Background

The number of temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens physically present in Australia is estimated every three months by identifying those persons who have entered Australia on temporary visas or as New Zealand citizens, and who have neither left Australia nor been granted permanent residence. This data provides useful point-in-time information on temporary entrants. It gives a more accurate picture of the population impact of Australia's temporary entry programs than data on the flow of temporary entrants in and out of Australia.

The number of temporary entrants in this report are broken down by the following categories:

Visitor visa holders

non-permanent entrants to Australia whose visa is for tourism, short stay business, visiting relatives or medical treatment;

Student visa holders

overseas students who undertake full-time study in registered courses. In this report, Student Guardian (subclass 580) visa holders are included in 'other temporary visa holders' and not in the 'student visa holders' category;

Working holiday maker visa holders

young adults from countries with reciprocal bilateral agreements with Australia who holiday in Australia and undertake short-term work and/or study and who hold a Working Holiday (subclass 417) or Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa;

Temporary skilled visa holders

Temporary Work (Skilled) subclass 457 visa holders mostly recruited by Australian companies whose visa is valid for up to four years;

Temporary graduate visa holders

overseas students who wish to remain in Australia for up to 18 months (under the Graduate Work Stream) or up to 4 years (under the Post-Study Work stream) to gain skilled work experience or improve their English language skills and who hold a Temporary Graduate (subclass 485) visa;

Bridging visa holders

non-citizens who are provided with lawful status while they have business with the government or the courts regarding immigration matters;

Other temporary visa holders

include holders of other temporary visas such as New Zealand Citizen Family Relationships (non-New Zealand citizens who are family members of a New Zealand citizen), social/cultural (Entertainment, Sport, Visiting Academic, Religious Worker, etc), international relations (Diplomatic, Exchange, Domestic Worker, etc), training (Occupational Trainee and Professional Development), Student Guardian and transit visas;

New Zealand visa holders

New Zealand citizens granted a Special Category Visa (subclass 444) on arrival in Australia. It should be noted that a small number of New Zealand citizens who were holding a temporary visa other than subclass 444 are included in the temporary visa category relating to the visa held.

Rounding in reported data

Figures given in this report are rounded to the nearest ten. Percentage changes are calculated from unrounded numbers. This may result in minor discrepancies from results calculated from rounded numbers.

Reporting of primary and secondary visa holders

Figures given in this report include both primary and secondary visa holders.

Executive summary

Total temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens snapshot

There were 1 765 450 temporary entrants and New Zealand citizens in Australia on 31 March 2013, compared with 1 672 950 on 31 March 2012 (an increase of 5.5 per cent).

Temporary visa holders

The number of temporary visa holders, that is excluding New Zealand citizens on Special Category (subclass 444) visas and bridging visa holders, was 1 013 740 on 31 March 2013 compared to 924 530 on 31 March 2012, an increase of 9.6 per cent.

Quarterly comparison

Compared with 31 December 2012, the end of the previous quarter, the number of temporary entrants as at 31 March 2013 is a decrease of 1.4 per cent from 1 028 290 to 1 013 740.

The percentage change in the major components from 31 December 2012 to 31 March 2013 was:

- Visitor visa holders a decrease of 38.2 per cent; ٠
- Student visa holders an increase of 37.3 per cent; .
- Working holiday maker visa holders an increase of 5.1 per cent; .
- Temporary skilled visa holders an increase of 21.5 per cent; •
- Temporary graduate visa holders an increase of 7.5 per cent;
- Other temporary visa holders an increase of 15.1 per cent.

The directions of these movements are consistent with usual seasonal patterns.

Visitor visa holders

The number of visitor visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was 248 250, an increase of 12.6 per cent compared with 220 380 on 31 March 2012.

Student visa holders

The number of student visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was 332 470, a decrease of 3.5 per cent compared with 344 480 on 31 March 2012.

Temporary skilled visa holders

The number of temporary skilled (subclass 457) visa holders (including secondary visa holders) in Australia on 31 March 2013 was 190 920, an increase of 19.0 per cent compared with 160 420 on 31 March 2012.

The five countries with the largest number of temporary skilled visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 were:

- United Kingdom 47 750 visa holders, an increase of 15.5 per cent from 31 March 2012
 - 28 220 visa holders, an increase of 36.8 per cent

New Zealand visa holders

The number of New Zealand (subclass 444) visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was 632 890, an increase of 2.7 per cent compared with 616 110 on 31 March 2012.

