This may be because the arrangement had not yet commenced or the arrangement is no longer in place. A citizenship country of 'Not Specified' can result from eligible dual nationality applicants where the non-eligible nationality has been recorded for the WHM application.

Note 1: Data in years prior to 2017-18 was revised on 1 October 2019, due to better source data becoming available. This may result in minor discrepancies with previously published statistics.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Citizenship country:	The country of citizenship of the visa applicant or visa holder. Where a visa applicant or visa holder has more than one citizenship country, either the citizenship of the travel document or the citizenship nominated by the visa applicant is used.
Granted:	Unless otherwise specified, the number of visas granted includes all visa grants.
Snapshot date:	The snapshot date is a point in time at which a count is undertaken. In this report, the number of visa holders in Australia at a point in time is used.
Visa applicant:	Used to refer to clients applying for a visa.
Working Holiday Maker:	Refers collectively to both the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa.

BACKGROUND TO THE WORKING HOLIDAY MAKER VISA PROGRAM

The purpose of the Working Holiday Maker (WHM) visa program is to foster people-to-people links between Australia and partner countries, with particular emphasis on young adults. It has been in existence since 1975. Today, the WHM visa program includes two subclasses: the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa and the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa. Partner countries initially comprised a relatively small number of Commonwealth countries. The program now has 50 partner countries and regions from across the world.

Australia has an overarching bilateral arrangement, usually in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding, with each partner country or region. Of the 50 partner countries or regions, 19 are Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa arrangements, and 31 are Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa arrangements. The key difference between the two visas is that Work and Holiday visa arrangements generally have caps on the number of first visas granted in each program year and additional eligibility requirements.

WHM arrangements are largely reciprocal, providing Australians with similar opportunities overseas. In considering whether to add new WHM partner countries, the Australian Government considers a range of factors, including the ability of the prospective partner to offer reciprocity to Australians, and the strength of existing people-to-people links.

1.1. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- WHM (both Working Holiday and Work and Holiday) visa applicants must:
- be aged 18-30 (inclusive) at time of application. For Canada, France, Denmark, Ireland, Italy and The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (including British National Overseas passport holders) the age is 18-35 (inclusive).
- hold a passport from an eligible partner country or region. A list of eligible countries and regions is provided in the 'Australia's Working Holiday Maker Visa Arrangements' section of this report.
- not be accompanied by dependent children during their stay in Australia.
- meet financial, health and character requirements.

Work and Holiday visa applicants must meet additional requirements, which vary between eligible countries, based on the agreements set out in the individual MOUs for partner countries.

1.2. WORKING WHILE IN AUSTRALIA

All WHMs may work for the full duration of their 12 month stay in Australia but generally cannot remain with any one employer for longer than six months (by operation of mandatory visa condition 8547), unless an exemption applies or they have obtained written permission from the department.

1.3. STUDYING WHILE IN AUSTRALIA

All WHMs are entitled to study for a period of up to four months during their 12-month stay in Australia

1.4. SECOND AND THIRD WORKING HOLIDAY VISAS

First-time Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa holders who complete three months of 'specified subclass 417 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a second Working Holiday visa. Second Working Holiday visa holders who complete six months of 'specified subclass 417 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a third Working Holiday visa.

Specified subclass 417 work includes work in the agriculture, mining, construction, tourism and hospitality industries, as well as bushfire and natural disaster recovery work, and critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors.

1.5. SECOND AND THIRD WORK AND HOLIDAY VISAS

First-time Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa holders who complete three months of 'specified subclass 462 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a second Work and Holiday visa. Second Work and Holiday visa holders who complete six months of 'specified subclass 462 work' during their stay become eligible to apply for a third Work and Holiday visa.

Specified subclass 462 work includes work in the agriculture, construction, tourism and hospitality industries, bushfire and natural disaster recovery work and critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors.

The department continues to accept specified work under critical COVID-19 healthcare and medical sectors performed after 31 January 2020 for applicants who apply for a second or third WHM visa.

1.6. PROCESSING TIMES

The published processing times are updated on a monthly basis to reflect current caseloads and processing pressures.

Processing times are impacted each month by changes in application volumes, seasonal peaks, complex cases and incomplete applications.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE WORKING HOLIDAY MAKER (WHM) VISA PROGRAM

- On 16 September 2024, India officially joined the Working Holiday Maker visa program and became the 50th Working Holiday Maker partner country. The non-reciprocal arrangement – established via side letter to the Australia-India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (AI-ECTA) – provides up to 1,000 Subclass 462 visa places per year to eligible Indian passport holders.
- On 1 October 2024, the Department implemented a Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa pre-application process (a ballot) for first Work and Holiday visa applicants from China, India and Vietnam.
 - The ballot system, with an AUD\$25 registration fee, aims to provide an equitable, streamlined and transparent method for selecting applicants in cases where the demand significantly exceeds the available visa places for a participating country.
 - Selected ballot registrants must meet standard Work and Holiday requirements to be granted a subclass 462 visa.
- From 1 July 2024, WHMs working in certain sectors may continue to work for the same employer in Australia for more than 6 months without seeking permission. The full list of exemptions is available at [6 month work limitation \(homeaffairs.gov.au\)](https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/6-month-work-limitation)
- On 1 July 2024, the WHM arrangements made under the Australia-United Kingdom Free Trade Agreement (Australia-UK FTA) was fully implemented. These arrangements include:
 - increasing the maximum eligible age for United Kingdom WHM applicants to 35 from 1 July 2023; and
 - the removal of specified work requirements for United Kingdom WHMs from 1 July 2024.
- On 8 September 2023, Australia signed a Strategic Partnership with the Philippines, including a new reciprocal Work and Holiday visa for Australians and Filipinos. The arrangement provides up to 200 subclass 462 visas for young Filipinos and Australians annually. Commencement details for this arrangement will be published on the department's website when available.

KEY STATISTICS

This executive summary covers the WHM program from 1 January 2025 to 30 June 2025.

The WHM program has been tracking at an upward trend since full re-opening of Australia's borders following the COVID-19 pandemic. Both lodgements and grants of WHM visas have increased in the six-month period to 30 June 2025 compared to the same period of 2024. The increase in demand of the WHM program can be attributed to program setting changes, including age increases and specified work changes.

- As at 30 June, 2025, there were 206,187 WHM (subclass 417 and subclass 462) visa holders in Australia, up from 170,437 at 31 December 2023.
- A total of 175,070 WHM (subclass 417 and subclass 462) visas granted, compared with 122,387 visa grants in the same period in 2024, including:
 - 86,374 first, 42,340 second and 10,316 third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa grants
 - 22,801 first, 9,516 second and 3,723 third Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa grants
- The United Kingdom, France, Republic of Ireland, Italy and Korea were the top five citizenship countries of the Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa grants in the six-month period to 30 June, 2025 cumulatively accounting for 71.9 per cent of the total.
- Indonesia The People's Republic of China, United States, Argentina and Chile were the top five citizenship countries of the Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa grants in the six-month period to 30 June 2025, cumulatively accounting for 60.1 per cent of the total.

1. APPLICATIONS LODGED FOR WHM PROGRAM

In the six months to 30 June 2025, 141,841 visa applications were lodged across the total WHM program, a 13.4% per cent increase compared to 125,058 in the same period of 2024.

For Working Holiday (subclass 417), first visa applications decreased by 1.7 per cent to 72,467, second visa applications increased by 23.7 per cent to 28,531 and third visa applications increased by 169.3 per cent to 12,967.

For Work and Holiday (subclass 462), first visa applications increased by 23.8 per cent to 13,757, second visa applications decreased by 16.4 per cent to 8,216 and third visa applications increased 133.8 per cent to 5,894.

2. VISAS GRANTED

WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA PROGRAM

In the six months to 30 June 2025, a total of 115,875 visa applications were granted for the Working Holiday program, compared to 93,804 in the same six months of 2024.

FIRST WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA PROGRAM

A total of 72,202 first Working Holiday visas were granted in the six months to 30 June 2025. This is a 1.2 per cent increase compared to 71,354 in the same six months of 2024.

Top five countries for first Working Holiday visa grants for 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 were:

1. United Kingdom (42,383)
2. France (30,955)
3. Germany (13,280)
4. Italy (12,424)
5. South Korea (12,374)

SECOND WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA PROGRAM

A total of 29,639 second Working Holiday visas were granted in the six months to 30 June 2025. This is a 55.5 per cent increase compared to 19,055 in the same six months of 2024.

The top five countries or regions for second Working Holiday visa grants for 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 were:

1. United Kingdom (28,606)
2. Ireland (9,869)
3. France (8,555)
4. Italy (5,637)
5. Taiwan (5,037)

In 2024-25 to 30 June 2025, 46.5 per cent of those granted a second Working Holiday visa did not nominate an industry. This is due to the Australia-United Kingdom Free Trade Agreement (Australia-UK FTA), which exempts UK passport holders from having to meet the specified work requirement if they applied on or after 1 July 2024 for a second or third Working Holiday visa.

For the remainder who did nominate an industry, 27.9 per cent nominated *agriculture, forestry & fishing* as the industry in which they had undertaken "specified work" to acquire eligibility. A further 13.9 per cent nominated *accommodation & food services*, 9.1 per cent nominated *construction* and 2.6 per cent nominated *mining*.

THIRD WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA PROGRAM

A total of 14,034 third Working Holiday visas were granted in the six months to 30 June 2025. This is a 313.7 per cent increase compared to 3,392 in the same six months of 2024.

The top five countries or regions for third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa grants for 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 were:

1. United Kingdom (8,423)
2. Ireland (3,616)
3. Taiwan (3,349)
4. France (2,427)
5. Italy (1,905)

In 2024-25 to 30 June 2025, 44.1 per cent of those granted a third Working Holiday visa did not nominate an industry.

This is due to the Australia-United Kingdom Free Trade Agreement (Australia-UK FTA), which exempts UK passport holders from needing to meet the specified work requirement if they applied on or after 1 July 2024 for a second or third Working Holiday visa.

For the remainder who did nominate an industry, 26.0 percent nominated *agriculture, forestry & fishing* as the industry in which they had undertaken “specified work” in order to acquire eligibility. A further 11.9 per cent nominated *accommodation & food services*, 11.7 per cent nominated *construction* and 6.2 per cent nominated *mining*.

WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA PROGRAM

In the six months to 30 June 2025, a total of 30,171 visa applications were granted, compared to 18,365 visas granted in the same six months of 2024.

FIRST WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA PROGRAM

A total of 15,087 first Work and Holiday visas were granted in the six months to June 2025. This is a 71.6 per cent increase compared to 8,793 visas granted in the same period in 2024.

The top five countries for first Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa grants in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 were:

1. United States of America (5,740)
2. Peoples Republic of China (excl SARs) (5,000)
3. Indonesia (4,796)
4. Chile (3,393)
5. Spain (3,221)

SECOND WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA PROGRAM

A total of 9,259 second Work and Holiday visas were granted in the six months to June 2025. This is an 18.7 per cent increase compared to 7,800 visas granted in the same period in 2024.

The top five countries for second Work and Holiday visa grants in 2024-25 to June were:

1. Indonesia (5,031)
2. Argentina (2,418)
3. Thailand (1,679)
4. Chile (1,643)
5. Vietnam (1,541)

In 2024-25, 54.2 per cent of those granted a second Work and Holiday visa nominated *agriculture, forestry & fishing* as the industry in which they had undertaken ‘specified work’ in order to acquire eligibility. A further 33.2 per cent nominated *accommodation & food services*, and 5.5 per cent nominated *construction*.

THIRD WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA PROGRAM

In the six months to 30 June, 2025, a total of 5,825 third Work and Holiday visas were granted. This is a 228.9 per cent increase compared to 1,771 visas granted in the same six months of 2024.

The top five countries for third Work and Holiday visa grants in 2024-25 were:

1. Indonesia (3,747)
2. Vietnam (1,247)

3. Thailand (1,049)
4. Argentina (898)
5. China, Peoples Republic of (excl SARs) (869)

In 2024-25, 56.7 per cent of those granted a third Work and Holiday visa nominated *agriculture, forestry & fishing* as the industry in which they had undertaken “specified work” in order to acquire eligibility. A further 30.9 per cent nominated *accommodation & food services* and 5.0 per cent nominated *construction*.

3. GRANT RATES

WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA PROGRAM

The grant rate for first Working Holiday visas in the six-month period ending 30 June 2025 was 99.8 per cent. The grant rate for second Working Holiday visas was 99.4 per cent. The grant rate for third Working Holiday visas was 99.7 per cent.

WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA PROGRAM

The grant rate for first Work and Holiday visas in the six-month period ending 30 June 2025 was 95.4 per cent. The grant rate for second Work and Holiday visas was 99.8 per cent. The grant rate for third Work and Holiday visas was 97.5 per cent.

The generally high grant rates for WHM visas are indicative of the low-risk nature of this caseload. Online lodgement for this caseload also contributes to the high grant rate. Several automated eligibility checks occur during online lodgement, alerting clients early in the application process if they do not meet visa requirements.

4. WORKING HOLIDAY MAKERS IN AUSTRALIA

WORKING HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 417) VISA HOLDERS

As at 30 June 2025, there were 164,620 Working Holiday visa holders in Australia. This is a 21.6 per cent increase compared to 135,398 on 30 June 2024.

