Notes on statistical tables presented by citizenship country

A result of 'na' indicates that the country did not have a Working Holiday Maker arrangement with Australia during the specified period. This may be because the arrangement had not yet commenced or the arrangement is no longer in place. Refer to the table 'Australia's Working Holiday Maker arrangements' in the 'Background to the Working Holiday Maker visa program' section.

A citizenship country of 'Not Specified' can result from eligible dual nationality applicants where the non-eligible nationality has been recorded for the WHM application.

Note 1: Data in years prior to 2017-18 was revised on 1 October 2019, due to better source data becoming available. This may result in minor discrepancies with previously published statistics.

Definition of terms

Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes all visa grants.
Snapshot date:	The snapshot date is a point in time at which a count is undertaken. In this report, the number of visa holders in Australia at a point in time is used.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa.
Working Holiday Maker:	Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa.

Background to the Working Holiday Maker visa program

The purpose of the Working Holiday Maker (WHM) visa program is to foster people-to-people links between Australia and partner countries, with particular emphasis on young adults. It has been in existence since 1975. Today, the WHM visa program includes two subclasses: the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa. Partner countries initially comprised a relatively small number of Commonwealth countries. The program now has 44 partner countries and regions from across the world.

Australia has an overarching bilateral arrangement, usually in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding, with each partner country or region. Of the 44 partner countries or regions, 19 are Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa arrangements, and 25 are Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa arrangements. The key difference between the two visas is that Work and Holiday visa arrangements generally have caps on the number of visas granted in each program year and additional eligibility requirements.

WHM arrangements are largely reciprocal, providing Australians with similar opportunities overseas. In considering whether to add new WHM partner countries, the Australian Government considers a range of factors, including the ability of the prospective partner to offer reciprocity to Australians, and the strength of any people-to-people links.

Eligibility requirements

WHM (both Working Holiday and Work and Holiday) visa applicants must:

- be aged 18-30 (inclusive) at time of application. For Canada, France and Ireland, the age is 18 to 35 (inclusive).
- hold a passport from an eligible partner country or region. A list of eligible countries and regions is provided in the 'Australia's Working Holiday Maker Visa Arrangements' section of this report
- not be accompanied by dependent children during their stay in Australia
- meet financial, health and character requirements.

Work and Holiday visa applicants must meet additional requirements, which may include:

- functional English
- successful completion of at least two years of undergraduate university study (except Israel & USA)
- a letter of home country/government support in association with their visa application (except Argentina, Austria, Chile, China, Israel, Portugal, Spain, Singapore and USA).

Working while in Australia

All WHMs may work for the full duration of their 12-month stay in Australia, but generally cannot remain with any one employer for longer than six months (by operation of mandatory visa condition 8547).

A visa holder may work for the same employer for a combined total of more than six months, provided the work is undertaken in a different location and work in any one location does not exceed six months. Studying while in Australia

All WHMs are entitled to study for a period of up to four months during their 12-month stay in Australia.

Background to the Working Holiday Maker visa program - continued

Second and third Working Holiday visas

First-time Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa holders who complete three months of 'specified subclass 417 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a second Working Holiday visa. Second Working Holiday visa holders who complete six months of 'specified subclass 417 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a third Working Holiday visa. The six months of specified work must have been carried out on or after 1 July 2019, so no third visas were granted before January 2020.

Specified subclass 417 work includes work in the agriculture, mining and construction industries, bushfire recovery work, critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors, and tourism and hospitality work in northern, remote or very remote Australia only.

Second and third Work and Holiday visas

First-time Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa holders who complete three months of 'specified subclass 462 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a second Work and Holiday visa. Second Work and Holiday visa holders who complete six months of 'specified subclass 462 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a third Work and Holiday visa. The six months of specified work must have been carried out on or after 1 July 2019, so no third visas were granted before January 2020.

Specified subclass 462 work includes work in the agriculture, construction and tourism and hospitality industries, bushfire recovery work and critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors.

