Background

The number of temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens physically present in Australia is estimated every three months by identifying those persons who have entered Australia on temporary visas or as New Zealand citizens, and who have neither left Australia nor been granted permanent residence. This data provides useful point-in-time information on temporary entrants. It gives a more accurate picture of the population impact of Australia's temporary entry programs than data on the flow of temporary entrants in and out of Australia.

The number of temporary entrants in this report are broken down by the following categories:

Visitor visa holders

non-permanent entrants to Australia whose visa is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment:

Student visa holders

overseas students who undertake full-time study in registered courses. In this report, Student Guardian (subclass 580) visa holders are included in 'other temporary visa holders' and not in the 'student visa holders' category;

Working holiday maker visa holders

young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and undertake short-term work and/or study and who hold a Working Holiday (subclass 417) or Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa;

Temporary skilled visa holders

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa holders mostly recruited by Australian companies whose visa is valid for up to four years;

Temporary graduate visa holders

overseas students who wish to remain in Australia for up to 18 months to gain skilled work experience or improve their English language skills and who hold a Temporary Graduate (subclass 485) visa;

Bridging visa holders

non-citizens who are provided with lawful status while they have business with the government or the courts regarding immigration matters;

Other temporary visa holders

include holders of other temporary visas such as New Zealand Citizen Family Relationships (non-New Zealand citizens who are family members of a New Zealand citizen), social/cultural (Entertainment, Sport, Visiting Academic, Religious Worker, etc.), international relations (Diplomatic, Exchange, Domestic Worker, etc.), training (Occupational Trainee and Professional Development), Student Guardian, transit and Maritime Crew visas;

New Zealand visa holders

New Zealand citizens granted a Special Category Visa (subclass 444) on arrival in Australia. It should be noted that a small number of New Zealand citizens who were holding a temporary visa other than subclass 444 are included in the temporary visa category relating to the visa held.

Rounding in reported data

Figures given in this report are rounded to the nearest ten. Percentage changes are calculated from unrounded numbers. This may result in minor discrepancies from results calculated from rounded numbers.

Reporting of primary and secondary visa holders

Figures given in this report include both primary and secondary visa holders.

Executive summary

Total temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens snapshot

There were 1,764,980 temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens in Australia on 30 June 2015, compared with 1,699,570 on 30 June 2014 (an increase of 3.8 per cent).

Temporary visa holders

The number of temporary visa holders, that is excluding New Zealand citizens on Special Category (subclass 444) visas and bridging visa holders, was 1,008,930 on 30 June 2015 compared to 955,860 on 30 June 2014, an increase of 5.6 per cent.

Quarterly comparison

Compared with 31 March 2015, the end of the previous quarter, the number of temporary visa holders as at 30 June 2015 is a decrease of 10.9 per cent from 1,132,170 to 1,008,930.

The percentage change in the major components from 31 March 2015 to 30 June 2015 was:

- Visitor visa holders a decrease of 20.5 per cent
- Student visa holders a decrease of 9.3 per cent
- Working holiday maker visa holders a decrease of 10.2 per cent
- Temporary skilled visa holders a decrease of 2.7 per cent
- Temporary graduate visa holders an increase of 14.1 per cent
- Other temporary visa holders a decrease of 13.9 per cent.

These changes are in line with usual seasonal patterns.

Visitor visa holders

The number of visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 227,160, an increase of 12.8 per cent compared with 201,420 on 30 June 2014.

Student visa holders

The number of student visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 374,570, an increase of 10.2 per cent compared with 339,760 on 30 June 2014.

Temporary skilled visa holders

The number of temporary skilled (subclass 457) visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 188,000, a decrease of 3.6 per cent compared with 195,080 on 30 June 2014.

Bridging visa holders

The number of bridging visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 102,220, an increase of 8.0 per cent compared with 94,630 on 30 June 2014.

New Zealand visa holders

The number of New Zealand (subclass 444) visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 653,830, an increase of 0.7 per cent compared with 649,090 on 30 June 2014.

Total temporary entrants

Annual comparison

An estimated 1,764,980 temporary entrants were present in Australia on 30 June 2015, compared with 1,699,570 on 30 June 2014, an increase of 3.8 per cent over the period.

The three largest components in Australia on 30 June 2015 were New Zealand visa holders (653,830 visa holders and 37.0 per cent of the total), student visa holders (374,570 / 21.2 per cent) and visitor visa holders (227,160 / 12.9 per cent).

Of the major components, the number of other temporary visa holders increased by 13.5 per cent from 30 June 2014, visitor visa holders increased by 12.8 per cent and student visa holders increased by 10.2 per cent.

Quarterly comparison




Figure 2: Temporary entrants in Australia - quarterly historical series

The total number of temporary entrants in Australia on 30 June 2015 was 1,764,980, a decrease of 6.7 per cent compared with 1,892,340 on 31 March 2015 (Figure 2). Of the major components, the number of New Zealand visa holders increased by 0.7 per cent from 31 March 2015, student visa holders decreased by 9.3 per cent and visitor visa holders decreased by 20.5 per cent.





Figure 3: Temporary entrants in Australia - percentage of top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for temporary entrants in Australia on 30 June 2015 was New Zealand (654,070 visa holders), followed by China (excl SARs) (161,570), India (144,460), United Kingdom (93,300) and South Korea (50,760) (Figure 3).

Total temporary entrants - continued

When comparing the number of temporary entrants in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 4 shows that over the past five years, the number of temporary entrants from New Zealand increased by 17.4 per cent from 30 June 2010, China (excl SARs) increased by 30.9 per cent, India increased by 1.6 per cent, United Kingdom increased by 14.8 per cent and South Korea decreased by 11.6 per cent.