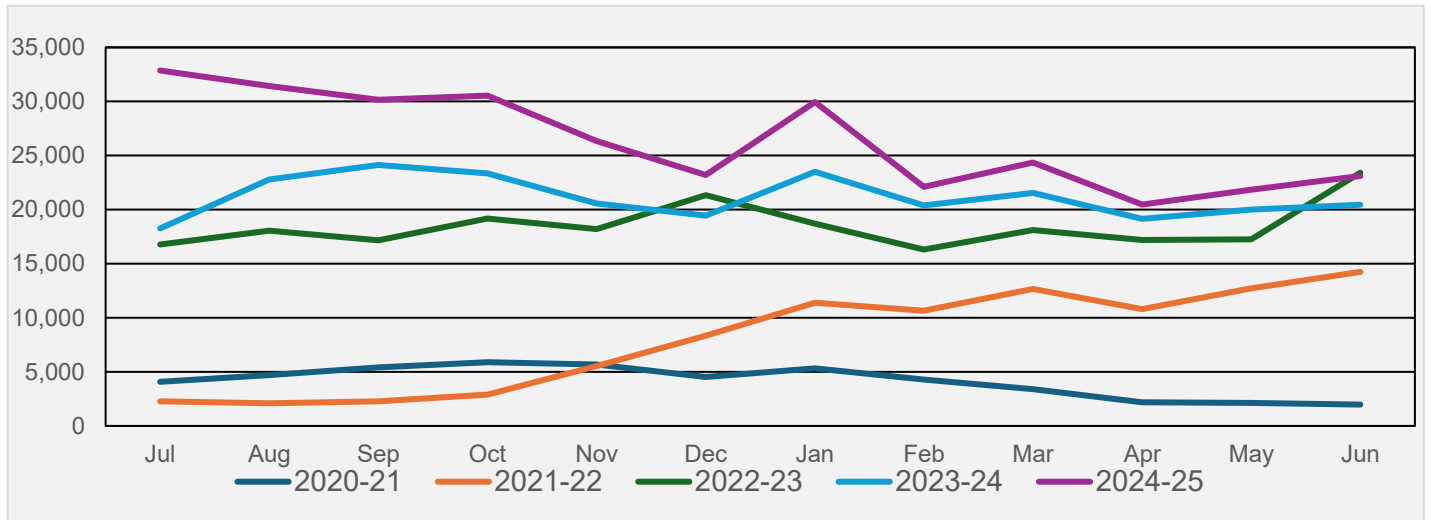
WORK AND HOLIDAY (SUBCLASS 462) VISA HOLDERS

As at 30 June 2025, there were 46,351 Work and Holiday visa holders in Australia. This is a 22.6 per cent increase compared to 37,818 on 30 June 2024.

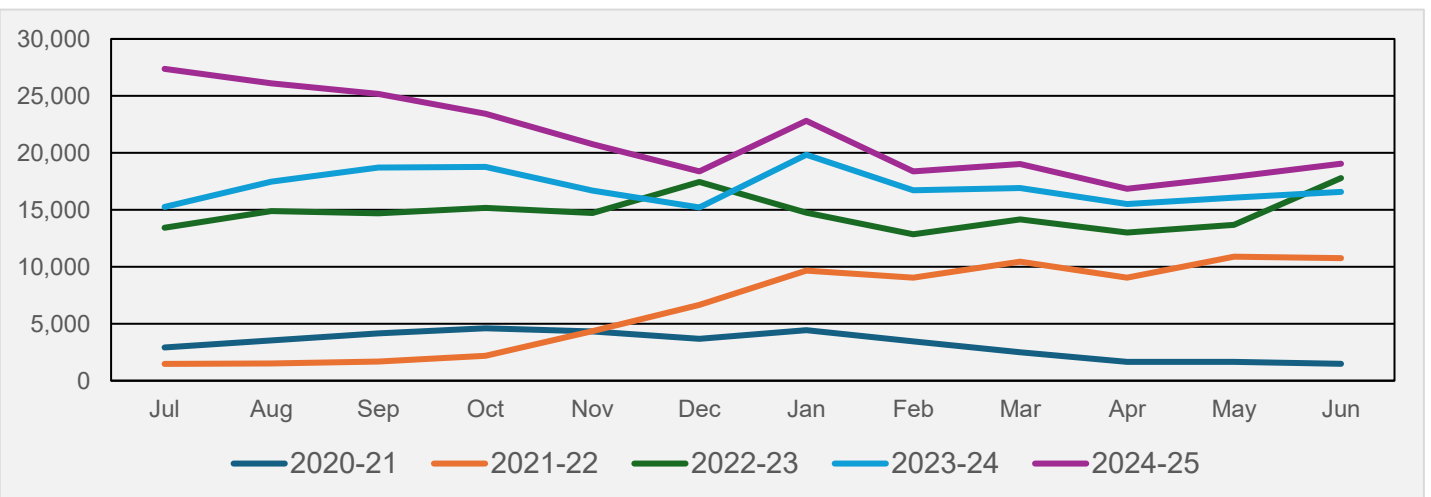

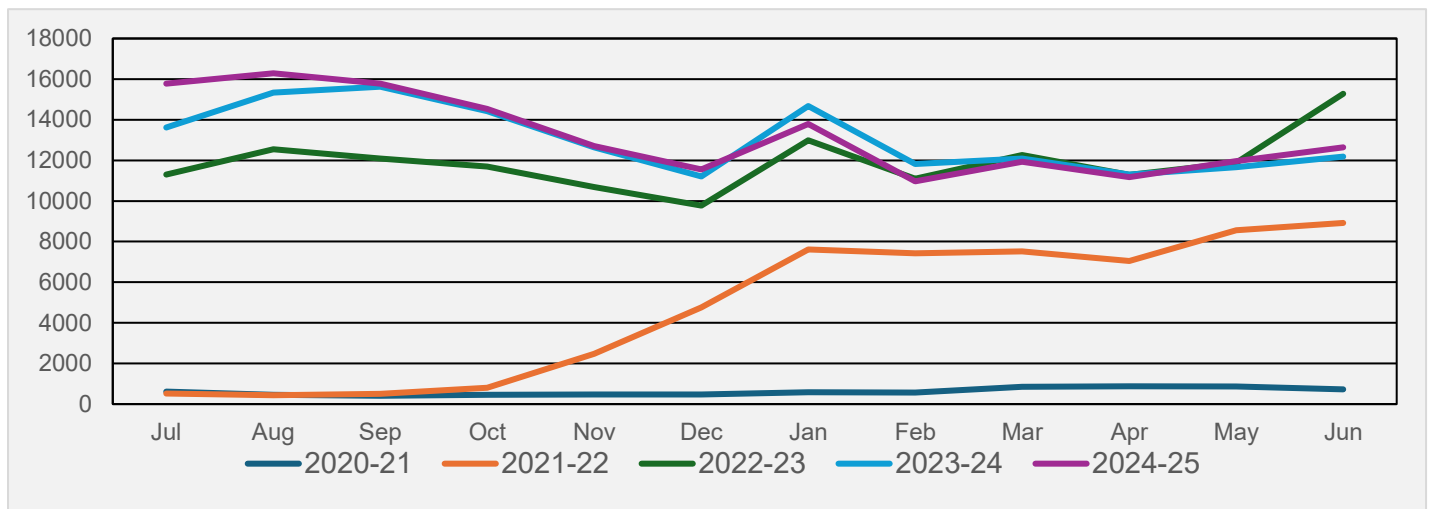
1.02 Total number of Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications lodged in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by month -comparison with previous four financial years

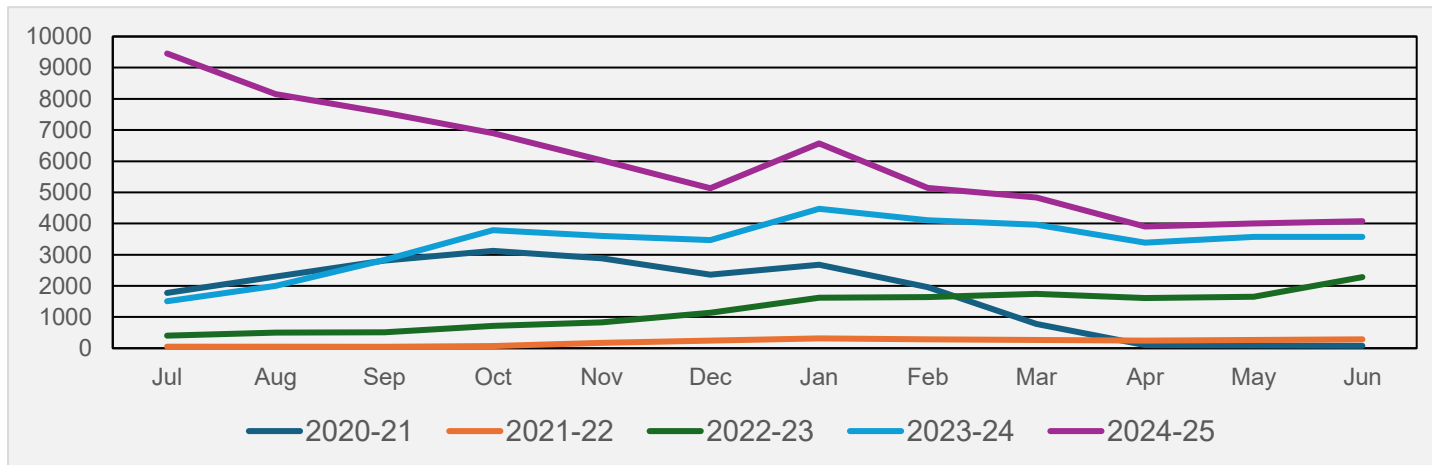

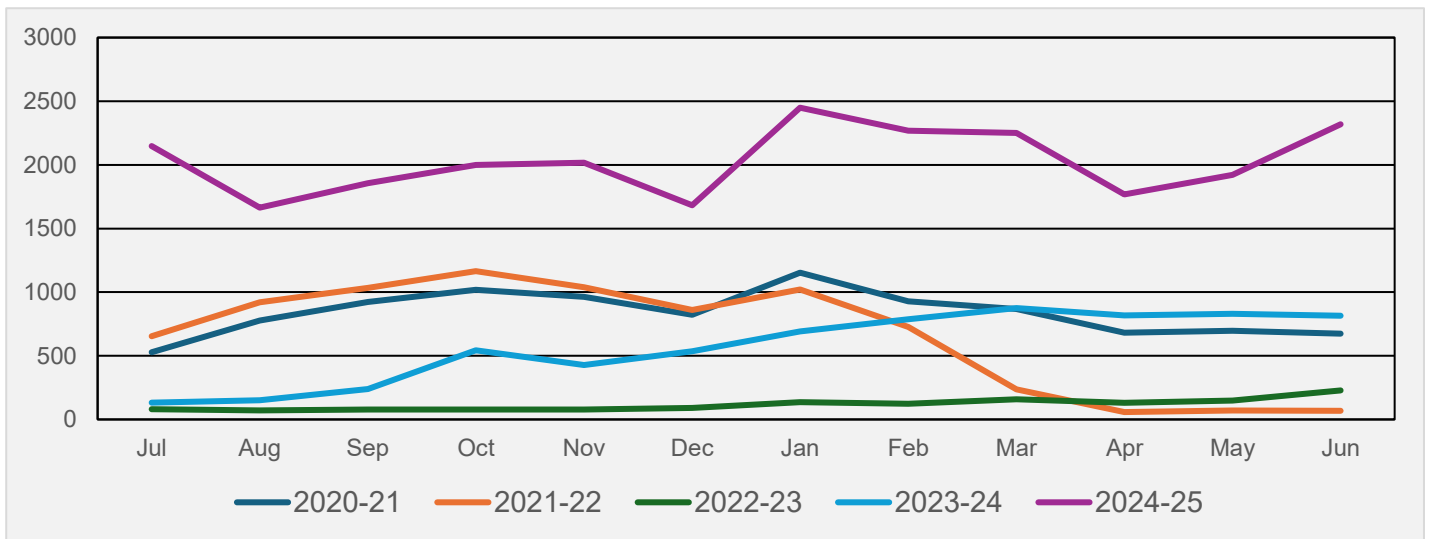
1.04 Number of second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications lodged in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by month - comparison with previous four financial years