Total temporary entrants

Annual comparison

An estimated 1 765 450 temporary entrants were present in Australia on 31 March 2013, compared with 1 672 950 on 31 March 2012, an increase of 5.5 per cent over the period.

The three largest components in Australia on 31 March 2013 were New Zealand visa holders (632 890 visa holders and 35.8 per cent of the total), student visa holders (332 470 / 18.8 per cent) and visitor visa holders (248 250 / 14.1 per cent).

Of the major components, the number of temporary graduate visa holders increased by 46.9 per cent from 31 March 2012, working holiday maker visa holders increased by 19.7 per cent and temporary skilled visa holders increased by 19.0 per cent.





Figure 1: Temporary entrants in Australia - annual historical series

Total temporary entrants - continued

Quarterly comparison

The total number of temporary entrants in Australia on 31 March 2013 was 1 765 450, an increase of 0.9 per cent compared with 1 748 870 on 31 December 2012 (Figure 2). Of the major components, the number of New Zealand visa holders increased by 2.3 per cent from 31 December 2012, student visa holders increased by 37.3 per cent and visitor visa holders decreased by 38.2 per cent.


The directions of these movements are consistent with usual seasonal patterns.





The top source citizenship country for temporary entrants in Australia on 31 March 2013 was New Zealand (633 170 visa holders), followed by China (excl SARs) (142 800), United Kingdom (142 470), India (121 660) and South Korea (54 710) (Figure 3).






Total temporary entrants - continued

When comparing the number of temporary entrants in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 4 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of temporary entrants from New Zealand increased by 37.7 per cent from 31 March 2008, China (excl SARs) increased by 31.3 per cent, United Kingdom increased by 16.6 per cent, India increased by 42.4 per cent and South Korea increased by 3.8 per cent.





Visitor visa holders




Figure 5: Visitor visa holders in Australia - annual historical series




Figure 6: Visitor visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

There were 248 250 visitor visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 12.6 per cent when compared with 220 380 on 31 March 2012 (Figures 5 and 6).

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of visitor visa holders in Australia was 31 December 2012 with 401 940 visa holders (Figure 6).





Figure 7: Visitor visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for visitor visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was United Kingdom (48 420 visa holders), followed by China (excl SARs) (30 090), India (21 270), United States of America (17 150) and Germany (10 660) (Figure 7).

When comparing the number of visitor visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 8 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of visitor visa holders from United Kingdom decreased by 17.6 per cent from 31 March 2008, China (excl SARs) increased by 95.6 per cent, India increased by 125.8 per cent, United States of America increased by 7.4 per cent and Germany increased by 7.0 per cent.





Student visa holders




Figure 9: Student visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 332 470 student visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents a decrease of 3.5 per cent when compared with 344 480 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 9).




Figure 10: Student visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of student visa holders in Australia was 30 September 2009 with 434 030 visa holders (Figure 10).

Student visa holders - continued





Figure 11: Student visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for student visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was China (excl SARs) (84 190 visa holders), followed by India (30 210), Vietnam (16 890), South Korea (16 650) and Malaysia (16 280) (Figure 11).

When comparing the number of student visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 12 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of student visa holders from China (excl SARs) increased by 14.7 per cent from 31 March 2008, India decreased by 46.4 per cent, Vietnam increased by 96.3 per cent, South Korea decreased by 24.7 per cent and Malaysia decreased by 4.7 per cent.





Working holiday maker visa holders





Figure 13: Working holiday maker visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 170 700 working holiday maker visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 19.7 per cent when compared with 142 600 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 13).




Figure 15: Working holiday maker visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for working holiday maker visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was United Kingdom (31 070 visa holders), followed by South Korea (23 390), Taiwan (22 590), Ireland (17 610) and France (15 940) (Figure 15).




Figure 16: Working holiday maker visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of working holiday maker visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 16 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of working holiday maker visa holders from United Kingdom increased by 54.3 per cent from 31 March 2008, South Korea increased by 21.9 per cent, Taiwan increased by 782.8 per cent, Ireland increased by 57.0 per cent and France increased by 152.1 per cent.

Temporary skilled visa holders




Figure 17: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 190 920 temporary skilled visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 19.0 per cent when compared with 160 420 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 17).




Figure 18: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of temporary skilled visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2013 with 190 920 visa holders (Figure 18).




