About this report

This report provides data about the Visitor visa program administered by the Department of Home Affairs (the Department). The report has been produced to assist tourism industry stakeholders and policymakers.

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data can be dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the Department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, figures for the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

Definition of terms

Approved Destination Status (ADS):	This scheme facilitates the travel of organised tour groups from the People's Republic of China (PRC) to Australia by approved travel agents.
Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Decided:	The term used for counts of decisions. See below for definition of 'decisions'.
Decisions:	An outcome where a decision-maker (including system-generated decision-making) grants or refuses a visa or sponsorship application.
ETA:	Electronic Travel Authority. An electronic visa available to citizens from low risk countries. The term 'low risk' applies to countries which issue ETA eligible passports. A list of these can be found on the Department's website.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review grants.
In Australia:	In this report, refers to the location of the client at the time the application was lodged. An applicant in Australia may already hold a visa of the same kind or may be applying for another type of visa.
Lodged:	Lodged is the count of paper applications receipted in a departmental office or submitted electronically.
On hand:	A visa application, nomination or sponsorship that has not been finalised.
Outside Australia:	In this report, the term refers to the location of the client at the time of lodging the application.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa.
Visa holders in Australia:	The number of visa holders lawfully in Australia. This is not a count of all valid visas, as a number of visa holders may be outside Australia on the snapshot date.

Background to the Visitor visa program

Visa travel purpose and activities

The Visitor visa program allows travellers to enter or remain in Australia for short-term visits. The program can be divided into two main groups by travel purpose: Tourism and Business.

Tourism activities may include a holiday or recreation, taking a cruise, or visiting family and friends.

Business activities may include:

- making general business or employment enquiries
- investigating, negotiating, entering into or reviewing a business contract
- conducting activities as part of an official government visit
- taking part in a conference, trade fair or seminar (but not being paid by the organisers to take part)
- undertaking tourist activities.

Visitor visa holders cannot engage in work in Australia (that is, perform an activity in Australia a person would normally be remunerated for).

Visa subclasses and streams

The Visitor visa program is currently made up of three subclasses, the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601), the eVisitor visa (subclass 651) and the Visitor visa (subclass 600). The Visitor visa (subclass 600) has five streams, the Tourist stream, the Sponsored Family stream, the Business Visitor stream, the Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream and the Frequent Traveller stream.

- Electronic Travel Authority (subclass 601). This visa allows ETA eligible passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can be made through the Australian ETAapp. An ETA holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. - 2. eVisitor visa (subclass 651). This visa allows eligible European passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can only be made online. An eVisitor holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. - 3. Visitor visa (subclass 600). This visa allows any passport holder to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes, depending on the stream. Visitor visas can be granted with different stay and validity periods, and may allow single or multiple entries to Australia. More information is available at: https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/visitor-600
 - **Tourist stream.** This stream of the Visitor visa allows people to enter or remain in Australia for tourism purposes. Applications can be made online.
 - Business Visitor stream. This stream allows people to enter Australia for business visitor purposes. Applications can be made online.
 - **Sponsored Family stream.** This stream allows people who are sponsored, usually by a family member, to enter Australia to visit family. This stream has additional sponsorship requirements which are designed to provide assurance that the visa holder will comply with their visa conditions and depart Australia before their visa expires. Applications can be made online.
 - Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream. This stream allows People's Republic of China (PRC) (excluding SARs) passport holders to visit Australia for tourism part of an organised tour group. Applications can only be made through an approved Chinese travel agent participating in the ADS scheme.
 - **Frequent Traveller stream.** This stream allows eligible passport holders who travel often to Australia to enter Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. This visa might be granted with a validity period of up to 10 years. Applications can only be made online.

On 23 March 2013, changes were made to Visitor visas as part of the Australian Government's Visa Simplification and Deregulation project. A number of historic Visitor visa subclasses were repealed and replaced with the current subclasses as outlined in the table below. Where relevant, historic data in this report may refer to both current and previous visa subclasses.

Note: A small percentage of clients who lodged these visa subclasses may now be lodging Temporary Work (Short Stay Activity) (subclass 400) visa applications, which is not covered in this report.

Background to the Visitor visa program - continued

The below table outlines the current and previous Visitor visa subclasses/streams, travel purpose of each subclass/stream (including how they are referenced in this report) and the location of the client at time of lodgement.

