



About this report

This report provides data about the Visitor visa program administered by the Department of Home Affairs (the Department). The report has been produced to assist tourism industry stakeholders and policymakers.

This report is published every six months. Current and previous versions of the report are available on the department's website at: https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/research-and-statistics/statistics/visa-statistics/visit

Data is sourced from several departmental visa processing and recording systems. Data can be dynamic and there can be delays in transmission of information from the Department's global operations. Variations in figures between this report and previous reports can occur. Due to these issues, figures for the current financial year should always be considered provisional.

Definition of terms

Approved Destination Status

(ADS):

Citizenship country: The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant

Decided: The term used for counts of decisions. See below for definition of 'decisions'.

Decisions: An outcome where a decision-maker (including system-generated decision-making)

grants or refuses a visa or sponsorship application.

ETA: Electronic Travel Authority. An electronic visa available to citizens from low risk

countries. The term 'low risk' applies to countries which issue ETA eligible passports.

Granted: Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes primary and review

grants.

In this report, refers to the location of the client at the time the application was lodged.

An applicant in Australia may already hold a visa of the same kind or may be applying

for another type of visa.

Lodged: Lodged is the count of paper applications receipted in a departmental office or

submitted electronically.

On hand: A visa application, nomination or sponsorship that has not been finalised.

Outside Australia: In this report, the term refers to the location of the client at the time of lodging the

application.

Visa applicant: Used to refer to clients applying for a visa.

Visa holders in Australia: The number of visa holders lawfully in Australia. This is not a count of all valid visas,

as a number of visa holders may be outside Australia on the snapshot date.

Background to the Visitor visa program

Visa travel purpose and activities

The Visitor visa program allows travellers to enter or remain in Australia for short-term visits. The program can be divided into two main groups by travel purpose: Tourism and Business.

Tourism activities may include a holiday or recreation, taking a cruise, or visiting family and friends. **Business activities** may include:

making general business or employment enquiries

investigating, negotiating, entering into or reviewing a business contract

conducting activities as part of an official government visit

taking part in a conference, trade fair or seminar (but not being paid by the organisers to take part) undertaking tourist activities.

Visitor visa holders cannot engage in work in Australia (that is, perform an activity in Australia a person would normally be remunerated for).

Visa subclasses and streams

The Visitor visa program is currently made up of three subclasses, the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601), the eVisitor visa (subclass 651) and the Visitor visa (subclass 600). The Visitor visa (subclass 600) has five streams, the Tourist stream, the Sponsored Family stream, the Business Visitor stream, the Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream and the Frequent Traveller stream.

Electronic Travel Authority (subclass 601). This visa allows ETA eligible passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can be made online or through a travel agent, airline or specialist service provider. An ETA holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. More information is available at:

eVisitor visa (subclass 651). This visa allows eligible European passport holders to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. Applications can only be made online. An eVisitor holder can visit Australia as often as they wish in a 12 month period, and stay up to 3 months each time they enter Australia. Visitor visa (subclass 600). This visa allows any passport holder to visit Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes, depending on the stream. Visitor visas can be granted with different stay and validity periods, and may allow single or multiple entries to Australia. More information is available at:

Tourist stream. This stream of the Visitor visa allows people to enter or remain in Australia for tourism purposes. Applications can be made online or by paper.

Business Visitor stream. This stream allows people to enter Australia for business visitor purposes. Applications can be made online or by paper.

Sponsored Family stream. This stream allows people who are sponsored, usually by a family member, to enter Australia to visit family. This visa additional sponsorship requirements which are designed to provide assurance that the visa holder will comply with their visa conditions and depart Australia before their visa expires. Applications can be made online or by paper.

Approved Destination Status (ADS) stream. This stream allows People's Republic of China (PRC) (excluding SARs) passport holders to visit Australia for tourism part of an organised tour group. Applications can only be made through an approved Chinese travel agent participating in the ADS scheme.

Frequent Traveller stream. This stream allows eligible passport holders who travel often to Australia to enter Australia for tourism or business visitor purposes. This visa might be granted with a validity period of up to 10 years. Applications can only be made online.

On 23 March 2013, changes were made to Visitor visas as part of the Australian Government's Visa Simplification and Deregulation project. A number of historic Visitor visa subclasses were repealed and replaced with the current subclasses as outlined in the table below. Where relevant, historic data in this report may refer to both current and previous visa subclasses.

Note: A small percentage of clients who lodged these visa subclasses may now be lodging Temporary Work (Short Stay Activity) (subclass 400) visa applications, which is not covered in this report.

The below table outlines the current and previous Visitor visa subclasses/streams, travel purpose of each subclass/stream (including how they are referenced in this report) and the location of the client at time of lodgement.