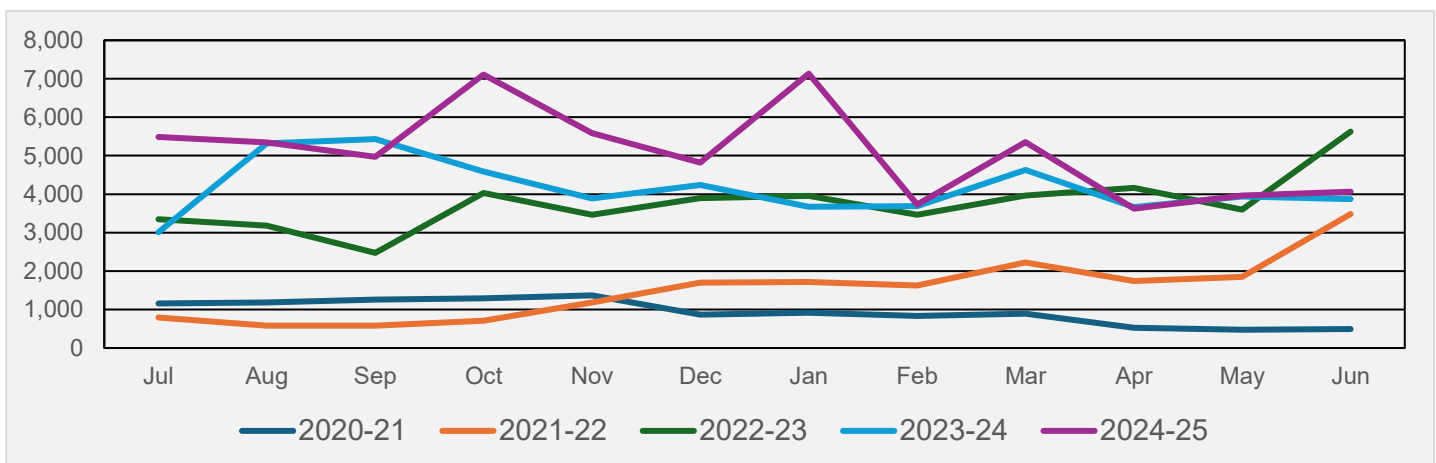

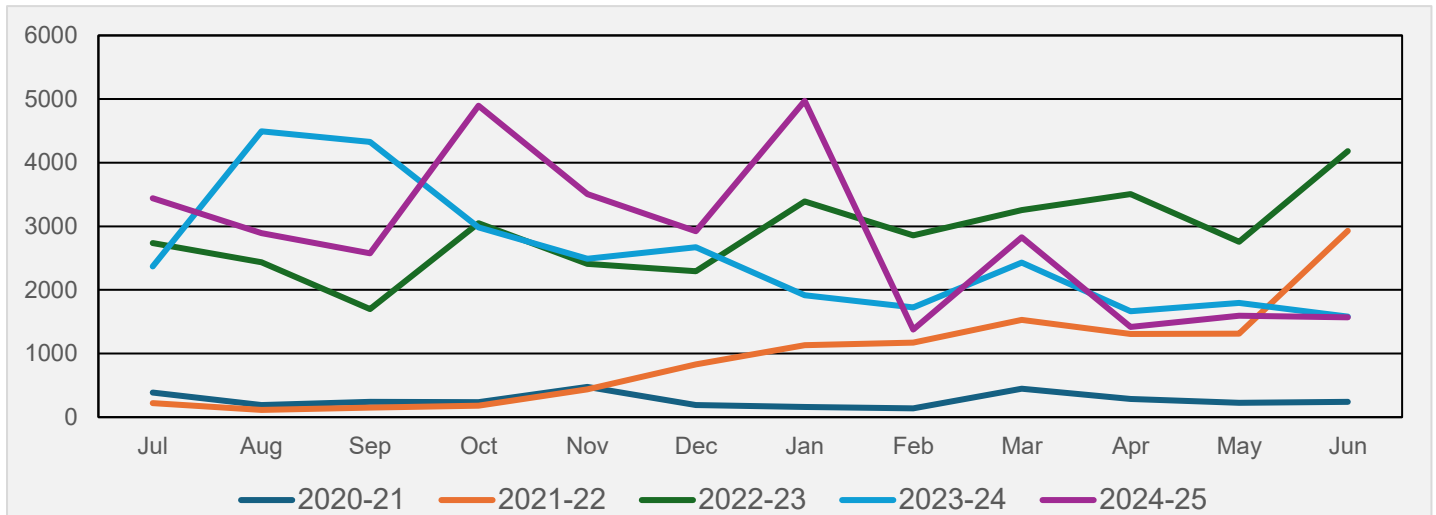

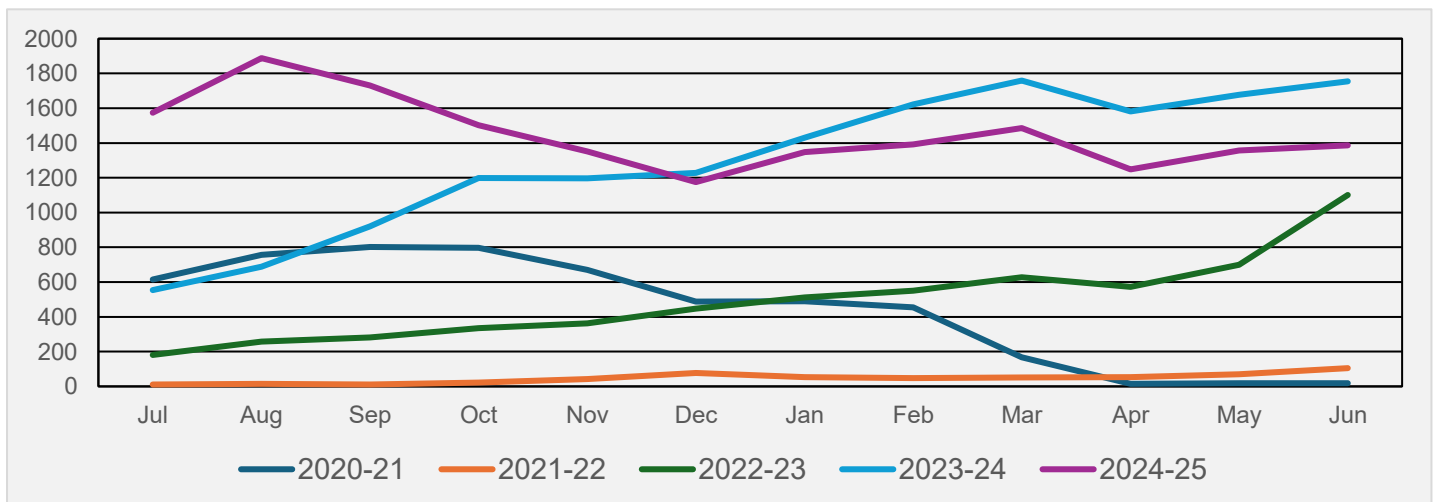

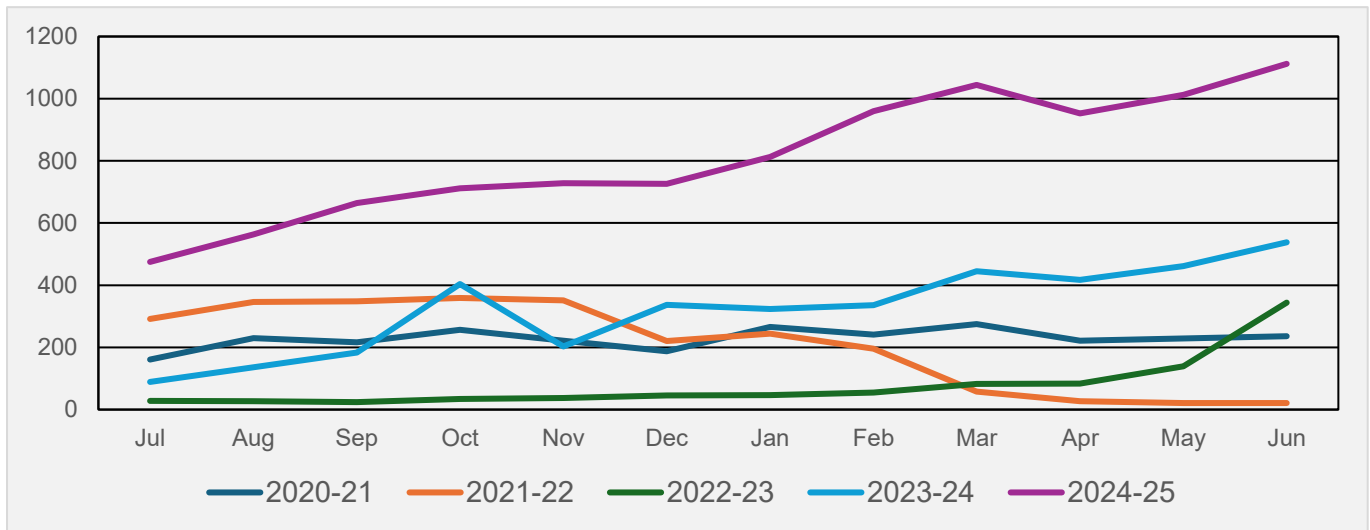
1.08 Number of second Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa applications lodged in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by month - comparison with previous four financial years