Note: Where a visa subclass/stream allows both tourism and business visitor activities, data in this report will be based on the applicant's declared travel activity for their <u>initial</u> entry to Australia for the purposes of determining Tourism or Business visitor activity.

Family members

All applicants, including dependent family members, must lodge their own separate Visitor visa application.

Visa Requirements

To be eligible for a Visitor visa, the applicant must genuinely intend to stay temporarily in Australia for the purpose for which the visa is granted (for tourism or business visitor purposes). Applicants must be able to demonstrate that they have access to adequate means to support themselves (and their family where relevant) during their stay in Australia, including health insurance where required. Applicants must also meet certain health and character requirements.

Work is not permitted on any Visitor visas. Where a person is found to be working in breach of their visa conditions, they could face visa cancellation and an exclusion period.

Study or training, of up to three months, may be permitted on a Visitor visa. However, if the visa holder's main reason for travel ling to Australia is study, a student visa might be more appropriate.

Background to the Visitor visa program - continued

Extending stay

Visitor visas cannot be 'extended'. However, Visitor visa holders may extend their stay in Australia by applying for another visa, which may include a Visitor visa (subclass 600) - Tourist stream before their current visa ceases. This is the only Visitor visa stream that is available to applicants already in Australia seeking to extend their stay.

Visa refusals

A decision to refuse a Visitor visa application is made when a delegate of the Minister is not satisfied that the applicant meets the legal criteria for grant of a visa. When refusing a visa application, the Department provides an applicant a written decision record that sets out the reason for the decision and any review rights.

Processing times

The published processing times are updated on a monthly basis to reflect current caseloads and processing pressures. Processing times are impacted each month by changes in application volumes, seasonal peaks, complex cases and incomplete applications.

Executive Summary

Key Points

- This executive summary covers the Tourism and Business group¹ Visitor visa statistics for the Visitor visa
 program for the period 1 July 2022 to 31 December 2022. The terminology used in this executive summary to
 describe Tourism and Business stream visas and subclasses are referenced on pages 3-4 of this report. Figures
 referred to in this report include applications made in and outside of Australia. It should be noted that subclass
 600 (Tourist stream) is the only Visitor visa option for applicants already in Australia.
- Since the initial re-opening of Australia's borders in October 2021, and subsequent changes, the demand for Visitor visas continues to increase and impact the Visitor visa program in the 2022-23 program year. The Department has been prioritising the processing of Visitor visa applications lodged outside Australia to ensure the Visitor program is able to respond to the increasing Visitor visa application lodgement rate.
- From 6 July 2022, all Australian border restrictions were lifted to allow international travellers to Australia
 regardless of vaccination status. Despite the increasing demand on Visitor visas, remaining travel restrictions by
 a number of source countries impacted the timeframe for the Visitor visa application lodgement rate to return to
 pre-pandemic levels.
- Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic and international travel restrictions, China was Australia's largest source country for visitors. Although China announced the re-opening of its borders from January 2023, flights to Australia remain at lower levels than prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, travel costs are higher, timeframes for issuance of Chinese passports are extended and Australia has not yet regained an Approved Destination Status (ADS). The Department anticipates that it will take some time before Chinese visitor visa lodgements return to pre-pandemic levels.
- The processing of on-hand visa applications is a government priority to clear visa backlogs and reduce processing times.
- This report should be read in conjunction with <u>The Administration of the Immigration and Citizenship Programs</u>.

1 Applications lodged

In the first half of 2022-23 program year, 1,940,208 Visitor visa (Tourism and Business group) applications were lodged; up 782.0 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22 program year.

The United Kingdom was the largest source country for Visitor visa lodgments during the first half of 2022-23 program year with 261,886 lodgments (up 777.5 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22), ahead of India (up 355.8 per cent to 245,193) and the United States of America (up 2091.7 per cent to 221,186).

Tourism

The Tourism group accounted for the majority of Visitor visa applications lodged during the first half of the 2022-23 program year, with 689,194 applications. This was an increase of 782 per cent compared to the same period in the 2021-22 program year.

The top three source countries for Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were:

- 1. UK (up 754.3 per cent to 248,783)
- 2. India (up 334.9 per cent to 226,724)
- 3. USA (up 1989.2 per cent to 199,850).

