About this report

This report provides data about the Visitor visa program administered by the Department of Home Affairs (the Department). The report has been produced to assist tourism industry stakeholders and policymakers.

This report is published every six months. Current and previous versions of the report are available on the department's website at: https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/research-and-statistics/statistics/visa-statistics/visit

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data can be dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the Department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, figures for the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

Definition of terms

Approved Destination Status (ADS):	This scheme facilitates the travel of organised tour groups from the People's Republic of China (PRC) to Australia by approved travel agents.
Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Decided:	The term used for counts of decisions. See below for definition of 'decisions'.
Decisions:	An outcome where a decision-maker (including system-generated decision-making) grants or refuses a visa or sponsorship application.
ETA:	Electronic Travel Authority. An electronic visa available to citizens from low risk countries. The term 'low risk' applies to countries which issue ETA eligible passports. A list of these can be found on the Department's website.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review grants.
In Australia:	In this report, refers to the location of the client at the time the application was lodged. An applicant in Australia may already hold a visa of the same kind or may be applying for another type of visa.
Lodged:	Lodged is the count of paper applications receipted in a departmental office or submitted electronically.
On hand:	A visa application, nomination or sponsorship that has not been finalised.
Outside Australia:	In this report, the term refers to the location of the client at the time of lodging the application.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa.
Visa holders in Australia:	The number of visa holders lawfully in Australia. This is not a count of all valid visas, as a number of visa holders may be outside Australia on the snapshot date.

Background to the Visitor visa program

Visa travel purpose and activities

The Visitor visa program allows travellers to enter or remain in Australia for short-term visits. The program can be divided into two main groups by travel purpose: Tourism and Business.

Tourism activities may include a holiday or recreation, taking a cruise, or visiting family and friends.

Business activities may include:

- making general business or employment enquiries
- investigating, negotiating, entering into or reviewing a business contract
- conducting activities as part of an official government visit
- taking part in a conference, trade fair or seminar (but not being paid by the organisers to take part)
- undertaking tourist activities.

Visitor visa holders cannot engage in work in Australia (that is, perform an activity in Australia a person would normally be remunerated for).

Visa subclasses and streams

The Visitor visa program is currently made up of three subclasses, the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601), the eVisitor visa (subclass 651) and the Visitor visa (subclass 600). The Visitor visa (subclass 600) has five streams, the Tourist stream, the Sponsored Family stream, the Business Visitor stream, the Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream and the Frequent Traveller stream.

- Electronic Travel Authority (subclass 601). This visa allows ETA eligible passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can be made through the Australian ETAapp. An ETA holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. - 2. eVisitor visa (subclass 651). This visa allows eligible European passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can only be made online. An eVisitor holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. - 3. Visitor visa (subclass 600). This visa allows any passport holder to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes, depending on the stream. Visitor visas can be granted with different stay and validity periods, and may allow single or multiple entries to Australia.  - **Tourist stream.** This stream of the Visitor visa allows people to enter or remain in Australia for tourism purposes. Applications can be made online.
 - Business Visitor stream. This stream allows people to enter Australia for business visitor purposes. Applications can be made online.
 - **Sponsored Family stream.** This stream allows people who are sponsored, usually by a family member, to enter Australia to visit family. This stream has additional sponsorship requirements which are designed to provide assurance that the visa holder will comply with their visa conditions and depart Australia before their visa expires. Applications can be made online.
 - Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream. This stream allows People's Republic of China (PRC) (excluding SARs) passport holders to visit Australia for tourism part of an organised tour group. Applications can only be made through an approved Chinese travel agent participating in the ADS scheme.
 - **Frequent Traveller stream.** This stream allows eligible passport holders who travel often to Australia to enter Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. This visa might be granted with a validity period of up to 10 years. Applications can only be made online.

On 23 March 2013, changes were made to Visitor visas as part of the Australian Government's Visa Simplification and Deregulation project. A number of historic Visitor visa subclasses were repealed and replaced with the current subclasses as outlined in the table below. Where relevant, historic data in this report may refer to both current and previous visa subclasses.

Note: A small percentage of clients who lodged these visa subclasses may now be lodging Temporary Work (Short Stay Activity) (subclass 400) visa applications, which is not covered in this report.

Background to the Visitor visa program - continued

The below table outlines the current and previous Visitor visa subclasses/streams, travel purpose of each subclass/stream (including how they are referenced in this report) and the location of the client at time of lodgement.

Note: Where a visa subclass/stream allows both tourism and business visitor activities, data in this report will be based on the applicant's declared travel activity for their <u>initial</u> entry to Australia for the purposes of determining Tourism or Business visitor activity.