Recent developments in the Working Holiday Maker (WHM) visa program

Any Work and Holiday program developments, including signings and commencement dates for new Work and Holiday visa arrangements, will be announced on the department's website at:

- From 19 August 2020, WHMs could count critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors undertaken anywhere in Australia after 31 January 2020 as specified work to apply for a second or third WHM visa.
- On 12 October 2020, the Acting Minister for Immigration, Citizenship, Migrant Services and Multicultural Affairs, the Hon Alan Tudge MP, announced that WHMs who were unable to travel to Australia or had to leave early due to COVID-19 would be eligible for a VAC waiver to return to Australia in the future, or a refund if they had passed the relevant age limit.
- From 14 November 2020, former WHMs who transitioned to a COVID-19 Pandemic event visa to continue undertaking critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors could count this work as specified work towards eligibility for a second or third WHM visa. These new arrangements recognise the contribution of WHMs doing critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors and ensure they can still access subsequent WHM visa options.
- WHMs employed in critical sectors who were not eligible for a second or third WHM visa continued to be able to apply for a COVID-19 Pandemic event visa to continue their critical work in Australia.
- From 1 July 2021 to 31 December 2022, holders and former holders of a COVID-19 affected WHM visa are able to make a nil visa application charge (VAC) WHM application online.

Working Holiday Maker visa changes helping COVID-19 recovery

- On 22 June 2021, the Minister for Immigration, Citizenship, Migrant Services and Multicultural Affairs announced further changes to the WHM program to assist with Australia's COVID-19 economic recovery.
- From 8 May 2021, WHMs working in the tourism and hospitality sectors anywhere in Australia may now work for up to 12 months with the same employer or organisation without requesting permission.
- From 22 June 2021, work undertaken in the tourism and hospitality sectors in northern, remote or very remote Australia can also be counted as specified work towards eligibility for a second or third WHM visa. This option will be available for WHM applications lodged from March 2022.
- From March 2022, eligible current and former WHMs in Australia will also be able to apply for a WHM vis a with a nil VAC. This will provide another opportunity to meet the specified work requirements for a subsequent WHM visa.

Australia and UK Free Trade Agreement

On 15 June 2021, the Australian and UK governments announced that agreement in principle has been reached between Australia and the UK to increase the maximum eligible age from 30 to 35 years for Working Holiday Maker (WHM) applicants from the UK and Australia.

- While agreement in principle has been reached, no changes have yet been made to existing arrangements.
- The agreement will also provide an opportunity for WHMs to stay in the UK and Australia for up to three years, with no requirement to undertake 'specified work'.
- Negotiations have not yet concluded, however it is anticipated that these changes will be made within five years.

Executive Summary

Key Points

The decrease in WHM program lodgements and grants in the period 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021 can be attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic. The longer-term decline in demand for WHM visas observed over several years prior to the pandemic may have been influenced by changing currency exchange rates and economic and labour market conditions in partner countries and Australia.

- In 2020-21, there was a:
 - total of 39,586 Working Holiday Maker (WHM) (subclass 417 and subclass 462) visas granted, which is a 73.5 per cent decrease compared to 2019-20 (149,249).
 - 98.1 per cent decrease in first Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa grants from 92,282 (2019-20) to 1,749 (2020-21).
 - 25.9 per cent decrease in second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa grants from 28,316 (2019-20) to 20,982 (2020-21).
 - 98 per cent decrease in first Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa grants from 19,845 (2019-20) to 397 (2020-21).
 - 8.9 per cent decrease in second Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa grants from 6,128 (2019-20) to 5,585 (2020-21).
 - 57.4 per cent decrease of WHM visa holders in Australia from 85,691 at 30 June 2020 to 36,526 at 30 June 2021.
- 8,476 third Working Holiday (subclass 417) and 2,397 third Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visas were granted.

1 Applications lodged for WHM program

In 2020-21, 49,601 visa applications were lodged for total WHM program, 69 per cent decrease compared to 159,750 in 2019-20.