Note: Where a visa subclass/stream allows both tourism and business visitor activities, data in this report will be based on the applicant's declared travel activity for their <u>initial</u> entry to Australia for the purposes of determining Tourism or Business visitor activity.

Family members

All applicants, including dependent family members, must lodge their own separate Visitor visa application.

Visa Requirements

To be eligible for a Visitor visa, the applicant must genuinely intend to stay temporarily in Australia for the purpose for which the visa is granted (for tourism or business visitor purposes). Applicants must be able to demonstrate that they have access to adequate means to support themselves (and their family where relevant) during their stay in Australia, including health insurance where required. Applicants must also meet certain health and character requirements.

Work is not permitted on any Visitor visas. Where a person is found to be working in breach of their visa conditions, they could face visa cancellation and an exclusion period.

Study or training, of up to three months, may be permitted on a Visitor visa. However, if the visa holder's main reason for travelling to Australia is study, a student visa might be more appropriate.

Extending stay

Visitor visas cannot be 'extended'. However, Visitor visa holders may extend their stay in Australia by applying for another visa, which may include a Visitor visa (subclass 600) - Tourist stream before their current visa ceases. This is the only Visitor visa stream that is available to applicants already in Australia seeking to extend their stay.

Background to the Visitor visa program - continued

Visa refusals

A decision to refuse a Visitor visa application is made when a delegate of the Minister is not satisfied that the applicant meets the legal criteria for grant of a visa. When refusing a visa application, the Department provides an applicant a written decision record that sets out the reason for the decision and any review rights.

Processing times

Global Visitor visa application processing times are published on the Department's website at: http://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/about/access-accountability/service-standards/global-visa-citizenship-processing-times The published processing times are updated on a monthly basis to reflect current caseloads and processing pressures. Processing times are impacted each month by changes in application volumes, seasonal peaks, complex cases and incomplete applications.

Executive Summary

Key Points

- This report covers Visitor visa statistics for the Visitor visa program for the 2023-24 program year (1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024). Figures referred to in this report include applications made in and outside of Australia.
- Visitor visa application lodgements continued to steadily increase during the 2023-24 program year with a total of 5,274,215 applications in the Visitor visa program (Tourism and Business), up 26.9 per cent compared to the 2022-23 program year. The People's Republic of China was the largest source country with 708,247 applications lodged; an increase of 114.5 per cent compared to the 2022-23 program year.
- A total of 4,713,442 Visitor visas (Tourism and Business) were granted during 2023-24; up 23.4 per cent compared to the 2022-23 program year. Tourism visa grants increased by 24.4 per cent (4,202,441) and Business visa grants increased by 15.8 per cent (511,001) in the 2023-24 program year when compared to 2022-23.
- There were 337,844 Visitor (Tourism and Business) visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2024; a 2.2 per cent increase compared to 30 June 2023 (330,449).
- A key initiative announced at the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Special Summit (4-6 March 2024) was to improve visa access to Australia for ASEAN nationals and Timor Leste, including the extension of Business visa validity from three years to up to five for applications lodged from 1 April 2024.
- While Visitor visa numbers in Australia continue to trend upwards, they are yet to return to pre-COVID levels. A total of 5,274,215 Visitor visa (Tourism and Business) applications were lodged during the 2023-24 program year, which is 12 per cent lower than the total Visitor (Tourism and Business) visa lodgements for the 2018-19 program year (5,965,700). In addition, the number of Visitor visa holder arrivals in Australia from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 was 20 per cent lower than the corresponding period in 2018-19, 5,203,008 arrivals compared to 6,509,956.

This report should be read in conjunction with The Administration of the Immigration and Citizenship Program

1. Applications lodged

There were 5,274,215 Visitor visa (Tourism and Business) applications lodged during the 2023-24 program year; up 26.9 per cent compared to the corresponding period in the 2022-23 program year.

The People's Republic of China was the largest source country for Visitor visa lodgements, with 708,247 applications lodged, ahead of the United States of America (564,242) and the United Kingdom (483,882).

Tourism Visitor visas

Tourism visitor visas accounted for the majority of Visitor visa applications lodged during the 2023-24 program year, with 4,722,769; up 28.1 per cent compared to the same period in the 2022-23 program year.

The top three source countries for Tourism Visitor visa application lodgements were:

- People's Republic of China (up 123.5 per cent to 596,247)
- 2. United States of America (up 24.9 per cent to 515,247)
- 3. United Kingdom (up 4.6 per cent to 455,523).

Business Visitor visas

551,446 Business Visitor visa applications were lodged during the 2023-24 program year, up 18 per cent compared to the same period in 2022-23.