Business

During the first half of 2022-23 program year, a total of 195,924 Visitor visa applications in the Business Group were lodged; up 705.0 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22.

The top three source countries for Visitor visa applications in the Business Group were:

- 1. USA (up 3958.3 per cent to 21,336)
- 2. India (up 1011.3 per cent to18,469)
- 3. Singapore (up 511.2 per cent to 15,769).

2 Visas granted

Tourism

In the first half of 2022-23 program year, 1,657,213 Visitor visas in the Tourism group were granted; an increase of 956.0 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22 program year (156,930).

The top three countries for Visitor visa grants in the Tourism group were:

- 1. UK (up 688.7 per cent to 247,272)
- 2. USA (up 2050.5 per cent to 198,882)
- 3. India (up 388.6 per cent to 181,383).

Business

In the first half of 2022-23 program year, 184,510 Visitor visas in the Business group were granted; an increase by 691.0 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22 program year (23,325).

The top three countries for Visitor visa grants in the Business group were:

- 1. USA (up 4505.7 per cent to 21,186)
- 2. India (up 1017.5 per cent to 16,740)
- 3. Singapore (up 500.0 per cent to 15,456).

3 Grant rates

Grant rates are provided on a quarterly basis and since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Visitor visa grant rates have fluctuated due to lower visa finalisation rates, higher withdrawal rates and reprioritisation of visa caseloads.

With lodgement rates and overall finalisations remaining lower for the 2022-23 program year, when compared to pre-pandemic reporting periods, minimal weight should be given to the grant rate as a reflection of the caseload risk.

4 **Processing times**

Processing times are provided on a quarterly basis and are based on the age of applications finalised in a specific time period.

Visa processing times can vary due to individual circumstances, the quality and completeness of applications and whether further information is required.

Focus on clearing the visa backlog, and finalising older applications, has temporarily impacted processing times.

Visitor visa processing times have continued to trend down as the visa backlog is cleared and more recent visa applications are finalised. During the 1 October 2022 to 31 December 2022 quarter:

- 75 per cent of Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were processed within 27 calendar days, compared to 57 days for the corresponding quarter in 2021;
- 75 per cent of Visitor visa applications in the Business group were processed within 8 calendar days, compared to 1 day for the corresponding quarter in 2021.

5 Applications on hand

Since the remaining border restrictions were lifted from 6 July 2022, demand for Visitor visas has continued to increase and the Department has been prioritising the processing of on hand Visitor visa applications. As at 31 December 2022:

- 79,057 Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were on hand, compared to 131,869 at 31 December 2021;
- 8,172 Visitor visa applications in the Business group were on hand, compared to 5,414 at 31 December 2021.

6 Visa holders In Australia

On 31 December 2022, there were 530,283 Visitor (Tourism and Business group) visa holders in Australia. This was a 696.4 per cent increase compared to 66,582 Visitor visa holders in Australia on 31 December 2021.

The Visitor (subclass 600) visa comprised the largest cohort with 300,310 visa holders in Australia, followed by the eVisitor (subclass 651) visa with 139,586 visa holders, and the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601) with 90,387 visa holders. The subclass 600 visa is the only Visitor visa option for applicants already in Australia wanting to extend their stay.

7 Approved Destination Status (ADS)

The ADS scheme has not re-commenced following the lifting of international travel restrictions. Consequently, there were no Visitor visas lodged under the ADS scheme in the reporting period.

8 Arrivals

During the first half of 2022-23 program year, there were 1,664,174 arrivals on Visitor (Tourism and Business group) visas; a 2658.1 per cent increase compared to the same period of the 2021-22 program year (60,338).

The top three countries for arrivals on Visitor visas were:

- 1. UK (up 2428.0 per cent to 240,588)
- 2. USA (up 4685.3 per cent to 193,852)
- 3. India (up 1471.5 per cent to 169,185)

4 Processing times

This section contains information on 25, 50 and 75 percentile processing times for visitor visa applications.

In general terms:

- 25 percentile means that 25 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 75 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the more straight-forward visitor visa applications.
- 50 percentile more commonly known as the median, it means that 50 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 50 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the typical visitor visa applications.
- 75 percentile means that 75 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 25 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the more complex visitor visa applications.

Note: The calculation of days between lodged and grant date has been adjusted to ensure compatibility with the new database.