Visitor visa holders




Figure 5: Visitor visa holders in Australia - annual historical series




Figure 6: Visitor visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

There were 227,160 visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents an increase of 12.8 per cent when compared with 201,420 on 30 June 2014 (Figures 5 and 6).

In the past five years, the quarter with the highest number of visitor visa holders in Australia was 31 December 2014 with 468,480 visa holders (Figure 6).




Figure 7: Visitor visa holders in Australia - percentage of top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was China (excl SARs) (44.960 visa holders), followed by India (34.630), United States of America (17.670), United Kingdom (16,020) and Malaysia (9320) (Figure 7).




Figure 8: Visitor visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 8 shows that over the past five years, the number of visitor visa holders from China (excl SARs) increased by 126.4 per cent from 30 June 2010, India increased by 109.4 per cent, United States of America decreased by 6.9 per cent, United Kingdom decreased by 17.6 per cent and Malaysia increased by 63.8 per cent.

Student visa holders




Figure 9: Student visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 374,570 student visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents an increase of 10.2 per cent when compared with 339,760 on 30 June 2014 (Figure 9).




Figure 10: Student visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past five years, the quarter with the highest number of student visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2015 with 413,120 visa holders (Figure 10).

The top source citizenship country for student visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 was China (excl SARs) (82,570 visa holders), followed by India (48,590), Vietnam (20,690), South Korea (17,150) and Nepal (16,450) (Figure 11).




Figure 12: Student visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of student visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 12 shows that over the past five years, the number of student visa holders from China (excl SARs) increased by 3.4 per cent from 30 June 2010, India decreased by 39.5 per cent, Vietnam increased by 26.0 per cent, South Korea decreased by 20.4 per cent and Nepal decreased by 7.7 per cent.

Working holiday maker visa holders




Figure 13: Working holiday maker visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 143,920 working holiday maker visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents a decrease of 4.8 per cent when compared with 151,200 on 30 June 2014 (Figure 13).




Figure 14: Working holiday maker visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past five years, the quarter with the highest number of working holiday maker visa holders in Australia was 31 December 2013 with 178,980 visa holders (Figure 14).




Figure 15: Working Holiday Maker visa holders in Australia - percentage of top 5 citizenship countries




Figure 16: Working Holiday Maker visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of working holiday maker visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 16 shows that over the past five years, the number of working holiday maker visa holders from United Kingdom increased by 37.7 per cent from 30 June 2010, Taiwan increased by 192.5 per cent, South Korea decreased by 17.8 per cent, France increased by 54.3 per cent and Germany increased by 34.7 per cent.

There were 188,000 temporary skilled visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents a decrease of 3.6 per cent when compared with 195,080 on 30 June 2014 (Figure 17).




Figure 18: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series




Figure 20: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of temporary skilled visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 20 shows that over the past five years, the number of temporary skilled visa holders from India increased by 179.9 per cent from 30 June 2010, United Kingdom increased by 15.4 per cent, Philippines decreased by 1.0 per cent, Ireland increased by 129.0 per cent and China (excl SARs) increased by 84.1 per cent.




Figure 21: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 26,260 temporary graduate visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents an increase of 4.2 per cent when compared with 25,200 on 30 June 2014 (Figure 21).





Figure 22: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past five years, the quarter with the highest number of temporary graduate visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2013 with 41,090 visa holders (Figure 22).



When comparing the number of temporary graduate visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 24 shows that over the past two years, the number of temporary graduate visa holders from China (excl SARs) increased by 26.3 per cent from 30 June 2013, India decreased by 63.6 per cent, Nepal increased by 4.2 per cent, Pakistan increased by 12.4 per cent and Vietnam increased by 3.4 per cent.

Figure 24: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend










Figure 27: Other temporary visa holders in Australia - percentage of top 5 citizenship countries

When comparing the number of other temporary visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 24 shows that over the past five years, the number of other temporary visa holders from Philippines increased by 45.9 per cent from 30 June 2010, China (excl SARs) increased by 59.6 per cent, United Kingdom decreased by 2.8 per cent, India increased by 70.6 per cent and United States of America increased by 31.4 per cent.




Figure 28: Other temporary visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

Bridging visa holders

Bridging visas provide lawful status to certain non-citizens who would otherwise be unlawful and therefore liable to be detained under the Migration Act 1958. Bridging visa A is granted to non-citizens who have had a substantive visa and who have made a valid application for a further substantive visa. Bridging visa B is granted to Bridging visa A holders who demonstrate substantial reasons for travel. Bridging visa C is granted to applicants who do not hold a substantive visa when they apply for a substantive visa while in Australia. Bridging visa E is granted to certain unlawful non-citizens in circumstances of compliance interest, including those who are making arrangements to depart Australia. Other Bridging visa classes are granted to non-citizens under other specific circumstances.




Figure 29: Bridging visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 102,220 bridging visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015. This represents an increase of 8.0 per cent when compared with 94,630 on 30 June 2014 (Figure 29).




Figure 30: Bridging visa holders in Australia - guarterly historical series




Figure 31: Bridging visa holders in Australia - percentage of top 5 citizenship countries




Figure 32: Bridging visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of bridging visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2015 with earlier years, Figure 32 shows that over the past five years, the number of bridging visa holders from India decreased by 35.8 per cent from 30 June 2010, China (excl SARs) decreased by 1.3 per cent, Iran increased by 2702.8 per cent, Sri Lanka increased by 324.7 per cent and United Kingdom increased by 165.0 per cent.




Figure 34: New Zealand subclass 444 visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series