The top three source countries for Business Visitor visa applications were:

- 1. People's Republic of China (up 76.6 per cent to 112,000)
- 2. United States of America (up 4.8 per cent to 48,995)
- 3. Malaysia (up 14 per cent to 46,106)
- 1. Refers to statistical reporting grouping of tourism and business visitor visas
- 2. Subclass 600 (Tourist stream) is the only Visitor visa option for applicants already in Australia.

2. Visas granted

Tourism Visitor visas

A total of 4,202,441 Tourism Visitor visas were granted during the 2023-24 program year; an increase of 24.4 per cent compared to the same period in 2022-23 (3,377,219).

Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (subclass 601) visas represented the largest volume of Tourism Visitor visa grants from July 2023 to 30 June 2024, with 1,898,667 visa grants. Followed by Visitor (subclass 600) visas and eVisitor (subclass 651) visas, with 1,397,813 and 852,224 visa grants respectively.

The top three countries for Tourism Visitor visa grants were:

- 1. United States of America (up 24.6 per cent to 511,188)
- 2. People's Republic of China (up 124.6 per cent to 484,104)
- 3. United Kingdom (up 4.3 per cent to 451,008).

Business Visitor visas

There were 511,001 Business Visitor visa grants during the 2023-24 program year; an increase of 15.8 per cent compared to the same period in 2022-23 program year (441,276).

The top three countries for Business Visitor visa grants were:

- 1. People's Republic of China (up 76.9 per cent to 99,079)
- 2. United States of America (up 4.4 per cent to 48,432)
- 3. Malaysia (up 13.5 per cent to 44,572).

3. Grant rates

Grant rates are provided on a quarterly basis. The overall grant rate for all Visitor visas (Tourism and Business) increased slightly to 88.2 per cent for the 1 April 2024 to 30 June 2024 quarter, compared to 86.7 per cent for the corresponding quarter in 2022-23.

4. Processing times

Processing times are provided on a quarterly basis and are based on the age of applications finalised in a specific time period. Visa processing times can vary due to individual circumstances, the quality and completeness of applications, and whether further information is required.

Visitor visa processing times continued to trend down. During the 1 April 2024 to 30 June 2024 quarter:

- 75 per cent of Tourism Visitor visa applications were processed within 15 calendar days, compared to 17 days for the corresponding quarter in 2022-23
- 75 per cent of Business Visitor visa applications were processed within 6 calendar days, compared to 7 days for the corresponding quarter in 2022-23.

5. Applications on hand

As at 30 June 2024:

- 72,162 Tourism Visitor visa applications were on hand, compared to 54,022 at 30 June 2023
- 6 608 Business Visitor visa applications were on hand, compared to 4 727 at 30 June 2023.

6. Visa holders In Australia

On 30 June 2024, there were 337,844 Visitor (Tourism and Business) visa holders in Australia; a 2.2 per cent increase compared to 330,449 Visitor visa holders in Australia on 30 June 2023.

The Visitor (subclass 600) visa comprised the largest cohort with 250,548 visa holders in Australia, followed by the ETA (subclass 601) visa with 61,477 visa holders, and the eVisitor (subclass 651) visa with 25,816 visa holders.

7. Approved Destination Status (ADS)

The ADS scheme re-commenced in September 2023 after being paused by the Chinese government in early 2020 due to border restrictions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since resumption of the scheme until 30 June 2024, 25,196 Visitor (ADS) visas were granted to citizens of the People's Republic of China.


8. Arrivals

There were 5,203,008 arrivals on Visitor (Tourism and Business) visas during the 2023-24 program year; a 42.6 per cent increase compared to the corresponding period in the 2022-23 program year (3,649,121).


The top three countries for arrivals on Visitor visas from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 were:

- 1. United States of America (up 33.9 per cent to 612 413)
- 2. People's Republic of China (up 277.7 per cent to 561,540)
- 3. United Kingdom (up 7.4 per cent to 520,635)


1.01 Number of Visitor visa applications lodged in 2023-24 to 30 June 2024 by month - comparison with previous four financial years






1.04 Number of Tourism Visitor visa applications lodged in 2023-24 to 30 June 2024 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year








2.01 Number of Visitor visa applications granted in 2023-24 to 30 June 2024 by month - comparison with previous four financial years






2.04 Number of Tourism Visitor visa applications granted in 2023-24 to 30 June 2024 by visa group - comparison with same period in previous year







6.01 Number of Visitor visa holders in Australia at the end of each month in 2023-24 to 30 June 2024 by month - comparison with previous four financial years






6.03 Number of Visitor visa holders in Australia as at 30 June 2024 by citizenship country - comparison with same period in previous year




