## Pathways to permanent residence

In the 2016-17 program year to 30 June 2017:

- 50,420 subclass 457 visa holders were granted permanent residence or a provisional visa, a decrease of 1.4 per cent compared with the same period in the previous program year (51,140);
- the vast majority of permanent visa grants to subclass 457 visa holders were in the economic migration stream (96.5 per cent), with the remaining permanent visa grants in the family stream (3.5 per cent).