In 2020-21, Working Holiday (subclass 417), first visa applications decreased by 92.2 per cent (7,379) and second visa applications decreased by 33.7per cent (20,934) compared to 2019-20.

In 2020-21, Work and Holiday (subclass 462), first visa applications decreased by 85.5 per cent (3,225) and second visa applications increased by 25.1 per cent to 5,290 compared to 2019-20.

2 Visas granted

Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa program

A combined total of 31,207 first, second and third Working Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21 a 74.6 per cent decrease compared to 122,673 in 2019-20.

First Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa program A total of 1,749 first Working Holiday visas were

Granted in 2020-21, a 98.1 per cent decrease compared to 9 92,282 in 2019-20.

A total of 20,982 second Working Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21.

In 2020-21, 82.3 per cent of those granted a second Working Holiday visa nominated agriculture as the industry in which they had undertaken "specified work" in order to acquire eligibility. A further 9.2 per cent nominated construction, 1.7 per cent mining.

Third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa program

A total of 8,476 third Working Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21

The top five countries or regions for third Working Holiday visa grants were:

- Taiwan (1,877)
- United Kingdom (1,721)
- France (951)
- Ireland (885)
- South Korea (668)

In 2020-21, 75.4 per cent of those granted a third Working Holiday visa nominated agriculture as the industry in which they had undertaken "specified work" in order to acquire eligibility. A further 13.1 per cent nominated construction, and 3.4 per cent mining.

Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa program

A combined total of 8,379 first, second and third Work and Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21, a 68.5 per cent decrease compared to 26,576 in 2019-20

First Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa program

A total of 397 first Work and Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21, a 98 per cent decrease compared to 19,845 in 2019-20.

The top five countries for first Work and Holiday visa grants were:

Second Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa program

A total of 5,585 second Work and Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21, an 8.9 per cent decrease compared to 6,128 in 2019-20.

The top five countries for second Work and Holiday visa grants were:

- Argentina (979)
- China (951)
- Chile (665)
- Spain (608)
- United States of America (573)

In 2020-21, 65.3 per cent of those granted a second Work and Holiday visa nominated agriculture as the industry in which they had undertaken "specified work" in order to acquire eligibility. A further 27.2 per cent nominated hospitality and 3.6 per cent construction.

Third Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa program

A total of 2,397 third Work and Holiday visas were granted in 2020-21.

The top five countries for third Work and Holiday visa grants were:

- China (710)
- Indonesia (408)
- Chile (290)
- Argentina (279)
- United States of America (175)

In 2020-21, 54 per cent of those granted a third Work and Holiday visa nominated agriculture as the industry in which they had undertaken "specified work" in order to acquire eligibility. A further 40.2 per cent nominated hospitality, and 2.7 per cent construction.

3 Grant rates

The grant rate for first Working Holiday visas in the 2020-21 was 83.5 per cent. The decrease in WHM grant rates in the 2020-21 program year can be attributed to international travel restrictions, introduced in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The grant rate for first Work and Holiday visas was 58.9 per cent. The grant rate for second Work and Holiday visas was 99.5 per cent. The grant rate for third Work and Holiday visas was 99.2 per cent.

The generally high grant rates for WHM visas are indicative of the low risk nature of this caseload. The large proportion of online applications for this caseload also contributes to the high grant rate. A number of automated eligibility checks occur during online applications, alerting clients early in the process if they do not meet visa requirements.


4 Working Holiday Makers in Australia


Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa holders


1.01 Total number of Working Holiday Maker visa applications lodged in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




1.02 Total number of Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications lodged in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




1.05 Number of third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications lodged in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years






















2.01 Total number of Working Holiday Maker visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




2.02 Total number of Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




2.03 Number of first Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




2.04 Number of second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years

2.06 Total number of Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years




2.07 Number of first Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by month - comparison with previous four financial years












2.27 Second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by employer industry




2.28 Third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2020-21 to 30 June 2021 by employer industry