Family members

All applicants, including dependent family members, must lodge their own separate Visitor visa application.

Visa Requirements

To be eligible for a Visitor visa, the applicant must genuinely intend to stay temporarily in Australia for the purpose for which the visa is granted (for tourism or business visitor purposes). Applicants must be able to demonstrate that they have access to adequate means to support themselves (and their family where relevant) during their stay in Australia, including health insurance where required. Applicants must also meet certain health and character requirements.

Work is not permitted on any Visitor visas. Where a person is found to be working in breach of their visa conditions, they could face visa cancellation and an exclusion period.

Study or training, of up to three months, may be permitted on a Visitor visa. However, if the visa holder's main reason for travel ling to Australia is study, a student visa might be more appropriate.

Background to the Visitor visa program - continued

Extending stay

Visitor visas cannot be 'extended'. However, Visitor visa holders may extend their stay in Australia by applying for another visa, which may include a Visitor visa (subclass 600) - Tourist stream before their current visa ceases. This is the only Visitor visa stream that is available to applicants already in Australia seeking to extend their stay.

Visa refusals

A decision to refuse a Visitor visa application is made when a delegate of the Minister is not satisfied that the applicant meets the legal criteria for grant of a visa. When refusing a visa application, the Department provides an applicant a written decision record that sets out the reason for the decision and any review rights.

Processing times

The published processing times are updated on a monthly basis to reflect current caseloads and processing pressures. Processing times are impacted each month by changes in application volumes, seasonal peaks, complex cases and incomplete applications.

Executive Summary

Key Points

- This executive summary covers the Tourism and Business group¹ Visitor visa statistics for the Visitor visa
 program for the 2022-23 program year (1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023). The terminology used in this executive
 summary to describe Tourism and Business stream visas and subclasses are referenced on pages 3-4 of this
 report. Figures referred to in this report include applications made in and outside of Australia. It should be noted
 that subclass 600 (Tourist stream) is the only Visitor visa option for applicants already in Australia.
- Post-pandemic recovery in the demand for visitor visas continued at a consistent rate in the 2022-23 program year when compared to the immediate period after Australian border restrictions were lifted in October 2021. At the end of 2022-23 program year, the number of Visitor visa applications lodged had recovered to less than 10 per cent below the number of applications lodged in June 2019. The number of Visitor visa holders in Australia at 30 June 2023, however, was greater than the number of June 2019.
- China reopened its borders for international travel in January 2023 and this has contributed to the recovery of Australia's Visitor visas program. With a number of bans on imports from Australia lifting, Chinese Business Visitors showed a strong recovery and was the top source country of overall Business Visitors in the 2022-23 program year. While Australia had not yet regained an Approved Destination Status (ADS) in 2022-2023 program year, overall demand for Visitor visas from Chinese nationals remained below pre-pandemic levels.
- The reduction of visa processing times and processing of on-hand visa applications was a government priority throughout 2022-23. The Department's continued focus on addressing the backlog resulted in significant reduction of the number of visa applications to be processed and the overall processing times have also improved during the 2022-23 program year.
- This report should be read in conjunction with The Administration of the Immigration and Citizenship Programs.

1 Applications lodged

In the 2022-23 program year, 4,155,117 Visitor visa (Tourism and Business group) applications were lodged; up 204.2 per cent compared to the 2021-22 program year.

India was the largest source country for Visitor visa lodgments during the 2022-23 program year with 463,702 lodgments (up 76.2 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22), ahead of the United Kingdom (up 192.2 per cent to 463,405) and the United States of America (up 360.0 per cent to 459,354).

Tourism

The Tourism group accounted for the majority of Visitor visa applications lodged during the 2022-23 program year, with 3,687,947 applications. This was an increase of 198.6 per cent compared to the same period in the 2021-22 program year.

The top three source countries for Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were:

- 1. UK (up 192.6 per cent to 435,539)
- 2. India (up 70.3 per cent to 428,484)
- 3. USA (up 379.0 per cent to 412,581).

Business

During the 2022-23 program year, a total of 467,170 Visitor visa applications in the Business Group were lodged; up 257.4 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22.

The top three source countries for Visitor visa applications in the Business Group were:

- 1. China (up 606.4 per cent to 63,424)
- 2. USA (up 240.7 per cent to 46,773)
- 3. Malaysia (up 1053.4 per cent to 40,439).

2 Visas granted

Tourism

In the 2022-23 program year, 3,377,219 Visitor visas in the Tourism group were granted; an increase of 233.8 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22 program year (1,011,787).