Figure 19: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries




Figure 20: Temporary skilled visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of temporary skilled visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 20 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of temporary skilled visa holders from United Kingdom increased by 59.1 per cent from 31 March 2008, India increased by 118.9 per cent, Ireland increased by 428.1 per cent, Philippines increased by 11.6 per cent and United States of America increased by 73.3 per cent.

Temporary graduate visa holders




Figure 21: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 41 090 temporary graduate visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 46.9 per cent when compared with 27 980 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 21).




Figure 22: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of temporary graduate visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2013 with 41 090 visa holders (Figure 22).





Figure 23: Temporary graduate visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries

The top source citizenship country for temporary graduate visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was India (15 020 visa holders), followed by China (excl SARs) (6 540), Nepal (3 090), Sri Lanka (1 450) and Malaysia (1 430) (Figure 23).

When comparing the number of temporary graduate visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 24 shows that over the past 2 years, the number of temporary graduate visa holders from India increased by 37.9 per cent from 31 March 2011, China (excl SARs) increased by 69.8 per cent, Nepal increased by 66.1 per cent, Sri Lanka increased by 98.9 per cent and Malaysia increased by 289.4 per cent.





Other temporary visa holders

The largest visa subclasses for other temporary visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 were:

- 461 New Zealand Citizen Family Relationship (Temporary)
- 995 Diplomatic (Temporary)
- 410 Retirement
- 428 Religious Worker
- 442 Occupational Trainee




Figure 25: Other temporary visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 30 310 other temporary visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 5.7 per cent when compared with 28 670 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 25).





Figure 26: Other temporary visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of other temporary visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2013 with 30 310 visa holders (Figure 26).

The top source citizenship country for other temporary visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was United Kingdom (5 400 visa holders), followed by United States of America (3 040), China (excl SARs) (2 740), South Korea (1 380) and India (1 160) (Figure 27).





When comparing the number of other temporary visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 24 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of other temporary visa holders from United Kingdom decreased by 14.8 per cent from 31 March 2008, United States of America increased by 0.2 per cent, China (excl SARs) increased by 8.5 per cent, South Korea decreased by 24.6 per cent and India decreased by 10.9 per cent.





Figure 28: Other temporary visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

Bridging visa holders

Bridging visas provide lawful status to certain non-citizens who would otherwise be unlawful and therefore liable to be detained under the *Migration Act 1958*. Bridging visa A is granted to non-citizens who have had a substantive visa and who have made a valid application for a further substantive visa. Bridging visa B is granted to Bridging visa A holders who demonstrate substantial reasons for travel. Bridging visa C is granted to applicants who do not hold a substantive visa when they apply for a substantive visa while in Australia. Bridging visa E is granted to certain unlawful non-citizens in circumstances of compliance interest, including those who are making arrangements to depart Australia. Other Bridging visa classes are granted to non-citizens under other specific circumstances.

There were 118 820 bridging visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents a decrease of 10.2 per cent when compared with 132 320 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 29).





Figure 30: Bridging visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series

In the past 5 years, the quarter with the highest number of bridging visa holders in Australia was 31 March 2012 with 132 320 visa holders (Figure 30).

Bridging visa holders - continued

The top source citizenship country for bridging visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 was India (25 780 visa holders), followed by China (excl SARs) (11 830), United Kingdom (5 620), Sri Lanka (5 580) and South Korea (4 160) (Figure 31).





Note: A number of Bridging Visa E visas are granted with the citizenship country not specified. These visa holders are included in other countries.




Figure 32: Bridging visa holders in Australia - top 5 citizenship countries trend

When comparing the number of bridging visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013 with earlier years, Figure 32 shows that over the past 5 years, the number of bridging visa holders from India increased by 372.4 per cent from 31 March 2008, China (excl SARs) increased by 54.8 per cent, United Kingdom increased by 130.6 per cent, Sri Lanka increased by 606.6 per cent and South Korea increased by 76.7 per cent.




Figure 33: New Zealand subclass 444 visa holders in Australia - annual historical series

There were 632 890 New Zealand subclass 444 visa holders in Australia on 31 March 2013. This represents an increase of 2.7 per cent when compared with 616 110 on 31 March 2012 (Figure 33).




Figure 34: New Zealand subclass 444 visa holders in Australia - quarterly historical series