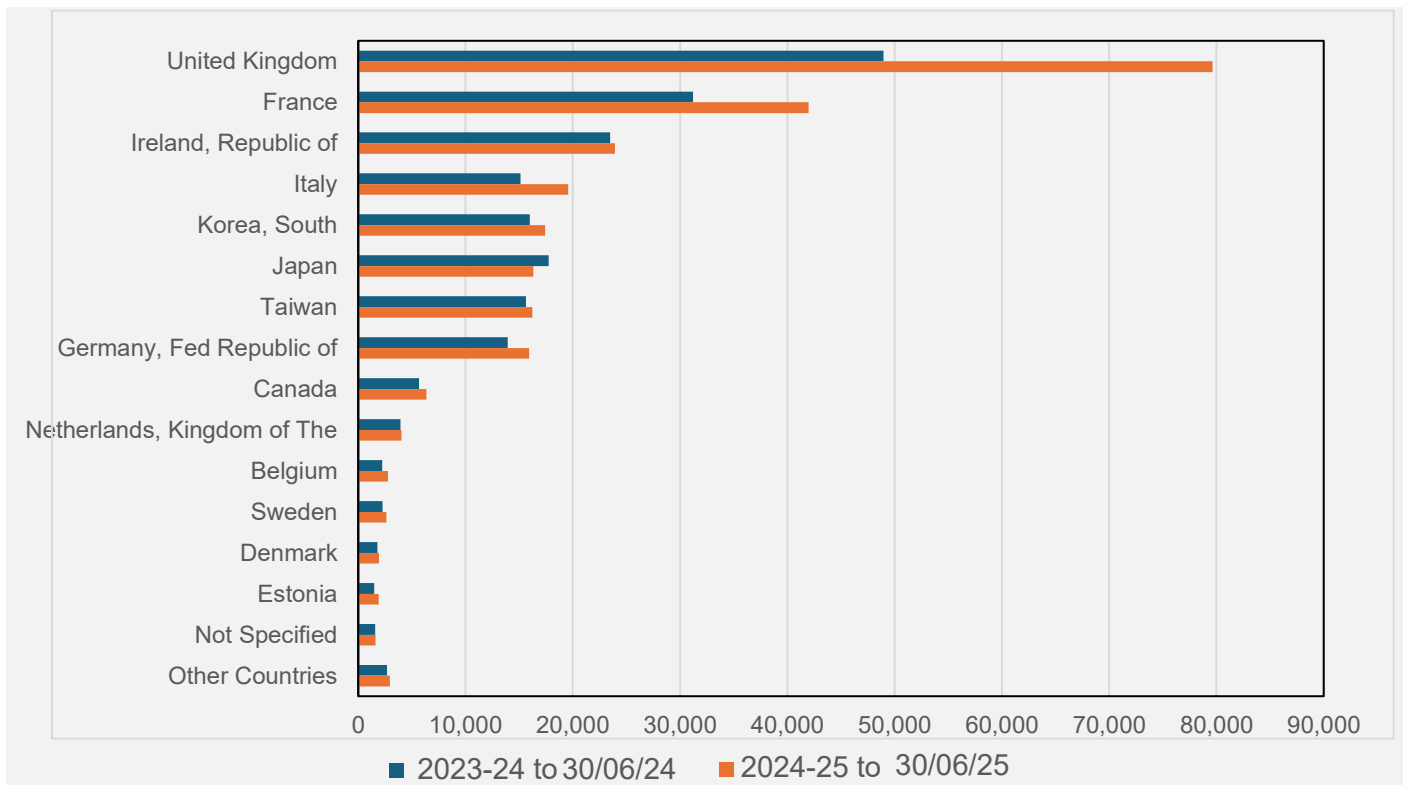

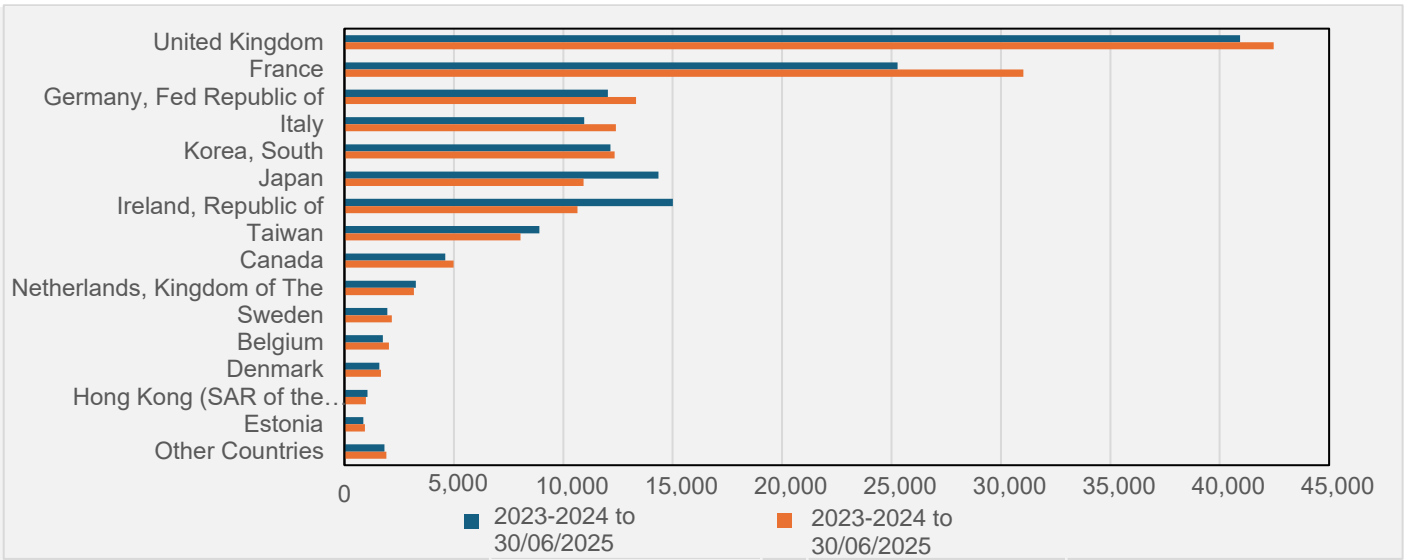

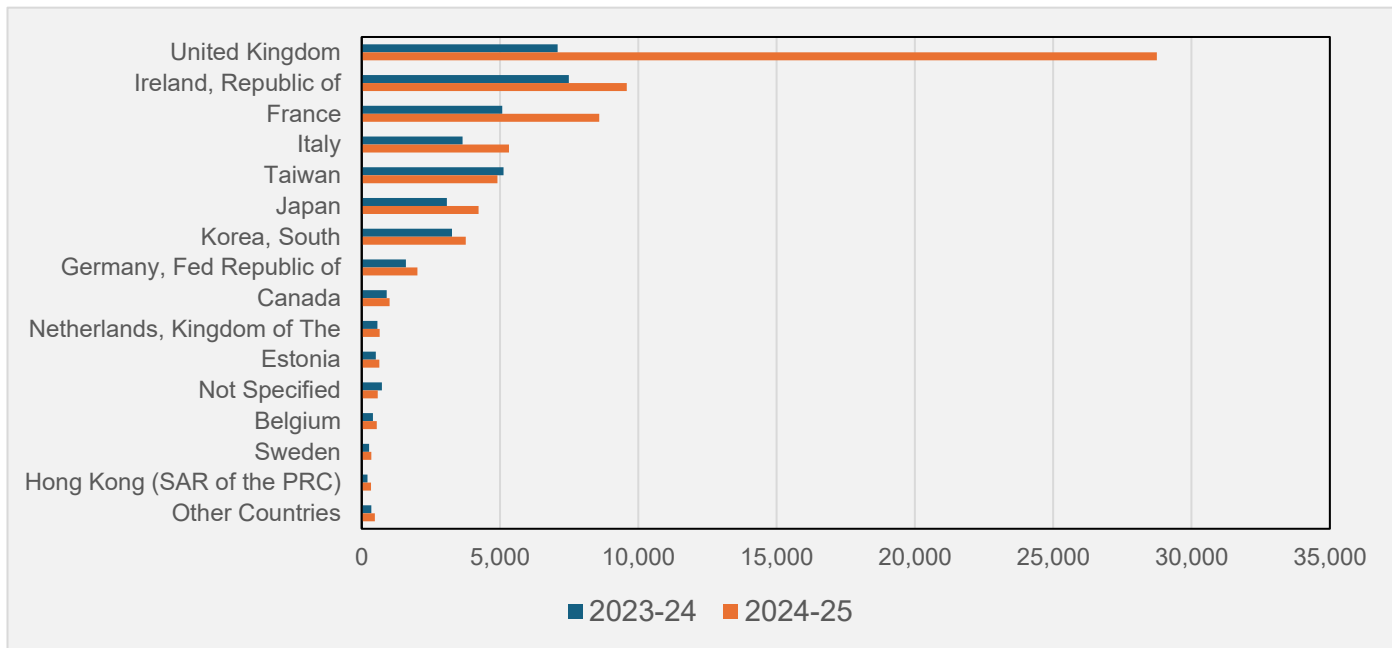

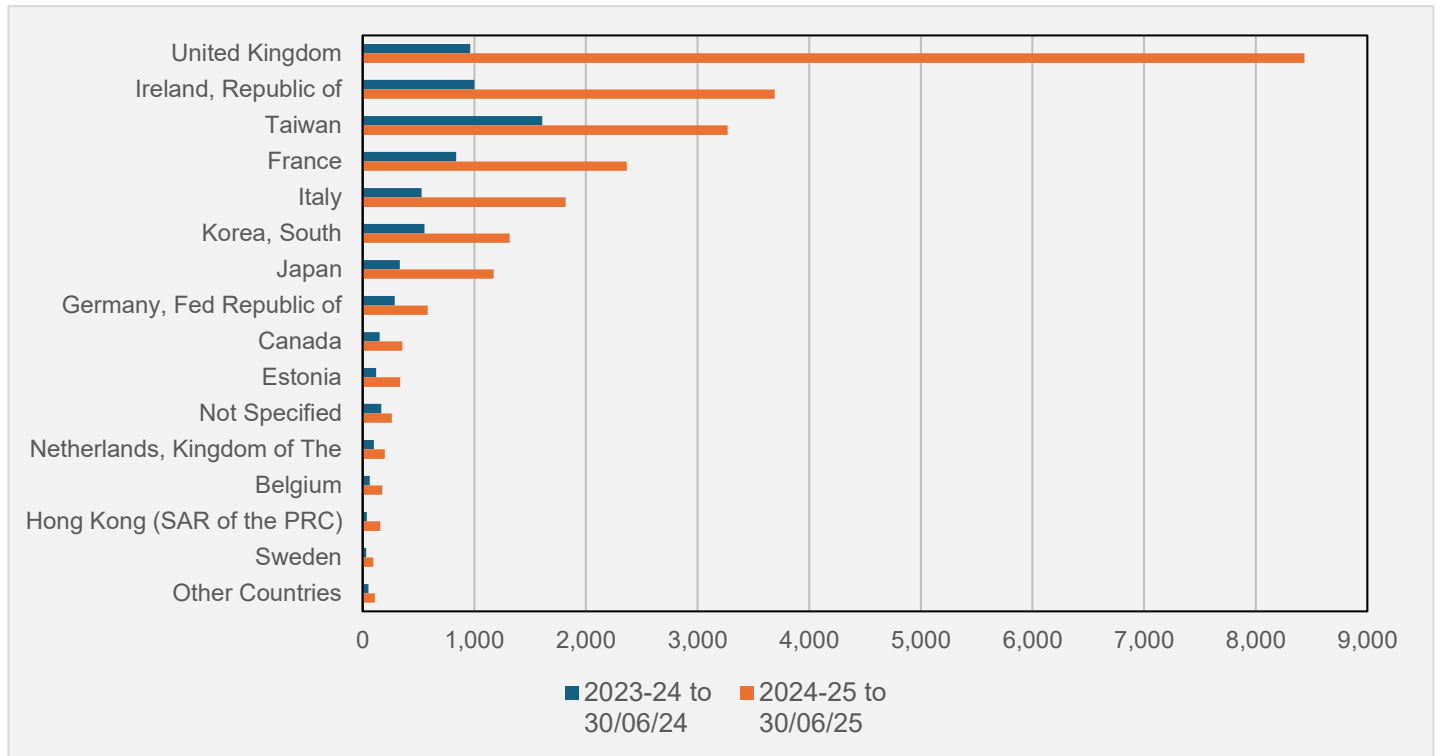

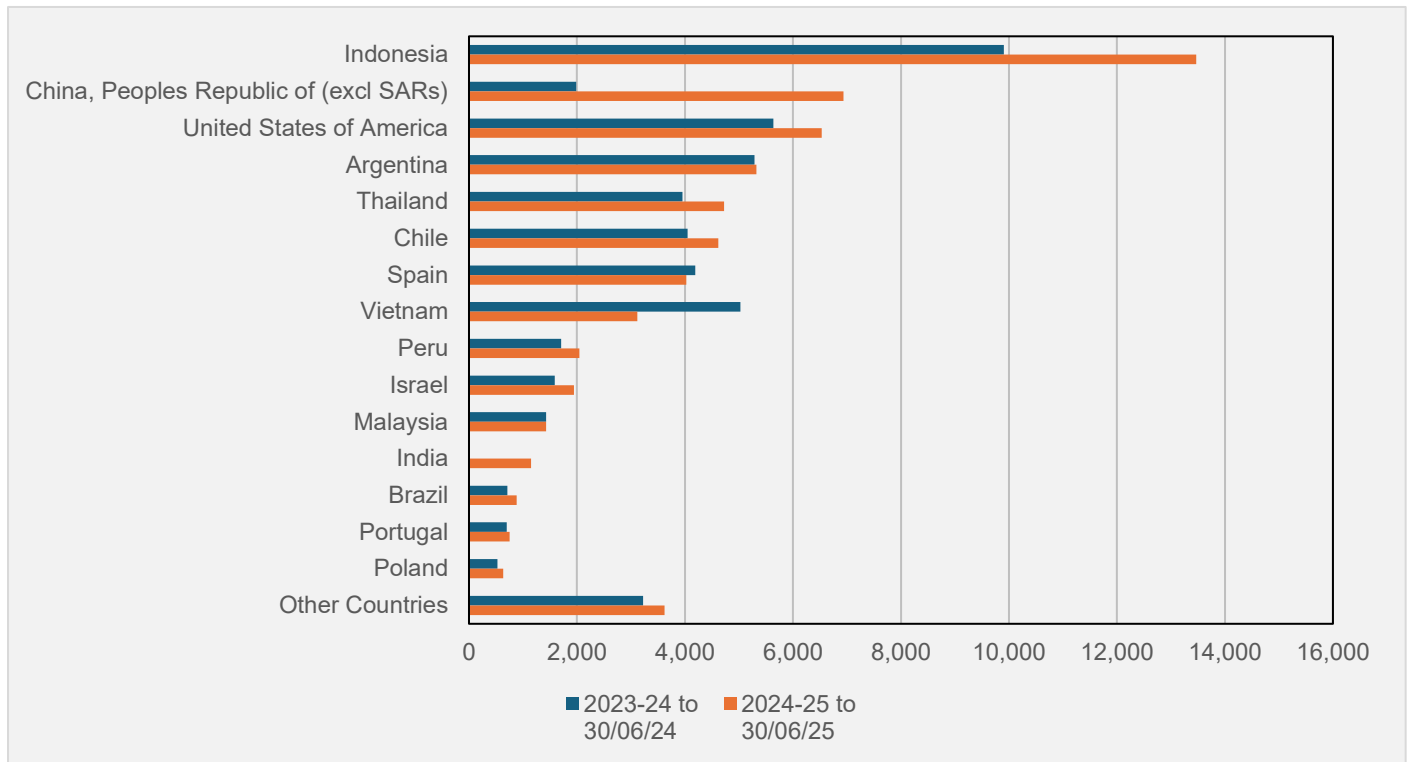

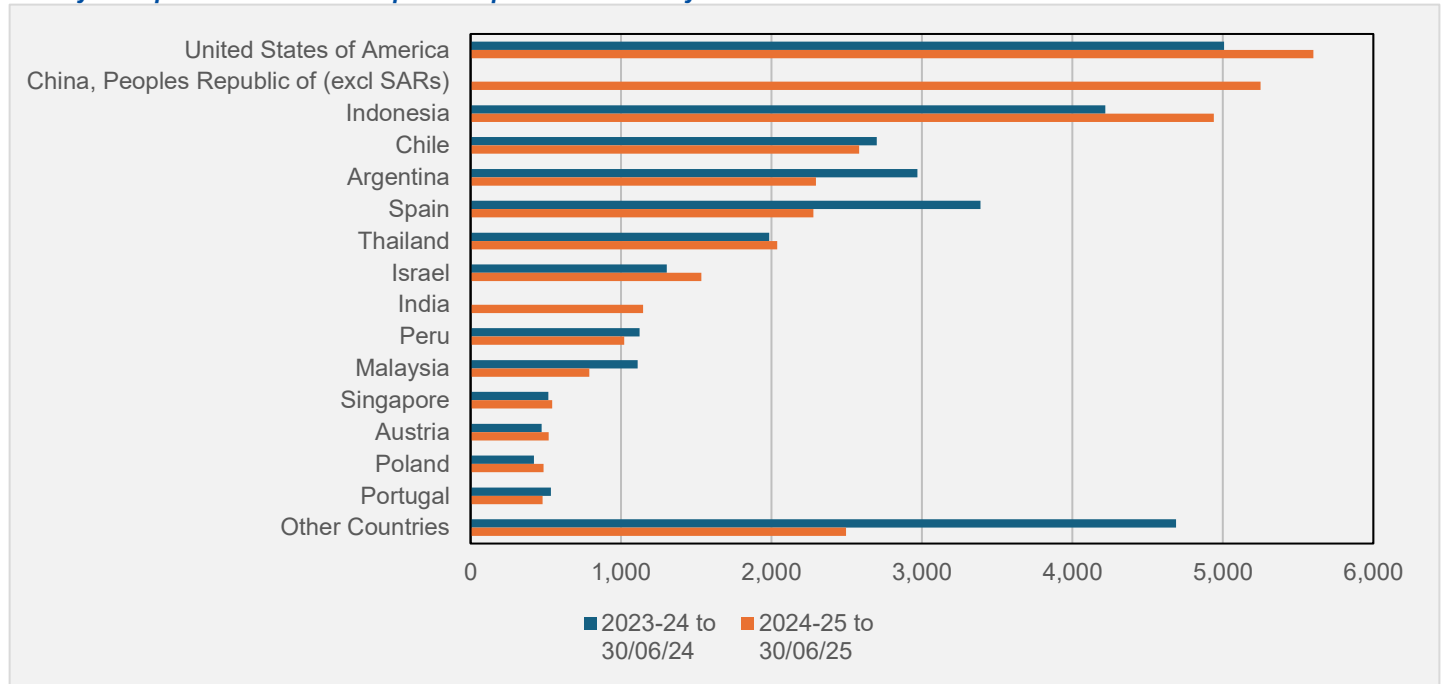

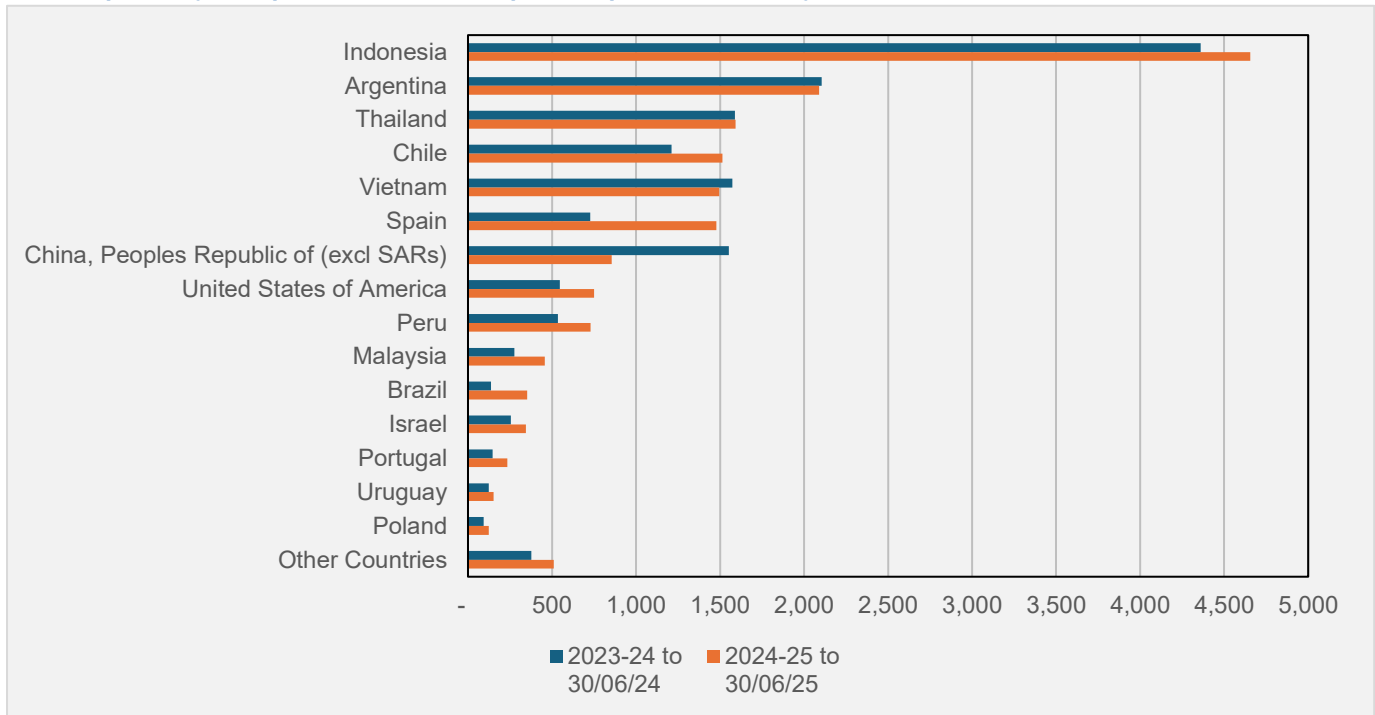

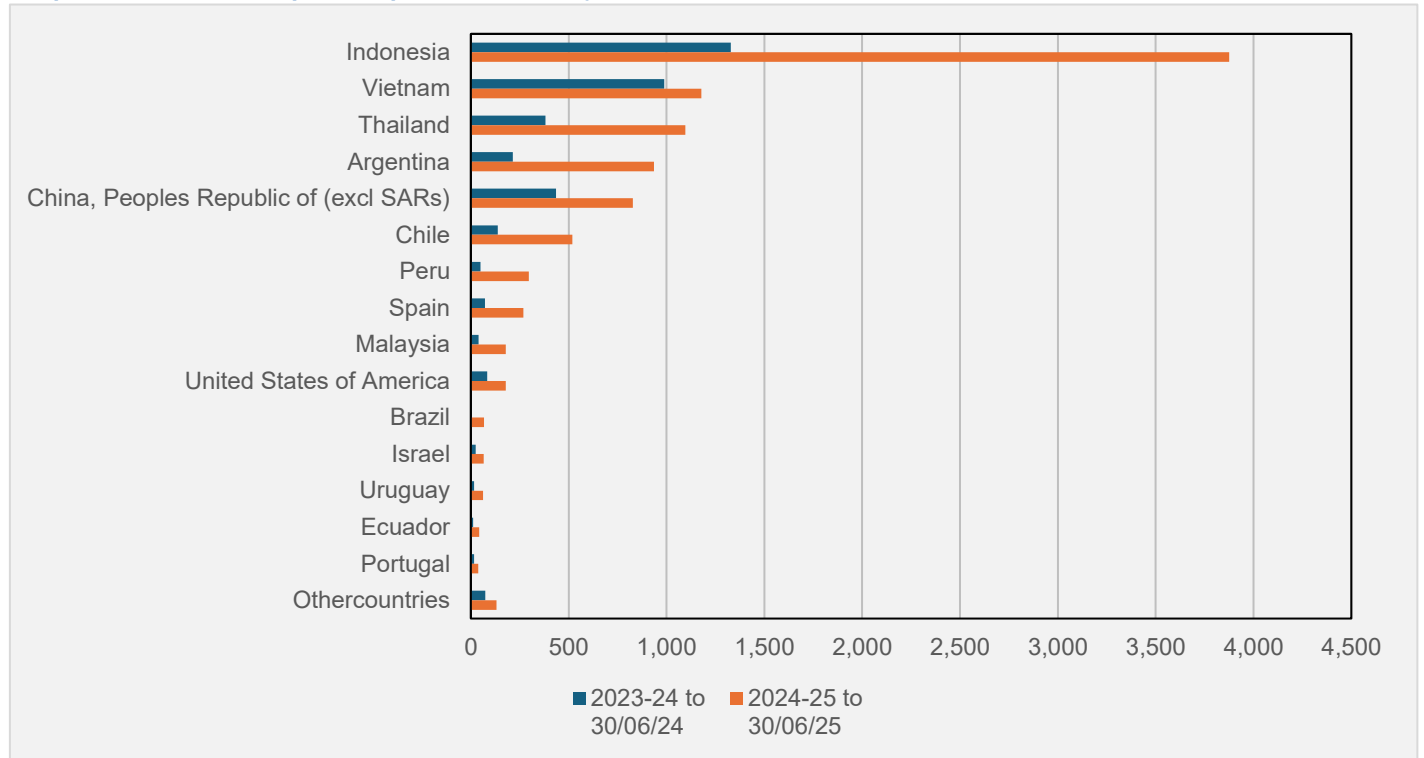

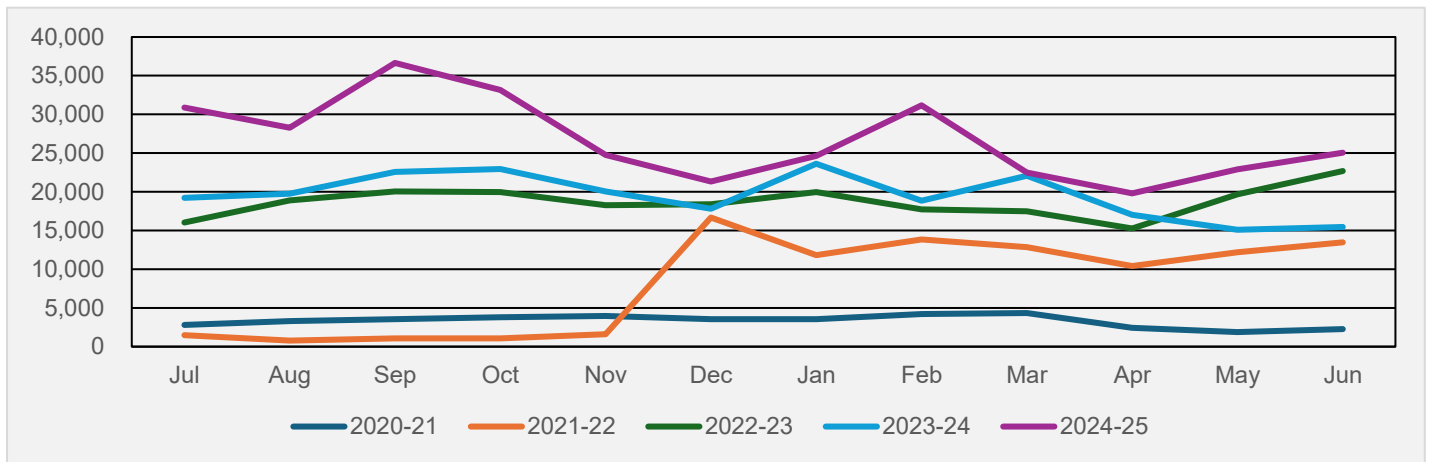