The top three countries for Visitor visa grants in the Tourism group were:

- 1. UK (up 186.5 per cent to 432,539)
- 2. USA (up 387.2 per cent to 410,178)
- 3. India (up 70.8 per cent to 325,565).

Business

In the 2022-23 program year, 441,276 Visitor visas in the Business group were granted; an increase by 267.4 per cent compared to the same period in 2021-22 program year (120,103).

The top three countries for Visitor visa grants in the Business group were:

- 1. China (up 583.3 per cent to 56,020)
- 2. USA (up 245.0 per cent to 46,387)
- 3. Malaysia (up 1232.9 per cent to 39,282).

3 Grant rates

Overall quarterly grant rates in the Business group have remained consistently above 92 per cent in the 2022-23 program year.

The overall grant rate in the Tourist group has decreased from 91.6% at 30 June 2022 to 85.8% at 30 June 2023. In the post-pandemic global economic downturn, a number of countries are also experiencing the compounded effects of changes in their geopolitical situation. The higher refusal rates for these countries reflect their citizens' ability to meet visa requirements as genuine visitors to Australia.

4 **Processing times**

Processing times are provided on a quarterly basis and are based on the age of applications finalised in a specific time period.

Visa processing times can vary due to individual circumstances, the quality and completeness of applications and whether further information is required.

Focus on clearing the visa backlog, and finalising older applications, had temporarily impacted processing times.

Visitor visa processing times have continued to trend down as the visa backlog is cleared and more recent visa applications are finalised. During the 1 April 2023 to 30 June 2023 quarter:

- 75 per cent of Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were processed within 17 calendar days, compared to 59 days for the corresponding quarter in 2022;
- 75 per cent of Visitor visa applications in the Business group were processed within 7 calendar days, compared to 15 day for the corresponding quarter in 2022.

5 Applications on hand

The demand for Visitor visas has continued to increase and the Department prioritised the processing of on hand Visitor visa applications throughout the 2022-23 program year. As at 30 June 2023:

- 53,545 Visitor visa applications in the Tourism group were on hand, compared to 234,608 at 30 June 2022;
- 4,570 Visitor visa applications in the Business group were on hand, compared to 11,830 at 30 June 2022.

6 Visa holders In Australia

On 30 June 2023, there were 330,449 Visitor (Tourism and Business group) visa holders in Australia. This was a 50.5 per cent increase compared to 219,606 Visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2022.

The Visitor (subclass 600) visa comprised the largest cohort with 252,395 visa holders in Australia, followed by the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601) visa with 52,981 visa holders, and the eVisitor (subclass 651) with 25,073 visa holders. The subclass 600 visa is the only Visitor visa option for applicants already in Australia wanting to extend their stay.

7 Approved Destination Status (ADS)

The ADS scheme had not re-commenced in program year 2022-23 following the lifting of international travel restrictions. Consequently, there were no Visitor visas lodged under the ADS scheme in the reporting period.


8 Arrivals

During the 2022-23 program year, there were 3,649,121 arrivals on Visitor (Tourism and Business group) visas; a 421.5 per cent increase compared to the same period of the 2021-22 program year (699,725).


The top three countries for arrivals on Visitor visas were:

- 1. UK (up 377.0 per cent to 484,705)
- 2. USA (up 577.6 per cent to 457,371)
- 3. India (up 186.0 per cent to 337,715)


1.01 Number of Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




1.02 Number of Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year




1.03 Number of Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year



1.04 Number of Tourism Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year




1.05 Number of Business Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year



1.06 Number of Tourism Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year




1.07 Number of All Business Visitor visa applications lodged in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year





2.03 Number of Visitor visa applications granted in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year





2.04 Number of Tourism Visitor visa applications granted in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year




2.05 Number of Business Visitor visa applications granted in 2022-23 to 30 June 2023 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year



4 Processing times

This section contains information on 25, 50 and 75 percentile processing times for visitor visa applications.

In general terms:

- 25 percentile means that 25 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 75 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the more straight-forward visitor visa applications.
- 50 percentile more commonly known as the median, it means that 50 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 50 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the typical visitor visa applications.
- 75 percentile means that 75 per cent of applications granted during the period were processed within the number of days shown in the tables. Conversely, 25 per cent took longer than the number of days shown. This measure gives an indication of how long it is taking to process the more complex visitor visa applications.

Note: The calculation of days between lodged and grant date has been adjusted to ensure compatibility with the new database.






6.02 Number of Visitor visa holders in Australia as at 30 June 2023 by visa subclass - comparison with same date in previous year

6.03 Number of Visitor visa holders in Australia as at 30 June 2023 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year




