Pathways to permanent residence

In the 2016-17 programme year to 31 December 2016:

Philippines

- 24,590 subclass 457 visa holders were granted permanent residence or a provisional visa, a decrease of 7.7 per cent compared with the same period in the previous programme year (26,640)
- the vast majority of permanent visa grants to subclass 457 visa holders were in the economic migration stream (96.9 per cent), with the remaining permanent visa grants in the family stream (3.1 per cent).