2.04 Number of second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by month - comparison with previous four financial years

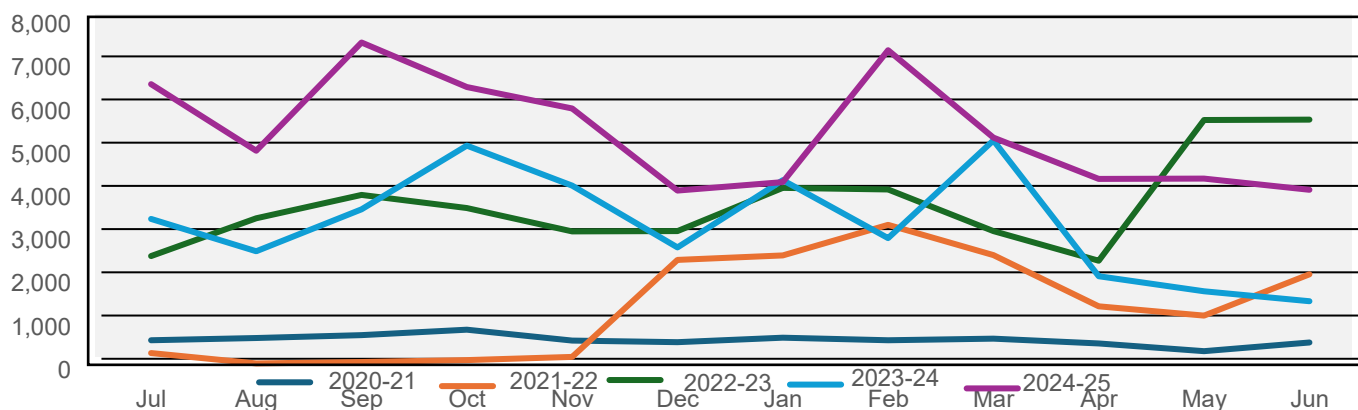

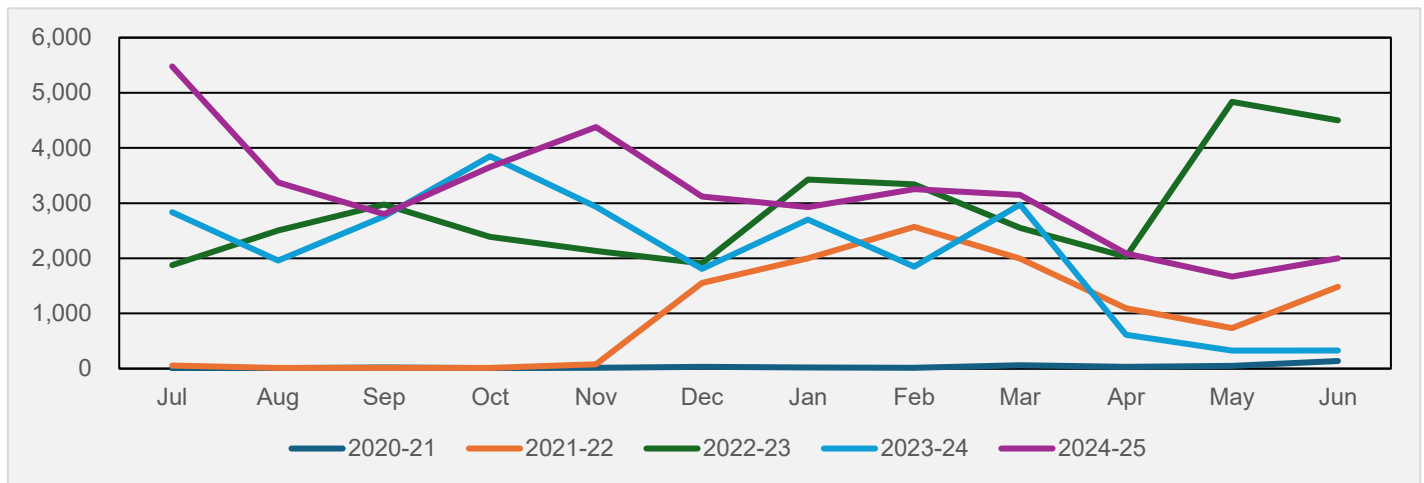

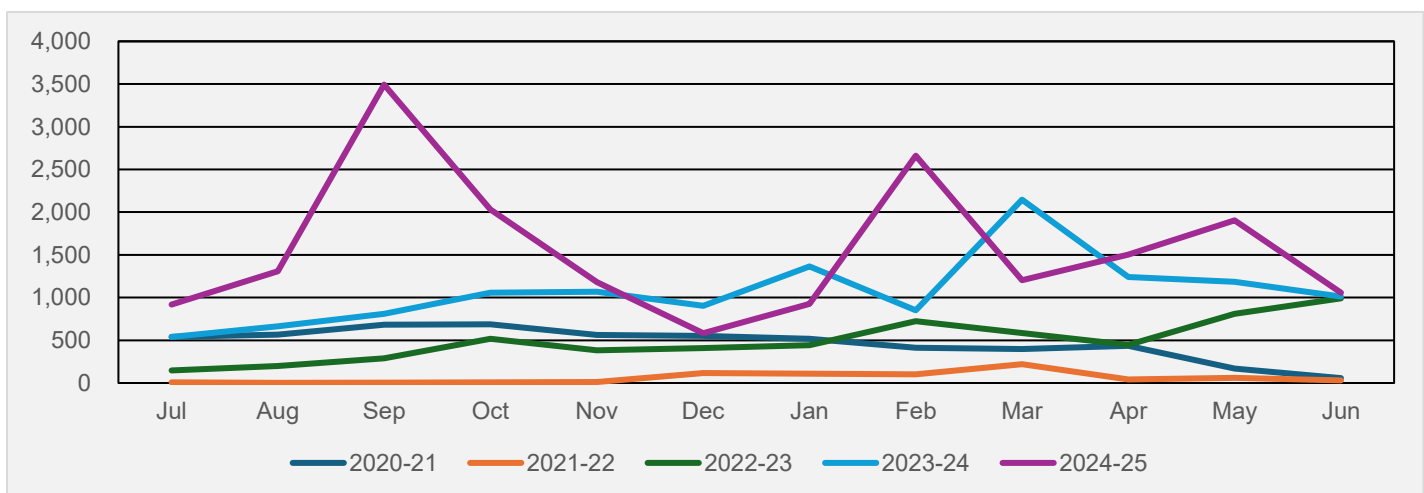

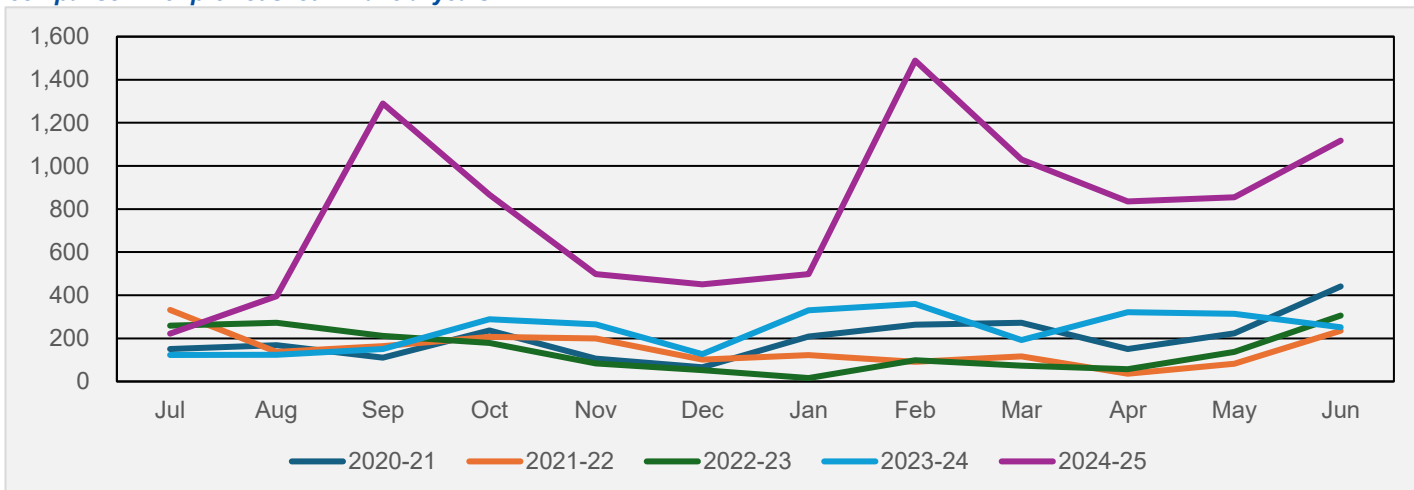
2.08 Number of second Work and Holiday (subclass 462) visa applications granted in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by month - comparison with previous four financial years

