3737 Family Stream outcomes, 3170 (84.8 per cent) were primary and 567 (15.2 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - India with 580 (15.5 per cent) and
 - China (excl SARs) with 566 (15.1 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to Victoria's population totalled 15,408. Of all permanent additions:
 - 39.2 per cent (6043) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 78.4 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 65.7 per cent (7934) were in the Skill Stream
 - 34.2 per cent (4128) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.1 per cent (18) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 11.5 per cent (1769) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 10.1 per cent (1559) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 9365 settlers arrived in Victoria. The top source countries of birth were:
 - China (excl SARs) with 1795 (19.2 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - India with 1535 (16.4 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 4387 persons departed permanently from Victoria, of which:
 - 684 (15.6 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 104 (2.4 per cent) were Managers and
 - 3247 (74.0 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 2133 (48.6 per cent) were Australian born compared to 2254 (51.4 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 5821 or 92.3 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Melbourne statistical division, an increase of 12.6 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Similar to the subclass 457 visa grants, 85.4 per cent (919) of primary Employer Sponsored outcomes went to Melbourne.

Melbourne

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Melbourne were:
 - Professionals with 1800 (58.1 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 697 (22.5 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Melbourne were:
 - Professionals with 435 (47.3 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 303 (33.0 per cent).

Barwon

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Barwon were:
 - Professionals with 20 (45.5 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 17 (38.6 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Barwon were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 19 (57.6 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Professionals with 7 (21.2 per cent).

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Goulburn

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary subclass 457 visa grants for positions nominated in Goulburn were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 16 (41.0 per cent) and
 - Professionals with 15 (38.5 per cent).
- In the first quarter of 2014-15, the top occupations for primary Employer Sponsored positions in Goulburn were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 11 (33.3 per cent) primary outcomes and
 - Professionals with 10 (30.3 per cent).

- There were 4234 Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa grants in the first quarter of 2014-15; a 5.7 per cent decrease compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
- Of the 4234 grants, 2373 (56.0 per cent) were primary and 1861 (44.0 per cent) were secondary visa grants.
- The occupations with the highest number of primary visa grants were:
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 958 (40.4 per cent) and

 - Higher Education Sector with 2471 (46.1 per cent) and
 - Vocational Education and Training Sector with 1556 (29.1 per cent).

Skill Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 5804 Skill Stream outcomes, of which 2616 (45.1 per cent) were primary and 3188 (54.9 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Primary Skill Stream outcomes by the top occupations were:
 - Professionals with 1337 (51.1 per cent) and
 - Technicians and Trades Workers with 815 (31.2 per cent).
- Skill Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - United Kingdom with 1231 (21.2 per cent) and
 - India with 687 (11.8 per cent).

Family Stream

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, there were 1737 Family Stream outcomes, 1540 (88.7 per cent) were primary and 197 (11.3 per cent) were secondary outcomes.
- Family Stream outcomes by the top source citizenship countries were:
 - United Kingdom with 257 (14.8 per cent) and
 - India with 180 (10.4 per cent).

Permanent additions

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, permanent additions to Western Australia's population totalled 9218. Of all permanent additions:
 - 50.3 per cent (4637) were people who were granted a permanent visa onshore
 - 87.5 per cent were included in the permanent migration programme, of which:
 - 76.1 per cent (6133) were in the Skill Stream
 - 23.9 per cent (1928) were in the Family Stream and
 - 0.0 per cent (<5) were in the Special Eligibility Stream;
 - 4.4 per cent (403) were in the Humanitarian programme and
 - 8.2 per cent (752) were Australian and New Zealand citizens from overseas who identified themselves as settlers.

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Settler Arrivals

- During the first quarter of 2014-15, 4581 settlers arrived in Western Australia. The top source countries of birth were:
 - United Kingdom with 734 (16.0 per cent) settler arrivals and
 - New Zealand with 549 (12.0 per cent).

Permanent departures

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 2851 persons departed permanently from Western Australia, of which:
 - 403 (14.1 per cent) of total permanent departures were Professionals
 - 151 (5.3 per cent) were Technicians and Trades Workers and
 - 2036 (71.4 per cent) were either not employed, not in the labour force or did not provide sufficient information to code an occupation.
- Of the total permanent departures, 1134 (39.8 per cent) were Australian born compared to 1717 (60.2 per cent) born overseas.

Regional Analysis

- In the first quarter of 2014-15, 3611 or 85.3 per cent of subclass 457 visas were granted for positions in the Perth statistical division, a decrease of 6.2 per cent compared to the same period in the previous financial year.