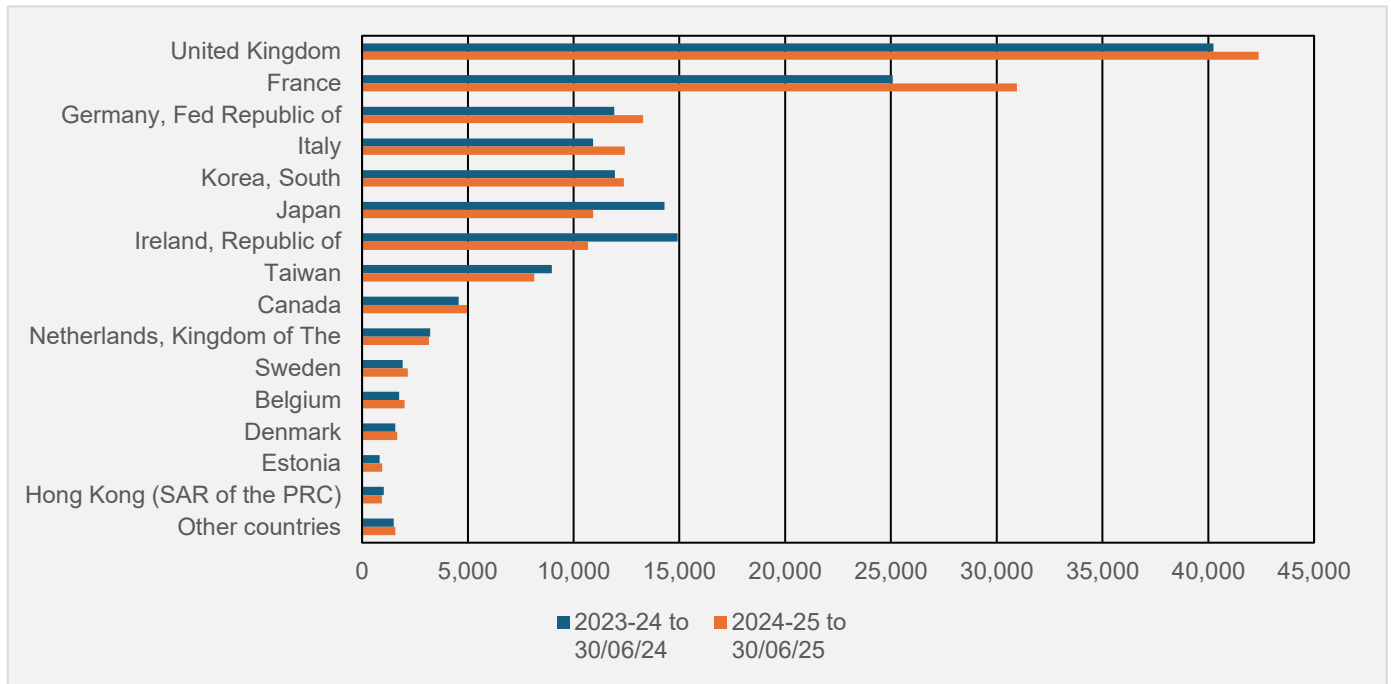

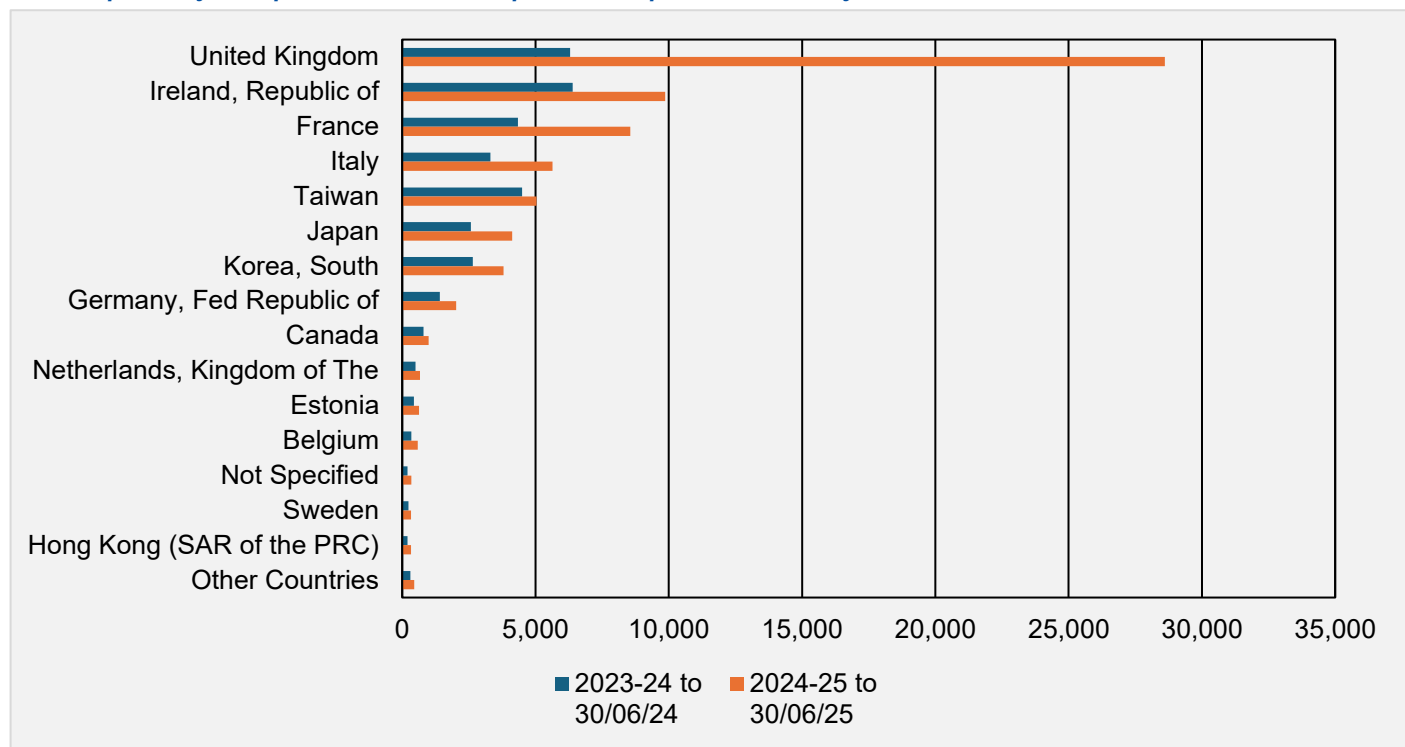

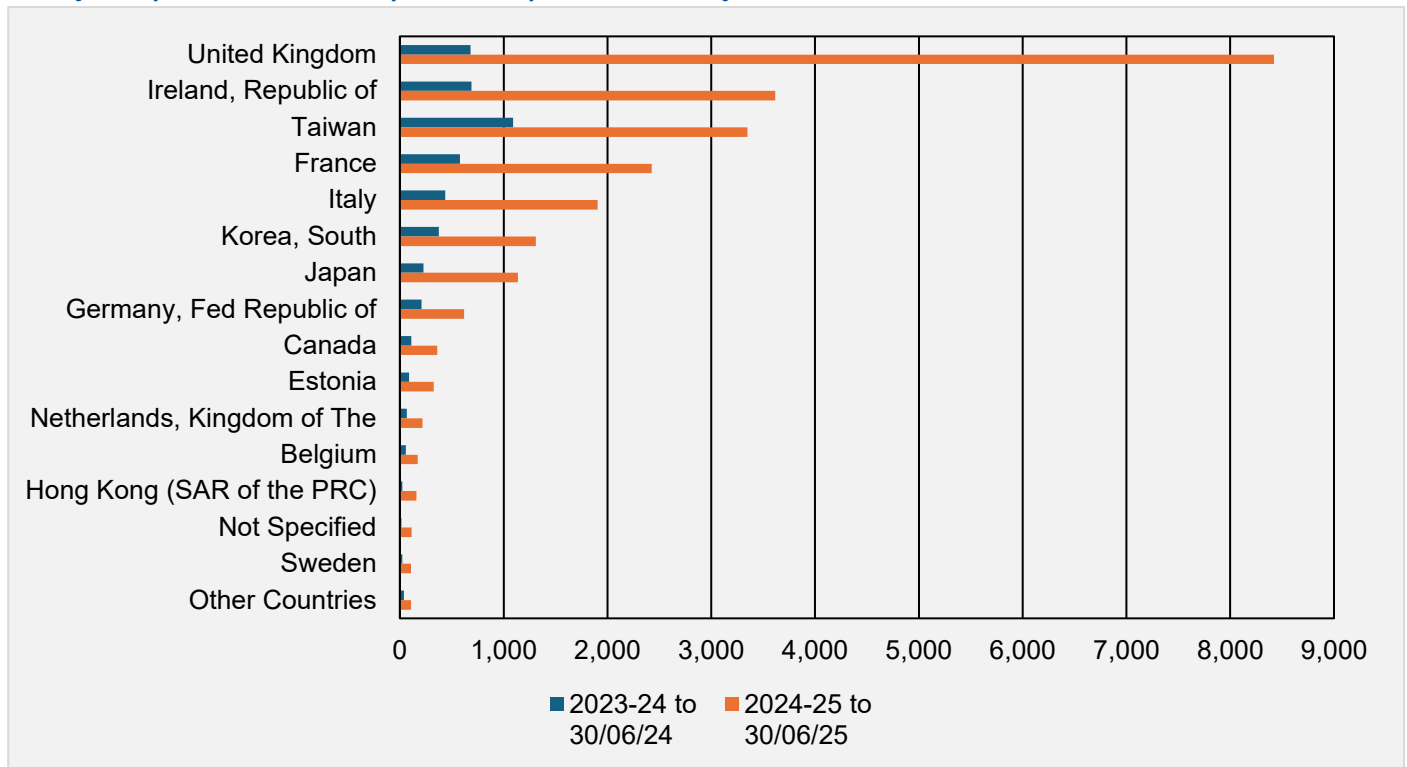

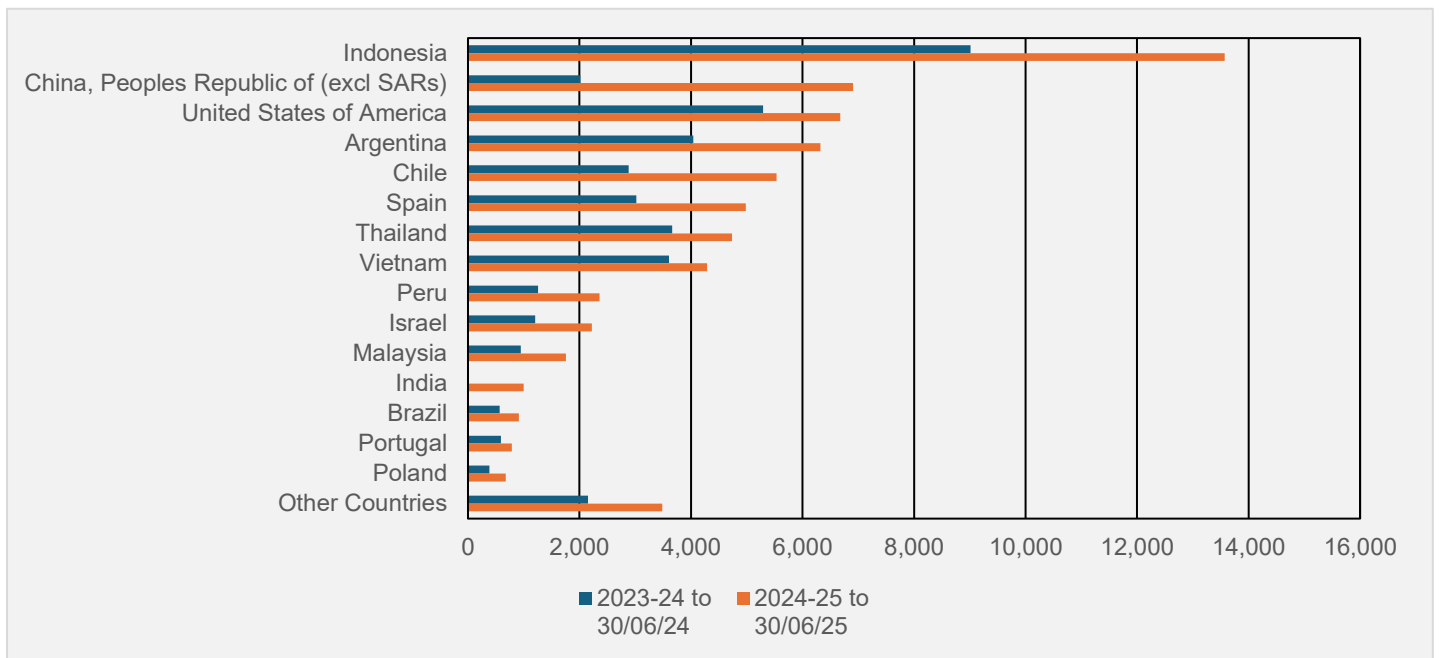

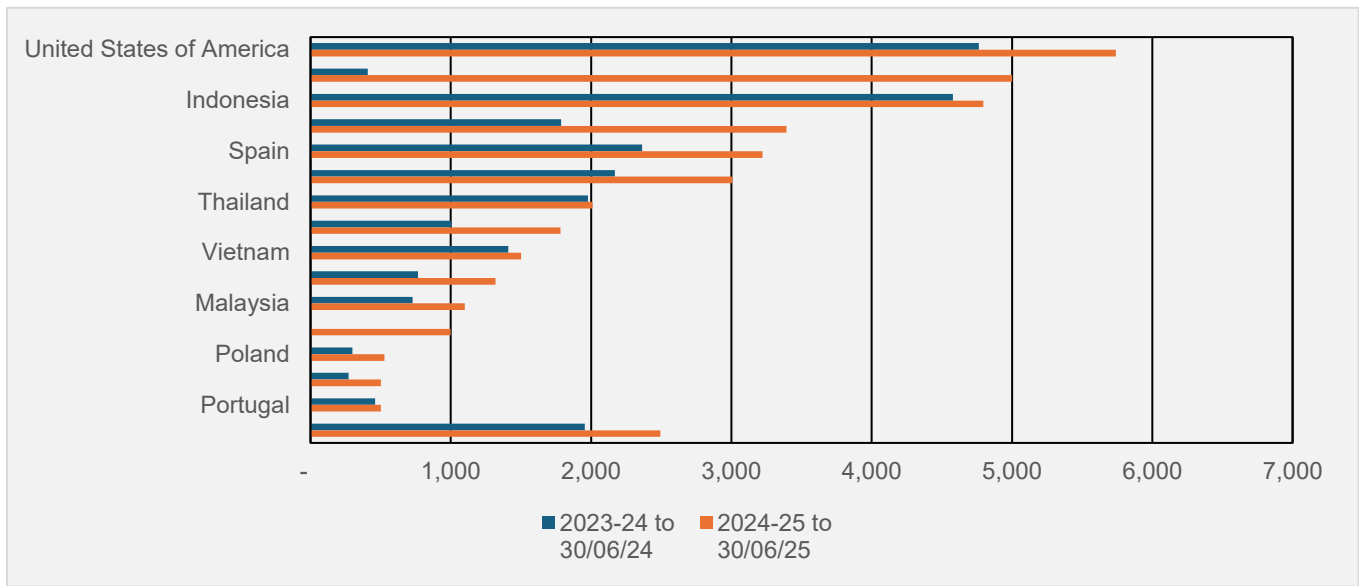

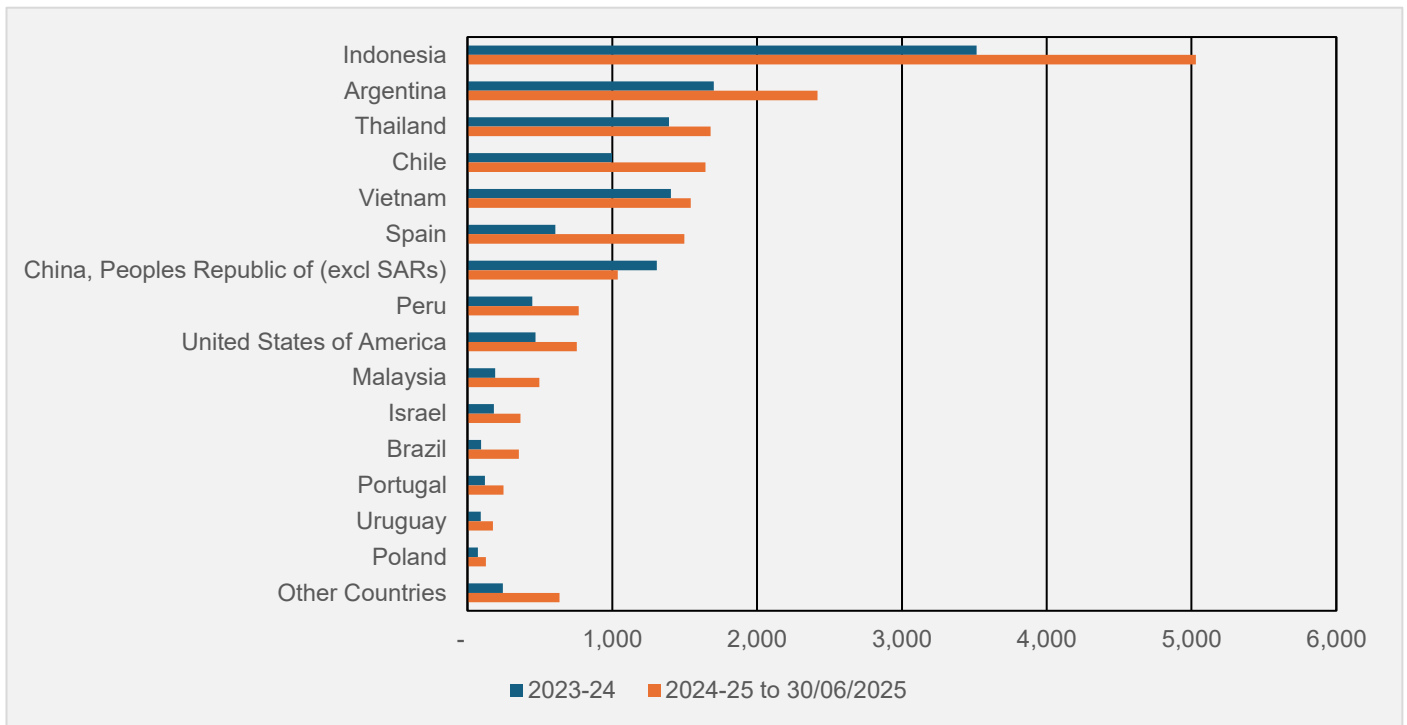

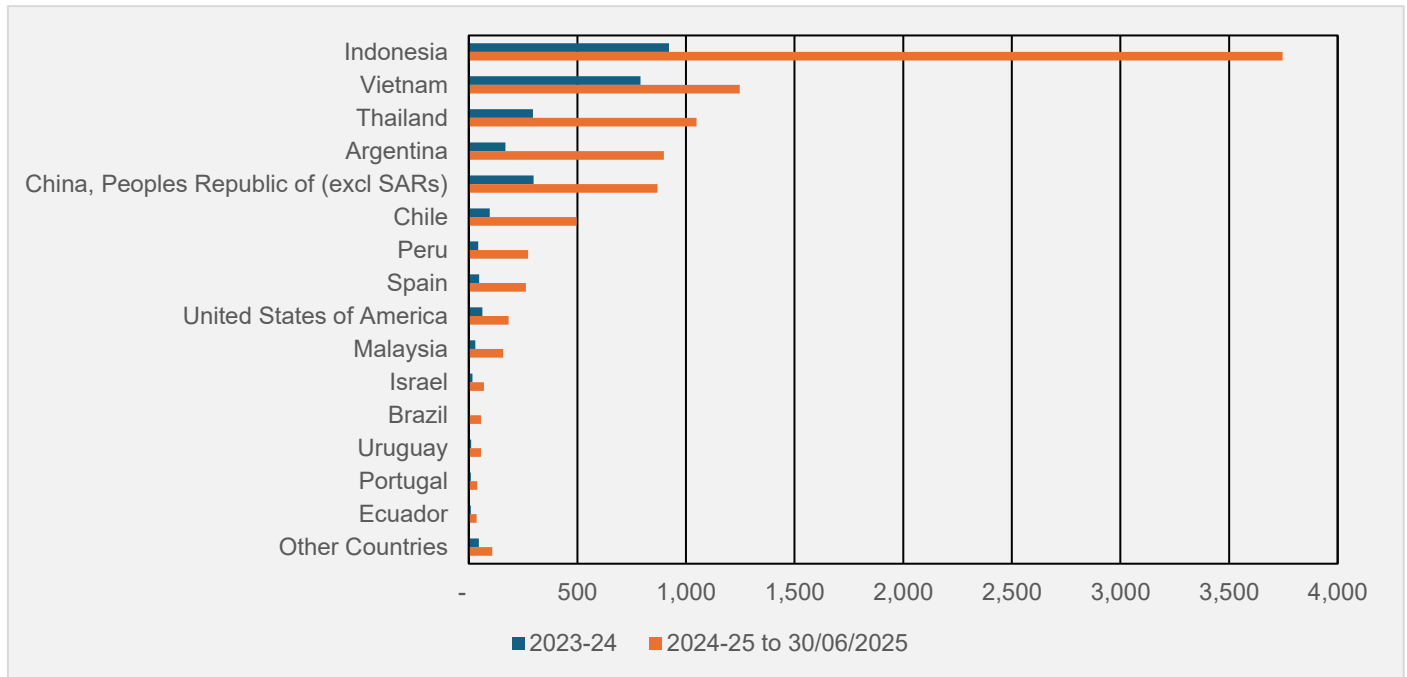

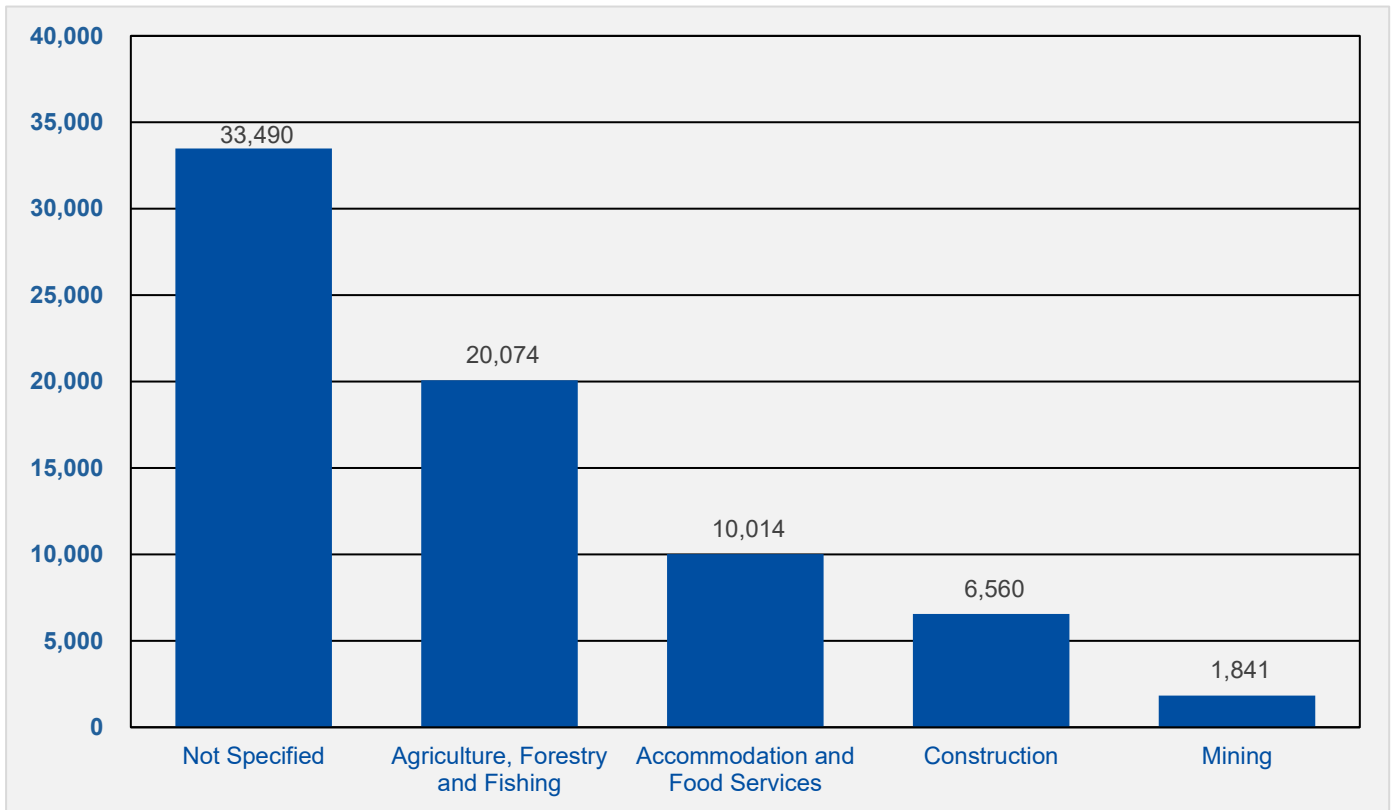

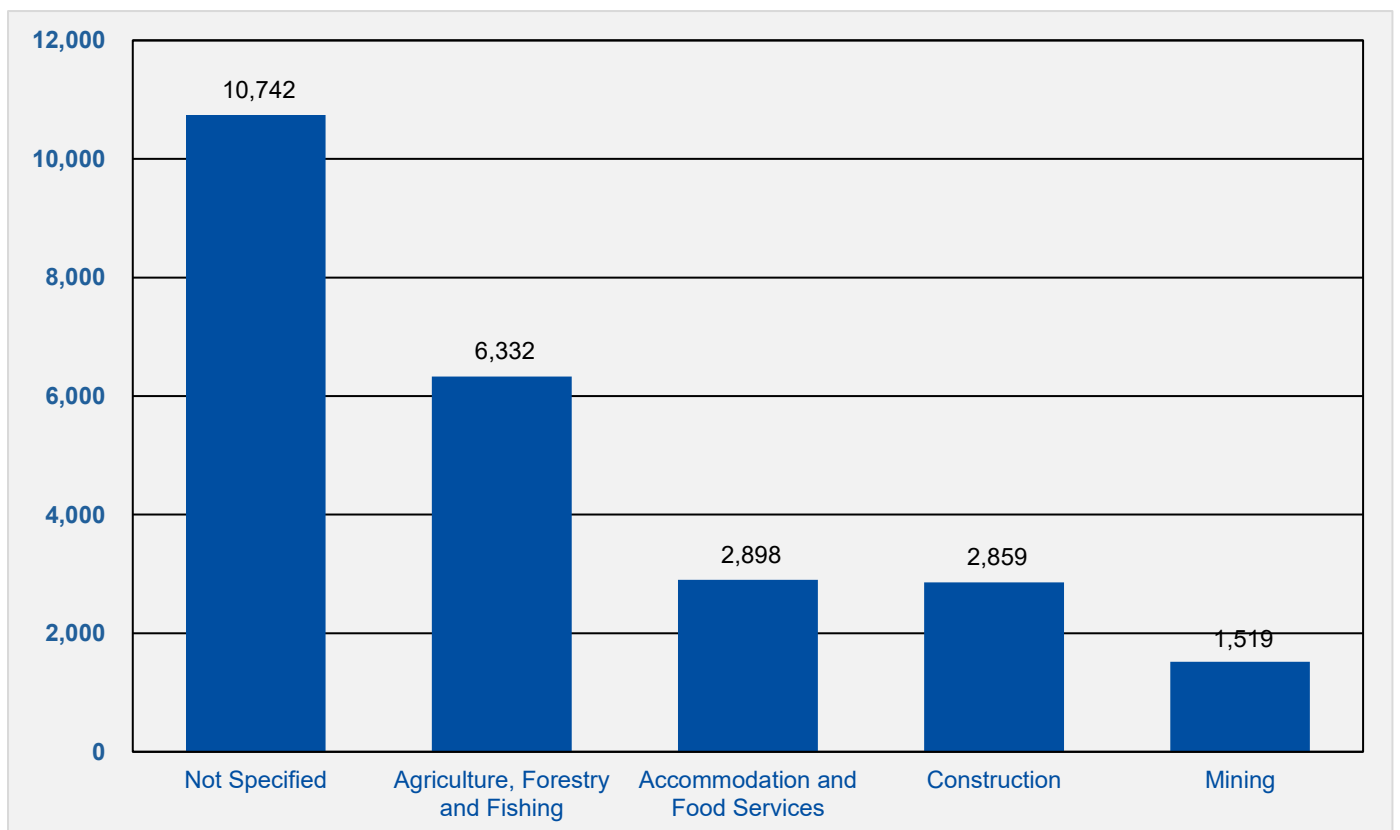

2.21 Second Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by employer industry

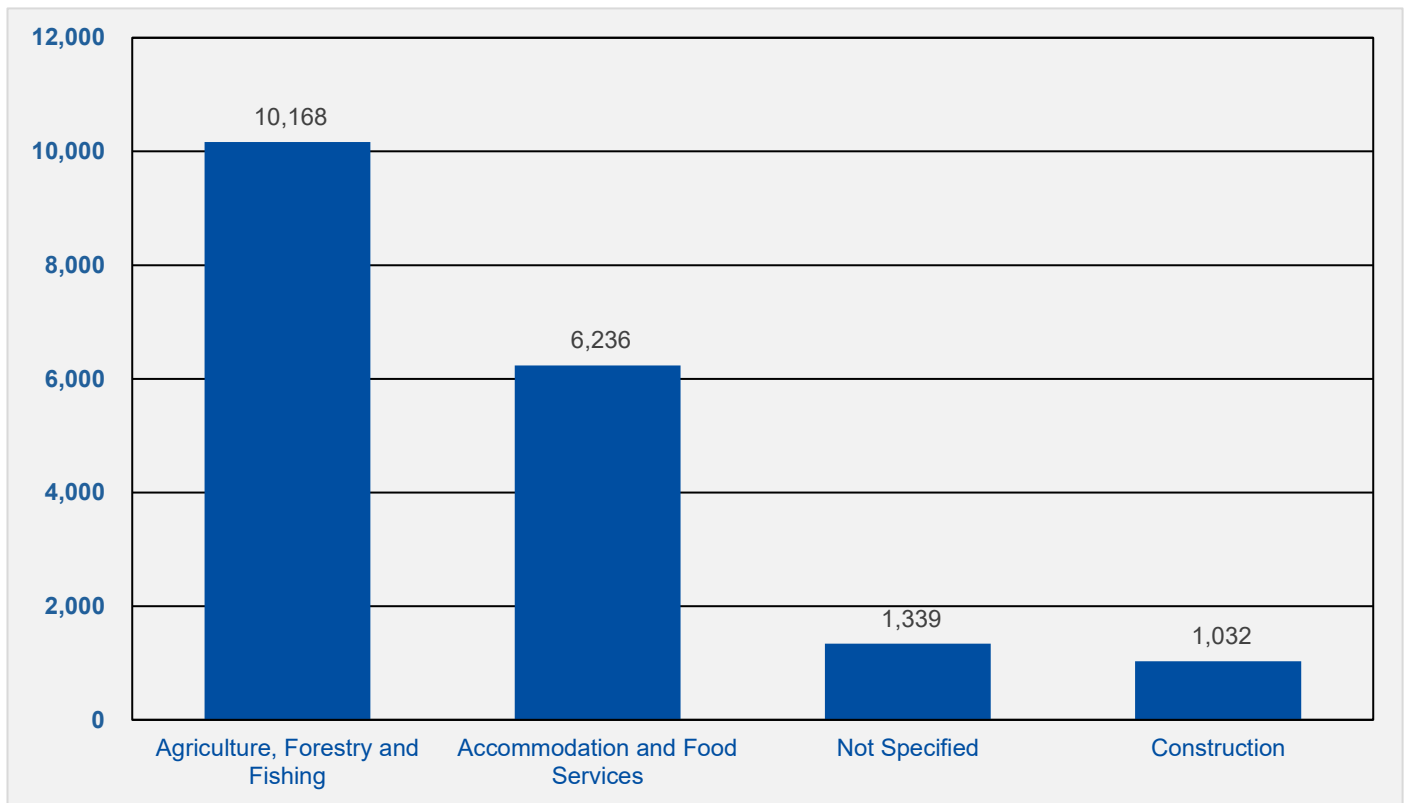


2.22 Third Working Holiday (subclass 417) visa applications granted in 2024-25 to 30 June 2025 by employer industry

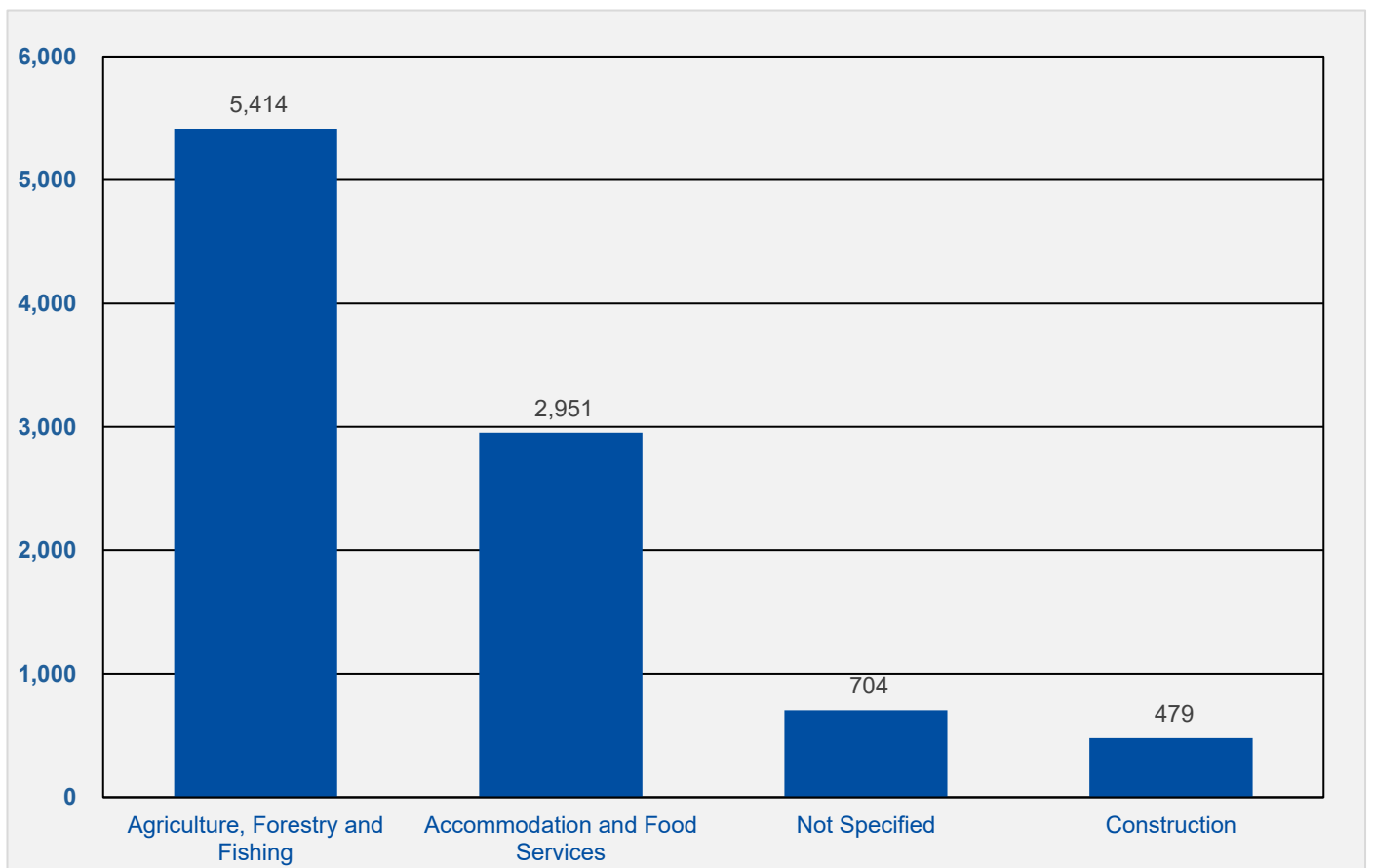

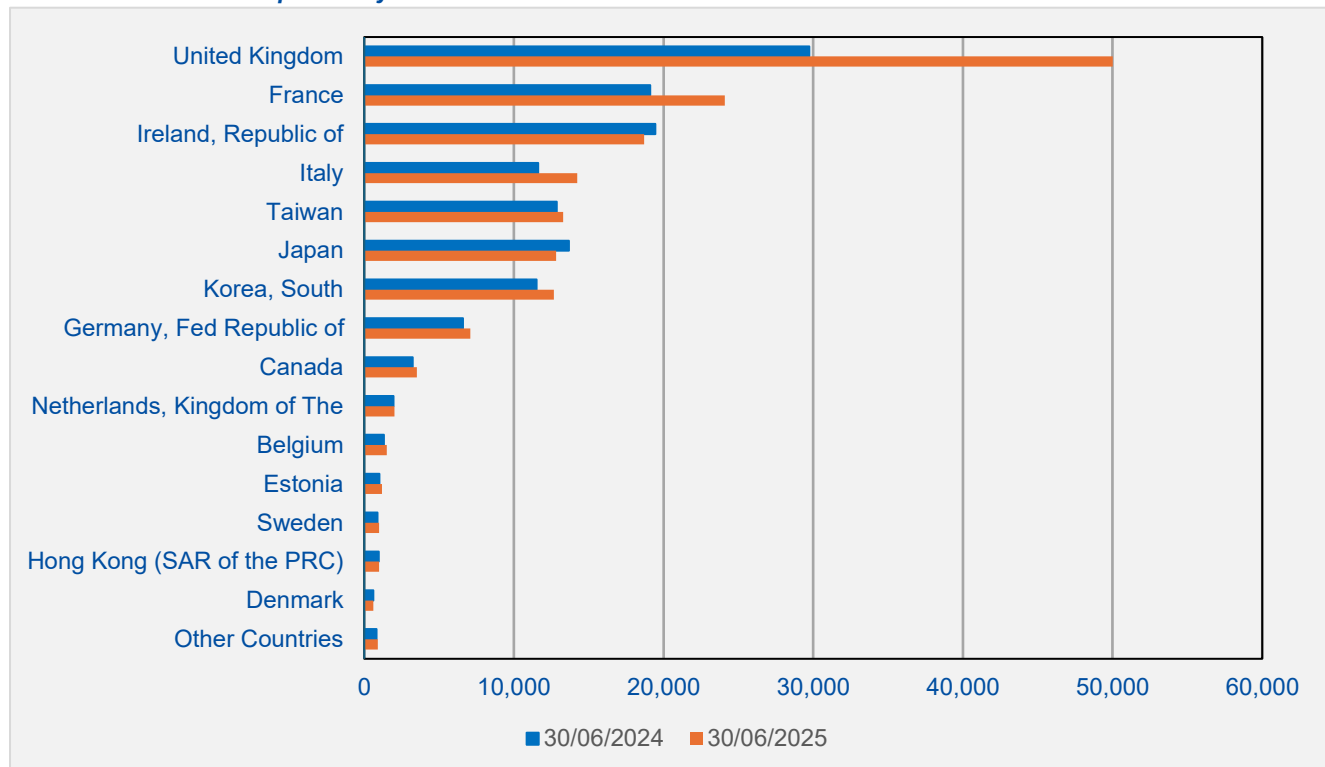

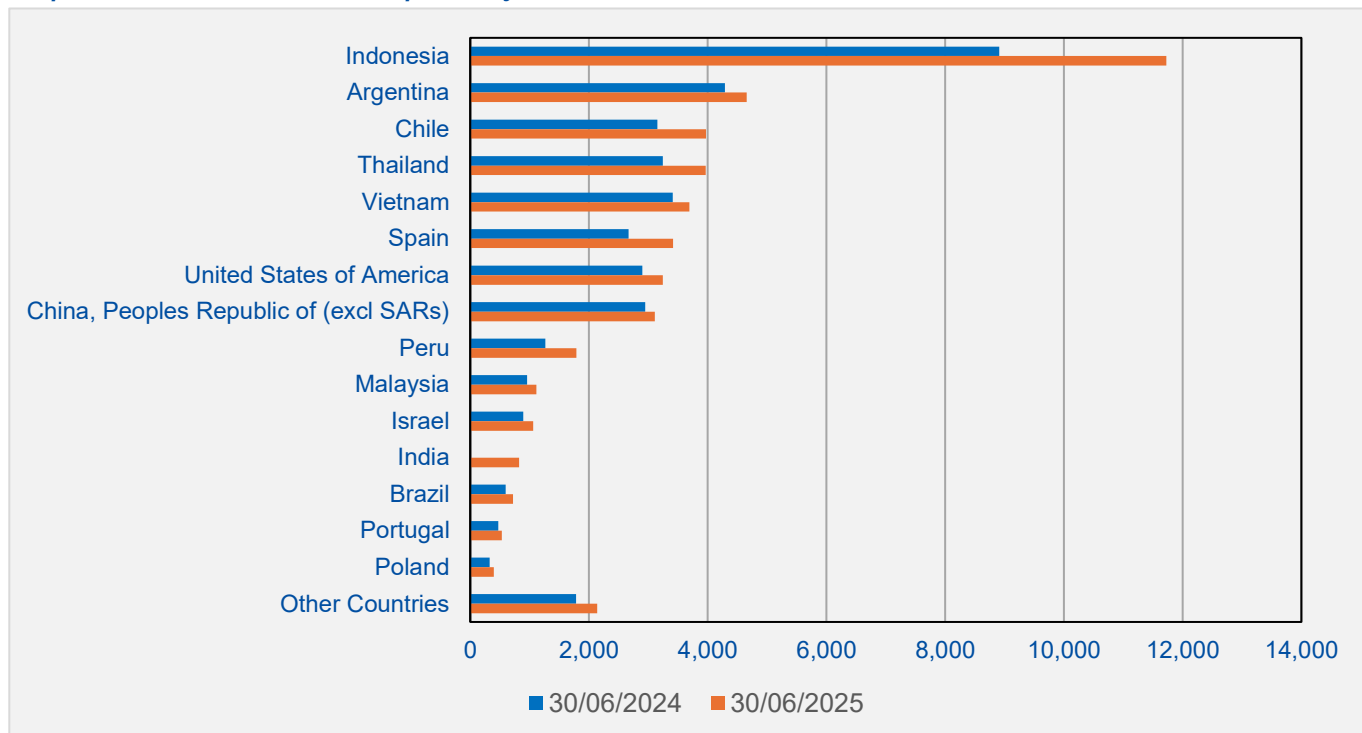
